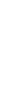

The government which was claiming that there is no foreign exchange to import coal, has suddenly presented a Cabinet paper for the import of coal till 2025 and question lies as to how the coal will be imported.

Ranawaka was addressing a press conference held in Colombo yesterday. He added that it is not known whether there has been a technical breakdown in the Norochcholai power plant, but one of the power plants was in a state of being closed for maintenance.

The MP said that this crisis has been created by not procuring coal in a manner that would withstand a formal procurement process and the country's economic situation and foreign exchange reserves.

The MP also pointed out that instead of suddenly increasing the electricity bill in an unbearable manner, the government should have increased the bill successively in the

Ranawaka said the Ceylon Electricity Board may have lost a lot of money due to the non-payment of electricity bills by government institutions, and that a system of daily payment of these bills should be set up before increasing the electricity bill.

The Commission does not agree at all regarding postponing the elections. The Election Commission should have the power to postpone Local Government elections".

"Provincial Council Elections have not been held for many years now due to the problematic nature of two Acts. The Parliamentary Select Committee had recommended to amend the said Acts and to hold

the Provincial Council Elections in the old way. The Commission is ready to conduct the election in any way," Punchihewa added. "Parliament should be dissolved to hold the Parliamentary General Elections. But according to the provisions of the Constitution, even if the President wishes, he does not have the power to dissolve the parliament for two and a half years after the first parliament convenes," he said.


The incident took place around 10.30 a.m. in the Colombo Fort-bound Uttara Devi intercity express train (4018) from Kankesanthurai and Jaffna.

This is the second incident reported involving passengers and railway staff in this area within this week. Earlier on August 15, a tense situation was reported in the Yal Devi express train when a group of passengers clashed with another group of passengers and train staff over a seatrelated issue. Three passengers were hospitalized following this incident.

The ticket inspector sustained injuries to his eye and is receiving treatment, the hospital sources said.

Railway security officers have arrested the suspect and handed him over to the police for necessary action. Maho police is conducting investigations.

On July 23, a railway security guard was killed after two drunken train passengers kicked him out of the train when he advised them against their conduct between Veyangoda and Wandurawa railway stations.

When questioned that the Trade Unions will be very hostile to restructuring, he said "I don't worry about unions, what matters is people. People are going to stand it if they think things can get better".

Wickremesinghe also said that the government will have to raise taxes such as tax on capital, tax on wealth. "The tax net has to be widened. And that will bring some of the lost revenue. By about the middle of next year, we'll have the same, or

we'll even go beyond the tax net we had in 2018". The President said that beginning of 2023 will be tough but the ending will be better, "we're trying to reduce the period of pain. If the revenue keeps coming in, we'll know in the next three

months, then the end will be better". He said Sri Lankan economy will return to normal maybe about 2024, 2025. Initially we thought 2024 but it looks like 2023 is going to be a bad year globally, so it can be 2024, 2025.

When asked what country Sri Lanka wants to follow, he said "We would like to be like Singapore, but let's start by emulating the standard of Thailand, Malaysia and Vietnam".

The President also said that remittances are picking slowly but it may get better next year, and there's the prospect of tourism returning too. "We're trying to get the tourists starting this winter and prices will be cheap. But from next year onwards, we have to get the summer and the winter. This year, the attraction will be prices".

The visa issued to her was terminated by the department after she had violated visa conditions by posting Aragalaya protest content on social media.

The Immigration and Emigration Department seized her passport and later informed her to leave Sri Lanka by August 15.

Following this incident, Fraser filed an application to the Court of Appeal on Tuesday (16) seeking to terminate the decision taken by the Immigration and Emigration Department to deport her from Sri Lanka. But, it was rejected by Court.

Currently, she has gone missing instead of leaving the country and legal action will be taken against her after she is arrested, the Department said.

Senior Engineers Union representatives stated this in a discussion held on Wednesday evening with Power and Energy Minister Kanchana Wijesekera. They said that they will offer their support to the restructuring plans of the Electricity Board as it is the only available remedy to avoid further destruction now.

They said it should be done right now. Recently, many trade unions took trade union action against the revision of the Electricity Act. But they said that their trade union did not

work against it and this time also they will support the restructuring proposal by giving their suggestions.

They emphasized that it is problematic that the Electricity Board continues to be a burden on the people, the country and the Treasury and that it can be built as an effective institution by restructuring. They added that support will be provided for the speedy implementation of renewable energy projects.

Passenger terminal facilities will be upgraded to better serve foreign passengers arriving in Colombo by sea and air, Ports, Shipping and Aviation Minister Nimal Siripala de Silva said.

The Minister stated that successful discussions have already been made with shipping lines and their local agents on encouraging passenger vessels to call at the Port of Colombo and stated that the Marketing and Business Development Division of the SLPA should implement a large-scale internet-based strategic promotion programme on the matter.

Citing the conceptual developments and distinction between 'National Security' and 'Human Security', Gen. Gunaratne, while

concerning the country's standpoint, stated that the national security dynamics today includes managing global pandemics, mitigating and adapting to climate change, maintaining clean water, maintaining reliable food supplies, and protecting the property of individuals and communities, dealing with economic and political dilemmas as well as the ability to protect state sovereignty, influenced by a number of international actors.

Sri Lanka has become vulnerable for arms and drugs trafficking, illegal, unregulated and unreported fishing on the man-made cycle, whereas global warming and resulting sea-level rises and weather anomalies, increased ocean pollution and impact on marine eco-systems, depleted fisheries, rising of ocean temperatures and salinity, as natural issues that are creating problems in the Indian Ocean which in turn has created a severe impact on the security of Sri Lanka in the Indian Ocean, he added.

Someone needs to call in, invite the main creditor nations. We will ask Japan to do it, President Ranil Wickremesinghe told Reuters in an interview, adding that he would travel to Tokyo next month to meet Prime Minister Fumio Kishida.

Udeeshan Jonas, chief strategist at Colombo-based investment bank CAL Group, said Wickremesinghe's outreach to Japan could help secure additional funds after once a restructuring plan is agreed.

"As one of the Quad countries, Japan

can bring India and the rest of the key bilateral creditors together and Sri Lanka can work on a restructuring plan that will cover a large part of the debt," Jonas said, referring to the Quad grouping of the United States, Japan, Austral-

ia and India. "Only China will be on the other side," he said.

Wickremesinghe said talks were ongoing with China, and that they had been positive so far. Sri Lanka's total bilateral debt was estimated at US\$ 6.2 billion at the end of 2020 by the IMF,

according to a March report, with Japan and China holding the largest shares.

This year alone, India has poured in around US\$ 4 billion to help keep Sri Lanka's economy afloat, mainly through credit lines and swaps.

Sri Lanka also has US\$ 14 billion of international sovereign bond debt. Besides seeking help from its allies, Sri Lanka is also negotiating with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for a loan package worth between US\$ 2 billion and US\$ 3 billion, Wickremesinghe said.

LESSONS TO LEARN FROM ACHIEVEMENTS OF SINHALA KINGS

here is much talk today about overcoming the current economic crisis some of which is frivolous and confusing the people abusing the hallowed freedom of expression nurtured by the indigenous culture based on Buddhism, a cornerstone of which is the spirit of inquiry long before it was found to be a sine qua non of philosophical excellence. During the days of the European Renaissance of around 1500 the so-called activists were still active for no cause after the real strugglers performed their task.



He feared some retaliation because he strengthened the coast guard service and the other defensive measures on the coast and 'made the island hard to subdue by the

The remaining twenty-six years of the reign of Sena II were a period of peace and affluence. The king endowed the monasteries, built new shrines and gave alms liberally. In irrigation he extended the Minipe scheme on the Mahaweli Ganga and constructed a feeder canal to augment the supply of Mahakanadarawa tank near Mihintale.'

It would have been well for politicians who worked within the dispensation of Parliamentary democracy post-Independence, to have taken a leaf from the book of the majority of the Sinhala kings of yore who answered the description of European benevolent despots such as long reigning Empress Catherine the Great (1762-1796) and Emperor Peter the Great (1682-1725) of Russia and Emperor Frederick the Great (1740-1786) of Prussia.

It is fervently hoped that President Ranil Wickremesinghe who for all intents and purposes is well and truly representative of the entire populace through Parliament elected by the people and so well-read as not to lose anything by the wanton incineration by ruffians of his cherished possession, his library will emulate his royal forefathers for the rebuilding of Sri Lanka.

Demurrage as unavoidable as death and taxes?



he issue of demurrage was in the news recently with news that fuel ships that could not be unloaded incurred considerable demurrage entailing a further drain in foreign exchange.

This case concerns a writ application in the Court of Appeal (Fonnys Pvt Ltd. V Sri Lanka Ports Authority - SLR - 108, Vol 2 of 2004 [2004] LKCA 44; (2004) 2 Sri LR 108 (17 September 2004)) with regard to a consignment of industrial off-road tyres.

The Court of Appeal judgement

records the case antecedents as follows: "The petitioner imported from Israel a consignment of industrial off-road tyres valued at US\$ 25,238 which is equivalent to Rs, 1,621,412.41 at the rate of exchange prevailing at the time of the filing of this application. The petitioner states that its representatives were informed by the Valuation Department of the Sri Lanka Customs that the consignment cannot be cleared since the documents have been referred to the Preventive Division of the Sri Lanka Customs for their approval.

The petitioner complains that the Preventive Division of the Sri Lanka Customs took 63 days to satisfy itself that there was no under-valuation of the goods, and the petitioner was allowed to clear the said consignment only on 2nd June 1998. It is common ground that the petitioner made representations to the Director-General of Customs that the petitioner should not be burdened with payment of port demurrage charges for the said period.'

When the petitioner's representative went to the port to clear the goods he received a letter from a Port Authority official stating that penal rent should be waived, but basic

rent and port charges should be levied. Basically, a lot of demurrage there.

The petitioner sought among other relief: (a) a writ of certiorari quashing the order and / or decision made by the 2nd respondent as evidenced by the endorsement made by him on the letter dated 6th July 1998 marked as I;

(b) a writ of mandamus ordering the 1st and 2nd respondents to release the consignment referred to in the said letter marked as 'I' on payment of the relevant port handling charges

The Minister in charge of Ports and Shipping had issued a letter and it was the position of the petitioner that this letter has approved a waiver of rent and not just penal rent — all types of demurrage, and rent.

The Appeal Court judgement goes onto explain the difference between penal rent or demurrage and other regular rents in the following terms:

"The 'demurrage rent' referred to in the said letter marked as H is in respect of 'penal charges' as appearing in the SLPA Tariff Guide marked as '2R2'. Accordingly, it is contended by the respondents that as only 'penal rent' or what is commonly referred to as the 'demurrage rent' have been waived,

the petitioner is liable to pay the basic rent and port handling charges to the SLPA, which has been calculated at Rs. 147,000 as evidenced by the documents marked '2R4a' to '2R4c'."

What is demurrage? The Court judgement went so far as to quote the Oxford dictionary with regard to what demurrage is, and what it

"The Oxford Dictionary (10th Edition) page 381 defines 'demurrage' as "a charge payable to the owners of a chartered ship in respect of delay in loading and discharging". In Krishna Mining Co. Ltd. v Pan Islamic Steamship Co. Ltd Nimal Dissanayake J., defined the term as "damages payable by the charterer for the delay caused over and above the agreed time for discharging or loading.'

In a decided case (Tajit & Co (Pvt) Ltd v Sri Lanka Port Authority and Two others) the Director General of Customs has recommended that because the Customs Department delayed a certain consignment, demurrage should be waived. However, the Court of Appeal did not

In the case under review, the Court of Appeal cited the Tajit case in judgement in the following manner:

"It is true that according to P3 the Director-General of Customs has suggested to the Ports Authority that the petitioner should be given some relief in respect of the consignment as there was no customs violation committed. It is observed that the concession suggested by the Director-General of Customs should be considered in the light of the provisions of section 38 (1) of the Sri Lanka Ports Authority Act which deals with 'Recovery of charges in arrears.'"

After analysing the provisions of section

returned

38 of the Act, His Lordship concluded as fol-

"From the above, it is clear that the 1st respondent has the statutory authority to levy port charges, irrespective of whether the goods were seized by the Customs or not. In the circumstances, the rejection by the Ports Authority of the request made by the Director-General of Customs to waive part of the port charges cannot be considered as illegal or arbitrary."

As can be seen, the entreaties by the Director General of Customs were ignored by the Ports

Authority, and the Court of Appeal did not see anything wrong with that. Though it is not stated anywhere in that judgement in those specific terms, it appears that the Court goes by strict adherence to the Sri Lanka Port Authority Act. Nowhere does the Act state that any delays

due to the work of other Government departments should be compensated by waiver of demurrage of rent. It appears that the reasoning is that the Ports have to do their job and that those who use their services have to expect and plan for delays — such as Customs delays if and when they occur. i.e: these are par for the course, and cannot be reasons for denying the Port Authority rents and other fees they charge for their services.

In conclusion the judgement observed:

"It is important to note that this question of interpretation arises in the context of a letter written by an officer of the Government for the purpose of communicating a decision of a Minister in regard to a matter for which there is no express statutory provision. In fact, learned State Counsel has stressed that there is no express provision in the Sri Lanka Port Authority Act, No. 51 of 1979 for waiving any of the charges that may otherwise be levied by the said Authority, and that the Authority could have in law ignored the decision of the Minister to waive 'demurrage rent' communicated to the petitioner by the letter dated 6th July 1998

For the foregoing reasons the court decided to dismiss the application of the petitioner for the twin writs of certiorari and mandamus with cost fixed at Rs. 12,000 payable by the petitioner.

Fisheries Minister Douglas Devananda during a fact-finding tour of all major fisheries harbours located along the North Western and Western coastal belt said that a Cabinet paper would be put up to get Cabinet approval for making necessary amendments to out-of-date laws and regulations in the existing Fisheries Act.

The Fisheries Minister visited the Kalpitiya, Puttalam, Chilaw, Udappuwa and Negombo fisheries harbours where he had several discussions with the officials and the fishermen, which mainly focused on the acute scarcity of kerosene oil.

The owners of multi-day fishing vessels in Kalpitiya brought to the notice of the Minister that the ban imposed on their vessels prohibiting prawn fishing is not justifiable. Minister Devananda admitted that such acts caused big losses to the fishermen as well as a significant loss of foreign exchange that could be earned from the prawn export busi-

Minister Devananda during the observation tour instructed the officials concerned to accelerate the improvements to the Kalpitiya harbour's breakwater, which is being extended by 75 metres.

He promised the fishing community in Udappuwa to take action without delay to stop erosion in the Udappuwa maritime area. During his visit to the Negombo fisheries harbour, the Fisheries Minister instructed the Ceylon Fishery Harbours Corporation General Manager Janaka Mudalige to finalize the plan for the deepening of the fisheries harbour.

At a meeting with the Negombo fishing community Minister Devananda pledged to end the kerosene oil scarcity in the fisheries industry. He said that it was a serious problem to provide kerosene oil to nearly 27,000 fishing boats in the country, out of the limited quota being allocated for the fisheries indus-

A sound step

he move by President Ranil Wickremesinghe to establish a Committee to go into all appointments and/or replacements of Heads of State sector organisations is a sound one indeed that would ensure merit over anything else to be the criterion in all such selections.

It would also ensure an independent assessment of the capabilities and competence of the prospective candidates usually recommended by the Minister concerned. Presently all such appointments are made based on affiliations to the Ministers/politicians concerned and/or personal loyalty. Needless to say, this is hardly the recipe for efficiency or progress.

Earlier, former President Gotabaya Rajapaksa too appointed such a body to vet selections to top posts in the State Sector including Ministry Secretaries. However, this only proved to be a cosmetic exercise, with mostly square pegs in round holes placed in important positions. The Public Service was packed with retired military officers with no inkling of the subjects they were entrusted to oversee, and hand-picked Viyath Maga followers, who proffered wrong and hasty advice that is at least partly responsible for the present crisis.

The mammoth losses suffered by 52 State Sector ventures as detailed in our editorial yesterday shows to what extent inefficiency and mismanagement had led to this state of affairs. Needless to say, the appointment of misfits, toadies and yes men to top bureaucratic positions in the State Sector spelled ruin for these bodies for which the country is paying a heavy price today. This is because loyalty took precedence over skills and ability with the rulers doing as they please.

It is well known that in most State Sector bodies under the last Government, friends and relatives of the ruling clan ruled the roost, drawing fat salaries and giving nothing in return. Many a State body was run to the ground due to such thoughtless acts.

The new Committee, it is hoped, would ensure that the right man/woman is appointed for the job and merit alone would be the criterion in all such selections. The country has been brought to its knees by the callous decisions of the rulers in making illadvised appointments to responsible positions in Government. Not just in State bodies, but all appointments to top posts should be guided by merit and ability including postings to our foreign missions.

The newspapers are full of accounts of the doings of a so-called diplomat to a powerful Western nation during an earlier presidency which brought shame and dishonour to the country. We can do without such types and only the very best from among our career diplomats should be appointed for posting to important countries.

According to the news item on the appointment of the Committee, any appointment as Head of a State Corporation, Statutory Board or a State-Owned Enterprise (SOE) should first have the approval of the Committee. Similarly removal or replacements of serving Heads of such bodies too should receive the approval of the Committee, in case the Ministers wish to make such changes.

This would also ensure that no arbitrary decision is taken by a new Minister to remove the serving Head of a Government body that will come under him or her (new Minister), who could then be replaced by the Minister's favourite, sometimes unjustly.

The decision taken by the President to ensure tight control of expenditure in all State Sector organisations too is a positive step and would lead to a drastic reduction of waste and profligacy in Government spending. Especially the abuse of official vehicles and renting out of vehicles by Heads of Government bodies when there are vehicles already available in the pool should come under the sharp scrutiny of the Presidential Secretariat.

Also the move taken to hold the Heads of Departments accountable for any overspending too is a good one and will act as a deterrent against splashing around as most State Sector organisations do at present. In fact, under the Yahapalanaya too there was a similar move to hold to account the Heads of Government Departments responsible for excess spending and in the case of recruitment above the required cadre, to get the Head of Department to pay such salaries out of his/her own pocket. It is not known what became of this project.

It will also be a sound move to get all Heads of State Sector organisations to give an account of their performances during a given period of time and if found wanting, they should be replaced pronto. Today, it is known that with a very few exceptions Heads of State bodies are warming their seats while drawing fat salaries. A progress report of the work performed should be demanded periodically from all Chairpersons and Directors.

Private sector organisations are run efficiently and profitably because such requirements are mandatory and those who fall back on the job invariably get fired, perhaps on the spot. The problem with the State sector is that the Head of the State body concerned more often than not is a stooge of the Minister or another top politician and is invariably protected. This is why the Committee appointed to oversee appointments should be extra vigilant.

BALANCING ACT TO PROTECT SOVEREIGNTY AND FRIENDSHIP

rime Minister Dinesh Gunawardena stressed that Sri Lanka's biggest asset is its strategic location and the prime interest of the Government is to keep the Indian Ocean as a Zone of Peace for free commercial navigation. The country has no interest whatsoever to get involved in regional or international power games. Sri Lanka treats every nation as a friend, while zealously guarding the sovereignty and independence of the country.

In his first interview to a foreign news service, Prime Minister Gunawardena told Tomomi Asano of the Japanese newspaper Yomiuri Shimbun that since ancient times the ports in Sri Lanka were popular with commercial vessels of the traders and the country continued to provide facilities to vessels from all corners of the world. Even today, vessels of many countries call on Sri Lankan ports and occasionally there are Naval crafts calling on for replenishments, joint military exercises or on friendly calls. During all these Sri Lanka strictly maintains the condition that such visits are not directed against the interests of a third country as Sri Lanka strictly adhere to its policy of neutral-

This policy has displayed its practicality once again, when there were some apprehensions about the entry of Chinese satellite tracking ship Yuan Wang 5 to Hambantota Port and those fears were smoothened by frank discussions with all the parties concerned.

Though the permission was given in June 2022 for the vessel to enter the Port on August 11 and remain until 16th, Sri Lanka requested for its deferment as it was essential to sort out reasons with India and the United States regarding their expressed concerns. The positive outcome of high level official consultations resulted in solving those issues and then it was intimated to China that the vessel could enter Hambantota Port on

August 16. The talks succeeded as there is a very good understanding between Sri Lanka and its immediate neighbour India as well as the United States.

The friendship and cooperation with India was further stressed when Vice Chief of the Indian Navy Vice Admiral SN Ghormade came to Colombo earlier this week to hand over a maritime surveillance Dornier aircraft to the Sri Lankan Navy. The aircraft was provided to Sri Lanka from the inventory of the Indian Navy to help the country meet its immediate security requirement. The Indian Navy has already provided extensive training to a team from Sri Lanka Navy and the Air Force to operate the maritime surveillance aircraft.

Indian media, quoting highly placed defence source, said, "Sri Lanka has been a key partner of India and we will continue to expand our bilateral defence cooperation in the months and years to come." The source added that the participation of President Ranil Wickremesinghe at the handing-over ceremony, was a clear signal about expanding strategic ties between the two countries. India will provide to Sri Lanka two Dornier aircraft which were being manufactured by the Government-owned aerospace major Hindustan Aeronautics Limited

At the handing-over ceremony President Wickremesinghe thanked India for gifting a Dornier aircraft to enhance Sri Lanka Navy's maritime surveillance capabilities and bolster the India-Sri Lanka defence ties. He said that history has brought both nations together like two sides of the same coin and the two countries must forge ahead together. "This is the start

of cooperation between our Air Force, Navy and Indian Navy in maritime surveillance."

The aircraft will be flown and maintained by 15 Sri Lanka Air Force crew who were specifically trained in India for four months. The team consists of pilots, observers, engineering officers and technicians. They will be supervised by the Indian technical team attached to the Sri Lanka Air Force. The team would undertake comprehensive supervision of aircraft, airframe, aircraft support equipment, ground support equipment, and relevant documents and would ascertain the serviceability of all the assets.

Indian defence sources said it was significant that the Dornier was handed over to Sri Lanka a day before a high-tech Chinese satellite tracking ship docks at Hambantota Port.

The world's attention to foreign vessels and aircraft entering Sri Lanka in the last few days did not limit to the Chinese vessel and Indian aircraft. Pakistan's newly-commissioned Chinese-built frigate PNS Taimur docked at the Colombo Port on last Friday for a couple of days and a section of Indian media inaccurately reported that the vessel took part in Sri Lanka-Pakistan joint 'war games'.

Immediately Sri Lanka Navy rejected the fallacious media reports that it was holding war games with a Pakistani warship docked at the Colombo Port but confirmed that it would hold a "Passage Exercise" in the Western seas with PNS Taimur as it leaves the port. Sri Lanka allowed PNS Taimur to make a port call in Colombo while on its way to join the Pakistan Navy fleet after the Bangladesh Government denied it permission to dock at Chattogram Port as August is a month

of mourning for Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina as her father, Sheikh Mujib-ur-Rehman was assassinated on August 15, 1975.

Indian defence analysts are of the opinion that there was no need for India to worry about the entry of Chinese ships to ports in South Asia. Two analysts, Sameer Patil and Don McLain Gill argued that the unfolding situation may impede China's intent to increase its regional strategic influence and power projection. In an article in Diplomat magazine, they argued that critical indicators of the strategic influence of an extra-regional power lie in its ability to sustain bilateral military exercises and operationalize defence cooperation with regional states.

"While China has emerged as a major arms exporter to the region (primarily Pakistan, Bangladesh and Myanmar), it has not been able to expand military exchanges and other facets of defence cooperation with South Asian states," Patil and Gill said in a joint write-up.

Citing India's growing material capabilities and its geographic proximity, the regional experts said most South Asian states too have found it prudent to not overtly engage in actions with extra-regional states that may directly upset the regional balance of power. "Therefore, China's attempts to convert its growing presence into strategic influence to offset India's leadership role in the region received a setback." they said.

Prime Minister Dinesh Gunawardena emphasized the importance of ties with India last week. "The deep, long-standing ties between our two countries have promoted our common strategies for development and enriched our cultures", he said in a letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the occasion of India's 75th Independence Anniversary last Monday. "We are also bound by the common beliefs of peace, harmony and solidarity of the region and world at large," he said.

Our strong partnership – built on the foundation of shared democratic values has never been more important, Prime Minister Gunawardena said and assured, "We look forward to continued close cooperation to build better, safer and more prosperous lives for the peoples of our two countries."



PRESIDENT RANIL WICKREMESINGHE'S INTERVIEW WITH THE ECONOMIST

ALL-PARTY GOVERNMENT, SPRINGBOARD FOR ECONOMIC RECOVERY

President Ranil Wickremesinghe explains how he plans to help Sri Lanka's recovery in an interview with The Economist in Colombo on August 14, 2022.

Excerpts from the interview:

The Economist: Thank you very much for taking the time to see us, Mr. Wickremesinghe. The last time we were here was three weeks ago, when it was obvious that this was a country in crisis. We got in last night and the vibe has changed tremendously. It's visible on the street, on the way in from the airport. What has happened since July 21st to have caused that change?

Ranil Wickremesinghe: Firstly, I think people wanted law and order. A lot of people are losing out... employed people couldn't go to work. They had complaints about the Government, but when President Gotabaya [Rajapaksa, Mr. Wickremesinghe's predecessor] left, they were willing to give us another chance.

The election of the President went constitutionally, Parliament voted, and has taken on the existing Cabinet so that we can call for an All-Party Government, with people from outside within the committee system. We will devise some new mechanisms for that. People know that we are going in for a tough time. And they want to get out of it as soon as possible. Even those that supported the Aragalaya [the protest movement], from about the end of May, they were getting tired of [the chaos]. And they didn't expect the violence that took place on the 9th and the 13th.

TE: Concretely though, there's obviously more fuel in the country, the QR code system seems to be a big success, the fuel gueues have vanished. There are more cars and auto rickshaws on the street. What steps have been taken in the past three weeks to have changed the mood of the country?

RW: Well, first, we had to tackle the fuel issue. Second was the fact that we were reaching out to everyone. Even peaceful protesters in the Aragalaya were welcomed. We are willing to establish people's assemblies to look at all the changes to be made. The new standing order for oversight committees makes room for four youth representatives. And they can ask questions, with the permission of the chairman. And while they can't subscribe to the report, they can have their views recorded in it. And the Parliament itself is grappling with ensuring that all the parties in the all-party administration can work together.

TE: You've said it's very important to you to form that kind of Government. What's so important about it? And what makes it problematic?

RW: Well there's a big crisis here. So how do we even get parties to work together? I've taken the lead in pushing the 22nd Amendment [to reduce the powers of the Executive Presidency], which is what they all wanted. So we will bring that in. And then you can set a new study for a new constitution, if they want.

I brought that together with the select committee, the oversight committee system, plus a new National Council, modelled on something like the European Council. Also, we will try to get behind a common minimum programme so that the Government knows that we have party support. Other issues can be discussed regularly, once a month.

That's to get the party leaders in. I said that I'm willing to have some of the chairmen of the oversight committees invited to Cabinet as and when necessary.

TE: What have been the obstacles in setting up this All-Party Government?

RW: We're only in discussions and every party is now in different groups. It's not merely a question of parties, but groups and their point of view. The responsibility for the country coming out of the crisis lies with Parliament. I refer even the IMF proposals to Parliament. If anyone has better proposals, certainly we look at them. Otherwise we have to go ahead with what we have.

TE: You've been very honest in recent weeks about how difficult it's going to be, and what needs to happen to reduce the deficit and get back to a primary surplus, to reduce Government debt. In terms of concrete steps, legislative priorities on economic policy, what are some of the things you need to tackle first?

RW: We need a public-finance bill on the new taxes, then on Stateowned enterprises [SOEs]. My idea is to do a deep cut and make a legislative framework for a highly com-

petitive export-oriented economy, and then ensure the recovery takes off by 2024. It's not worth dragging this out.

Take a deep cut, but ensure that you can get recovery going so...

TE: What do you mean by deep cut?

RW: So that when you make changes, make it deep, make all the changes you have to make and then allow it to come up. Thailand did that but Thailand only had a banking crisis, they didn't have a budget crisis. We have both but I am confident we can somehow make it through.

TE: What does it mean in practice to say that you want to establish the legislative framework for a competitive econ-

RW: Firstly, budgetary. You take the fiscal and monetary steps to get your deficit down. At the same time you have to look at the legislative steps that are necessary to build a highly competitive, export-oriented economy. We did this back in 1977 when I was in the Cabinet. We brought in legislation to open up the

TE: So can you give us two or three examples, for the short term, for the budget, on income tax, VAT, SOEs?

RW: You will have to raise taxes, you will have to tax capital, tax wealth. The tax net has to be widened. And that will bring some of the lost revenue. By about the middle of next year, we'll have the same, or we'll even go beyond the tax net we had in 2018.

TE: You've also mentioned you want Sri Lanka to be not just upper-middleincome but upper income in 25 years. What are some of the things you need to do now to make that happen?

RW: That's a question about how do you open up? Before that, we've got to handle the whole issue of banks. We are looking now at disposing of some State assets, which will give us about \$ 2bn-3bn. That's the groundwork. Then to open up we have some of the reports we used in 2018-19 that you could implement, but basically integrate yourself with the region. In South Asia itself I can't see very much regional integration. So we will look at closer relations with ASEAN [Association of South-East Asian Nations] and RCEP [Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement, an Asian trade pact].

TE: Apart from Sri Lankan Airlines, what are some of the marquee SOEs that could be privatised?

RW: Well, you can sell Sri Lanka Insurance, there's Telecoms. What we do with the Petroleum Corporation is another question.

TE: So open up the petroleum market to other players?

RW: Yes, we'll open up investments, but we have to talk to all holders of concessions because some have been running for over 40 years. Laws governing the offshore economy also need to change. We're looking at Ireland as a model for that.

TE: What are some of the immediate laws you're going to bring in?

RW: A law similar to US Chapter 11 bankruptcy is one of the most immediate. The rest are about economic stability. We've also got some additional powers for the next year and a half to tackle the situation.

TE: You mentioned a few laws that you said you're going to bring into Parlia-

ment. That's what I was referring to. **RW:** Well this process will go on into 2024, company law has to be amended, a whole lot of commercial laws, we are looking at ease of doing business. So that means cutting through so many regulations. There are so many laws for how to operate even a basic item-there are so many authorities running by themselves. I'm also looking at the BOI [Board of Investment], we have to look at the overall investment effort of Sri Lanka. I'm not satisfied with it. The money we put in we haven't gotten back. So I suppose in one way this is a disaster, but it's also an opportunity to create something new, like we did in 1977.

TE: How much are the things that you were just talking about part of the demands from the International Monetary Fund, and how much goes beyond that?

RW: The demand is actually always tabulated for the four-year agreement. So we have to go ahead with that. That'll be the base for the restructuring, and then we'll be able to build on that.

TE: With some of the things you're talking about, it sounds like you're not just dealing with the immediate situation, but ensuring that Sri Lanka has a strong foundation.

RW: A strong foundation. And we won't be around then, but we'll become an upper-income country

TE: You said that the IMF agreement, which was supposed to come in August, is probably only going to be in September?

RW: We've been discussing, there are about three items that have been finalised, the team is coming, then you're also picking up the discussions with Lazard and Clifford Chance [Sri Lanka's financial and legal advisers]. The problem is that the disturbances of July pushed back the time for this to go ahead.

TE: And then what does the timeline look like from September?

RW: If we can get the board agreement, then we can get at some of the other organisations' advance and get us some money until the tranche comes through. But more than that, it will inspire investor confidence. We speak to some other countries, too. The main issue thereafter is debt sustainability. First, we have to tackle this with the major official donors, then for the first time, you'd have to go to the London Club [of private creditors].

TE: What will determine whether the agreement happens?

RW: There are some outstanding issues. Debt sustainability, the criteria we have given, some of the incentives of taxation.

TE: You've been very complimentary in the press about India's assistance. How sympathetic have the other bilateral creditors been?

RW: Many of them are but they're saying first go to the IMF. They felt that Sri Lanka just allowed this crisis to happen. I think there will be more assistance once we get the IMF

TE: Are you encouraged by the agreement between China and Zambia? RW: Yes, but it's for a low-income

model, and we are in a middleincome country.

TE: Moving on from economics, there's been a lot in the Indian press in the last couple of weeks, not only about the Chinese ship that is supposed to dock at Hambantota but also the Pakistani ship that's supposed to dock or has docked in Colombo. Now Sri Lanka obviously cannot entirely align itself with one or another big Asian power. But how do you manage that balance of competing interests from big powerful neighbours?

RW: It's becoming more difficult now, especially after Ukraine and the agreement between Russia and China. You could see the pressure building up on the European side.

And in particular my worry is that this rivalry can come into the Indian Ocean. We've so far kept out the power rivalry from the Indian Ocean. But I think we have to face up to that situation and work with everyone. Sri Lanka, of course, has a special relationship with India where we have to look after each other's interests. But most countries in the Indian Ocean want to stay out of the power rivalry. So we have to be clear about that and say what our policies

TE: So you think the rhetoric we see in the Pacific and the South China Sea, you think the Indian Ocean is perhaps the next venue for that sort of thing?

RW: You don't want that to happen. For instance, now, Nancy Pelosi on her own has created a crisis [in Taiwan]. I don't think the US Government has been happy, but they had to back her up. We don't want any of that happening here. We see India as the net security provider in the area. And then all other countries can also be present as long as it doesn't lead to rising tensions or increase the rivalry between states.

TE: Are there lessons for other countries in how you're handling this?

RW: There'll be something to learn from what we have done and from what we haven't done.

TE: In the past few months Western publications have written that Sri Lanka could be the first of many countries to default. In the same vein, given the conditions of 2022, what lessons do you think there are for other countries to avoid some of the same mistakes made in the past few months and years economically?

RW: There are many lessons. For instance, you can't subsidise items every day, you will run out of money. Second, the balance of trade. That's the big issue for all of us, because we have greater disadvantages on the balance of trade compared to bigger economies like China and India. We have people leaving the country. We have to put our economy in order to attract investment, but for different reasons: the reason to go to Bangladesh is quite different from the reason to come to Sri Lanka. What I've learnt is that for the smaller economies in the region, you want to go to the IMF on time, be careful about the foreign debt that you run up. Basically Governments have to make hard decisions if they want to prevent default.

TE: On the subject of making the economy more competitive, who do you see as your peers, or indeed your influences or competitors?

RW: We would like to be like Singapore, but let's start by emulating the standard of Thailand, Malaysia and Vietnam.

TE: In terms of what you were talking about earlier, making decisions to make the economy more competitive, cutting the debt and deficit, all of these are going to be painful decisions. How do you intend to take Sri Lankans with you after this period of political unrest?

RW: You have to be honest about what is happening, and how much money are you setting aside for the vulnerable people? I mean, people realise it's bad, they just want to get out of it, you can assure them that you can get out quickly then it'll be harder for a time. But get them out quickly is what we have to do, and there is hope. And you can't just reject what the Government does if you can't offer a solid alternative.

TE: But how will you deal with it if there's renewed hostility or protests once people realise just how bad things are and how hard they're going to get?

How much do you worry about that? RW: I worry especially on food. People need food, we don't want them to go hungry. The middle class was expanding and now we've got to make cuts in their living standards, with people who were above the poverty line falling below it, we have to give support to them in the shortest possible time. We have to dispose of some State assets and have that money in our reserves.

TE: But it's a hard message, isn't it? I mean, after everything over the past six months, 12 months, to tell people, "You know what, things are going to be even tougher now for a little while"?

RW: People know that, I mean, basically, we tell them the truth, tell them that we are going through a hard time.

TE: What's your experience been when telling people about this?

RW: I've been losing some elections.

TE: With SOE restructuring, in particular, the unions have been very hostile. **RW:** I don't worry about unions, what matters is people. People are going to stand it if they think things can get better.

TE: One of the things the previous Government did was pretend things were not so bad. And of course, people are not idiots. They knew things were bad, and they came on to the street. Is it perhaps

a hope that by being honest to people by saying, "Look, I'm going to level with you, this is what's happening," that will persuade them that there's no point protesting, because that's just what things

RW: I hope so. And also we are looking at other political issues, at getting in the changes to the system that they want, to discuss those, to open up the political system.

TE: You've started to develop quite warm relationships with the military. That's not really something that people have been used to about you, can you talk us through that?

RW: I don't have warm relations with the military at all. As President and Minister of Defence I have certain functions. The only time that I did something out of the way was to give those certificates to the air mobile battalion that safeguarded Parliament. Tomorrow I'm going to the handing over of the Dornier aircrafts by the Indians to us in the National Defence College, as the President. And the air mobile battalion is something I started in 1993. So I was quite happy to be amongst them. I go to the Security Council, which I have to do once a week. Other than that, some of the events I'm going to are just ones the President has to attend.

TE: So you wouldn't say there's been any change in your relationship with the military?

RW: No, just that one time I gave certificates to the people who protected Parliament. If the Parliament went, there would have been chaos in the country. And I wanted to give a message that the soldiers have done their duty. Now the MPs must do their duty too.

TE: The Dornier thing tomorrow is really interesting because again, it's Sri Lanka doing this balancing act. On the one hand there's this ship in Colombo, there's that ship in Hambantota and then the President is going and accepting surveillance aircraft from the Indians. Am I interpreting this correctly as balancing?

RW: We have been involved with India in the Colombo dialogue on the maritime security of this area. And this is a part of extending the Sri Lankan reach by having maritime surveillance aircraft. The Dornier is being given by India to train our people but we've been working alongside them. The problem now is the shortage of fuel. Our Navy has not been able to operate at full capacity. There's a similar operation that we are carrying on with Australians on the boat people. We are intercepting a large number every week, I go to the Defence Ministry when people come in, it's 40, 50, 60 people every week who try to get from here to Australia. So, we are working with

both India and Australia. TE: Why did you decide to keep the Defence Ministry as part of your portfo-

RW: The Defence Ministry is basically held by the President and I took it over so that we could stabilise and establish law and order. But I think we also have to make a lot of changes in the defence structure. And we are talking about defence [in] 2030, and have it embedded from then onwards. It's a part of the restructuring and

modernisation we have to do. TE: So what are the defence priorities

for Sri Lanka? **RW:** Firstly, to help the Police, civil power to maintain security here. Secondly, we are looking and then working with India, Australia on the maritime side. But we are also looking outward, we are in Mali now and expanding our role in the UN Peacekeeping Forces. In Mali we're doing quite well. So we can expand that, see if we have a future there. But we also have to contain the defence budget.

TE: On the defence budget, that's one of the possible areas where you might need to make cuts. How are you going to do that?

RW: I think that's for the Secretary of Defence and the others to work

TE: On the subject of terrorism, one of the things you said while you were Prime Minister is about asking British Intelligence to do a full proper inquiry about the 2019 Easter bombings.

RW: Yes, British Intelligence is involved in these inquiries about the Easter bombings. There are so many issues that have been raised. And we are talking to the UK to get help to do a final review. We don't have their theories of what's happening.

TE: So the idea is to do an authoritative final one and put that to rest? RW: Yes.

TE: Just to go back to the adjustments in the negotiation process with the IMF. So vou're going to resume negotiations at the end of the month. And then hoping to get the staff level agreement sometime in September? And how is that going? Are you already speaking to the various creditors, bilateral, private etc? RW: We're talking to official credi-

tors. I will be writing to the private creditors, maybe some time this

RW: We're informing them on the situation. TE: Do you have a prediction to make:

TE: And what are you asking them to

at what point does Sri Lanka return to, say, 2018 levels of prosperity? What can Sri Lankans look forward to? **RW:** Maybe about 2024, 2025?

Initially we thought 2024 but it looks like 2023 is going to be a bad year globally, so it can be 2024, 2025.

TE: And for Sri Lankans, will 2023 be a better or a worse year than 2022?

RW: I would say the beginning will be tough. But the ending will be better, we're trying to reduce the period of pain. If the revenue keeps coming in, we'll know in the next three months, then the end will be better.

TE: Are remittances picking up? **RW:** A little. But it may get better next year, and there's the prospect of tourism returning too. We're trying to get the tourists starting this winter and prices will be cheap. But from next year onwards, we have to get the summer and the winter. This year, the attraction will be prices. I hope that prices won't be the attraction next year.

TE: To come back to our very first question, what are the concrete steps you took between coming in and now for things here in Colombo to at least look like they have improved?

RW: It's picking up now because with all the turbulence economic activity could not take place. Those economic activities are now taking place. We've had quite big festival crowds, people are feeling free and they're moving around. So they are feeling quite relaxed, more secure. But the turbulence was here. What happened here was originally very nice. I mean, young people protesting, saying the President has to go home. But at some stage they got taken over, they got pushed out. And many of them have spoken to me because they could not take on the more violent crowds. So we restored order here, and we've closed that place. We are now preparing another place where young people can go. maybe in a month's time hope that

we can get it ready. TE: As in, a designated protest site? RW: Yeah for anyone, people who want to come and perform, similar

to the site they had here earlier in April and early May. TE: In the initial days after you became

President, we met some of those people in front of the building here. They were convinced that you were somehow representing or protecting the Rajapaksas. How do you deal with that sort of perception amongst these people?

RW: I worked with President [Chandrika] Kumaratunga, I contested in the previous election [in 1999]. And in the [2001] election, I won Parliament so we worked together for two years, then the whole thing came apart. Next time I went along with President [Maithripala] Sirisena, who was from another party but we carried him through. We had our own problems. So I have a habit of working with Presidents who are on the other side when the situation arises. And there are some ministers who have done the same thing from both sides. And I came in because the situation was so bad, and we had to handle it economically. And I was not even the first choice, they offered it to Sajith Premadasa, the Leader of the Opposition. He didn't want to take it, so I came in and tried from that time to bring about a broader based Government.

TE: Some of the laws you're going to bring to Parliament are going to cause a lot of pain for people. Are you confident you can push them through?

RW: We have already said that if you don't want the IMF, you must come up with alternative plans.

TE: Do you foresee at some point in the 2020s or perhaps the 2030s a future President Rajapaksa? **RW:** I can't speak of the future.

TE: Did you think you'd become Presi-

RW: I didn't think that my house would be burnt, so, you know... TE: Was it a fair exchange, do you

think? RW: No.

TE: Do you feel that still—you're strong politically, but emotionally?

RW: Of course you feel it when you go home and you don't have books to read, or music to listen to.

TE: Mr. Wickremesinghe, thank you very much for your time.

35% spike in COVID-19 deaths in 4 weeks - WHO Chief

Monkeypox cases jumped 20% last week across 92 countries

SWITZERLAND: Deaths linked to COVID-19 reported globally have increased by 35 per cent in the last one month, said World Health Organisation (WHO) Chief Dr. Tedros Ghebreyesus in the latest briefing on COVID-19 and Monkeypox.

With the pandemic in its third year, it has been repeated multiple times by leaders and experts that the world has to learn to live with COVID-19. But in a warning against dropping guards, the WHO Chief said that this does not mean that "we pretend it's not there". "It means we use all the tools we have to protect ourselves, and protect others," he said.
"We're all tired of this virus, and tired of the

pandemic. But the virus is not tired of us," the World Health Organisation chief further said.

Omicron remains the dominant variant and, in the last one month, BA.5 sub-variant represented more than 90% of sequences.

"None of us is helpless. Please get vaccinated if you're not, and get a booster (dose) if you need it. Wear mask and maintain social distancing," the

WHO Chief urges in the video. "We cannot live (with the virus) with 15,000 deaths a week. We cannot live with mounting hospitalisations. We can't live with inequitable access of vaccines," the WHO Chief said in a desperate appeal.

The world has reported over 59 crore cases since the start of the pandemic and over 64 lakh deaths. The United States has reported a majority of these cases (over 9.3 crore), followed by India (around 4.4 crore).

Meanwhile, the WHO Chief also said that more than 35,000 cases of Monkeypox have now been reported from 92 countries and territories, with almost 7,500 cases being registered last week - a 20 per cent increase.

Ghebreyesus said there has been a total of 12 Monkeypox-related deaths across the world so far. Ghebreyesus's statement comes even as Bavarian Nordic A/S, the only company with an approved vaccine for Monkeypox, said it's no longer certain it can meet demand as cases continue to rise across the world. - THE HINDUSTAN TIMES



UKRAINE ACCUSES RUSSIA OF LAUNCHING MISSILES FROM BELARUSIAN AIRSPACE

UKRAINE: Russian President Vladimir Putin and Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko held their own meeting on Saturday at Putin's summer residence near St. Petersburg, where they discussed increasing weapons shipments to Belarus, including nuclear weap-

The barrage of missiles struck a wide swath of territory as Ukrainian forces struggled to hold on to the eastern city of Lysychansk, Kyiv's last foothold against a Russian onslaught in the Luhansk region.

A military base near the western Ukrainian town of Yavoriv was hit by four Russian missiles fired from the Black Sea, regional governor Maksym Kozytskyv said. He said two other missiles were intercepted. Details of casualties were not immediately known, but at least 35 people were killed in a similar attack on Yavoriv in March. Missile strikes were also reported on Chernihiv and Zhytomyr in the north, with a total of 48 missiles launched, according to Ukrainian presidential adviser Mykhailo Podolyak.

Ukraine charged that the strikes from Belarusian airspace reflected a deliberate effort by the Kremlin to "draw Belarus into the war in Ukraine as a direct partic-

Belarus's Lukashenko is a long-standing and loyal ally of Putin, and allowed Russian troops and materiel to remain in his country after joint exercises in February. Those troops, tanks and other equipment were then used in Moscow's invasion of Ukraine. - TIMES OF INDIA

BOOK SALES FOR RUSHDIE'S THE SATANIC VERSES SURGE AFTER STABBING

RUSHDIE ATTACKER SAYS HE IS 'SURPRISED' AUTHOR SURVIVED - NEW YORK POST

US: Book sales for Sir Salman Rushdie's novel The Satanic Verses have surged after the author was stabbed at an event in the US last week.

The contentious 1988 book rose to number eight on Amazon's chart of most-sold fiction books of the week and was sold out by other booksellers. The sales spike appeared to be somewhat driven by readers showing solidarity with Sir Salman, who has been the target of death threats for decades including a fatwa, over the book.

INDIA: Actress Jacqueline Fernandez, who was on Wednesday named as an accused in the charge sheet filed by the Enforcement Directorate in a multi-crore money laundering case linked to alleged conman Sukesh Chandrashekhar and others, shared a post on her social media page saying she will remain "strong" in these testing times.

The federal probe agency filed the fresh (Second Supplementary) charge sheet or prosecution complaint in this case on Wednesday before a special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court in Delhi and, according to sources, the Actress has been arraigned in it as an accused.

While Fernandez didn't directly comment on the case, she re-shared an anonymous motivational quote on her Instagram stories. "Dear me, I deserve all good things, I'm powerful, I accept myself. It'll all be ok. I'm strong, I'll achieve my goals and dreams. I can do it (sic)," read the post. The 36-year-old Actress, known for films such as "Kick", "Bhoot Police" and most recently "Vikrant Rona", is the only accused named in the latest charge sheet. She has been questioned multiple times by the ED in this case, the last being in June. Fernandez, a Sri Lanka national, debuted in the Hindi film industry in 2009. - ZEE NEWS

MADHUBALA GETS RELIEF AFTER YEARS OF DENTAL PAIN

PAKISTAN: Madhubala, a 16-year-old elephant in Pakistan suffering for years from a dental infection and pain caused by a broken tusk, finally got relief on Wednesday after undergoing treatment while under unique standing sedation. Madhubala is one of four African ele-

phants being treated in Karachi by an eightmember team from global animal welfare group Four Paws, which in 2020 relocated Kaavan - an elephant dubbed the world's loneliest - to Cambodia from Islamabad. Named after a legendary Indian actress,

Madhubala's eyes were taped shut, her legs tied to side-grills to support her during sedation and the subsequent treatment at the Karachi Zoo.

The veterinarians had to use drills and other heavy surgical tools to extract the infected tusk which came out in bits and

INSEE breaks ground for USD 3 mn warehouse at H'tota Port Industrial Park

INSEE Cement began construction of their mega capacity warehouse within the industrial park in Hambantota International Port (HIP) last week.

The US\$ 3 million investment by INSEE will be the largest warehousing facility inside a port in Sri Lanka for raw materials used in the production of cement. The warehouse which will see completion in the next 6 months will hold a capacity of 45,000 cubic metres and is being built on a 17,300 sq metre plot of land. Johnson Liu, CEO of HIPG and Nandana Ekanayake Chairman/

Chief Executive Officer of INSEE were chief guests at the groundbreaking ceremony, which was held at the warehouse site. The CEO of HIPG said, "INSEE was the port's first bulk cargo customer since inception and the largest volume contributor."

"We have always had a win-win collaboration with INSEE where they could increase their volumes owing to the high-quality service we offer and help streamline their local supply chain, while contributing to the largest dry bulk volumes handled by the port. This new investment by INSEE in

HIP's industrial park is proof of their trust in us, as well as being a commitment to meet the demands of the local industry."

Chairman/CEO of INSEE Nandana Ekanayake, said, "Hambantota Port is a vital link in our raw material supply chain. INSEE has been using this port since 2018 and so far, we have cleared around 1.7 million tons of bulk cargo through the port, of which we did a little over 1 million in 2021."

"Today, we laid this foundation as another step to strengthen our partnership with HIPG and it is a part of our commitment when we

signed the 10-year lease agreement with the port, to construct this 100,000 square foot warehouse for slag. We see great potential in developing channels through HIP and we will double our investment in the future."

Once it is completed, it will be used to store shipments of cement raw material arriving at the Hambantota International Port and later be transferred to INSEE's production plant. The modern construction of the warehouse is geared to store the raw material in safe environmentally friendly

Sampath Bank posts Rs 7.1 bn PAT, Rs. 9 bn PBT

Despite the prevailing economic turmoil, Sampath Bank posted a commendable PAT of Rs 7.1 billion and PBT of Rs. 9 billion for the period ended 30th June 2022, reflecting a minor increase of 0.3% and slight decrease of 5.5% respectively compared to the figures declared in 1H 2021.

In the meantime, the Group declared a PAT of Rs 7.4 billion and PBT of Rs 9.6 billion, denoting a decline of 2% and 5.5% respectively over the first half of 2021. Total interest income increased by 41.1 % year on year to Rs 59.2 bn in the first half of 2022, compared to Rs 41.9 bn in the same period of the previous year. This significant increase in interest income is due to the upward trend in interest rates in the first half of 2022. The AWPLR at the end of the reporting period reached 22.62%, which is 1,711 bps higher than the rate reported on 30th June 2021.

Interest expenses increased by 22.6 %compared to the corresponding period of last year due to the rising interest trend. The

Bank's total interest expense was Rs 27.8 bn at the end of the current reporting period compared to Rs 22.7 bn reported in 1H 2021. The Bank recorded a significant increase of 69.9% in its net fee and commission income (NFCI) in 1H 2022 compared to the same period of the previous year. During the first half of 2022, net other operating income increased to Rs 16 bn, an unprecedented 378% increase compared to Rs 3.4 bn recorded in the corresponding period of the previous year. This was mainly due to the 80%

depreciation of the rupee against the US Dollar. Continuing to act prudently, the Bank recognised a total impairment charge of Rs 28.2 bn for 1H 2022 compared to Rs 5 bn reported in the corresponding period of last year, representing a 464% increase. In order to absorb the possible losses, the Bank decided to increase the allowance for overlay against the tourism sector customers. The Bank provided Rs7 bn against SLISBs and Rs 11.8 bn against SLDBs as at June 30,

Operating expenses for the first half of 2022 amounted to Rs 13.7 bn, a 24.3% increase from the Rs 11 Bn recorded for the first half of 2021. The primary reason for the increase in operating expenses was an increase in the inflation rate, which rose significantly during the first six month of 2022. Throughout 1H 2022, the Bank maintained all of its capital ratios well above the regulatory minimum requirements. The Bank maintained a strong position with regard to its capital ratios with sufficient buffers to absorb any shocks that may result from economic uncertainties. At the end of June 2022, Sampath Bank's total assets surpassed Rs. 1.3 tn, denoting an increase of Rs. 122 bn (annualized growth of 20.2%) from Rs 1.2 tn as of December 31, 2021.

Total advances grew by 29.7% (annualized) in 1H2022 to reach Rs 933 bn as at June 30, 2022, up from Rs 813 bn at the end of December 2021.

'Invigorating agriculture could save billions spent on food imports'

Having all the supportive agricultural base and having 25% of the country's people engaged in agriculture still the island has to resort to import food spending somewhere around USD 2.5 billion," affirmed Roshan Rajadurai addressing the Advocata Reset conference which concluded recently in Colombo

It is therefore evident that although one fourth of the population engaged in agriculture with supportive irrigation and riverine systems, the sector was still in a very bad state. Although paddy has been the staple crop with 1.8 million people engaged in paddy cultivation, if one looks at the figures paddy farmers were in eternal debt cycle. This was not only applicable to paddy but other crops as

Having all the advantages, the country's agricultural sector and workers were not thriving. This is evident with the cost of rice imports to Sri Lanka in 2020 exceeding Rs 2 billion. However, he noted that the inherent geographical topography climate and ecosystem of Sri Lankan land provided a favorable platform which can invigorate agriculture on which about 28% of the island's employed people were directly involved.

"More so 77% of our population is rural based and most of these agricultural holders or operators are in the region so by invigorating agriculture we can uplift the quality of life and the lifestyle of about two million of our population," he observed. Rajadurai also claimed that agriculture was important to Sri Lanka in terms of

The G20 has no permanent secretariat. The G20 representatives, referred to as "Sherpas," collaborate with the finance ministers and central bank governors to coordinate the timetable and activities. India recently said ex-NITI Aayog CEO Amitabh Kant would be the G20 Sherpa after Pivush Goval.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given leadership to the Indian representation at G20 summits since 2014. In a recent paper by the Observer Research Group, under the caption, "What will India's G20 presidency focus on,"

authored by SAMIR SARAN and JHANVI TRIPATHI, said:

"India's Presidency must leave the grouping with the agility and energy to respond to new realities. It must create a future-ready multilateralism through a novel and robust institutional architecture. India's, agenda must resonate beyond the one year it holds the presidency."

"Two major transformations will define our economies and societies going forward: the digital transition and the green transition. Both are key to addressing the development challenge as well. These transitions are the meeting point of geopolitical and youth aspirations that will dictate our political, economic, and social well-being.

On the digital front, India, to a large extent, has been a first mover. Indian youth aspirations are digital-first; the government has responded, and the digital economy is at the centre of its aim for a \$5-trillion economy by the second half of the 2020's.

The youth survey carried out by the Observer Research Foundation on tech policy found that 83% of respondents want India to adopt-policies that prioritise its domestic technology indus-

try. At the same time, 80% welcome greater cooperation with international partners on technology. An appropriate balance is needed where technological multilateralism does not come at the cost of the needs of developing countries.

India- G20 must also recognise the unprecedented carbonconstrained nature of future

growth. Arguments for a green transition can no longer be limited to the moral high ground of saving the planet.

India is ready to handle these challenges with diligence and for the well-being of the developing nations as an emerging global economy.

India also can, through its initiatives, resuscitate the ailing economies in the region and create a new economic order for the Asian region with the aim of uplifting not only India but the entire region as a global economic powerhouse.

Ranumi Eashwarage is a Canadian born swimmer of Sri Lankan origin. She is currently the fastest 12 years old female sprinter in Canada for her age in butterfly and freestyle. On July 10th, 2022, Ranumi engraved her name in Canadian record books with a new Alberta provincial age group record for the girls 12 and under 50m butterfly short course. That 50-butterfly time broke the previous record once was held by Tokyo 2020 Olympic silver medalist Rebecca Smith and after her, Canadian National team swimmer Kyla Leibel for the last eight years. This 12-year old's 50m butterfly time is faster than the current Sri Lankan woman' national record for this event of all ages.

"It's amazing. It was the last day of the meet. I was just trying to put in every bit of strength I had in me. I knew coming into this meet that with all the training I've had, I would set at least one new record- if not more", Ranumi said after the race.

With all her dedication and hard work, Ranumi was able to earn number 1 rank in all of Canada for 50m butterfly, 100m butterfly and 50m freestyle in both long course and short course for her age in 2021/2022 meets. Her amazing swim talents were first identified at the age of 6, when she surprised her parents by completing all the available swim levels in the city of Calgary for 5–12-year-olds. Then her parents signed her up for a swim club introducing competitive swimming and she never looked back.The 12-year-old rising star who was inspired by Michael Phelps for always practicing the hardest to become the best of the best. Her Sri Lankan born mother and father who graduated from Faculty of Engineering, University of Moratuwa said "It is hard to set a new record at this stage as the previous world class Canadian swimmers have already set up those records even tougher when they were young. Therefore, these records are not broken frequently. It was the moment that

we were hoping for. On the other hand, this is a sport that almost every Canadian child learns from a young age – So, holding the number-one- rank in Canada for an entire swimming season among thousands of same age swimmers is truly remarkable.

The 12-year-old sprinter had an incredibly successful season this year 2022, winning 50m, 100m butterfly and freestyle in each swim meet including Spring and Summer Provincial Championships. "She always came home with many podium finishes and aggregate winner awards", her parents further stated.

Additionally, Ranumi is keen on piano, saxophone, guitar, art, and public speaking. She can read, write, and fluently speak the Sinhala language although she was born and raised in Canada. Apart from the fluency in English and Sinhala, she is learning two other languages as well. Ranumi's motto: "Be yourself and be unique. Start where others have stopped."


