W HEREAS by section 2 of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the Government Gazette, to bring any town or village mentioned in the schedule thereto under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or village for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

Provided that paupers dying in the Government Civil Hospital shall be buried free of charge by the hospital contractor or servants under the direction of the cemetery-keeper. Provided also that on the production of a certificate signed by a minister of the Christian religion the senior officer of police, or any headman not lower in rank than a korala, the friends or relatives of a deceased person may be exempted from payment of the fees herein authorized for the digging of a grave, and the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

WHEREAS by sections 57 and 58 of "the Local Boards' Ordinance, 1898," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Board from time to time to make such by-laws as it may deem expedient for any of the purposes therein mentioned, provided that such by-laws shall not be of any force or effect until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, who is thereby empowered, with such advice, to confirm or disallow the same.

### Ordinance No. 13 of 1898.

By-law under Section 56.

The use of the nets called Katumasdel, Kumbiladel, Elanadel, and Nuldel is prohibited in any part of the lagoon and of the Kalutara river lying within the limits of the Local Board.

THE following rules framed by the Village Committee of Manmunai North, Manmunai South, Eruvil, Porativu, Karavaku, and Nindur, Sampanturai, and Akkarai pattu, in the District of Batticaloa, Eastern Province, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 24 of 1889, and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

1. All burials and cremations shall take place within a defined space or spaces set apart for the purpose by the Government Agent for each village.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to use for any other purpose the ground so set

apart

3. The Chairman of the Village Community will, if necessary, allot portions in each burial ground for the different communities in each village or group of villages, and it will be incumbent on each community to confine its burials and cremations to each such portion.
