GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. *Allowance.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. *New Entrants to the Public Service.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of New Entrants appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) New Entrants will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) They will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) The confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on their passing within specified periods of time graded proficiency tests in Sinhala, leading up to the level of the J. S. C. Standard. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of the increments falling due, until the passing of same. Any officer who does not pass the proficiency tests of the Junior School Certificate standards by the end of his period of probation/trial will be liable to have his services terminated.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempt from passing the proficiency tests in Sinhala as a prerequisite for confirmation.

(iv) They will also be required to pass an Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in appointment.

5. *Qualifications required.*—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(ii) A candidate for any post for which the minimum educational qualification prescribed is a pass in the Senior School Certificate examination or equivalent or higher examination shall have a pass in the Sinhala language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate examination or its equivalent if he is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium. (This requirement will not apply to those officers who are in the Public Service from a date prior to January 1, 1961, and who seek appointments to other posts in the Public Service.)

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. Such officers should in addition send a duplicate thereof direct to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, to reach him on or before the closing date. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of Departments should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

8. *Definition of Salary for the Purpose of Eligibility.*—Salary for purposes of eligibility means only the basic substantive salary and does not include any acting salary, allowance, &c.

ROYAL CEYLON AIR FORCE

Officer Vacancy—Technical (Signals) Branch

APPLICATIONS are invited for one Officer vacancy in the Technical (Signals) Branch of the Royal Ceylon Air Force.

2. The selected candidate will be granted a regular commission in the rank of Pilot Officer.

(The duties of an officer in the Technical (Signals) Branch apart from normal Air Force duties include those concerned with Radio Engineering with particular reference to airborne radio and radar, radio navigational aids, V. H. F. and H. F. communications, radar aids, radio tele-printers and land communications).

3. The selected candidate will be required to undergo training in Ceylon and abroad.

PAY AND ALLOWANCES :

4. For particulars of Pay and Allowances reference should be made to the Air Force Pay Code, 1961, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 12,395 of April 28, 1961 as amended from time to time.

(a) The Basic Pay applicable to the officers up to the rank of Squadron Leader is as follows :—

Pilot Officer—Non Cadet Entry Rs. 4,500 per annum.

Flying Officer—Rs. 4,860 per annum rising up to Rs. 5,580 per annum by two annual increments of Rs. 180 and one of Rs. 360.

Flight Lieutenant—Rs. 6,660 per annum rising up to Rs. 7,740 per annum by six annual increments of Rs. 180.

Squadron Leader—Rs. 8,820 per annum rising up to Rs. 9,900 per annum by six annual increments of Rs. 180.

(b) *Uniform Allowance* : On commissioning an allowance of Rs. 650 is granted for tropical outfit. On being posted overseas for duty or training purposes, a further outfit allowance of Rs. 1,300 will be granted. On completion of two years' service an allowance of Rs. 25 will be paid for maintenance of uniforms.

(c) *Other Allowances* : The cost of living allowance, Special Living Allowance and Rent Allowance will be paid at the Government rates.

5. Pensions/Gratuity are payable in terms of the Air Force Pensions and Gratuities Code, 1962, published in *Gazette* No. 13,301 of September 14, 1962, as amended from time to time. Permanent and Pensionable Service under the Crown or previous service in the Ceylon Defence Forces or any other Armed Service of the British Commonwealth will count for pension.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE :

6. The prospects and conditions of service of an officer of the Royal Ceylon Air Force are in terms of Royal Ceylon Air Force (Regular and Regular Reserve) Regulations published in *Gazette* No. 10,240 of April 27, 1951 as amended from time to time.

7. A single officer lives in the Officers' Mess and is provided with furnished accommodation, his food and batman service. During such period he will not be paid C. L. A. and S. L. A.

8. A married officer will be provided with Married Quarters (if available) and an allowance in lieu of personal batman.

9. Air Force Officers are liable to be posted for duty or training in any part of the world, at any time.

10. The selected candidate will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act No. 33 of 1950 and relevant amendments made to the Air Force Regulations.

BASIC REQUIREMENTS :

11. Applicants must possess the following requirements :—

(a) *Nationality* : Candidates must be citizens of Ceylon—

- (i) by descent, or
- (ii) by registration.

(b) *Age* : Candidates must not be more than 26 years of age on July 1, 1965.

(c) *Educational/Professional* : Candidates should provide satisfactory proof that they possess one of the following qualifications :—

- (i) A degree in Engineering or Science with Physics and/or Mathematics of a recognised University, or
- (ii) Should have passed the First Examination in Engineering, or Science (General or Special) of the University of Ceylon (with Mathematics and Physics) or
- (iii) Have passed the Intermediate Examination in Engineering or Science (with Mathematics and Physics) of the University of London, or
- (iv) Passed the Senior School Certificate with Pure and Applied Mathematics and Physics or G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) in six subjects including Pure and Applied Mathematics and Physics at one and the same sitting or have passes in the G. C. E. (Advanced Level) in Mathematics and Physics provided they hold in addition either the City and Guilds of London Institute, Intermediate Certificate in Telecommunications, Engineering or higher examination and the maintenance of V. H. F. and H. F. Transmitters and Receivers or Radar;
- (v) Any other qualification which in the opinion of the Commander of the Air Force is equivalent to any one of the above clauses (i to iv).

- (d) *Medical Standard* : Candidates must conform to Air Force Medical Standards (minimum height 5 ft. 4 ins., Chest 32 ins., Weight 105 lbs.)
- (e) Applicants must be unmarried and will not be permitted to marry for two years after the date of commission.
- Note.*—Officers will not be permitted to marry non-Ceylonese and marriage to non-Ceylonese may result in stoppage of promotions or withdrawal of commission.

INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANTS :

12. Applications should be made in the form appearing at para 19 of this notification. No printed copies of the form of application are available and applicants are required to prepare their own forms. Applications which are not in accordance with the prescribed form will be rejected.

13. Applications are to be addressed "The Commander of the Air Force, P. O. Box 594, Colombo", and the envelope is to be marked on the left hand top corner "Application Technical/Signals Branch—Officers". Applications will be accepted up to 12 noon on Saturday, August 28, 1965.

14. Applications should be accompanied by Copies of —

- (a) The applicant's Certificate of Birth ;
- (b) The Certificate of the Highest Educational/Professional qualification obtained ;
- (c) Certificates of character obtained from at least two responsible persons who are personally acquainted with the applicant;
- (d) Certificates in support of any claim made in the application.

15. Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Head of the Department concerned and bear a certificate to the effect that the officer can be released if selected.

SELECTION, INTERVIEWS, Etc. :

16. If on receipt of the application a candidate is found to possess the necessary qualifications as at para 11 and is considered suitable he will be instructed to appear at his own expense before a selection board at a specific place, date and time.

17. Those candidates considered suitable by the preliminary Selection Board will be examined by the Principal Medical Officer of the Air Force prior to presentation to the Final Selection Board.

18. The final selection will be made by a Board appointed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs. The candidate selected will be so informed by the Board and will be given an approximate date on which he will be commissioned.

2. Qualifications required.—

- (a) Every applicant must be—
- a citizen of Ceylon ;
 - not less than 18 years or more than 22 years of age on 31st August, 1965 ;
 - unmarried (Airmen will not be permitted to marry within two years of the date of enlistment)
- (b) Applicants should have passed the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) with a minimum of four (4) subjects.
- Applicants for Technical Trades should have passed in Mathematics. Preference will be given to candidates who have in addition passed in Physics, Chemistry and Applied Mathematics ;
 - Applicants for the trade of Clerk Accounting who are proficient in Book-keeping will be given preference ;
 - Applicants for the trade of Clerk General Duties who are proficient in Typewriting/ Shorthand in the Official Language will be given preference ;

(iv) Applicants for the trade of Male Nurse should have passed in Hygiene and Physiology. Preference will be given to candidates who have in addition passed in Chemistry and Physics ;

(v) Any candidate who has special skills or technical knowledge or other form of relevant training may, at the discretion of the Commander of the Air Force, be considered even though he may be lacking the requisite educational or age qualifications.

(c) *Medical Standard.*—Height 5 ft. 4 in. (Operations Ground—Height 5 ft. 6 in.) Chest 32 in. (unexpanded) and Weight 105 lb.

3. Conditions of Service.—

(a) Terms of Engagement :

(i) A candidate on final selection will be enlisted in the Regular Air Force and shall be required to serve for TWELVE YEARS of which FIVE YEARS will be Regular Air Force Service and SEVEN YEARS will be in the Regular Reserve. Good prospects are available for hardy men who are prepared to work day or night under very difficult conditions in any part of the country. Opportunities exist for suitable airmen to re-engage for further service, in order to qualify for pension, under the Air Force Pensions and Gratuities Code, 1962, published in *Government Gazette* No. 13,301 of 14th September, 1962, and as amended from time to time.

(b) Airmen will be governed by the Air Force Act (Chapter 359 of the Ceylon Legislative Enactments), Air Force Regulations and Orders.

(c) *Official Language Requirements.*—The selected candidates must conform to the Official Language Policy of the Ceylon Government.

(d) *Rates of Pay and Allowances.*—Pay and Allowances will be granted in accordance with the Air Force Pay Code, 1961, published in *Government Gazette* No. 12,305 of 28th April, 1961, and as amended from time to time.

4. Other Requirements.—

 - (i) certificate of registration of birth. (Baptismal certificate or certificates issued for the purpose of the Educational Code will not be accepted.);
 - (ii) certificates of the highest educational qualification;
 - (iii) testimonials referred to in paragraph 4 (d) above.

Note.—Originals of these certificates and testimonials should be produced when the applicant is called for an interview.
- (f) Receipt of applications will NOT be acknowledged.
- (g) If on receipt of an application, it is considered that the candidate may be suitable for the appointment for which he applied, he will be instructed to appear, AT HIS OWN EXPENSE, before Air Force Recruiting Officers at a specified place, time and date.
