BENGAL.—No. 118.

Australia—Torres Strait—Telegraph Cables—Ellis Channel and Aplin Pass.

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 8 of 1899) that the prohibited anchorages in Ellis Channel and Aplin Pass, across which the telegraph cables are laid, are now marked by buoys painted green with the word "Telegraph" on them, two of which mark the line of cable across Ellis Channel and one the line of cable across Aplin Pass.

The prohibited area extends for one and a half cables on each side of the line indicated by the buoys.

The buoys are laid approximately on the lines of cables, as denoted by test-houses; that in Aplin Pass being about 1 cable distant from the Thursday Island fringing reef, and those in Ellis Channel being $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables and $2\frac{1}{4}$ cables distant respectively from the fringing reefs of Thursday Island and Horn Island.

BENGAL.—No. 119.

Pacific Ocean—Tonga Islands—Nomuka Group—Reef reported to the Eastward.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 248 of 1899) that there is an apparently well-founded native report that a shoal exists south-eastward of Uiba, Haapai group, and between 30 and 40 miles distant therefrom.

As this locality was not examined by H.M.S. Penquin during the recent survey, a shoal marked P. D., has been placed on the charts in lat. $20^{\circ} 23' S.$, long. $174^{\circ} 3' W.$

Japan—Shikoku Island—(1) Light exhibited on Muroto Saki.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 259 of 1899) that a light is now exhibited on Muroto saki, the southern extreme of Shikoku islands.

Muroto saki light is a flashing white light of the 1st order, every ten seconds, elevated 497 feet above the sea, and visible between the bearings S. 40° W., through west, north, and east, and S. 48° E. (272°) from a distance of 30 miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse is an iron cylinder, 34 feet high, painted white.

Approximate position: lat. 33° 14' 45" N., long. 134° 10' 30" E.

Variation, 4° westerly in 1899.

Nipon Island—Tsugaru Strait.—(2) Light exhibited at Tairadate.

Also that on the same date a light was exhibited at Tairadate, entrance of Mutsu (Rikuoku) gulf.

Tairadate is a flashing white light of the 4th order, every five seconds, elevated 69 ft. above the sea, visible between the bearings S. 8° E., through south and west, and N. 3° E. (191°) from a distance of 14 miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse is of iron, hexagonal in shape, 61 ft. high, and painted white.

Approximate position: lat. 41° 10' 40" N., long. 140° 38' 20" E.

Variation, 6° westerly in 1899.
