

Process and Equipment for the Treatment of Fermenting Teateaves ''.

Abstract.—A process and apparatus for the treatment of tea leaves in the course of fermentation is described. The process is characterized by the fermenting tea leaves being rapidly raised to a temperature of about 100°C. by contact with steam which is passed across a layer of tea leaves alternately from below upwards and from above downwards by a suitable arrangement of baffle plates. The apparatus consists essentially of a steam generator, a movable support designed to receive the leaves which passes through a container into which the steam is passed which passes through a container into which the steam is passed at one end and wi hdrawn at the other, and a condenser. The steam after contacting the leaves is condensed and the volatile tea oils are thereby recovered.
