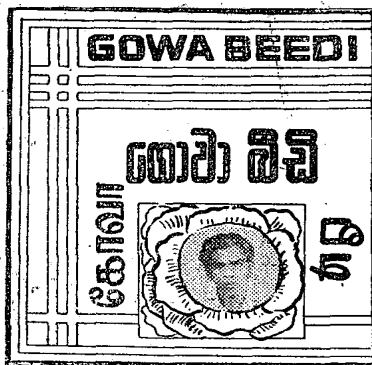

"Improvements in or Relating to Curved Screens and Method of Making Same".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim 1 which reads as follows:—

1. A method of manufacturing a curved screen for projecting motion picture films or the like, of the type comprising parallel juxtaposed light-diffusing elements, said method being characterized in that it consists in constructing longitudinal panel of which the two large sides are substantially parallel to each other, in associating with each panel light-diffusing elements substantially parallel to said large sides while giving to each element a variable angular setting from one panel to the other, and preferably, on a same panel, in juxtaposing said panels along said sides and securing them in the relative positions thus obtained, the angular setting thus given to the elements depending on the position occupied by the panel considered in the complete screen and such that the light-diffusing faces of said elements be substantially parallel to a same direction perpendicular to the axis of the film projection.

METAL CLOSURES LIMITED

"Improvements in Closure Seals".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim 1 which reads as follows:—

1. A closure cap for vacuum sealing, an externally screw-threaded container comprising a disc-like vacuum cap member, adapted to seal against the mouth of a container and an outer closure shell having a top, a threaded skirt and a security band at the lower margin of the skirt, said security band being engaged with a co-operating formation on the container to prevent the closure shell from being removed from the container without at least partial separation of the security band from the skirt of the closure shell, the vacuum cap member being arranged so as to remain in undisturbed sealing relation with the container on unscrewing of said outer closure shell until the degree of separation of the security band from the skirt of the closure shell, necessary to permit removal of the closure shell from the container, has taken place.

"Closure Cap and Method for Forming Same".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim 1 which reads as follows:—

1. A lightweight metal closure cap of the type adopted to be formed over a lip bordering the opening of a container neck, said cap comprising a disc-like top portion an annular gasket within said cap and engaged with the wall thereof a laterally depending skirt depending from and around said top portion, a pair of scores extending into the metal of said cap, commencing at the free end edge of said skirt and continuously at least part way across said top, said scores establishing a tear strip there between, a tearing ear extending laterally outwardly as an integral extension of said tear strip from the free edge of said skirt at the commencement of and between said scores, characterized by said scores (10, 11; 14, 15; and 16, 17) being uniform in cross-sectional contour throughout their extent said gasket (25) having integral extensions (18) extending into and filling said scores (14, 15) where said gasket (25) crosses said scores (14, 15) and said gasket extending from a position (26) closely adjacent the periphery of said top (2) to a position (27) part way down said skirt (3) said scores (10, 11) in said skirt (3) having been formed by the simultaneous scoring of the interior of said skirt (3) while forming the cap (1) from a flat blank by drawing an annular peripheral portion (43) of said blank laterally from the plane of said blank (26) while supporting the center circular portion of said blank (26) and scoring said annular peripheral portion (43) as the same is drawn into a lateral position with respect to said center portion. (The numbers in brackets refer to the diagrams accompanying the specification).

"Improvements Relating to Removal of Stalk from Manufactured Tea."

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claims 1 and 2 which read as follows:—

1. A process of separating stalk from tea leaf which consists of immersing a mixture of stalk and the tea leaf in a volatile organic liquid medium of such specific gravity that the stalk rises

and the tea leaf sinks in the liquid, dividing the liquid into stalk-containing and leaf-containing portions and treating each portion to separate the solids (stalk and tea leaf respectively) from the liquid medium and to recover the liquid.

2. A process as claimed in claim 1 wherein the specific gravity of the liquid medium is within the range 1.15 to 1.35.

"Improvements in the Drilling of Offshore Wells".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim 1 which reads as follows:—

1. A method of drilling an offshore well and completing it with its wellhead equipment at a depth beneath the surface of the water where it is not subject to damage by collision with moving vessels, said method comprising drilling a borehole in the ocean floor from a drilling vessel by means of a drill stem and drilling tool, lowering over the drill stem a conductor pipe having a wellhead support structure and a well casing-head attached to the top thereof until the lower end of said conductor pipe has entered the borehole before the end of the drill stem has left it, arranging on the wellhead support structure guide cables extending to said vessel, lowering said conductor pipe into said borehole until the wellhead support structure and casinghead are at least at a water depth greater than the draft of vessels using the waters, running a cementing pipe string into said conductor pipe and cementing said conductor pipe in place within said borehole, lowering and guiding a blowout preventer to the top of the said casing-head and releasably connecting it thereto, guiding to and supporting on the top of the said blow-out preventer in a fluidtight manner the lower end of a marine conductor pipe extending to a point above the surface of the water, passing a drill stem and drilling tool down through said marine conductor pipe, blow-out preventer and conductor pipe to the bottom of the borehole, and continuing drilling of the borehole.

"Cementing Well Casings".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim 1 which reads as follows:—

1. A method of cementing a string of casing in an offshore well drilled by equipment on a structure positioned above the surface of a body of water, which comprises the steps of leaving at least a portion of a drill string in the drilled hole so that the drill string extends from a point within the well to a point above the surface of the water to serve as a guide for the casing, running a well casing down over the drill string so that the casing extends from a point above the surface of the water down into at least the top of the well suspending the casing from its upper end, withdrawing the drill string from the casing, running a cement retainer to a position in the casing near the bottom thereof, securing the cement retainer to the inner wall of said casing, removably attaching the upper end of the casing to a pipe string, lowering the pipe string and casing simultaneously until the casing is in a final position in which its bottom is at a predetermined depth in the well but off the bottom thereof and the top of the casing is still above the top of the well, hanging the pipe string by the upper end thereof from the structure above the surface of the water, and pumping cement through the pipe string and

through the casing below the cement retainer and up the outside of the casing to cement the casing in the well.
