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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, July 15, 1899, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 11.

*Present:*—The Hon. Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 17 last were read, confirmed, and signed.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund and Water-rate Account from close of 1898 to June 30; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Return of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of June; and Health Officer's Report and Diary for the same month.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following were laid on the table:—

- (a) Return of tolls collected by the several collectors on behalf of the Municipal Council to end of June.
- (b) Reports by Inspectors on laundries visited during June.
- (c) Return of burials in the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery during the half-year ended June 30.

4. The following correspondence was submitted and read:—

#### *Drainage of Kandy.*

- (a) Letter No. 38 dated June 17 from the Colonial Secretary, asking what sum will be actually required on loan for payment of the drainage of Kandy road, also Chairman's reply stating that the Council believe that at least Rs. 200,000 will be required.

#### *Minutes of Proceedings.*

- (b) Letter No. 40 from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging the receipt of Minutes of Proceedings of Meeting of May 20.

#### *Pension to Cemetery Keeper.*

- (c) Letter No. 41 dated June 30 from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging receipt of application for pension for the cemetery keeper and requesting proof of his age.

## Drainage of Kandy.

(d) Letter No. 42 dated June 30 from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of a resolution passed at a Meeting of the Legislative Council on 28th of same month, authorizing payment of a loan of Rs. 251,000 for the improvement of the sanitation of the town (drainage).

(e) Letter No. 2,220 dated July 7 from the Director of Public Works, stating, in reply to the Secretary's letter of 1st instant, that good progress is being made with the survey and estimate of cost relating to the new drainage scheme for the town of Kandy.

5. In accordance with notice, Mr. Beven asked—If the Health Officer has been informed that the regulations passed by the Council require him to have his office at the Town Hall.

Reply.—On May 3 a copy of the regulations drawn up by the Special Committee were sent to the Health Officer. According to clause XIV., the Health Officer is to be at the Municipal Office or at some other appointed place.

6. In pursuance to notice, Mr. Beven moved "that a Special Committee be appointed to report on the financial condition of the Council."

This was seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, and on being put to the meeting was carried *nem. con.*

The following members were nominated as members of the Special Committee:—Messrs. Sproule, Beven, Vanderwall, and Creasy—two to form a quorum. Mr. Sproule to convene meetings.

## Health Officer's Report for the Month of June, 1899.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to submit my report for the month of June.

*Scavenging.*—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out, in spite of the difficulty the contractor experienced towards the latter end of the month owing to the scarcity of cattle, due to an outbreak of rinderpest.

*Water Supply.*—The water supply has been abundant and the quality good (*vide* report of analysis appended).

*Drains.*—The construction of the drains, both small and large, remains as unsatisfactory as when last reported upon, owing, however, to the constant and heavy showers which fell during the month they were in a comparative sanitary condition from the flushing they received.

*Alleys.*—These are much in the same unsatisfactory condition as they have been for some time past.

*Latrines.*—The public latrines are well kept. I regret receptacles for the storage of dry-earth have not yet been provided as suggested by me.

*Dairies.*—The dairies are in a satisfactory condition.

*Bakeries.*—Well kept and in good order.

*Public Market.*—The vegetable stalls have not yet been rebuilt as pointed out in my previous reports. In other respects the market is clean and well kept.

*Food Supply.*—The beef, mutton, fish, &c., exposed for sale during the month were daily inspected and found to be of good quality and of sufficient quantity. The supply of fresh ripefruit was unusually large. With regard to the supply of meat, &c., I have to state that 434 cattle, 99 buffaloes, 125 sheep, and 221 goats were slaughtered during the month for the use of the public.

*Exposing Shed and Slaughter House.*—Well kept, and in a good sanitary condition.

*Laundries.*—In fairly good order.

*Dry Fish Boutiques.*—Well kept, and the articles of food exposed for sale sound and wholesome.

*Night Soil.*—The present arrangements for the removal and disposal of night soil are highly satisfactory. In this connection I beg to invite the special attention of the Chairman and Council to a report from the Scavenging Inspector, which shows how the expenditure under this head has been gradually reduced from Rs. 1,446.46 a month in December, 1898, to Rs. 876.50 in June of this year, without the least prejudice to the efficacy of the work done. With less expenditure in the repair of drums and more economy in the use of disinfectants, I have every reason to believe that the cost of working the night soil department will not exceed half of what was spent last year.

*Notices.*—157 notices were issued during the month by the Inspectors to clear noxious vegetation, to limewash filthy premises, to clear cesspits, &c. Most owners and occupiers of houses attended to orders given, and action has been taken in the case of defaulters.

*Health of the Town.*—This was generally good. With the exception of a few cases of chickenpox, no disease worthy of note was reported. Towards the end of the month rinderpest broke out among cattle. Whenever this was discovered the cattle were segregated and placed under medical treatment and the stalls disinfected.

From the examination of the source of the water herein referred to, and the results obtained by analysis, I am of opinion that it is admirably adapted for all domestic purposes.

From SCAVENGING INSPECTOR to the HEALTH OFFICER, Municipal Council, Kandy.

Kandy, July 11, 1899.

SIR,—I BEG to submit my report as requested by you for last month showing details of expenditure in removing night soil and emptying cesspits from houses.

*Removal of Night Soil Buckets from Private Houses.*—Since the month of June the additional number of night soil buckets from private houses registered has been 26. This work was carried on without any extra carts or coolies being employed.

*Disinfectants used.*—The quantity of disinfectant used during last month was far less than the quantity used in any previous months, owing to *dry-earth being largely* used as recommended by the Health Officer. This system works well, and hardly any effluvia arises from the buckets used in carrying night soil. Twelve bottles of carbolic fluid and 48 lb. of carbolic powder were used in the aggregate.

*Repair to Night Soil Drums, &c.*—The number repaired during last month was 46 at Re. 1.50 ; total Rs. 69. I annex a list of drums and cost of repairing same from December to June, 1899. The cost of repairs seems a heavy item, but I am doing my best to reduce the expenditure under this head:—

*Emptying of Cesspits in Private Houses.*—Eight cesspits were emptied during last month. A sum of Rs. 92.85 was deposited to defray expenses connected with this work. Out of this sum Rs. 61.30 was expended to meet the hire of coolies and bulls, and the commission of 10 per centum allowed to the Inspector for supervising the work, and the balance Rs. 31.55 represents fees due to the Council. The work of emptying cesspits was satisfactorily done without a single complaint being made by the householders.

*Night Soil Buckets from Private Houses which have not being registered.*—Since I took over the work of Scavenging Inspector on May 16, 1899, I detected 18 houses in which 22 additional buckets were used without being registered in the office. This, I believe, was an omission through oversight on the part of my predecessor. I have now made a correct list of all buckets in use and submitted it to the office for the recovery of fees.

*Disposal of Night Soil from Jails.*—The consolidated charges which by agreement the Jail authorities have to pay for removing night soil is Rs. 200 per month. The Council had to supply three carts, bulls, and coolies to do the work, and it was done during daytime some months; but as there were complaints of the night soil carts passing through the principal streets during daytime and thereby causing annoyance, the Chairman directed that the carts should only be allowed to work during night. At present I have to supply 5 carts instead of 3—4 to Bogambara Jail and 1 to the Old Jail, King street—at the cost of Rs. 30 per each cart, or Rs. 150 per month; and five coolies at Rs. 13·50 each, or Rs. 67·50 per mensem. The work is done at a loss to the Council of Rs. 17·50 a month. I would therefore suggest that the Jail authorities be communicated with on the subject, and that an increase in the amount of the Council's consolidated charge be asked for from January 1, 1900, as estimates for next year are now in the course of preparation to be submitted to Government.

*Cattle Hoof Disease.*—I beg to report that 26 head of cattle died during last month, and up to date, from this disease. The cattle belonged to owners of night soil carts and scavenging carts, consequently a great deal of work in scavenging and emptying cesspits in private houses was delayed; but I am glad to say that the work of removing night soil from public latrines and private houses was in no way interrupted.

*Cost of Night Soil Establishment.*—At the commencement of this year, as well as during last year, there were 22 carts employed in removing night soil, besides one cart for removing blood from the slaughter-house and one cart for removing ash from the manure pits; total 24 carts. At present, however, the number employed is only 15. I think that the present number is quite sufficient, although, as mentioned before, 26 additional buckets from private houses were added to the register last month. This total is made up of 331 buckets from private houses; 152 buckets from public latrines—27 in number.

I append a statement showing the difference in the cost of working the removal of night soil for the first six months of the current year. It will be observed that the reduction by the Health Officer on my suggestion of carts and coolies has to a great extent reduced expenditure during the months of April, May, and June without in any way affecting the *quality* of the work or the quickness of its execution.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on July 15, 1899, at 1.30 p.m.

*Present*:—The Chairman; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; Dr. W. G. Keith; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; E. Coates, Esq.; and D. C. F. Obeyesekera, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Anthonisz asked—with reference to the following paragraph in the Colonial Secretary's letter to the Chairman, dated March 15, 1899: "His Excellency desires me to state that unless the Municipal Council can find some way at an early date of making the water from the Bikke reservoir fit for consumption, the question of the equity of the water-rate must be re-considered"—what steps have been taken to have the water filtered.

The Chairman replied that Government had been written to on the subject, and the reply was that the matter had been referred to the Director of Public Works for report.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. Coates moved "that the Council do now pay to the Treasurer of the Galle Band the promised sum of Rs. 200 for the purchase of new musical instruments, a further sum of Rs. 200 having been raised from the residents as required."

Seconded by Dr. Anthonisz.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. Coates moved "that a lamp-post be erected in the road (without name) leading from the new Fort gate to the tennis court."

Seconded by Mr. C. L. M. Abdul Carim.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. Coates moved "that a new lamp of greater power be put to the existing lamp-post at the top of the said road, near the old sun dial."

Seconded by Mr. D. C. F. Obeyesekera.—Carried.

6. In terms of section 209 (a) of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 the Chairman applied for power to require owner of house No. 7, Small Moderbay street, to substitute a dry-earth closet for the existing cesspit.

Resolved,—That authority be granted.

7. Submitted accounts for June, 1899 and Progress Report of Works for June, 1899

## Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended March 31, 1899.

The general health was good. There was a mild epidemic of chickenpox confined chiefly to Wards Nos. 5 and 4. About the middle of January a child, who was sent to his relations in the Fort from an estate bungalow, where some children were laid up with measles, developed the disease. Few other cases were reported in the Fort. On February 8 the Police Officer of Bope reported a death from suspected cholera at Kovilagodawatta. I immediately visited the spot and ordered disinfection of the house, &c. The cause of death was acute diarrhoea.

On February 11 I received information from the Colonial Surgeon of a suspected case of plague at Magalla. The patient was one Carolis Jayasooriya of Magalla, who left Bombay on January 26, and arriving at Tuticorin on January 30 was quarantined there till February 4. He reached Galle by the 5 P.M. train on February 5. The history given by the patient was that about January 19 he felt pain in the groins and consequent inconvenience in walking, but kept on attending to his business until swellings were noticed in his groins. He took no treatment in Bombay (having probably left as soon as the swellings were noticed). At Tuticorin he was treated by Dr. Fernandez, and since his arrival here by a native specialist. The patient denied having ever suffered from venereal

sores or gonorrhœa recently, nor was he prescribed for venereal sores at Tuticorin or here by the vedarala who treated him for the buboes. When examined on February 11 the patient had glandular swellings in both the groins, but there was no trace of a scar on his penis or methral discharges, spelic wound at the periphery, erysipelas, scrofula, lymphadenoma, or any injury to account for the state of the glands. He had slight fever, and was confined to the house since his arrival. After a consultation between the Colonial Surgeon, Drs. Morgan, Pestonjee, and myself, it was decided to remove the patient to the Buona Vista plague hospital and to take every sanitary precaution. The patient and the other inmates refused to go to the hospital and showed much opposition, but by gentle means I persuaded the patient and those who wished to attend on him to go to the hospital at about 5 P.M. on February 11. The other inmates of the patient's house and those of three neighbouring houses were kept under surveillance. The patient's house, three neighbouring houses, clothing, &c., were thoroughly disinfected.

Since admission to hospital there was no improvement in the condition of the patient, who was under the treatment of the vedarala who treated him since his arrival here. His temperature on February 13 at 10 P.M. was 102, and on the 14th at 4.30 P.M. was 103.5. One gland was about the size of a hen's egg and the other about that of a large marble. The patient complained of pain, and there was tenderness about the glands.

On the morning of February 17 the Colonial Surgeon told me that the patient will be discharged from hospital the same morning, although there was no improvement in the state of the glands, and the patient was not free from fever, which registered 103.5 on the 14th evening. His sudden departure from a plague infected town on the first appearance of subjective symptoms without consulting any medical man there, most probably through fear of detection, and secretly getting a native specialist treatment and keeping to the house since his arrival here, all point to suspicion in the patient's mind. The suspicious history of the case, the symptoms for which he had been treated at Tuticorin by Dr. Fernandez and here by the vedarala, and the progress of the case since admission to the plague hospital (increase in the glandular swellings with pain, tenderness, and a temperature going up to 103.5 two days before the proposed discharge), all point to the diagnosis of the case as *pestis minor* or *pestis ambulans* confirmed by the absence of any other disease or injury to account for the state of the glands.

Actuated by a sense of duty with a conviction in my mind that this was a case of *pestis minor* I sent in my protest, which, however, was overruled, and the patient's discharge was ordered by the Chairman on February 18.

*Pestis minor* or *ambulans* is characterized by glandular swellings merely or with fever, whereas true plague is characterized by glandular swellings accompanied by a toxis infection of extreme intensity. *Pestis minor* is so uncertain in its incubation period, so indefinite in its duration, so unstable in its relation to malignant plague, and so uncertain in its onset and departure, that no scientific precision has been assigned to the relationships; but it is not less plague, and it no less merits the attention of the responsible authorities. The disease is not obviously contagious, and it rarely, if ever, causes death. In *pestis minor* a bacillus allied in every respect to the *kitasato* bacillus of true plague was discovered first in Calcutta. The bacillus is said not to possess the toxis or virulent properties of the true plague bacillus, but to be similar in all other respects. There may be but one bacillus, and according to its state of development or in consequence of its evolution, different types of the disease may prevail, each associated with a different train of symptoms. It is *pestis minor* which the medical officers of health in such parts as have communication with infected parts will do well to be on the look out for. A case of *pestis minor*, if allowed to land, and if not treated with strict sanitary precautions, will introduce the germs into the soil where, under favourable conditions, they thrive and multiply. The soil may serve not only as a mere vehicle, but as a host in which the parasite passes through a stage of its evolution and develop into the bacillus of true plague. This process of evolution may take several months or years perhaps, and I will not be surprised if we get an epidemic of plague here.

The Minutes of July 14, 1899, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of July 14, 1899, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the Council do consider the action of the Inspector-General of Police in preventing carriage traffic in Prince street, Fort, between 5 and 6 P.M. on Sundays."

Perera moved "that it be explained that the second sentence of the resolution of June 9, 1899, was framed in pursuance of what was understood from the outset to be the object in view, namely, an additional quantity of water for the domestic use of the public. The Council, when informed in April, 1896, of the intention of Government to ascertain from the Crown Agents the cost of duplicating the main, inquired what additional quantity of water would be available to the public by such duplication; and Government in reply stated specifically that the additional quantity of water available to the public by the duplication of the water main would be approximately 3,000,000 gallons per diem. Under the circumstances the Council trusts that the Government will now agree to the moderate terms of the resolution of June 9, 1899.

IN accordance with the requirements of section 3 of the Opium and Bhang Ordinance, No. 9 of 1889, I hereby give notice that the licenses for the sale by retail of opium within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo for the year commencing the first day of January, 1900, will, by resolution of the Municipal Council, be four in number. The said licenses will be put up to sale by public auction at this office at noon on Wednesday, October 11, 1899, and they will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances Nos. 9 of 1889 and 9 of 1897, and under the following conditions, viz. :—

1. That the place licensed shall be subject to inspection, and that no riotous or disorderly conduct be allowed to occur therein.
2. That the place licensed shall not be kept open for the sale of opium at any time before the hour of 6 in the morning or after 9 in the evening.
3. That the licensee shall cause to be painted or affixed in some conspicuous part of his shop his name, the number of the shop, and the words "Licensed to sell Opium by Retail."
4. That no person other than the licensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium under his license either as agent or servant of such licensee, unless the name of such agent or servant be registered in the Office of the Municipal Council, with the sanction of the Chairman.
5. Wholesale licenses will be issued only to retail dealers.
