1. The power to make acting appointments in the case of District Judges, Commissioners of Requests and Magistrates is hereby delegated to the Secretary, subject to the following limitations:—

- (1) The Secretary shall not make an acting appointment for a period of more than seven days at a time or for more than seven days in the aggregate in any one month.

Award

The Commissioner of Labour, by his Order under section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131, as amended by Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957 and 4 of 1962, has referred the undermentioned dispute for settlement by arbitration, and the following is the Award under section 17 (1):

"Whether Mr. W. B. Dharmasena worked in excess of normal hours of work since early 1961 to January, 1964, at the request of the management and if so, to what relief he is entitled."

Artie Amarasekera, appeared for the Industrial & Commercial Workers' Union, S. A. Villavarayan for Viswakula & Sons.

Dharmasena was employed in the Jewellery Shop of Viswakula & Sons at Galle Road, from 5.11.56. This is a small shop, and besides Dharmasena there were a salesman and a labourer.

The conditions of employment marked A.1 designates Dharmasena as a clerk; his initial salary was Rs. 175 and he was not entitled to any overtime payment.

He stated in evidence that he kept the books and that in addition he did sales, and for this additional work he was given an allowance of Rs. 25 which was later added on to his salary. He further stated that in or about 1960 he was asked by the management to stay in the premises and this additional work as a watcher was performed outside his normal working hours.

K. A. G. Perera, his brother-in-law, gave evidence that Dharmasena lived with him at Dehiwala, and that when he left his house he told him that the management had asked him to stay in the shop.

V. A. Piyadasa, one of the partners, denied that Dharmasena was asked to stay in the premises and stated that he stayed there for his own convenience with his permission.

Ranasinghe, the salesman, was employed in this shop before Dharmasena, and he has stayed in the shop before he rented out a house for him and his family. A labourer always stayed in the premises and it was he who closed the windows at night.

R.1 is a letter written by Dharmasena on 11.2.64. In this letter he has stated that he was mentally disturbed and worried about the treatment meted out to him and had applied for two weeks' leave. He did not work in this shop thereafter. R.2 to R.6 are letters written by Dharmasena between 24.2.64 and 11.4.64, applying for extensions of leave. After his last letter he has taken work under a new employer in Kandy. Except for his designation as Assistant Manager, the nature of his work under his new employer is the same; his salary is only Rs. 5 more than the salary he drew under Viswakula & Sons.

Letters R.1 to R.6 clearly indicate that Dharmasena had left Viswakula & Sons on his own accord and for some specific reason. He had not mentioned at this inquiry what that reason was. It was suggested for Viswakula & Sons that Dharmasena wanted the workman he had recommended to the Company to be dismissed and that the refusal of the Company to accede to his request had displeased him. This may or may not be true but it is evident that Dharmasena does not wish to disclose that reason. Though the dispute is in respect of extra hours of work, he claimed, whilst giving evidence, additional salary payment for doing sales in this

shop. In his new employment he sleeps in the premises. I disbelieve Dharmasena and accept the evidence of Piyadasa that Dharmasena slept in this premises for his own convenience. This claim of his is an afterthought to harass his former employer.

I hold that Dharmasena of Industrial & Commercial Workers' Union did not work in excess of normal hours of work since early 1961 to January, 1964, at the request of the management and that he is not entitled to any relief. I make award accordingly.

SCHEDULE**PART I***Definition of a normal working day (section 24)*

The number of hours constituting a normal working day (inclusive of one hour for a meal or rest) shall be nine.

PART II

The minimum rates of wages for time work applicable to the workers specified in Column I hereto shall be the rates set out in the corresponding entry in Column II.

Column I Class of Worker	Column II Rates of Wages for a normal working day Rs. c.
(a) Male worker not under 16 years of age ...	3 30
(b) Female worker not under 15 years of age ...	3 0
(c) Child worker ...	2 50

In the foregoing decisions "child worker" means a male worker under 16 years of age or a female worker under 15 years of age.

PART III*Overtime Rates*

In respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day, the minimum overtime rate shall be the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum daily rate of wages for time work by 8) increased by—

- (a) 25 per cent. of such minimum hourly rate, in case such work is performed between the hours 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.; and
- (b) 50 per cent. of such minimum hourly rate, in case such work is performed between the hours 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.

In the computation of the overtime rate—

- (1) a fraction of a cent which is less than one half of a cent shall not be taken into account;
- (2) one half of a cent shall be calculated according to the even number rule, that is, to the nearest even number; and
- (3) a fraction of a cent which is greater than one-half of a cent shall be counted as one cent.

PART IV*Weekly Holiday (section 24)*

Every employer shall allow each Sunday as the weekly holiday to all workers employed under him: Provided, however that an employer may employ any worker on a Sunday, subject to the conditions—

- (1) that a day within the six days next succeeding such Sunday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday;
- (2) that in respect of work done on such Sunday—
 - (a) a worker who has worked for 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal or rest) or for any period that falls short of nine hours by reason of the failure of the employer to provide him with work shall be remunerated at $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day.
 - (b) a worker who has worked for less than 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal or rest) by reason of his unwillingness to work shall, for each hour that he has worked be paid $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 8).

(c) a worker who has worked for more than 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal or rest) shall be remunerated at twice the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 8) for each hour of work in excess of 9 hours; and

- (3) that the remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any period shall be paid within the time prescribed for the payment of wages for such period by section 2 (b) of the Wages Boards Ordinance.

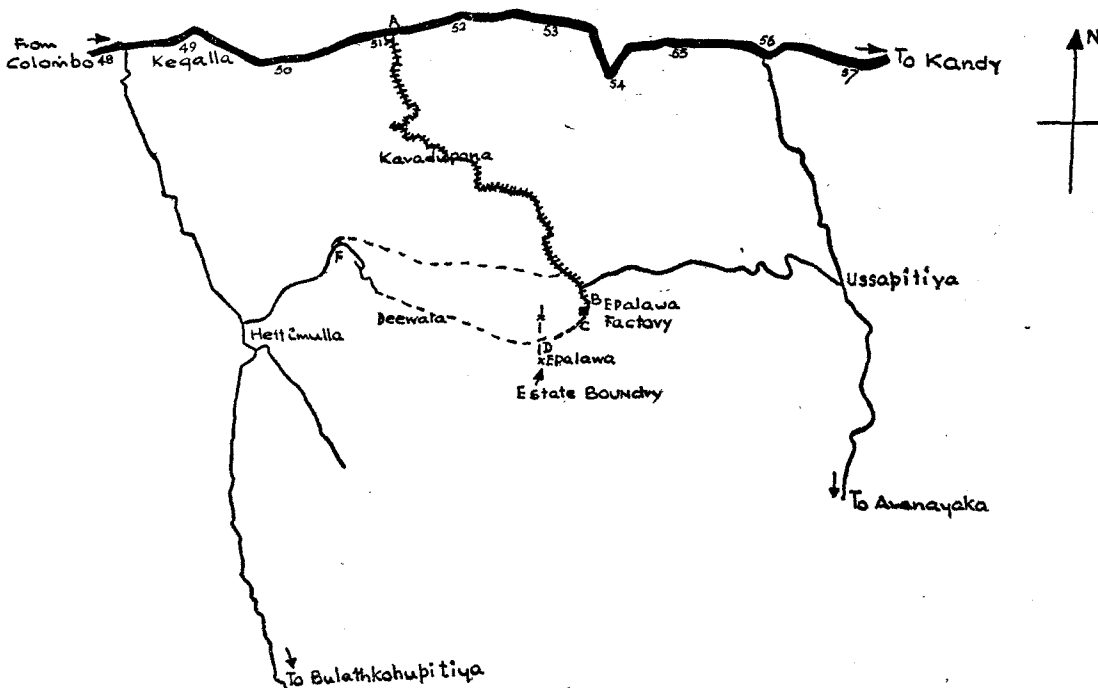
