It is apparent that the Union is not interested in this dispute anymore. In the circumstances I make award dismissing this dispute.

The Award

This is an award made under Section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act.

By virtue of the powers vested in him under section 3 (1) (d) of the said Act, the Commissioner of Labour, by his Order No. C/I 46, dated the 29th day of July, 1964, referred this dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute between the Ceylon Mercantile Union (hereinafter referred to as the 'Union') and the management of Messrs. Brooke Bond Ceylon Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as the 'Company') as contained in the statement appended to the said Order is :

whether the termination of the services of Mr. N. P. Perera is justified and to what relief he is entitled.

As required by the regulations framed under the Act, both parties had furnished statements in regard to the matter in dispute. The case was taken up for hearing on 19th February, 1965, and put off for the following day, when it was heard and concluded. Mr. P. B. Thampoe appeared on behalf of Mr. Perera while Mr. K. Nagalingam represented the Company.

The Company's position is as follows: N. P. Perera, who is a clerk, was detected on the evening of 20th January, 1964, attempting without permission to remove from the Company's premises a bottle containing a quantity of Pynol, a disinfectant. At the domestic enquiry, Perera was found guilty of theft and his services were terminated with effect from 25.1.64. He was paid up to this date also given a month's salary, ex gratia. Counsel for Perera argued that, while he did not condone the action of his client, he had no intention to commit theft. The Pynol and bottle were lying around, the former for use in the lavatory, and he did not think there was anything wrong in helping himself to them. He was aware, however, that there were strict rules in regard to the removal of tea from the premises and that permission was necessary for this. He was not secretive in the method of removal, having left the (wrapped) bottle in his case by the doorman, who, however, challenged him and demanded a gate-pass. Perera appealed to senior employees of the Firm to issue him with one but this was refused.

Arguing that the punishment meted out by the Company was too severe, Mr. Thampoe referred to clauses in the Collective Agreement between the Employers' Federation and the C.M.U. which deal with alternatives to dismissal, stoppage of increment, reduction to lower grades and similar matters.

Mr. Perera is not an illiterate. He has passed his S.S.C. (probably the G.C.E., with six subjects) and has been a clerk for 10 years. For a man with this education and experience, it is surely naive of him to say (through his counsel) that he did not realise that he was doing wrong. He had, in fact, expressed his regret earlier both by letter and at the domestic enquiry. "I knew I did the wrong thing.....I now feel sorry about the whole affair. I promise not to repeat this type of action again."

The Company had tight measures in regard to the removal of tea from its premises. Had an employee been caught removing tea instead of a small quantity of disinfectant and an empty ink bottle, what, it may be asked, would have been the punishment? No evidence was led to show what checks there were against executives of the Firm helping themselves to paper clips, using the Firm's telephone for private calls or using the Firm's cars for matters that could not be described as official.

Even if the Company was right in concluding that the removal of the Pynol constituted theft, its lofty attitude towards Perera is to be regretted. Asked by Court whether, if the Company offered re-instatement in a lower position, he would accept, he replied: "Even if it is on a lower salary I will accept."

Mr. Nagalingam has expressed concern over the impact of a possible re-instatement on the other employees and, rather than let this happen, was prepared to go very far in the matter of compensation! One is reminded of the Marquis in *A Tale of Two Cities* who attempted to make good with a gold coin the loss of a child that his carriage had run over.

I believe that Perera was guilty of serious misconduct but that it was an occasion for the Company to temper justice with mercy. Perera has ten years' service and no evidence was led to show that this record was anything but good. He is a young man and the father of two children. He is sorry for what he has done.

I accordingly order that he be re-employed as a clerk on a basic salary of Rs. 153 (or at a point in his Grade closest to this figure), that he forfeits all arrears of salary, allowances and privileges that would have accrued to him had he continued in employment beyond 25.1.64 and that he be given a period of three months after the publication of this Award within which to exercise his option of accepting or refusing this offer.

Inquiry was commenced on 16th March, 1963. Mr. Artie Amarasekera, represented the Samithiya and Mr. K. D. W. Senadeera, appeared for the lessees of the estate. During the course of the inquiry, the Union withdrew the matters (2) and (3), as contained in the statement of the matter in dispute as set out by the Commissioner of Labour. The terms of this interim settlement were implemented and thereafter on 2.11.64 both parties informed me that they had finally settled the matter. The terms of settlement agreed to by both parties were as follows—

1. Half month's gross salary for every year of service to be paid to all employees up to a maximum of 10 years. This will be calculated by taking the average of the last two years earnings of each of the employees (this is only in the case of daily paid workers as in the case of monthly paid workers, the average does not arise).
2. An interim payment of Rs. 100 to be made by the Turf Club before the 30th of November 1964 to those employees who have already been paid on the orders of this Court on 29th June, 1963 and 2nd February, 1964. This payment of Rs. 100 (to each employee) will be deposited by the Turf Club by the 25th of November, 1964, with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Industrial Relations, Colombo, together with the list of the names of the workers to whom the payment should be made and the Assistant Commissioner of Labour will make these payments.
3. The Ceylon Turf Club undertakes to submit to this Court on the next date which is the 15th of January, 1963:
 - (a) Full list of the employees who should be paid any gratuity;
 - (b) The average salary per month as required in paragraph 1;
 - (c) The amount to be paid to each worker in full and final settlement; and
 - (d) The amounts already paid.
4. The Ceylon Turf Club also undertakes to pay 50 per cent. of the full amount (after deducting all monies that have already been paid to the employees) by the 10th of February 1965 and the balance to be paid on or before the 10th of April, 1965.

The record also reads that Mr. Coomaraswamy, a steward of the Ceylon Turf Club and Committee Member and Col. Titus Medonza, Secretary of the Ceylon Turf Club were present. Mr. Leon, President of the Ceylon Turf Club Union and Mr. Hassen, the Organising Secretary of the Parent Union were also present in Court and accepted these terms which have been suggested to me. Mr. Coomaraswamy and Col. Medonza also undertake not to dispose of or otherwise utilise the two lakhs of rupees shown in the Balance Sheet referred to in my earlier order as being kept aside as payment of gratuity to employees till such time as the full payment of gratuity is made.

5. On 13.3.65 when this case was called to ascertain whether the payment had been made in terms of the aforementioned settlement, Mr. Amarasekera, who appeared for the Union on that date informed me that the Turf Club had still not implemented certain terms of the agreement and he submitted that since they have gone back on the undertaking that I should make my award on the terms of settlement suggested above. Mr. Advocate H. D. Tambiah who appeared for the Ceylon Turf Club on this day stated that he had nothing to say.

6. Having listened to the submissions made by both parties during the course of this inquiry, I think the terms of settlement agreed to are just and reasonable. I therefore direct the Ceylon Turf Club to pay the employees under this reference—

1. Half month's gross salary for every year of service up to a maximum of ten years to be paid to all employees. This amount to be calculated by taking the average of the last two years' earnings of each of the employees in the case of the Daily Paid workers. In the case of the monthly paid workers, their gross salary as at the time of reference.
2. All payments made to any employees during the course of these proceedings in terms of any interim settlement to be deducted from the amount mentioned in paragraph 1.
3. The Ceylon Turf Club will deposit with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Industrial Relations, Colombo, a list of all the employees as mentioned in the reference together with any amounts paid to them under paragraph 2. This list will also contain the balance amounts due to these employees. The Ceylon Turf Club will deposit the full said sum together with the said list within two weeks of the publication of this award.

I make award accordingly.

RENEWAL OF FIREARMS LICENCES—1966

Kegalle District

RENEWAL of firearms licences for the year 1966 will commence on 1st December, 1965. Owners of firearms should make their applications to the Divisional Revenue Officers of their respective areas, who will renew licences up to 31st March, 1966. Renewal thereafter will be done at the Kegalle Kachcheri. The addresses of the D.R.OO. are as follows:—

- (1) D.R.O. Beligal Korale—Nelundeniya.
- (2) D.R.O. Paranakuru Korale—Kegalle.
- (3) D.R.O. Dehigampal Korale and Lower Bulathgama-Yatiantota.
- (4) D.R.O. Atulugam and Panawal Korales—Dehiowita.
- (5) D.R.O. Galboda Korale—Mawanela.

2. Stamps will not be accepted in payment of gun licences fees. When a licence is lost, a certificate of loss should be obtained from the respective D.R.O. on payment of one rupee. No renewal will be done unless the old licence or the certificate of loss is produced. No applications for renewal will be accepted at the Kegalle Kachcheri during the aforesaid period. Licensees who fail to renew their licences before 31.12.1965 will be liable to a penalty equal to the licence fee. Licensees who fail to get their licences renewed on or before 31.3.1966 are liable to be prosecuted.

3. Every gun, revolver and pistol in respect of which an application for renewal of licence is made, should be available for inspection by the officers authorised to renew licences on my behalf before the issue of the licence. If a firearm has become unserviceable, it should be surrendered along with the licence for 1965 to the D.R.O. of the area on or before 31.12.1965, otherwise the licensee will be required to take out a licence for 1966 on payment of the usual charges.

RENEWAL OF FIREARMS LICENCES FOR 1966 IN BADULLA DISTRICT

IT is hereby notified for the information of the general public that the renewal of Firearms Licences in Badulla District for the year 1966, will be done by Divisional Revenue Officers of the respective divisions, commencing from October 15, 1965.

EXPORT CONTROL NOTICE No. 2/65

Export of Coir Bristle Fibre and Coir Mattress Fibre

REFERENCE Export Control Notice No. 3/64 of July 30, 1964, published in *Ceylon Gazette Extraordinary* No. 14,123 of July 30, 1964.

The minimum prices mentioned in the Schedule below will be effective from today and will remain in force until further notice.

The maximum cuts on fibre delivered at Shipper's Stores which a shipper may make, will continue to be 6 per cent for mattress fibre and 8 per cent, for bristle fibre. Shippers should insert on the receipts issued by them to millers the gross weight of the fibre as well as the nett weight of the fibre taken over by them.

No shipper should charge a brokerage or other fee on prices payable to millers for the fibre delivered at their stores. The maximum amount that may be charged by a shipper as loading or unloading charges will be 2 cents per cwt.

Export licences will be issued only if the shipper satisfies me by documentary evidence that he has paid to the millers from whom purchases are made, not less than the prices shown in

column II of the Schedule for the lowest grade of each description of fibre in column I therein.

The export duty and the cess payable on exports of fibre should be borne by the shipper.
