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Posts — Vacant

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. *Allowance.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. *New Entrants to the Public Service.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of New Entrants appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) New Entrants will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) They will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) The confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend *inter alia*, on their passing within specified periods of time graded proficiency tests in Sinhala, leading up to the level of the J.S.C. Standard. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of the increments falling due, until the passing of same. Any officer who does not pass the proficiency tests of the Junior School Certificate standards by the end of his period of probation/trial will be liable to have his services terminated.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempt from passing the proficiency tests in Sinhala as a pre-requisite for confirmation.

(iv) They will also be required to pass an Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in appointment.

5. *Qualifications required.*—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(ii) A candidate for any post for which the minimum educational qualification prescribed is a pass in the Senior School Certificate examination or equivalent or higher examination shall have a pass in the Sinhala language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate examination or its equivalent if he is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium. (This requirement will not apply to those officers who are in the Public Service from a date prior to January 1, 1961, and who seek appointment to other posts in the Public Service.)

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. Such officers should in addition send a duplicate thereof direct to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, to reach him on or before the closing date. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of Departments should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification, if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal, if discovered after the selection.

(v) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

8. *Definition of Salary for the Purpose of Eligibility.*—Salary for purposes of eligibility means only the basic substantive salary and does not include any acting salary, allowance, &c.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

Post of Vice-Principal (Male), Guru Vidyalayas

APPLICATIONS are invited from male candidates for the post of Vice-Principal (Male), Guru Vidyalayas in the Department of Education. Applications, which should be on printed forms provided by this office, should reach me on or before the following dates :—

- (a) Local Applications—24th September, 1965.
- (b) Overseas Applications—1st October, 1965.

Notes.—(i) No allegations that an application form or a letter respecting such form has been lost or delayed in the post can be considered. Candidates who delay their applications until the last days do so at their own risks.

(ii) Overseas candidates may obtain the printed form of application from the Office of the Ceylon Representative abroad. They may forward the form of application within the prescribed time, if they so desire, to the office of the Ceylon Representative abroad assigned to or nearest to the country of their residence for transmission to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Ceylon.

(iii) *Medical Examination and Passages.*—Ceylonese Officers selected abroad for appointment under the Ceylon Government will be required to present themselves for examination to approved Medical Practitioners with a view to it being ascertained whether they are physically fit for service. The fee for such examination as well as the cost of their passage expenses to Ceylon shall be paid by the Officers themselves.

2. Salary, Allowances and Conditions of Service.—

- (i) The salary scale attached to the post is Rs. 5,160—7 of Rs. 7,680 per annum.
- (ii) The selected candidate is liable to serve in any Guru Vidyalaya in the Island. A vacancy exists at present at the Katukurunda Guru Vidyalaya and the successful candidate may be appointed to the Katukurunda Guru Vidyalaya or elsewhere.

3. Terms of Engagement.—

- (i) The post is permanent and pensionable under the School Teachers' Pension Rules. In the case of an appointee who holds a pensionable post as teacher under the Minutes of Pension, prior to his selection, the post will be declared pensionable while held by him.
- (ii) The appointment will be in the first instance on probation/trial for a period of 3 years.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is not less than 30 years of age and not more than 50 years on 24.9.65. (Those already holding permanent appointments in the Public Service will be considered irrespective of these age limits.);
- (b) is a trained Graduate, with a minimum of 10 years' teaching experience. Experience of teaching in a Guru Vidyalaya and Administrative experience will be added qualifications. Candidates should possess good qualifications in Sinhala;
- (c) is of excellent moral character and physically sound.

5. Candidates will be required to produce any or all of the following documents when called upon to do so :—

- (a) certificate of registration of birth. (N.B.—Baptismal certificates or certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code of Regulation for Director-Managed Schools will not be accepted);
- (b) degree of highest educational certificates;
- (c) Two certificates of character, one of which should be from the Director of Studies, College Tutor or Professor;
- (d) Certificates of professional and/or technical qualifications;
- (e) certificates of the highest examination passed in Sinhala.

Note.—(i) No documents or copies of documents should be attached to the application form.

(ii) Applications of candidates who fail to produce document when required to do so will not be considered.

6. Applications from officers in the Public Service must be forwarded through the Head of their Department. They must, however, send a duplicate of the application direct to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, to reach him on or before the closing date.

7. Applications and any other communications relating thereto must be addressed to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, and not personally to any Officer in this Department.

8. Reference is invited to the general conditions applicable to appointments to posts in the Public Service published at the beginning of Part I, Section II, of this Gazette.

9. All applications will be acknowledged and any applicant who does not receive an acknowledgment within seven days of the closing date should at once notify the Secretary, Public Service Commission. Failure to comply with this provision will deprive the applicant of any claim to consideration.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Posts of Police Drivers

APPLICATIONS are invited for posts of Police drivers in the Police Department. Applications, which should be on specimen form given below, should be addressed to the Director, Police Training School, Kalutara, to reach him under registered cover, on or before September 27, 1965. The envelope enclosing the application should be marked on the left-hand top corner "APPLICATION FOR POLICE DRIVER".

2. *Salary scale.*—On joining Rs. 750 per annum and after one year Rs. 840 per annum rising to Rs. 1,764 per annum by 22 annual increments of Rs. 42 each with efficiency bars before reaching Rs. 1,050, Rs. 1,260, Rs. 1,470 and Rs. 1,638.

3. *Qualifications required.*—Every candidate should furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (i) is a citizen of Ceylon;
- (ii) is not under 25 years and not over 45 years of age on January 1, 1966. Ex-Servicemen or Ex-Employees of the U. K. Bases in Ceylon will be allowed age concessions. This age limit will not apply to present employees of the Police Department;
- (iii) has passed the 7th standard in Sinhala, Tamil or English in a school approved by the Department of Education. This minimum educational qualifications will be relaxed in the case of candidates already serving in Government Departments at the discretion of the Inspector-General of Police;
- (iv) is in possession of a very clean certificate of competence with four years driving experience after obtaining the certificate of competence. Preference will be given to candidates who have a knowledge of motor mechanism and certificate of competence endorsed to drive all types of vehicles;
- (v) is unmarried. Ex-Servicemen and discharged civilian employees of the U. K. Bases in Ceylon are exempted from this requirement.
- (vi) is not below 5' 3" in height.

4. Candidates will be tested (i) on their ability to drive and maintain a motor vehicle. (ii) On their knowledge of the "rules of the road", traffic signals and elementary mechanism of the type of vehicles which each candidate is competent to drive. (iii) To assess their general educational qualification.

Note.—No travelling expense is payable to candidates summoned for the tests and interviews.

5. Selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination before they can be appointed. No candidate though certified as fit to serve in any part of the Island will be appointed if he has any deformity or physical defects which interfere with his free normal movements which are necessary to ensure efficiency in driving.

6. *Training period.*—The training period of a driver will be five weeks at the end of which he will be required to pass a test in—

- (a) Driving,
- (b) Highway Code, and
- (c) Motor Mechanism—practical and theory.

7. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts are permanent and pensionable and contributions should be made to the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund and other departmental funds.

8. *Conditions of Service.*—(a) The selected candidates will be on probation for a period of three years. Those already holding pensionable appointments in the Public Service will be appointed to act for a prescribed period in the first instance.

(b) The selected candidates will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made, for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and, in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(c) The selected candidates will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders, Police Disciplinary Code and any other orders issued by the Inspector-General of Police or by the Government from time to time.

(d) They will not be allowed to marry until they are confirmed in their appointments. However, applications from drivers with two years satisfactory service will be considered and permission granted at the discretion of the Inspector-General of Police.

(e) At times when they are not required to drive vehicles, they will perform any routine duties of an official nature at a Police Station or other place of work, as directed by any Police Officer in authority provided such duties do not require the exercise of Police powers.

(f) Every driver will be re-tested at the end of the probationary/acting period and before every increment, to ensure that he maintains a satisfactory standard in driving, maintenance and turn out.

9. Applicants should attach to their applications, copies of—

- (i) certificate of birth,
- (ii) two recent testimonials of character,
- (iii) certificate of competence to drive, and
- (iv) certificate of educational qualifications.

10. Reference is invited to the general conditions applicable to appointments to posts in the Public Service published at the beginning of Part I, Section II, of this Gazette.

11. Appointees will be provided with—

- (a) free quarters,
- (b) free uniforms, and
- (c) kit box, rug, shoes and cleaning material.

12. Applications from candidates who are already in the Service of the Government should be forwarded through the respective Heads of Departments.

13. No application will be accepted after the closing date. Applications which do not conform in every respect to the requirements of this notification will be rejected.

**MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND CULTURAL

Commonwealth Scholarships in Canada, 1966

APPLICATIONS are invited for the award of scholarships offered under the Commonwealth Scholarship Plan and tenable in Canada from the beginning of the academic year commencing in mid-September, 1966.

The scholarships aim at providing opportunities for Ceylonese students to pursue advanced courses or undertake research in Canada. They are available only for post-graduate study or research. Applications for first degree courses will not be entertained.

There is no restriction of fields of study; but it should be noted that these scholarships will not be awarded to candidates who already hold a Ph.D. degree, nor will they be given for medical or dental degree or for clinical training.

The scholarships are meant for persons of good intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to the life of the country on their return after completion of the scholarship.

Note 1.—No application from a Government servant will be entertained unless the Head of his/her Department certifies in terms of Treasury Circular No. 514 of May 16, 1960, that the training provided by the scholarship is essential in connection with a project and the particulars of such project are indicated as required in that circular.

Note 2.—Applications from employees of Boards, Corporations, Universities and similar Government-aided or sponsored institutions should be sent through the Heads of respective institutions, who should be requested to complete the certificate in cage 27 of the application appropriately, when forwarding the application.

Note 3.—Each applicant should send only one application and should apply only for one course of study.

2. *Tenure.*—The duration of the scholarships will normally be two academic years and the intervening summer, except in cases where a shorter period is required to complete the required programme. In special circumstances an extension for an additional period will be granted if it is required by the scholar's programme of studies and is justified by his record.

Scholarships are, however, liable to be terminated at any time during the currency of the course at the discretion of the Canadian authorities for misconduct, irregularity in attendance, absence without permission of the authorities concerned from College or Hostel or unsatisfactory progress in studies or failure to pass examinations. In such an eventuality, the scholar might be required to return to Ceylon at his/her own expense.

3. *Eligibility.*—Candidates should—

- (i) be citizens of Ceylon;
- (ii) be not more than 35 years of age on October 1, 1966;
- (iii) if Government servants, be able to produce evidence that they have a knowledge of Sinhala of 8th standard level;
- (iv) possess at least a Second Class Degree of a recognized University, appropriate to the desired course of study. (Applications will not be accepted pending results);
- (v) possess a high proficiency in English.

Note 1.—A candidate who has entered into a bond or agreement to serve the Government or in a Board, Corporation, University or other Government-aided or sponsored institution for a specific period shall not be eligible to apply unless, by October 1, 1966, he/she has served the period specified in the bond or agreement and discharged fully the obligations entered into in the bond or agreement.

Note 2.—Government servants holding temporary appointments and those holding permanent appointments but not confirmed in their appointments, will similarly not be eligible to apply unless they are prepared to resign their posts in the event of their being selected for awards. Such willingness to resign should be specifically stated in cage 15 (d) of the application.

4. *Terms of Award.*—The scholarships will carry with them the following benefits:—

- (a) transportation to Canada and return, normally by the most direct economy air passage, as arranged by the External Aid Office;
- (b) approved tuition and other university fees (excluding board and residence);
- (c) a personal maintenance allowance at the rate of \$165.00 per month.
- (d) approved medical and hospital expenses;
- (e) a book allowances of \$100.00 in the first year of study and \$75.00 in subsequent years;
- (f) a clothing allowance of \$200.00 in the first year of study and \$10.00 per month in subsequent years;
- (g) in special circumstances an allowance for supplies not available in the university;
- (h) in special cases provision for travel within Canada up to total of \$500.00 if it is an essential part of the scholar's academic programme;
- (i) for a scholar who was married before coming to Canada and is accompanied by a spouse, a marriage allowance of \$100.00 per month while the spouse is in Canada, plus two-thirds of the cost of the spouse's fare to Canada and return as arranged by the External Aid Office. It would be desirable for married scholars bringing children to Canada to have additional financial resources.

These payments will be made only if there is adequate assurance that the scholar's spouse will be living in Canada for at least six consecutive months of the tenure of the scholarship and provided the spouse does not hold a scholarship or fellowship in Canada. If the spouse is employed, there will be a dollar for dollar reduction in the marriage allowance during the period of employment. If the spouse of a scholar wishes to seek paid employment, prior permission must be obtained from the Department of Citizenship and Immigration and from the External Aid Office;

(j) these payments are not taxable in Canada.

Note.—The grant of leave to Government servants selected for these scholarships will be governed by the Treasury and Departmental rules and regulations in force at the time.

5. *Interview.*—Eligible candidates will be required to present themselves for an interview to be held in Colombo at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses connected with this interview will be paid. They should also be prepared to produce at this interview, the originals of their certificates, birth certificate and any other documentary evidence in support of their candidature.

6. *Agreement.*—The selected candidates should, before their departure for Canada enter into Agreements with the Government of Ceylon—

- (a) undertaking among other things to pursue faithfully and diligently the prescribed course of studies and complete it satisfactorily, and to serve the Government of Ceylon, if so required, for a specific period (to be determined by Government) after completion of the course of studies; and,
- (b) undertaking to repay to the Government of Ceylon the full cost of the scholarship (i.e., all expenses incurred by the Government of Ceylon and the Awarding Agency in connection with the entire scholarship, including in the case of Government servants, salary, allowances, fees, &c.) in the event of their failure to comply with the terms and conditions of their Agreement.

7. *Medical Examination.*—Selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination, by a Special Medical Board appointed by the Government, as to their physical and mental fitness to undertake a course of studies in Canada.

8. The study proposed will not, in the case of Government servants, entitle them to enhanced emoluments or enhance their promotion prospects. In the case of others, the Government will not undertake to provide employment on their return after completion of the scholarship.

9. Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification, if the inaccuracy is discovered before selection, and to withdrawal of the award if discovered after selection.

10. A successful candidate who declines to be nominated or to accept an award, will be debarred from any other scholarship award for a period of two years.
