GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. **Allowance.**—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. **Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. **Terms of Engagement.**—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. **New Entrants to the Public Service.**—(i) The period of probation/trial of New Entrants appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) New Entrants will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956

(iii) (a) They will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) The confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend *inter alia*, on their passing within specified, periods of time graded proficiency tests in Sinhala, leading up to the level of the J.S.C. Standard. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of the increments falling due, until the passing of same. Any officer who does not pass the proficiency tests of the Junior School Certificate standards by the end of his period of probation trial will be liable to have his services terminated.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempt from passing the proficiency tests in Sinhala as a prerequisite for confirmation.

(iv) They will also be required to pass an Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in appointment.

5. **Qualifications required.**—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(ii) A candidate for any post for which the minimum educational qualification prescribed is a pass in the Senior School Certificate examination or equivalent or higher examination shall have a pass in the Sinhala language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate examination or its equivalent if he is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium. (This requirement will not apply to those officers who are in the Public Service from a date prior to January 1, 1961, and who seek appointment to other posts in the Public Service.)

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. Such officers should in addition send a duplicate thereof direct to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, to reach him on or before the closing date. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of Departments should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification, if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal, if discovered after the selection.

Unesco Fellowships for Writers

APPLICATIONS are invited for the award of Fellowships offered by UNESCO to enable creative Writers to undertake studies abroad. The number of Fellowships available for competition among all Member States is four, and as such no particular number of Fellowships has been pre-determined for any member state. The Government of Ceylon will nominate only one candidate.

These Fellowships are established to (a) provide an opportunity for creative writers to pursue their creative work abroad and acquire a direct experience of the ways of living in other countries, and (b) encourage interracial understanding and contribute towards enrichment of the cultural heritage of different peoples through the direct contacts which the holders of these Fellowships can establish with the creative artists of the other countries they visit. Special attention will be given to candidates who are interested in new methods of approach and techniques in writing.

The selected candidates must undertake to carry out literary work related to their own branch in one or more foreign countries, for the whole period of the Fellowship. They will be free to choose the country or countries they wish to visit on the condition that they know the language of the country or countries of study, or a language widely used in higher educational and cultural circles. The selected candidate should be prepared to furnish to UNESCO one or two works published.

The scholarships are meant for persons of good intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to the life of the country on their return after completion of the fellowship.

Note 1.—No application from a Government servant will be entertained unless the Head of his/her Department certifies in terms of Treasury Circular No. 514 of

16.5.60 that the training provided by the fellowship is essential in connection with a project and the particulars of such project are indicated as required in that circular.

Note 2.—Applications from employees of Boards, corporations, Universities and similar Government-aided or sponsored Institutions should be sent through the Heads of respective institutions, who should be requested to complete the certificate in cage 27 of the application appropriately, when forwarding the application.

2. *Tenure*.—The duration of the fellowship will be up to six months. The fellows in most cases will start their study abroad in October, 1966.

Fellowships are, however, liable to be terminated at any time during the currency of the course at the discretion of the UNESCO authorities for misconduct, irregularity in attendance, absence without permission of the authorities concerned from College or Hostel or unsatisfactory progress in studies or failure to pass examinations. In such an eventuality, the scholar might be required to return to Ceylon at his/her own expense.

3. *Eligibility*.—Candidates should—

- (i) be Citizens of Ceylon ;
- (ii) be not more than 45 years of age on 1.10.66 ;
- (iii) be a reputed writer ;
- (iv) possess a high proficiency in English.

4. *Applications*.—Applications should be made on a special form to be obtained from this office, and should be accompanied with :—

- (a) a list of works published ;
- (b) a statement of distinctions, awards, prizes, etc., gained as a writer ;
- (c) a general biographical account.

Note 1.—A candidate who has entered into a Bond or Agreement to serve the Government or in a Board, Corporation, University or other Government-aided or sponsored institution for a specific period shall not be eligible to apply unless, by 1. 10. 66. he/she has served the period specified in the Bond or Agreement and discharged fully the obligations entered into in the Bond or Agreement.

Note 2.—Government servants holding temporary appointments and those holding permanent appointments but not confirmed in their appointments, will similarly not be eligible to apply unless they are prepared to resign their posts in the event of their being selected for awards. Such willingness to resign, should be specifically stated in cage 15(d) of the application.

5. Terms of Award.—The scholarships will carry with them the following benefits:—

- (a) A monthly allowance fixed and paid in the currency of the country of study, according to the scale of stipends agreed by the United Nations in consultation with its Specialized Agencies.
- (b) Travel expenses.
- (c) An allowance of U.S. \$50 for the purchase of books necessary for his studies.
- (d) Incidental expenses connected with the work plan.

Note.—The grant of leave to Government servants selected for these scholarships will be governed by the Treasury and Departmental rules and regulations in force at the time.

Japanese Government Scholarships, 1966

APPLICATIONS are invited for the award of 5 post-graduate scholarships and 3 under-graduate scholarships offered by the Government of Japan for studies in the following fields:—

Science (Pure)
Engineering
Agriculture
Mercantile Marine
Fishery
Medical Science
Dentistry
Pharmacology.

The scholarships are meant for persons of good intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to the life of the country on their return after completion of the scholarship.

Note 1.—Applications for under-graduate scholarships will not be entertained from the following:—

- (a) Government servants holding permanent appointments and confirmed in their appointments.

- (b) Permanent and confirmed employees of Boards, Corporations, Universities and similar Government-sponsored or Government-aided institutions.

- (c) Those already following a course of studies at any University in Ceylon.

Note 2.—No application from a Government servant for post-graduate scholarships will be entertained unless the Head of his/her Department certifies in terms of Treasury Circular No. 514 of 16.5.60 that the training provided by the scholarship is essential in connection with a project and the particulars of such project are indicated as required in that circular.

Note 3.—Applications from employees of Boards, Corporations, Universities and similar Government-aided or sponsored Institutions should be sent through the Heads of respective institutions, who should be requested to complete the certificate in cage 27 of the application appropriately, when forwarding the application.

Note 4.—Each applicant should send only one application and should apply only for one course of study.

2. Tenure.—The duration of the scholarships will normally be 1½–2 years in the case of post-graduate studies, and 5–7 years in the case of under-graduate studies.

Scholarships are, however, liable to be terminated at any time during the currency of the course at the discretion of the Japanese authorities for misconduct, irregularity in attendance, absence without permission of the authorities concerned from College or Hostel or unsatisfactory progress in studies or failure to pass examinations. In such an eventuality, the scholar might be required to return to Ceylon at his/her own expense.

3. Eligibility.—Candidates should—

- (i) be citizens of Ceylon;
- (ii) be not more than 35 years of age on 1.4.66 in the case of post-graduate scholarships and, between 18 and 22 years of age on 1.4.66 in the case of under-graduate scholarships.

(iii) (a) For post-graduate scholarships—possess a degree of recognised University, appropriate for post-graduate studies in the desired field of study.

(b) For under-graduate scholarships—possess the following three qualifications:—

- (1) have passed the S. S. C. or G. C. E. (Ordinary) examination in six subjects (at one and the same sitting in either case) with English Language as a subject; and
- (2) have passed in Pure Mathematics and Chemistry at G. C. E. (Advanced Level), or H. S. C. or University Entrance examination; and
- (3) (i) applicants for Pure Science or Engineering should have passed in Physics at G.C.E. (Advanced Level) or H. S. C. or University Entrance Examination;

or

(ii) applicants for any of the other 6 fields of study should have passed in Biology (or in the alternative, in both Zoology and Botany) at G.C.E. (Advanced Level), H.S.C. or University Entrance Examination.

(iv) be willing to study the Japanese Language (as instruction will be through Japanese).

Note 1.—A candidate who has entered into a Bond or Agreement to serve the Government or in a Board, Corporation, University or other Government-aided or sponsored institution for a specific period shall not be eligible to apply unless, by 1.4.66, he/she has served the period specified in the Bond or Agreement and discharged fully the obligations entered into in the Bond or Agreement.

Note 2.—Government servants and employees of Boards, Corporations, Universities, etc., holding temporary appointments and those holding permanent appointments but not confirmed in their appointments, will similarly not be eligible to apply unless they are prepared to resign their posts in the event of their being selected for awards. SELECTION OF CANDIDATES FOR APPOINTMENT AS PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENTS OF POLICE—1965 NOTIFICATION

1. (a) A written qualifying examination will be held in or about January 1965, for the selection of Probationary Assistant Superintendents of Police. The posts are permanent and pensionable and selected candidates will be on probation for three years.

(b) The estimated number of vacancies to be filled is three. The Public Service Commission may omit to fill any or all the vacancies if it considers this necessary in the public interest.

2. The written qualifying examination will be held in Colombo in or about January 1966. Candidates will be notified of the exact date later.

3. *Method of Application.* (a) Candidates who possess the necessary qualifications will on application to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, be supplied with copies of the Regulations and Application Forms. Forms of application must be filled in by the applicants in their own handwriting and must reach the Secretary, Public Service Commission, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo, on or before October 22, 1965. No applications received after this date will be considered.

(b) On the Form supplied the candidate must enter full particulars regarding his career and qualifications. He must name on the Form two referees who can testify from personal knowledge to his character and ability. He must also obtain a certificate from a qualified Medical Practitioner giving his height and chest measurements and minimum eye-sight. Any special remarks as to physical development, &c., should be made in the appropriate cage of the form of application.

The Form when completed should be sent to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, accompanied by the following documents (with copies) :—

- (i) Birth Certificate, (Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code of Regulations for Assisted Schools will not be accepted);
- (ii) The educational certificate required by Section 5 (iii) below.
- (iii) Not more than four testimonials, including those from schools. At least one testimonial should be from the candidate's Director of Studies, College Tutor or Professor.

The original documents referred to above will be returned, copies being retained in the Office of the Secretary, Public Service Commission.

4. Applications from serving Government Officers who are qualified in terms of this Notification should be forwarded through the Heads of their Departments and should reach this office before the closing date for applications.

5. *Conditions of Eligibility* —

- (i) Candidates for this examination must be males and must be Ceylonese. For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- (ii) Candidates must have attained the age 22 and must not have attained the age of 26 years on August 1, 1965.
- (iii) He must be a graduate of a recognized University.
- (iv) He must be of good character.
- (v) He must be unmarried.
- (vi) He must be of a sound constitution and physically fit for service in any part of the Island.
- (vii) His minimum eye-sight must be 6/6 and 6/12 and colour vision must be normal.

A Candidate who requires the use of glasses will not be eligible.

6. *Permission to sit for written qualifying Examination.*—Candidates will be required to obtain a written nomination from the Public Service Commission to sit for the written qualifying examination. A Board specially appointed by the Public Service Commission for the purpose will advise the Commission on the grant of nomination. The Board may summon any candidate to appear before it, if necessary. The grant of such nomination will be at the absolute discretion of the Public Service Commission which will not be prepared to give reasons for any decision on any application.

7. *Scheme of Examination.*—The subjects for the written qualifying examination and the marks assigned are as follows :—

(1) Essay and Precise	150
(2) General Knowledge	150
(3) The Social, Political and Economic Development of Ceylon ..	150

Candidates will be permitted to take up these papers in either Sinhala, or Tamil or English at their option. No alteration of the linguistic medium indicated will be allowed after the closing date of applications.

Each written paper will be of two hours' duration and the syllabus will be as follows :—

Essay and Precise.—An essay to be written on one of several specified subjects and one or more passages of prose to be expressed in the candidate's own words but more succinctly. The essay will be judged on language style and arrangement as well as on the treatment of the subject.

General Knowledge.—A paper designed to test the candidate's general knowledge. No special syllabus is prescribed.

The Social, Political and Economic Development of Ceylon.—This paper relates to the Social, Political and Economic Development with special reference to modern Ceylon. No special syllabus is prescribed.

8. The written qualifying examination will be followed by—

(a) A Preliminary Interview.

(b) A Final Interview.

(i) Candidates who in the written qualifying examination reach a prescribed standard (to be determined by the Public Service Commission) will be summoned for the Preliminary Interview.

(ii) Candidates will be selected for the Final Interview by the Public Service Commission in the light of their performance at the Preliminary Interview and of their records.

(iii) The final order of merit will be determined by the Public Service Commission at the Final Interview. In making the selection the Public Service Commission will take into account the candidate's record, intelligence, character, personal fitness, general education, subsequent training and experience, if any, and suitability for the Police Service.

The Commissioners may at their discretion require a candidate to appear before them a second time if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

9. *Fees.*—The fee for the written qualifying examination will be Rs. 40 which should be paid before the closing date for application at the nearest Kachechi or at the General Treasury, Colombo, and credited to Revenue—Head VI, Sub-head 3, Item (4). The Kachechi or Treasury receipt should be attached to the application form.

A candidate who withdraws or absents himself from the written qualifying examination for any reason whatsoever at any time after he has been granted a nomination shall not be entitled to a refund of the whole or a portion of the fee. The full fee is returned to candidates who are not granted nominations to sit for the examination.

10. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection will disqualify such candidate.

11. *Medical Examination.*—Selected candidates will be required to undergo a medical examination as to physical fitness for service as a Police Officer in any part of the Island. No candidate will be appointed who does not pass this medical examination.

12. Reference is requested to the general conditions applicable to appointments to posts in the Public Service published at the beginning of Part I, Section II of the *Gazette*.

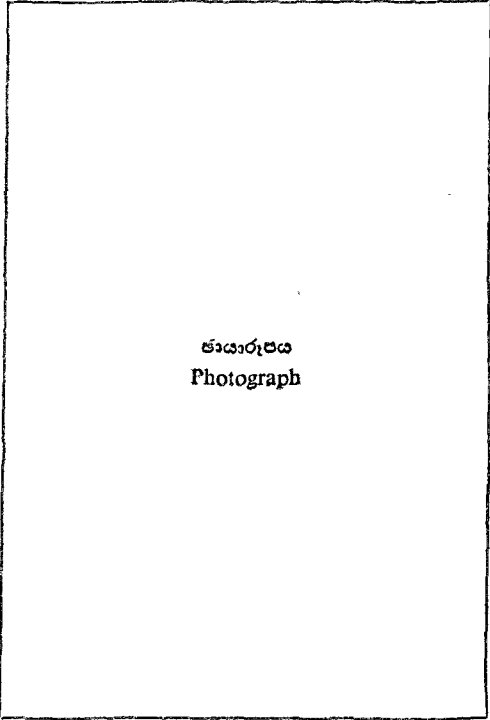
