RULES in respect of the Rest House at Hambantota made under section 4 of the Rest Houses Act (Chapter 275), by the Hambantota Urban Council, the appropriate authority in that behalf and approved by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section.

RULES

1. (1) Fees and charges at the rates set out in the Schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying any part of the rest house:

Provided that children under 12 years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rates.

- (2) No fee shall be charged in respect of the following:
- An infant in arms,
 - A servant who is in attendance on a visitor at the Rest House and sleeps within the Rest House, and
 - the chauffeur of any car garaged in Rest House premises if he sleeps in the car or in the garage.

2. (1) Every visitor shall, on his admission to the Rest House write his name and address legibly in the Rest House visitor's book.

(2) No visitor shall occupy any part of the Rest House or be supplied with refreshments until he has complied with the requirements of the preceding paragraph.

3. (1) No person shall occupy any part of the Rest House for more than three consecutive days without the written permission of the Chairman.

(2) Every occupier of the Rest House who has not obtained permission as aforesaid shall, on the expiration of three days, leave the rest house.

4. All charges paid by a visitor shall be entered by the rest housekeeper in the register kept for the purpose.

5 The Rest House charges payable by a visitor shall be paid in cash on demand, and in default of such payment the rest house-keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies to such visitor.

6. (1) No room shall be reserved for any visitor prior to his arrival unless it is engaged at least one day in advance.

(2) Where a room is reserved in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this rule, it shall be paid for, even if the person engaging it does not occupy it.

(3) Until the arrival of the person or persons for whom a room is reserved, such room shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

7. The rest house-keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

8. No bed, sofa or couch in the rest house shall be used for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon.

9. The value of all articles damaged or broken by a visitor shall be paid by the visitor in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the rest house notice board.

10. (1) Any complaint which a visitor desires to make about the resthouse or the rest house-keeper shall be noted in the complaint book kept in the rest house.

(2) It shall be the duty of the rest house-keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon to do so by any visitor.

(3) No remark or complaint about the rest house shall be written in the book in which the rest house charges are entered.

11. (1) No public lunch, dinner, garden party or other reception or function shall be held in the rest house premises except with the written permission of the Chairman, every such public lunch, dinner, garden party or other reception or function shall be conducted in such a manner as not to cause any disturbance to other visitors occupying the rest house.

(2) Where the Chairman allows the use of the whole or any part of the rest house for any of the purposes specified in sub-paragraph (1) there shall be paid to the Council—

(a) where the number of persons attending does not exceed twenty-four, a fee (in lieu of occupation charges set out in the Schedule hereto) of Rs. 15 for the first six hours, and Rs. 2 for every additional hour or part thereof, and

(b) where the number of persons attending exceeds twenty-four, occupation charges at the rates specified in the Schedule hereto.

12. A person in actual occupation of the rest house shall have a prior claim to the use of any garage or stable attached to the rest house, over persons not in occupation of the rest house.

13. The owner or hirer of a private vehicle garaged in the rest house or parked anywhere within the rest house premises shall notwithstanding that he himself has not occupied the rest house, pay the appropriate occupation fee for the period during which the vehicle is so garaged or parked, in addition to the fee for parking the vehicle or for the use of the garage.

14. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to prohibit the use of the rest house by any visitor who is convicted of a breach of any of these rules.

15. The rest house keeper shall not permit any person or persons to occupy any part of the rest house for any immoral purpose.

16. No visitor or servant of a visitor shall mis-behave or conduct himself in such a manner as to cause annoyance to other persons using the rest house.

17. No visitor shall be permitted to bring a dog to the rest house.

18. Any public servant occupying the rest house while on duty in connection with any matter appertaining to the Council, shall be charged occupation fees at half the rates specified in the Schedule hereto.

19. (1) Every trunk call originated from the rest house telephone shall be entered in the register kept for that purpose by the person making the call.

(2) Every visitor using the telephone for a trunk call shall pay the prescribed fee for trunk calls payable to the Post Office.

(3) The fees specified in paragraph (2) shall be paid to the rest house keeper in cash before the telephone is used and a receipt if desired obtained therefor.

(4) No visitor shall use the telephone unless the fees have been prepaid.

(5) A visitor desiring to make a trunk call shall give the rest house-keeper the necessary particulars together with the charges for such call.

20. Every person not in occupation of the rest house who uses the rest house telephone shall pay the personal occupation charge for the period he remains in the rest house in addition to the fee for the use of the telephone.

21. A breach of any of these rules shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

22. In these rules:

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council;

"Council" means the Hambantota Urban Council; and

"Rest house" means the Hambantota Rest house;

23. The rules or by-laws relating to the rest house at Hambantota published in *Gazette* No. 9,459 of September 14, 1945, and amended from time to time, are hereby rescinded.

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Chapter 264) and any amendments thereof, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952 and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities the payments of their pensions on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

(c) Educational and other Qualifications.—In all Schemes of Recruitment where the minimum qualification prescribed is a pass in the S. S. C. examination or equivalent or higher examination, a candidate who is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent examination.

(This requirement will not apply to those officers who have been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to February 3, 1963, and who seeks appointments to other posts in the Local Government Service.)
