THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Home Affairs by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 175) and applicable to every pilgrimage to the Digawapi Vihara in the District of Amparai.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the Digawapi Vihara (Pilgrimages) Regulations, 1965.
2. In these regulations—
 - “Government Agent” means the Government Agent of the Amparai Administrative District;
 - “Camp Area” means the area specified in the Schedule hereto; and
 - “Medical Officer” means the Medical Officer-in-charge of the Camp Area.
3. No person shall camp in any part of the area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Government Agent by a notice exhibited on the spot.
4. No person shall ease himself within the Camp Area except at a place provided for the purpose.
5. No person shall deposit any refuse whether liquid or solid, within the Camp Area, except in the place or in a receptacle provided for the purpose.
6. (1) No person shall keep any cattle for any purpose whatsoever in, or in the vicinity of the Camp Area, except at a place specially set apart as a cattle gala or at any other place reserved for the purpose by the Government Agent.
 (2) The person in charge of cattle shall cause the droppings to be removed, as soon as they are found, from the Camp Area to the nearest place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep the place occupied by cattle in a clean and sanitary condition.
7. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter the Camp Area, and no person shall bring any person suffering from any such disease into the Camp Area or aid or abet any such person to enter the Camp Area.
8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the Camp Area during the festival it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the Camp Area and to prescribe the routes and conveyances by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.
9. Every person within the Camp Area who contracts an infectious or contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease shall report the case to the Medical Officer or any other person authorised by such Medical Officer.
10. When any tank or well within the Camp Area is set apart for any specified purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use such tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is so set apart.
11. No person shall bathe within the Camp Area, except at a place specially provided for that purpose by the Government Agent.
12. The Medical Officer or any person authorised by such Medical Officer may, if he thinks it necessary, chlorinate any well within the Camp Area.
13. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated-water factory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala, or expose for sale any eatables within the Camp Area, unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. Such licence shall be issued free of charge, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer or by any person authorised by such Medical Officer.
14. (1) No person shall in the Camp Area sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer or by any person authorised by such Medical Officer.
 (2) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or the Medical Officer to seize and destroy any such food condemned as unwholesome under the provisions of paragraph (1).
15. Every person who exposes for sale any food or drink within the Camp Area shall—
 - (1) keep such food or drink, and all materials used for the preparation thereof in glass cases or in covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or wrapped or covered with clean paper or cloth, so as to protect such food or drink from contamination by flies or dust; and
 - (2) keep the premises, furniture and equipment used for the purpose of his trade in a clean and sanitary condition.
16. No person shall without the previous sanction of the Government Agent construct any booth or stall or extend any building within the Camp Area so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street or for any other purpose.
17. No person shall sell or expose for sale any commodity of any description at any place within the Camp Area other than the place set apart for the purpose by the Government Agent.
18. No person shall without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the Camp Area or within a distance of one mile from the boundaries, of such area.
19. No person shall slaughter any animal within the Camp Area.

The Digawapi Vihara Camp Area.

The area around Digawapi Vihara and bounded on the—

North : by Navakkodival Odai,

East : by Naikkayai Vadichal or Navaladi Vadichal,

South : by Thirayo Odai and bund,

West : by Navakkidival Odai, and situated in the Grama Sevaka Division of Oluvil in the D. R. O's Division of Akkaraipattu.
