#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the

Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 14 (1) of Ordinance No. 15 of 1896 it is enacted that when it appears to. the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to quarter police in such district, or, should a police force have been already established there, to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that for the reason aforesaid such district requires police or additional police, and may order police to be quartered in such district or additional police to be employed there :

And whereas it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereunto annexed it is desirable to quarter police in the said district :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that, by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein, the said district in the North-Central Province requires police, and do hereby order that a police force consisting of one sergeant and six constables be quartered in the said district, in the said North-Central Province, as from and after the First day of February, 1898, for a period of six months:

And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-eight.

HE following Rules in respect of Free Passes and Free Conveyance of Packages, &c., on the Ceylon Government Railways have been approved.

### Rules regarding Free Passes and Free Conveyance of Packages, &c., on the Ceylon Government Railways.

The following persons are authorized to travel without Pass or Ticket :---

His Excellency the Governor and suite.

The Lieutenant-Governor and Colonial Secretary.

- The General Manager of the Railways.\*
- The Engineer of Way and Works.\*
- The Locomotive Engineer.\*
- The Traffic Superintendent.\*
- The Accountant.\*

2. Persons other than the above-mentioned must only be allowed to travel on the Ceylon Government Railways if in possession of one of the following authorities prepared in accordance with the Departmental instructions :---

- (a) A numbered and properly dated printed card or paper Ticket issued at stations to the public on payment of fare.
- (b) A numbered printed Season Ticket signed by the General Manager.
- (c) A printed card or periodical Pass signed by the General Manager.
- (d) A numbered printed paper Pass on the authorized form signed by the General Manager and countersigned as issued by an authorized officer.
- (e) A printed and numbered Free Ticket (Form A 36) signed by the Booking Clerk at the issuing station.

#### ISSUE AND USE OF PASSES.

3. The Printed Card or Periodical Pass (c) is issued by the General Manager only, and entitles the holder to travel at any time within the dates and between the stations specified on the Pass. The persons entitled to hold these Passes are :----

- The Assistant Engineer of Way and Works. The District Engineers, Way and Works Department.

The Assistant Locomotive Engineer.

NOTE.—Passes in favour of District Officers will be available only within the limits of the District over which they are placed.

Card Passes must be returned to the General Manager within five days of the date of expiry.

4. A numbered printed Paper Pass (d) on the authorized form. These Passes must be signed by the General Manager, and may be issued by the Heads of Railway Departments to be mentioned, who will sign at the left-hand corner of the Pass, and will be held personally responsible for the proper issue of the Passes countersigned by them.

The General Manager only will issue Passes to-

Officers of Foreign Railways, their wives and children.

Officers and Contractors employed in the survey or construction of new railways, whose duties necessitate their travelling over the Railways.

Contractor for Clothing of Railway Staff.

Children of Railway Officials at outstations attending school.

Wives and children of Railway Officials to attend Divine Service.

Employés of the Railway Store Department.

Employés of the Railway Branch of the Auditor-General's Office.

The Engineer of Way and Works, the Locomotive Engineer, the Traffic Superintendent, and the Accountant may issue single-journey Passes to their wives and children when not travelling with them, and to the officers and subordinates of their own Department and their wives and children. The mother or sister of an unmarried man, dependent upon him and acting as his housekeeper, may be allowed the privilege of Free Passes to the same extent as allowed to the wife of a married man.

Passes may also be issued by the Traffic Superintendent once a month to the staff on the Kadugannawa Incline to enable them to obtain their provisions from either Kandy or Colombo.

These officers must not issue Passes to any persons not in their own Department.

In the absence of any of these officers an Assistant to be named by each of them may issue Passes for and on the responsibility of the said officers."

These Passes are available for a single journey only and on the date and between the stations specified on the Pass.

Exception .- These Passes, available for one month, will be issued by the Way and Works and Locomotive Engineers to workmen who are continually travelling on the business of the Railway; but they cannot be issued for a longer period than one month.

5. A printed and numbered Free Ticket (e) (Form A 36.)-These Tickets are issued at the stations, and must be signed by the Booking Clerk, who will be responsible for the production of a proper authority for the issue.

The Tickets are issued under the following circumstances only.

When a horsekeeper is travelling with a horse, or a drover with a consignment of cattle: in which case the number of the H. C. and D. Ticket for the horse or cattle must be quoted on the Free Ticket as the authority for issue, and the number of the Free Ticket issued must be quoted on the H. C. and D. Ticket as a reference.

When, owing to want of time or other reason, the Engineer of Way and Works, the Locomotive Engineer, the Traffic Superintendent, and Accountant, or officer authorized by them, is unable to issue Paper Passes for one of his subordinates to travel: in such a case the officer must give a

telegraphic or written authority to the Station Master to issue a Free Ticket, and must at the same time make out the ordinary Paper Pass to cover the journey made on the Free Ticket, and send it to the Accountant accompanied by memorandum stating the circumstances under which Free Tickets were issued.

When a warrant is produced signed by one of the under-mentioned officers and certified to be for the services stated :---

The Aide-de-Camp or Private Secretary to His Excellency the Governor, for staff, horses, carriages, &c., of His Excellency's establishment.

The Lieutenant-Governor, for his family and establishment.

The Hon. the Auditor-General, for his horse and carriage.

The Principal Civil Medical Officer, for his horse and carriage.

The Deputy Assistant Adjutant-General, for Military prisoners and their escort between Colombo and Kandy.

#### USE OF PASSES.

6. Passes can only be used by the officers or persons whose names are entered in the Passes, and within the limits of distance and time therein entered. They are not transferable.

7. Each holder of a periodical or card Pass must return it to the General Manager on ceasing to hold the office entitling him to hold the Pass, or upon going on leave necessitating the appointment of a substitute, or on expiration of the time for which the Pass was granted.

8. Each holder of a single-journey or book Pass must deliver it up at the end of his journey under the Pass, whether called upon to do so or not.

9. All Passes of every kind are to be examined by Ticket Collectors as minutely as ordinary tickets, and whenever the tickets of other passengers are examined.

10. Each holder of a Pass who is unable to produce it when travelling, and called upon to do so by a Guard, Ticket Collector, or other Railway Official entitled to ask for its production, will be required to pay full fare in precisely the same way as an ordinary passenger who is nuable to produce his ticket; and refund of the amount paid will not be made.

11. The misuse of a Pass, either by tranferring it or using it out of date or over a portion of the Railway over which it is not available, will render the user liable to instant dismissal or prosecution, as the case may be.

#### AUDIT OF PASSES.

12. A return of passes (Form A 190) must be rendered on the 5th of each month to the Railway Accountant by each officer to whom Pass Books have been issued.

13. This return will be rigidly scrutinized in the Accountant's Office and compared with the collected Passes, and it is the duty of the Accountant to investigate every case in which it appears to him that Passes have been incorrectly "returned" or issued.

14. The return when checked will be forwarded to the Auditor-General by the General Manager.

#### COLLECTION OF FREE PASSES AND FREE TICKETS.

15. Every endeavour must be made by the Staff to collect all Free Passes and Free Tickets, and the attention of Railway Officials is specially called to clause 8; and if they fail to deliver their Pass or Free Ticket at the end of their journey they will be punished.

16. Monthly Passes issued to workmen under clause 4 by the Engineer of Way and Works and Locomotive Engineer must be sent to the Accountant by these officers at the end of each month, accompanied by a memorandum.

17. All Passes and Free Tickets collected at stations must be entered on the back of the Ticket slip (A 1) in the spaces provided for this purpose.

18. Cancelled Passes or Passes not used must be sent to the Accountant not later than the day after the one on which they should have been used, otherwise they will be treated as having been used.

## FREE PASSES FOR SERVANTS AND BAGGAGE.

19. The holder of a Free Pass or Free Ticket will be entitled to the free conveyance of the same quantity of baggage as an ordinary passenger of the same class.

20. In case of the first appointment or the transfer of any officer or subordinate employed on the Railways, or on the issue of a Free Pass under rules 3 and 4, the General Manager may at his discretion issue a Pass for servants or for the carriage of a reasonable amount of baggage, furniture, or such horses and other domestic animals as are really wanted for use in addition to the allowance in the last rule.

#### GENERAL.

21. Each salaried Railway Official is entitled to six double-journey Passes per annum, and any over this number can only be issued by order of the General Manager. Daily-paid staff are not entitled to Free Passes.

entitled to Free Passes. 22. The General Manager, the Engineer of Way and Works, and the Locomotive Engineer, the Traffic Superintendent, and the Accountant may instruct Railway Officials who are only entitled to second or third class Passes to travel with them without Pass in a first class carriage, if they wish to interrogate them or communicate with them on Railway business.

## ENGINE, BRAKE VAN, AND TROLLY PASSES.

23. Only those holding a written authority to do so may travel on an engine or trolly or in a brake van.

24. These authorities may be issued as under :--

(a) To travel on the engine, by the General Manager or Locomotive Engineer.

(b) To travel on trolly, by the General Manager or Engineer of Way and Works.

(c) To travel in brake van, by the General Manager or Traffic Superintendent.

25. In addition to the special authority to travel on engine, trolly, or in brake van, the person so travelling must hold either a Ticket or Pass which would authorize him to travel on the date and over the distance covered.

#### FREE CONVEYANCE OF PACKAGES.

26. Under no circumstances whatever are packages to be forwarded by trains without being invoiced or way-billed.

27. Packages, &c., may be invoiced or way-billed "free" under the following conditions.

28. All packages, horses, carriages, or dogs belonging to the establishment or addressed to His Excellency the Governor or suite, the Lieutenant-Governor, or the General Manager of the Railways.

29. Cooked provisions for relief men on relief duty and workmen away from their homes on duty may be forwarded free.

30. Bread for the consumption of employés at outstations may be conveyed free.

31. Provisions for the staff at certain outstations will be conveyed free on special permit to be obtained from the General Manager through the Head of the Department.

32. The application must state (a) the weight and nature of provisions required per day, week, or month; (b) the station from which they are to be despatched.

33. The staff stationed at Kandy, Gampola, Nawalapitiya, Matale, Kalutara, and Galle are not allowed to have provisions conveyed free by rail.

34. The other stations above and including Kadugannawa may have their provisions sent from Kandy, and the remaining stations below Kadugannawa and including the Coast Line stations as far as Alutgama (Kalutara South excepted) may obtain their provisions from Colombo. Stations Kogoda to Gintota and Talpe to Matara may get their provisions from Galle.

Kosgoda to Gintota and Talpe to Matara may get their provisions from Galle. 35. Flowers may also be sent free by train to the Locomotive Engineer, Engineer of Way and Works, Traffic Superintendent, and Accountant.

36. Gifts of provisions, flowers, clothing, books, newspapers, and literature generally for the under-mentioned hospitals may be conveyed by rail to the stations named, if addressed to the official as specified below, and if a signed certificate stating that the contents are gifts for the use of the inmates is attached to the parcel :--

37. Articles actually required for use in the *Refreshment Car* may be booked free, and any articles belonging to the car and used by passengers in train may be returned free of charge.

38. Stores for stations from the Railway Store Department, or which are being sent for or returned from repairs, may be conveyed free.

Couplings, scotches, ball weights, and other implements in use by traffic may be sent from one station to another free of charge.

39. Engineers' Materials weighing 1 cwt. or less may be conveyed free of charge.

40. With the exceptions before stated, the Railway Staff must pay for their packages conveyed by rail, but may thereafter make application to the General Manager, through the Head of their Department, for a refund of the charges paid by them for such goods as were *boná fide* for their personal use.

The General Manager will in each case make such inquiry as he may think necessary and grant a refund at his discretion.

41. All packages, horses, carriages, and dogs conveyed free under these authorities must be invoiced or way-billed.

42. Any attempt to send packages free without invoice or way-bill will be considered an attempt to defraud, and will be dealt with accordingly.
