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PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATLON.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 23rd August, 1888, a Police Force was established in the town of Hatton for the effectual protection of person and property within the limits in the said Proclamation mentioned and described:

And whereas the said limits were altered by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by a Proclamation dated the 13th day of December, 1896:

And whereas by the 34th section of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that, for the purpose of creating a fund from which the expenses of the police payable by each town not created a municipality are to be defrayed, a tax shall be payable on the 31st day of March, on the 30th day of June, on the 30th day of September, and on the 31st day of December in every year for the quarter ending on the said days, respectively, on all houses and buildings of every description, and on all lands and tenements whatsoever within every such town, to an amount equal to such percentage on the bona fide annual value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements, as the Governor,

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with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint, except in cases where such amount shall fall below the sum of sixpence per quarter, in all which excepted cases sixpence per quarter shall be assessed and payable: Provided that such tax shall not in the aggregate exceed the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in such town as aforesaid, and which sum it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time to determine and appoint:

And whereas the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has determined and appointed that the sum necessary for the maintenance of the said Police Force in the said town of Hatton is Rs. 2,370:

Now therefore We, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and appoint that four per centum on the bond fide annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the said town of Hatton, the limits whereof were defined by the Proclamation dated the 13th day of December, 1896, shall be the percentage which the said amount of tax payable under the said 34th section of the said Ordinance shall equal for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

Given; at Batticaloa, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-eight.
