GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Chapter 284), and any amendments thereof, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities the payments of their pensions on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to Local Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

4. New-Entrant Officers.—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New-Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) "New-Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of prescribed proficiency tests in Sinhala within prescribed periods of time. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the suspension of increments and if a test is not passed within a further period of time beyond the prescribed period suspension will be converted to stoppage, such stoppage operating until the test is passed (Vide conditions relating to the implementation of the Official Language Act, published in *Gazette* No. 13,387 of 9.11.62).

(c) Educational and other Qualifications.—In all Schemes of Recruitment where the minimum qualifications prescribed is a pass in the S.S.C. examination or equivalent or higher examination, a candidate who is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent examination.

(This requirement will not apply to those officers who have been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to February 8, 1963, and who seek appointments to other posts in the Local Government Service.)

(d) **Efficiency Bars.**—New-Entrant Officers may be required to pass a prescribed Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala Language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in the appointment. Failure to pass this test will result in suspension in the first instance, stoppage in the second instance and deferment thereafter of the officer's increments.

(iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency test in Sinhala.

(v) Provisions of Local Government Service Regulations 21 and 22 will apply if the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala is not reached by the end of the period of probation/trial.

"(Conditions (iii) (a), (b) and (v) above will apply to those recruited through the Tamil/English medium.)"

Note.—The term "New-Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisements published on or after 29th January, 1960.

5. Qualifications Required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. Concessions to Ex-Servicemen.—(a) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to deduct their period of service in the Regular Force from their ages, where such deduction will enable them to be brought within the maximum age prescribed in the posts applied for.

(b) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to reduce the minimum educational standards laid down in the scheme of recruitment to any post in the Service to the next lowest examination.

7. Age Concession.—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

8. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE

Examination (English) for Recruitment to the Local Government Stenographers' Service, Lower Grade—1966

A competitive examination (English) for male and female candidates wishing to enter the Local Government Stenographers' (Lower Grade) Transferable Service will be held shortly in Colombo. The date and the place of examination will be notified later.

2. *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts of English Stenographer (Lower Grade) to serve in local authorities (other than Village Councils) on the salary scale Rs. 1,740 p.a. rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,780 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 2,940 per annum. Rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary Cost of Living allowance and a Special Living allowance at Government rates and conditions will be paid.

3. *Conditions of Service*.—(a) Male candidates, who are successful in the examination, will be appointed on 3 years' probation with effect from the date of appointment. Their posts are pensionable. Female candidates, who are successful in the examination, will be appointed on a provident fund basis in the first instance and will be on trial for a period of three years with effect from the date of appointment. They are entitled to opt to come into the pensionable establishment at any time before completing 10 years' service. The option once exercised will be irrevocable. These female candidates, who exercise this option during the period of trial, will be placed on probation thereafter, the period of probation being equivalent to that part of the three years' trial period, which they have not served.

Confirmation of candidates at the expiry of the period of probation and the continued employment at the expiry of the period of trial of female candidates who have not exercised the option to come into the pensionable establishment will be dependent on satisfactory work and conduct and on the passing of an efficiency test for which a practical examination is prescribed. Promotion over the E. B. before Rs. 2,940 will also be dependent on satisfactory work and conduct and on the passing of the test.

(b) Successful candidates who are holding permanent and pensionable posts in the Local Government Service, will be appointed on an acting basis in terms of Regulation 22(2) of the Local Government Service regulations and their confirmation in the posts will be considered at the end of the acting period. The acting period will be 6 months in the first instance.

(c) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the by-laws and the regulations of the local authority in which she/he is employed subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Cap. 264), and any other regulations framed thereunder.

(d) Candidates appointed to a Local Authority (other than a Municipal Council), will be liable to transfer within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the above Ordinance and may be posted to any station within the specified area in Ceylon. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Cap. 264), any further amendments of Ordinance and any regulations made thereunder.

(e) Successful candidates will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and, in particular, for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

4. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as and when vacancies occur.

5. *Eligibility*.—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese*.

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

(a) The London Matriculation Certificate or the Cambridge Senior Certificate or the Ceylon Senior School (English) or the Senior Domestic Science Certificate; or

(b) The Senior School (Sinhala or Tamil) Certificate together with one of the following:—

(i) A credit pass in English at the S. S. C. (Sinhala or Tamil) Examination, or at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level)—(Sinhala or Tamil Medium) Examination;

(ii) A pass in English Language at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level)—(English Medium) Examination;

(c) General Certificate of Education (Ordinary) in six subjects which should have been passed on not more than two occasions including—

(i) Sinhala/Tamil;

(ii) Arithmetic/Mathematics/Commercial Arithmetic;

(iii) English Language (credit); or

(d) The Final Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or

(e) One of the following—

(1) Cambridge Junior Certificate;

(2) J. S. C. (English) Education Department;

(3) J. S. C. (English) School approved by the Education Department;

Together with one of the following:—

(a) Higher Commercial Certificate (either section), London Chamber of Commerce;

(b) Commercial Certificate (either section), London Chamber of Commerce;

(c) Commercial Certificate (either section), Ceylon Chamber of Commerce.

Note.—APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ENTERTAINED FROM CANDIDATES WHO HAVE SAT FOR ANY OF THE EXAMINATIONS MENTIONED ABOVE. THE RESULTS OF WHICH HAVE NOT BEEN RELEASED BEFORE THE DATE OF CLOSING OF APPLICATIONS FOR THIS EXAMINATION.

(iv) Candidates must be not less than 17 years nor more than 40 years of age on September 22, 1966.

If necessary—

(a) Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilised service in the last war from their age; and

(b) Candidates, who were or are temporary Stenographers or Typists in Government Service for any continuous period of two years or more, may deduct such period of temporary service from their age provided that they were in such temporary employment on a date subsequent to April 1, 1946.

(v) Candidates should have been resident for at least three years immediately prior to September 2, 1966, within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance.

6. *Eligibility*.—Special concessions to those already in the Local Government Service—

(i) Typists in the Local Government Service who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before September 2, 1966, will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications.

(ii) Clerks in the General Clerical Class of the Local Government Clerical Service who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before September 2, 1966, will be permitted to sit for this examination irrespective of educational qualifications prescribed in para. 5(iii) (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) of this notification.

(iii) Persons holding permanent posts in the Local Government Service on September 2, 1966, and persons in the permanent employment of a local authority and temporary clerks in Local Authorities with not less than 2 years' satisfactory service on September 2, 1966, will be permitted to sit for this examination irrespective of educational qualifications prescribed in para. 5(iii) (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) of this notification.

7. Trolley Bus Drivers and Conductors who were in the service of the Passenger Transport Department of the Colombo M. C. and retired for abolition of office, are eligible to sit for this examination, provided they possess the qualifications prescribed in para. 5(iii) (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) of this notification and are not over 50 years of age on September 2, 1966.

8. *Applications*.—(i) Application forms for admission to the examination may be obtained from the office of Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29 1/5, (First Floor), Gaffoor Building, Fort, Colombo, from September 7, 1966.

Every person who applies by post for an entry form for this examination is required to send along with his application a self-addressed long envelope with the name of the examination written on the top left-hand corner of it, so that the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, may despatch the forms expeditiously to applicants.

(ii) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on or before September 22, 1966. Any application received after that date will be rejected. The name of the examination should be clearly written on the top left-hand corner of the envelope.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 15.

(iv) Candidates who are already employed in Government Service or Local Government Service must forward their applications through the Head of the Department/Local Authority in which they work. If any candidate fails to do so, he/she will be regarded as disqualified. Candidates are requested to forward

their applications to the Heads of the Departments/Local Authorities, well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, on or before September 22, 1966.
