**Award**

This is an award under section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (Revised Edition, 1956) as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957 and 4 of 1962. It relates to an industrial dispute between The Eksath Engineru Saha Samanya Kamkaru Samithiya and Messrs. Harrison's & Crosfield, Limited.

By his order made under section 3 (1) (d) of the aforesaid Act dated 9th October, 1964, the Commissioner of Labour referred the above dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute between the Eksath Engineru Saha Samanya Kamkaru Samithiya and Messrs. Harrison's & Crosfield, Limited is:—

“ whether the increase of 20 cents made in August, 1959, to the other Box Repairers in the Black Tea Department should be given to W. S. Perera too.”

Mr. Tilak Kulasekera, President, with Mr. C. M. K. Ariyadasa, Secretary, appeared on behalf of the Union and Mr. Naganagam, Assistant Secretary, Employers' Federation on behalf of the Company.

W. S. Perera joined the Company as a Box Repairer on 10.4.59 on a basic wage of 1.40 per day. On transfer to the Estate Tea Department in 1957, his daily rate of pay was increased to Rs. 1.80 to equate his wage with the wage of the other workmen in the Estate Tea Department. In July, 1957, he was sent to the Pool and his wage was reduced to 1.60 per day in keeping with the Wages Board rate for those engaged in repairing boxes. On representations made by the Union, his wage was restored to Re. 1.80 retrospectively.

The Union made a demand for an increase in the scale of wages for Carriers, Box Repairers and Handmen and the Company decided that Carriers only were entitled to an increase and was accordingly given an increase of 20 cents. The demand in respect of Box Repairers and Handmen, was dropped as would appear in the Company's letter of 21.6.59—(R. 4)—to the Union. In August, 1959, the Company increased the wage of all Box Repairers to Rs. 1.80 thereby standardising the wages of workers of this class and removing the anomaly of an individual Box Repairer receiving more than the others in the same class.

The Union agitated in September, 1959 that W. S. Perera should be given this further increase of 20 cents to which the Company replied by their letter of 19.9.59—(R.1)—that this increase was made to equate the wages of all Box Repairers. Paragraph 10 of the letter reads as follows:—

“ The Box Repairers were receiving Rs. 1.80 except for W. S. Perera who was receiving Rs. 1.80. The increment was given to the other Box Repairers so that they would all be receiving the same. We are not prepared to give W. S. Perera an increment which would then again give him more than the other Box Repairers.”

By letter of 10.6.60—(R. 2), the Company reiterated its earlier position. It further reiterated its position by its letter of 1.2.64—(R. 3).

According to the evidence, W. S. Perera started work as a Box Repairer and continues to this day as a Box Repairer doing the same type of work with seven other workers in the Black Tea Department. Since May, 1959, conditions of employment are governed by the Collective Agreement No. 1 which seeks to give equal pay for equal work in the same category. As far as possible an attempt had been made to standardise the wage structure.

It was argued that when a general demand is made in respect of a group of workers and that demand is conceded, then the benefit of that demand should be given to all workers in the same class without discrimination. That there has been no uniformity in wages prior to the signing of the Collective Agreement there can be no doubt, and this situation was brought about by previous Mills Managers who were empowered to grant ad hoc increases to any worker at their discretion.

Mr. Ariyadasa, the Secretary of the Union, in his evidence, tried to suggest that a new class of Markers were formed in June, 1959, after the signing of the Collective Agreement, but admitted in cross-examination that a new class of markers was formed in March, 1958, and that while he received a basic wage of Re. 1.78 the other Markers received Re. 1.70. Apparently, he got this increase of 08 cents prior to the Collective Agreement. In fact, he was the General Secretary when the Collective Agreement was signed in May, 1959. He did not impress me as a truthful witness and his evidence stands contradicted by the entries in his Personal Card. I have examined this document and I see no reason to doubt the genuineness of this document. To say the least, his evidence was unconvincing and he failed to present himself for further cross-examination on the next date. I am unable to place any reliance on his evidence.

There are about 24 Box Repairers out of whom 8 Box Repairers including W. S. Perera, work in the Black Tea Department, doing the same kind of work. If it is conceded that these 8 workers do more arduous work than the other Box Repairers, then there may be some justification for an increase in wages of these 8 men. There is a wage structure in regard to workers in a particular grade. I fail to see how an individual worker could claim an increase in wage over the wages of workers of the same grade for doing the same kind of work. W. S. Perera, in his evidence, admits that he and seven others do the same kind of work in the Black Tea Department and that there has been no cut in his salary.

According to Mr. Weerakoon, Mills Manager, there is a standard rate of wages for workers in the same class doing the same kind of work. I have no doubt that an increase of 20 cents was given to the Box Repairers in 1959 to remove an anomaly. A few instances of workers in the same class receiving a higher wage, existed prior to May, 1959. About 10 men with over ten years of service in the Heavy Gang, and who were later transferred to the Carrier grade, retained the benefit of an increase of 93 cents more than the other in the Carrier grade which was the rate they originally drew as Heavy Gang, and which was the rate paid to the Heavy Gang.

There has been an instance where an individual worker received a higher wage than others in the same class. One Appuhamy was selected in June, 1961, to do tinkering work and was made permanent at Rs. 2.25 per day. The Company decided to retain Appuhamy and do away with Cooray, but later agreed to continue Cooray in employment as a general helper to Appuhamy at Rs. 2 per day. As both Appuhamy and Cooray were doing the same work, Cooray's wage was increased by 25 cents in February, 1963, to place him on the same scale of wages as that of Appuhamy.

No evidence has been led by the Union to show that the Company was actuated by malice or ill-will towards W. S. Perera. No reason has been adduced why W. S. Perera should be given a wage increase of 20 cents over the others in the Box Repairers' grade. If this wage increase is permitted, it would undoubtedly create an anomaly thereby creating a vicious circle. I hold that W. S. Perera is not entitled to receive an increase of 20 cents made in August, 1959 to the other Box Makers in the Black Tea Department.

I make award accordingly.

**Interpretation—Decision**

This matter was referred to me by the Hon. the Minister of Labour and Social Services by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (Revised Edition 1956), as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, and 4 of 1962, for settlement by arbitration.

After inquiry the parties came to a settlement and I made my Award dated the 18th June, 1965. On the 25th August, 1965, the British Ceylon Corporation made an application in terms of section 34 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon 1956, requesting an interpretation of my award dated 18th June, 1965, in so far as it concerned driver No. 558, M. Cyril, who in my award was entitled to a sum of Rs. 1,018.

After noticing both parties the inquiry was fixed for 30th September, 1965. On this date Mr. Lakshman Kadigamar instructed by Messrs. Julius & Cooray appeared in support of the application and Mr. N. Shanmugathasan represented the Union. Mr. Kadigamar submitted that according to page 102 of the proceedings it was in evidence that the said driver, M. Cyril had resigned from the Company and he had already been paid some ex gratia payment and as such he requested that the driver, Cyril's name be deleted in my award of 18th June, 1965. Mr. Shanmugathasan said that the facts were correct and he would not seriously object to driver Cyril's name being taken off the award and left the matter entirely in the hands of Court.

I have gone through the evidence at page 102 and I find that driver Cyril had already resigned. The error of including driver Cyril's name in the award was due to the fact that according to page 107 of the proceedings Mr. Kadigamar handed over to Court document marked X with all the details as requested by Court in order that I may make my award. In those particulars marked X the employer-company had by an oversight included the name of driver Cyril as one of those who should receive some compensation. As this appears to be a genuine mistake I am of opinion that Driver Cyril who had received certain payments on his resignation should not be given any relief in my award of 18th June, 1965.

I therefore delete the name of driver Cyril from my earlier award.
