THE following Report relating to Rubber Cultivation in Ceylon is published for general information.

Royal Botanic Gardens, Peradeniya, April 14, 1898.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to report that during the week ended April 2 last, I visited the plantations of Para indiarubber at Edangoda and Yattipowa made in 1890-93 by the Forest Department, and also some of the estates near Neboda, on which a considerable amount of rubber has been planted.

2. The plantations belonging to the Forest Department are in very good order, and in a year or two many of the trees will be in condition to allow of experiments in tapping being made on

them, as is much to be desired.

3. On Culloden estate near Neboda, which I have examined in most detail, thanks to the courtesy of the visiting agent, Mr. Grigson, there are about 30,000 or more trees in very fine order. The older trees were grown from seed or cuttings obtained from Henaratgoda garden. Of recent years the estate has had much seed of its own, and this year their crop is expected to greatly exceed that at the disposal of Government.

4. A finer lot of trees than those on this estate and the neighbouring estates it would be difficult to find. The oldest trees are only fourteen years old, but rival the trees twenty-one years old at Henaratgoda. This is partly due to the fact that the Culloden trees are more widely separated than those at Henaratgoda, being planted among tea at distances of about 30 feet, partly to the more favourable soil and conditions of the Kalutara District.

5. A few experimental tappings have been made on the older trees on this estate and have shown very good results, better than those obtained at Henaratgoda, on which the data of profit and loss given in the Circular recently issued by this Department were based. As at present the demand for seed m kes it more profitable to keep the trees for seed, these experiments are not being continued just now.

From what I saw of the condition of the trees and the results of these tappings, I am strongly confirmed in my previous opinion that the cultivation of rubber bids fair to prove a profitable industry in Ceylon and a useful adjunct to the larger industry of tea and cocoanut cultivation.

#### RULES of the District Committee, Buddhist Temporalities, Kandy, made under Section 12 of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1889.

Three members of the District Committee shall form a quorum.

In the absence of the Chairman, one of the members present shall be elected as Chairman for the occasion.

A member absenting himself from three consecutive general meetings shall ipso facto cease to be a member. In the event of a vacancy occurring in the Committee the remaining members shall elect a duly qualified person to fill up the vacancy.

5. The meetings of the District Committee shall be held at the office of the Committee in Kandy on the first Saturday of every month at 2.30 p.m. The Committee shall have power to meet at any other time or at any other place in the district, due notice of change of time and place being given to members.

The Chairman shall have power to convene a special meeting of the Committee by giving not less than forty-eight hours' notice in writing, and any two members of the Committee shall have power to call upon the

Chairman to convene a special meeting in any case of emergency.

7. The Committee shall appoint one of their number as Honorary Secretary, and shall employ as many clerks

and messengers as may be found necessary.

8. The Honorary Secretary shall enter in a book the business to be placed before each meeting, and shall record in another book the minutes of the proceedings of each meeting, and the minutes shall be confirmed from time to time, the Chairman signing such confirmation.

9. A copy of the minutes of the proceedings of each meeting of the Committee shall be forwarded to the

Provincial Committee within a week of such meeting.

10. Every question coming before the meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. Whenever the votes of members present happen to be equally divided, the Chairman shall, besides his vote as a member, have a casting vote.

11. Whenever a vihare shall be given in charge of a trustee, four lists of the movable property belonging to the vihare shall be made, according to the Form A hereto annexed, in the presence of the member of the District Committee for the district in which the vihare is situate, the incumbent or his duly accredited representative, and two witnesses, who, as well as the trustee, shall duly sign the lists, of which one shall be kept by the incumbent, one by the trustee, and the other two forwarded to the District and the Provincial Committees respectively.

Two lists shall be made of all furniture and utensils left in charge of the incumbent for the purpose of service and for the use of the priests. Of these lists, duly signed by the incumbent or his representative, one shall be kept by the trustee and the other forwarded to the District Committee.

- 13. Whenever a dewale shall be given in charge of a trustee, three lists shall be made in the manner prescribed in Form A in the presence of the member for the district and two witnesses. When duly signed, one shall be kept by the trustee and the other two forwarded to the District and Provincial Committees respectively. In the case of the four Dewales in Kandy, the Chairman of the District Committee of Kandy shall also be present at the preparation of
- 14. In giving the Dalada Maligawa in charge of the Deyawadana Nilame, six lists shall be made according to the Form A in the presence of five at least of a Committee composed of the Chairman of the District Committee of Kandy, member of the District Committee for the District, two Ratemahatmayas nominated by the District Committee, one of the Basanayaka Nilames of the four dewales in Kandy, the President, and a member of the Provincial Committee, and the two High Priests of Asgiriya and Malwatta Vihare. Of the six lists thus made and duly attested, one shall be kept by the Deyawadana Nilame, two by the two High Priests, and the other three shall be forwarded to

the District Cemmittee, Provincial Committee, and the Kandy Kachcheri respectively.

15. The trustees of each temple shall keep an account book according to the Form B hereto annexed, and shall, in accordance with the 22nd clause of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1889, forward a statement of accounts to the District Committee at the end of every six months. The District Committee shall have power to call for and examine

the account book kept by the trustees.

16. The trustee of each temple shall keep a register according to the Form C, wherein he shall enter such offerings made at the temple as books, images, and so forth; a copy of this book shall be forwarded to the District

Committee once in six months.

17. The trustees shall issue receipts, which shall be according to the Form D hereto annexed, and shall bear the seal of the District Committee for services rendered by tenants and for moneys received in payment of rent, &c. The counterfoils of the receipts shall be forwarded to the District Committee together with the statement of accounts rendered at the end of every six months.

18. The District Committee shall keep a book is the manner prescribed in Form E wherein the accounts of

each temple shall be entered.

19. The District Committee shall have the power, with the approval of the Provincial Committee, to authorize the trustees to pay grants in aid of temple schools, conducted in accordance with rules which shall be framed by the District Committee and sanctioned by the Provincial Committee.
