The Public Performances Ordinance

RULE made by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Public Performances Ordinance (Chapter 176).

RULE

The rules made under the Public Performances Ordinance (Chapter 176), and published in *Gazette* No. 7,004 of April 4, 1919 as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended in so far as they relate the area within the administrative limits of the Chunnakam Town Council by the substitution, for the rule A 3 thereof, of the following new rule.

“A3 (1) An applicant for a Licence for the use of any building or erection for public performances to which persons are admitted on payment, shall before such licence is issued to him, pay to the Council a fee calculated at the following rates:—

Where the number of persons for whom seating accommodation is provided does not exceed 199	10 0	100 0	500 0

(2) Annual licences may be granted only in respect of buildings or erections which, in the opinion of the Council are not constructed of inflammable materials.”

THE VILLAGE COUNCILS ORDINANCE

ORDER made by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of powers vested in him by section 5 (2) of the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257), as amended by Act No. 60 of 1961.

Order

Provision in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby made for the matters necessary to give effect to the division referred to in the Orders relating to the sub-division of Kantalai village area in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Kantalai in the Trincomalee District, published in *Gazette* No. 14,108 of July 17, 1964.

1. The Village Council of each new village area shall be the successor of the Village Council of the old village area for all such purposes of the Village Councils Ordinance, as may relate to that new village area.

2. All by-laws made under the Village Councils Ordinance by the Village Council of the old village area as are in force on January 31, 1965, shall continue in force in each new village area in so far as these by-laws relate to that new village area, and shall be deemed to have been made by the Village Council of that new village area.

3. One-fifth and four-fifths of the amount lying to the credit of the Communal Fund of the old village area on January 31, 1965, shall on February 1, 1965, be credited to the Communal Fund of the Village Council of the new village areas of Agbopura and Kantalai respectively.

4. The movable property vested in or under the control of the Village Council of the old village area on January 31, 1965, shall on February 1, 1965, be deemed to be vested in the Village Council of the new village area of Kantalai.

5. Each land, building or other immovable property vested in or under the control of the Village Council of the old village area on January 31, 1965, shall on February 1, 1965, be deemed to be vested in the Village Council of the new village area within which such land, building or other immovable property is situated.

6. All rights, debts, liabilities and obligations of the Village Council of the old village area shall, in so far as they relate to each new village area, be deemed to be transferred to the Village Council of that new village area as from February 1, 1965.

7. Liabilities of the old Village Council in respect of the contributions towards the payment of pensions to its employees,

both present and past, shall be divided in the following manner:—

(a) In respect of pensions to those employees who have been transferred out, having served in the old Village Council, in the ratio of 1:4 between the new Village Councils of Agbopura and Kantalai respectively.

(b) In respect of pensions to those now serving in the old Village Council in the ratio of 1:4 between the new Village Councils of Agbopura and Kantalai respectively.

8. All files of papers and documents maintained at the office of the Village Council of the old village area, in so far as they relate to each new village area, shall be deemed to be transferred to the Village Council of that new village area as from February 1, 1965.

9. In this Schedule "new village area", unless otherwise specified, means the village area of Kantalai or the village area of Agbopura, as the case may be, described in the Schedule to the Orders published in *Gazette* No. 14,108 of July 17, 1964.

Provision in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby made for the matters necessary to give effect to the division referred to in the Orders relating to the sub-division of Thampalakamam village area in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Kinniya in the Trincomalee District, published in *Gazette* No. 14,108 of July 17, 1964.

SCHEDULE

1. The Village Council of each new village area shall be the successor of the Village Council of the old village area for all such purposes of the Village Councils Ordinance as may relate to that new village area.

2. All by-laws under the Village Councils Ordinance made by the Village Council of the old village area as are in force on January 31, 1965, shall continue in force in each new village area in so far as these by-laws relate to that new village area and shall be deemed to have been made by the Village Council of that new village area.

3. One-half of the amount lying to the credit of the Communal Fund of the old village area on January 31, 1965, shall on February 1, 1965, be credited to the Communal Fund of each of the new village areas of Thampalakamam and Mullipothana respectively.

4. The movable property vested in or under the control of the Village Council of the old village area on January 31, 1965, shall on February 1, 1965, be deemed to be vested in the Village Council of the new village area of Thampalakamam.

5. Each land, building or other immovable property vested in or under the control of the Village Council of the old village area on January 31, 1965, shall on February 1, 1965, be deemed to be vested in the Village Council of the new village area within which such land, building or other immovable property is situated.

6. All rights, debts, liabilities and obligations of the Village Council of the old village area shall, in so far as they relate to each new village area, be deemed to be transferred to the Village Council of that new village area as from February 1, 1965.

7. Liabilities of the old Village Council in respect of the contributions towards the payment of pension to its employees, both present and past, shall be divided in the following manner:—

(a) In respect of pensions to those employees who have been transferred out, having served in the old Village Council, in the ratio 1:1 between the new Village Councils of Mullipothana and Thampalakamam.

(b) In respect of pensions of those now serving in the old Village Council, in the ratio of 1:1 between the new Village Councils of Mullipothana and Thampalakamam.

8. All the files of papers and documents maintained at the office of the Village Council of the old village area, in so far as they relate to each new village area, shall be deemed to be transferred to the office of the Village Council of that new village area as from February 1, 1965.

9. In this Schedule "new village area", unless otherwise specified, means the village area of Thampalakamam, or the village area of Mullipothana, as the case may be, described in the Schedules to the Order published in *Gazette* No. 14,108 of July 17, 1964.

THE POINT PEDRO URBAN COUNCIL

The Rest House Act

RULES made by the Point Pedro Urban Council in respect of the Resthouse at Point Pedro under section 4 of the Rest House Act (Chapter 275), and approved by the Minister of Local Government under sub-section (2) of that section.

RULES

1. No person shall occupy any portion of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days without the special authority in writing of the Chairman.

2. Consolidated occupation fees at the rates set out in the Schedule hereto shall be paid by every person who uses or occupies the resthouse or garage or parks a vehicle within the premises of the resthouse:

Provided that:

- (i) Children under 12 years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rates; and
- (ii) no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—
 - (a) an infant in arms;
 - (b) a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at the resthouse and sleeps within the resthouse; or
 - (c) the chauffeur of any car garaged in resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car in the garage.

Provided further that the Chairman may order that fees calculated at half the rates set out in the Schedule hereto shall be charged in the case of persons comprising a party of school children or students accompanied by a teacher or teachers, such party being not less than twelve in number, if he is satisfied that they are breaking journey at the resthouse in the course of an educational tour.

3. The members and the officers of the Council shall be charged for the use of the resthouse or any part thereof half the rates specified in the Schedule hereto. This concession shall also apply to the members of their families.

4. Every person using the resthouse as an office or place of business shall desist from doing so if so requested by the resthouse-keeper.

5. (1) Every visitor shall, on admission to the resthouse, legibly write his correct name and address in the resthouse visitor's book.

(2) No visitor shall be entitled to use the resthouse, or to be supplied with refreshments until he has complied with the requirements of paragraph (1) of this rule.

6. No charges other than those payable to the Council shall be entered in the resthouse book by a visitor.

7. The resthouse fees and charges shall be paid in cash on demand. In default of such payment the resthouse keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supply. A copy of the Hotel Keepers Protection Ordinance (Chapter 30), shall be exhibited, together with these rules, in some conspicuous place in the resthouse.

8. (1) No room shall be reserved for any visitor unless it is engaged at least one day in advance.

(2) When a room is so reserved, it shall be paid for even if the person engaging it does not occupy it.

(3) Until the arrival of the person or persons for whom a room is reserved, the room shall be at the disposal of any other persons requiring it.

9. The resthouse-keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegrams requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

10. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used by any visitor for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon.

11. The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by that visitor in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

12. Visitors shall be entitled to call upon the resthouse-keeper to attend on them personally. The resthouse-keeper shall wear a white coat and shall be neatly dressed when attending on visitors.

13. (1) Any complaint which a visitor wishes to make about the resthouse keeper shall be noted in the complaint book.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon to do so.

14. No visitor shall bring any dog into the resthouse.

15. (1) No public lunch, dinner, garden party or other reception shall be held in the resthouse except with the written permission of the Chairman.

(2) Where the Chairman allows the use of the whole or a part of the resthouse for any of the purposes specified in the preceding paragraph there shall be paid to the Council:—

- (a) where the number of persons attending does not exceed twenty-four, a fee of ten rupees in lieu of occupation charges for the first six hours; and one rupee for every hour or part of an hour in excess of six hours, and
- (b) where the number of persons attending exceeds twenty-four, a fee of fifteen rupees in lieu of occupation charges for the first six hours and two rupees for every hour or part of an hour in excess of six hours.

16. Persons in actual occupation of the resthouse shall have a prior claim to the use of any garage or stable attached to the resthouse over the persons not in actual occupation of the resthouse.

17. The owner or hirer of a vehicle garaged in the resthouse or parked anywhere within the premises shall, notwithstanding that he himself has not occupied the resthouse, pay the personal occupation fees for the period during which the vehicle is garaged or parked, in addition to the fee for parking the vehicle or for the use of the garage.

18. (1) Every trunk or local call originated from the resthouse telephone shall be entered in the register kept for that purpose by the person making the call.

(2) Every visitor using the telephone shall pay a fee of ten cents for each call.

(3) Every visitor using the telephone for a trunk call shall pay the prescribed fee for trunk calls payable to the Post Office in addition to the fee of ten cents referred to in paragraph (2).

(4) The fees specified in paragraph (2) and paragraph (3) shall be paid to the resthouse-keeper in cash before the telephone is used and a receipt if desired obtained therefor.

(5) No visitor shall use the telephone unless the fees have been prepaid.

(6) A visitor desiring to make a trunk call shall give the resthouse-keeper the necessary particulars. The resthouse-keeper will then ascertain the amount due for such call and ask the Post Office to make the connection.

19. Every person not in occupation of the resthouse who uses the resthouse telephone shall pay the personal occupation charge for the period he remains in the resthouse in addition to the fee for the use of telephone.

20. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to prohibit the use of the resthouse by any visitor who contravenes these rules.

21. A breach of any of these rules shall be an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

22. In these rules—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council, and
“Council” means the Point Pedro Urban Council.

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. **Allowances.**—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. **Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Chapter 264) and any amendments thereof, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. **Terms of Engagement.**—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities the payments of their pensions on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to Local Government Service in terms on section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952 published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,328 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

4. **New-Entrant Officers.**—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New-Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) "New-Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of prescribed proficiency tests in Sinhala within prescribed periods of time. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the suspension of increments and if a test is not passed within a further period of time beyond the

prescribed period suspension will be converted to stoppage, such stoppage operating until the test is passed (Vide conditions relating to the implementation of the Official Language Act, published in *Gazette* No. 13,387 of 9.11.62.)

(c) **Educational and other Qualifications.**—In all Schemes of Recruitment where the minimum qualifications prescribed is a pass in the S. S. C. examination or equivalent or higher examination, a candidate who is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent examination.

(This requirement will not apply to those officers who have been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to February 8, 1963, and who seeks appointments to other posts in the Local Government Service.)

(d) **Efficiency Bars.**—New-Entrant Officers may be required to pass a prescribed Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala Language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in the appointment. Failure to pass this test will result in suspension in the first instance, stoppage in the second instance and deferment thereafter of the officer's increments.

(iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

(v) Provisions of Local Government Service Regulations 21 and 22 will apply if the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala is not reached by the end of the period of probation/trial.

"(Conditions (iii) (a), (b) and (v) above will apply to those recruited through the Tamil/English medium.)"

Note.—The term "New-Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisements published on or after 29th January, 1960.

5. **Qualifications Required.**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. **Concessions to Ex-Servicemen.**—(a) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to deduct their period of service in the Regular Force from their ages, where such deduction will enable them to be brought within the maximum age prescribed in the posts applied for.

(b) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to reduce the minimum educational standards laid down in the scheme of recruitment to any post in the Service to the next lowest examination.

7. **Age Concession.**—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

8. **Other Requirements.**—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

(vii) Applications should be made substantially in the form appended below and should be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, and NOT personally to him.

(viii) Applications received in this office after the closing date will not ordinarily be entertained. No allegations that an application has been lost or delayed in the post can be considered. Candidates who delay their applications until the last days will do so at their own risk.

By-Laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 39 of the Ordinance, every person who has in his possession, custody or control any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman, a schedule of particulars substantially in the form set out in Schedule A hereto, which may be obtained from the office of the Council.

(2) The schedule referred to in paragraph (1) shall be filled up and sent to the Chairman on or before in respect of the year 1965 by the person liable to pay the tax under section 39 of the Ordinance, and no such Schedule shall be required from such person in respect of any subsequent year during which he is in possession, custody, or control of such vehicle or animal.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 39(2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law (1) shall without further notice, be liable:—

(a) for the year 1965, in respect of the vehicles and animals specified in that Schedule, to pay the tax on or before the day of that year; and

(b) for every subsequent year, in respect of such vehicles and animals specified in that schedule as remain in his possession, custody, or control for more than thirty days in such subsequent year to pay the tax on or before the thirty first day of March of that year.

3. If any person, after having furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1 acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule and which is liable to the tax under Ordinance, or if any person has not furnished any Schedule under by-law (1), for the first time acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, he shall within one month from the date on which he acquires, commences to keep or use such vehicle or animal, sent a written notice to the Chairman stating the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use, and further furnish a written statement of particulars, substantially in the form set out in Schedule "A" hereto.

4. Subject to the provisions of section 39(2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the written statement referred to in by-law 3, shall be liable to pay the tax, in respect of the year in which such statement is furnished and in respect of every subsequent year, for the vehicles and animals specified in that statement which are in his possession, custody, or control, within such time as may be notified to him in that behalf by Chairman.

5. Every person who after having furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, claims to be exempt under section 39(3) of the Ordinance, from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is referred to in such Schedule or statement, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption, specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

6. Every person who after having furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, ceases to possess, keep or use any vehicle or animal shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman that he has ceased to possess, keep or use such vehicle or animal.

7. On payment of the tax by any person, the Chairman or any officer authorised by him in writing shall issue to that person, in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with such distinguishing letters for the vehicles specified in Schedule "B" hereto as are appropriate to that vehicle, and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles.

8. Where any plate issued under by-law 7, becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on payment of fifty cents, to receive a fresh plate.

The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise, that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of such owner and on payment by him of sixty cents.

9. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law (7), on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

10. A plate issued under by-law 7, in respect of one vehicle shall not be affixed on any other vehicle.

11. The Chairman or any person authorised by him in writing in that behalf may, with the assistance of the Grama Sevaka or a police officer if necessary, enter any land or building between the hours of six a.m. and six p.m. to ascertain whether any person has in his possession custody or control any vehicle or animal for which the tax is payable; and the person in charge of such land or building shall afford such facilities as may be required by the Chairman or such other person for the exercise of his powers under this by-law.

12. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any person authorised by the Chairman in writing, to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road or path for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate required by by-law 7 to be affixed on such vehicle; and the driver or person in charge of such vehicle shall, on being so requested, stop the vehicle and permit the Chairman or such other person to inspect such plate.

13. The by-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals made by certain Village Councils in the Trincomalee District and published in the Gazette are hereby rescinded, in so far as those by-laws relate to the Kantalai Village area.

14. In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council;

"Council" means The Village Council of Kantalai Village area in the Trincomalee District; and,

"Ordinance" means the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257).

CONSTRUCTION OF 6th LANE, BLOEMENDHAL

Preliminary Apportionment Under Section 26 of Chapter 268 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon

WITH reference to the provisional apportionment of cost published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 14,046 of 29th May, 1964, and the Notice No. ME/DC/PS42/61 of 3/7/64, served on all owners, the Municipal Council having considered the objections in connection with the construction of 6th Lane, Bloemendhal under section 26, Chapter 268 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon, approves the revised preliminary apportionment prepared by the Municipal Commissioner, Colombo, and resolves to do some or all of the following works of construction:—
