THE TOWN COUNCILS ORDINANCE**Order under Sections 2, 5, 6 and 9**

ORDER made by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 5, 6 and 9 of the Town Councils Ordinance (Chapter 256).

ORDER

- (1) The area delimited in the First Schedule hereto shall be a town for the purposes of the Town Councils Ordinance (Chapter 256), hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance" and the administrative limits of that town shall be the limits set out in that Schedule.
- (2) The name and designation of the Town Council to be constituted under the Ordinance for the aforesaid town shall be the following:—
"Urumpirai Town Council."
- (3) The number of members of whom the Urumpirai Town Council shall consist shall be eight.
- (4) The town for which the Urumpirai Town Council is to be constituted shall be divided into eight wards as defined in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (5) The date on which the term of office of Urumpirai Town Council shall commence shall be July 1, 1967.

FIRST SCHEDULE*Limits of the Town of Urumpirai*

All that area of land situated within the parts of Uredu (Grama Sevaka Division No. 83) and Urumpirai (Grama Sevaka Division No. 84) villages in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Valikamam East in Jaffna District, Northern Province and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from a point where the eastern limit of Chunnakam Town Council meets the centre line of Chunnakam Pattur Public Works Department road eastward and north-eastward along the centre line of the said Public Works Department road to the centre of its junction with the Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westward along the centre line of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road to the centre of its junction with Vilankan lane; thence south-eastward and north-eastward along the centre line of the said lane till it meets the north-westward prolongation of the northern boundary of the property of C. Sinnathurai; thence south-eastward along the northern boundary of the said property to the western boundary of Vilankan Sudalai (Cemetery); thence south-westward along the said boundary to the western extremity of the southern boundary of Vilankan Sudalai; thence south-eastward along the southern boundary of Vilankan Sudalai to its eastern extremity; thence south-westward along the eastern boundary of the property of C. Sinnathurai to the eastern extremity of the southern boundary of the said property; thence north-westward along the southern boundary of the said property to the eastern boundary of the property of K. Nagalingam; thence South-westward along the eastern boundary of the latter-mentioned property to the eastern extremity of the southern boundary of the said property; thence westward along the southern boundary of the said property to the eastern boundary of the property of S. Thambithurai, K. Vythilingam and others; thence southward along the eastern boundary of the said property to the northern boundary of the property of T. Thambithurai; thence eastward along the northern boundary of the said property to its eastern extremity; thence southward along the eastern boundary of the said property to

the northern boundary of the property of S. Sellapah; thence eastward along the northern boundary of the said property to its eastern extremity; thence eastward along the northern boundary of the property of N. Sangarapillai, A. Thirumeni, S. Abraham, S. Arulnandan, S. Selvaratnam and V. Visuvasam to its eastern extremity; thence southward along the eastern boundary of the said property and its prolongation to the centre line of Karanthan-Achchuveli road; thence eastward and north-eastward along the centre line of the said road till it meets the north-westward prolongation of the north-eastern boundary of the property of Vaithilingam; thence south-eastward along the south-eastern boundary and southward along the eastern boundary of the said property till it meets the westward prolongation of the lane on the northern boundary of the property of K. Poopalasingam; thence eastward along the said prolongation and the northern edge of the said lane to meet a line drawn northward in alignment with the eastern boundary of the said property; thence southward along the eastern boundary and westward along the southern boundary of the said property to the eastern boundary of the property of T. Ponnampalam; thence southward along the eastern boundary of the said property and its prolongation to the centre line of Karanthan-Neerveli Public Works Department road; thence eastward and southward along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with the lane on the southern boundary of the property of S. Thuraiappah; thence westward and southward along the centre line of the said lane to the northern boundary of the property of V. Kandasamy; thence by a straight line drawn southward to the north-eastern corner of Poothavarajar Kovil Veethy; thence southward along the eastern edge of the said Veethi to the Urumpirai-Kopai Village boundary; thence south-westward along the said village boundary to the northern extremity of the eastern boundary of the property of Ledchumy, widow of N. Kasian; thence southward along the eastern boundary of the said property and its prolongation to the centre line of Manipay Kaithady Public Works Department road; thence south-eastward along the centre line of the said road till it meets the Urumpirai-Kopai village boundary, thence south-westward along the Urumpirai-Kopai village boundary to the eastern extremity of the northern boundary of Elankaddu Sudalai (Cemetery); thence south-westward along the eastern boundary of the said Sudalai (Cemetery) to its southern extremity; thence by a straight line drawn south-westward to the eastern extremity of the northern boundary of the Kopai Electoral Farm;

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westward along the north-eastern boundary and south-westward along the north-western boundary of the Kopai Electoral Farm and along the village boundary between Urumpirai and Kopai north till it meets the village boundary between Kopai north and Kopai South; thence south-westward along the village boundary between Urumpirai and Kopai South till it meets the village boundary between Urumpirai and Kondavil; thence north-westward along the last mentioned village boundary till it meets the eastern boundary of Sodan Sudalai (Cemetery); thence northward, westward and southward along the eastern, northern and western boundaries of the said cemetery till it meets the northern edge of the road from Jaffna-Palali road to the cemetery; then westward along the northern boundary of said road to the cemetery and its prolongation to the centre line of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road; thence northward along the centre line of the said road till it meets the south-eastward prolongation of the southern boundary of the property of Dr. S. Saranabala-suriyar; thence north-westward along the said prolongation and the southern boundaries of the properties of Dr. Saranabala-suriyar and K. Tharmalingam to the western extremity of the southern boundary of the latter mentioned property; thence north-westward along the western boundary of the said property to the eastern extremity of the northern boundary of K. Sinnathurai; thence westward along the

said northern boundary to the southern extremity of the eastern boundary of the property of P. Rajaratnam and others; thence north-eastward along the said eastern boundary to the centre line of the lane on the southern boundary of the property of Velupillai; thence north-westward along the centre line of the said lane to the northern extremity of the eastern boundary of A. Nagalingam; thence south-westward along the eastern boundary of the properties of A. Nagalingam, T. Thangarajah, K. Sivarajah and A. Rasiah to the centre line of the lane on the southern boundary of the property of A. Rasiah; thence north-westward along the centre line of the lane to the centre of its junction with the bye-lane on the eastern boundary of the property of S. Sivapackiam; thence southward along the centre line of the bye-lane on the western boundary of the property of A. Ponniah to a line drawn in prolongation of the southern boundary of the said property; thence westward along the said prolongation and the southern boundary of the properties of A. Ponniah, V. Nallathamby, K. Ponniah to the eastern boundary of the property of A. Chelliah; thence southward along the eastern boundary of the said property to the eastern extremity of the southern boundary of the said property; thence westward along the southern boundary of the said property and along the southern edge of Pootharayan Temple Veethy to the eastern extremity of the southern boundary of the property of M. Arumugam, thence westward along the said property crossing the Annankai-Urumpirai Public Works Department road to the eastern extremity of the southern boundary of the property of S. Chelliah; thence westward along the southern boundary of the properties of S. Chelliah, N. Seenian and others and S. Kunan to the centre line of the lane on the western boundary of the property of S. Kunan; thence northward along the centre line of the lane to a line drawn in prolongation of the northern boundary of the property of S. Thampipillai and others; thence westward along the said prolongation and the northern boundary of the said property to the northern extremity of the western boundary of the said property; thence southward along the western boundary of the said property to the centre line of the lane on the western boundary of the property of V. Seenian.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westward and northward along the centre line of the lane on the western boundary of the property of V. Seenian to the "Nadai Varambu" on the southern and the eastern boundaries of the property of M. Sinnappu and others; thence westward along the southern boundary of the said property (south of the Maddu Soothira Kinaru) to its western extremity; thence northward along the western boundary of the said property to its northern extremity; thence by a straight line drawn north-eastward to the southern extremity of the western boundary of Karunakara Pillaiyar Kovil Veethy; thence northward along the western boundary of the said Veethy crossing the lane on the northern boundary of the Temple to the southern extremity of the western boundary of the property of Sabaratna Kurukkal; thence north-westward along the western boundary of the properties of K. Ariyakuddy, V. Nagalingam, K. Nadarajah, S. Ponnathurai, S. Kanagar, V. Sellar, V. Sellathurai and K. Sellathurai and K. Rajaratnam and others to the northern boundary of the property of A. Mailvaganam; thence westward along the northern boundary of the said property and its prolongation to the centre line of the lane on the western boundary of the property; thence northward along the centre line of the said lane to the centre of its junction with the Manipay-Kaithady Public Works Department road; thence by a straight line to the southern extremity of the western boundary of the property of V. Sellathurai; thence northward along the western boundary of the properties of V. Sellathurai, S. Mailvaganam and others Sivasampoo, A. Alagaratnam, N. Marimuttu, S. Nagalingam, T. Nadarajah, S. Sinnathamby, M. Vijayarajah, Thangammah, widow of Subramaniam, V. Chellapah, S. Manicavasagar, K. Suppiah, V. Suppiah and along the eastern boundary of the property of S. Anandan and

others to the southern extremity of the western boundary of A. Thanabalasingham; thence northward along the said boundary to the western extremity of the northern boundary of the said property; thence eastward along the northern boundary of the said property to the road reservation on the east of Palmayrah Grove; thence north-westward along the centre line of the said road reservation and along the centre line of the cart track to the southern boundary of the property of S. Perumal; thence westward along the southern boundary of the said property to the southern extremity of the western boundary of the said property; thence northward along the western boundary of the said property to its northern extremity; thence by a straight line drawn north-eastward to the southern extremity of the eastern boundary of Kaithialady Cemetery; thence northward, westward and again northward along the eastern boundary of the said cemetery to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Limits of the Wards of the Town of Urumpirai
Ward No. 1—Gnanavairavar

North: By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department Road with the Church Road, south-eastward along the centre line of the Church Road to the centre of its junction with Gnanavairavar Kovil Road; thence northward along the centre line of Gnanavairavar Kovil Road to the centre of its junction with Kata-pulam Lane; thence eastward and northward along the centre line of the said lane to the centre of its junction with the bye-lane; thence eastward and southward along the centre line of the bye-lane to a line drawn westward in prolongation from the southern boundary of the property of E. Rasiah and others; thence eastward along the said line and the southern boundary of the said property to the eastern limit of the Town Council area.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southward along the eastern limit of the Town Council area to its southern extremity.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westward, south-westward and again north-westward along the southern boundary of the Town Council area to the centre line of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department Road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastward along the centre line of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 2—Kaddu Vairavar

North: By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road and Kaddu Vairavar Kovil lane eastward and southward along the centre line of the said lane and the lane on the northern boundary of the property of K. Thambiah to the northern extremity of the western boundary of C. Sabaratnam; thence southward along the western boundary of the said property to the western extremity of the southern boundary of the said property; thence eastward along the southern boundary of the said property to the western extremity of the southern boundary of the property of Ambalavanar Ratnasabapathy; thence eastward along the southern boundary of the said property to the western extremity of the northern boundary of A. Ponnuthurai; thence eastward along the said boundary to the northern extremity of the eastern boundary of the said property; thence southward along the said boundary to the centre line of Sathapulam Lane; thence eastward and northward along the centre line of the said Lane to the centre of its junction with Puthu Sudalai Lane; thence south-eastward along the centre line of the latter mentioned lane and cultivated lands to a line drawn in alignment with the centre line of the lane on the western boundary of the property to E. Rasiah and others.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southward along the northward prolongation of the centre line of the lane on the western boundary of V. Rasiah and others till it meets the northern limit of the Ward No. 1.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westward, southward and again westward and southward and north-westward along the northern limit of Ward No. 1 to its western extremity.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northward along the centre line of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 3—Karanthan

North: By a line drawn from a point where the southern boundary of Urelu village meets the centre line of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road south-eastward, north-eastward and eastward along the southern boundary of the said village till it meets the eastern limit of the Town Council area.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southward and south-westward along the eastern limit of the Town Council area to the eastern extremity of the northern boundary of Ward No. 1.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westward and northward along the northern limit of Ward No. 1 to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Ward No. 2; thence northward along the said eastern limit to the eastern extremity of the northern limit of the Ward No. 2; thence westward south-westward and north-westward along the northern limit of Ward No. 2 to its western extremity.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northward along the centre line of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 4—Urumpirai South

North: By a line drawn from a point where the western limit of the Town Council area meets the centre line of Manipay-Kaithady Public Works Department road south-eastward along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westward along the western limit of Ward No. 1 to its southern extremity.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westward along the southern limit of the Town Council area to its western extremity.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northward and north-westward along the western limit of the Town Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 5—Katphapillaiyar

North: By a line drawn from a point where the centre line of the lane on the western boundary of the property of N. Kandasamy meets the southern boundary of Urelu village eastward along the southern boundary of the said village till it meets the northern extremity of the western limit of Ward No. 3.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westward along the western limits of Wards Nos. 3, 2 and 1 to the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 4.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westward along the northern limit of Ward No. 4 till it meets the centre line of Ninalvady lane.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastward along the centre line of Ninalvady to the centre of its junction with Parayakadavai lane on the northern boundary of the property of K. Packiam; thence north-westward and northward along the said lane to the

centre of its junction with the lane on the western boundary of the property of T. Sinnadurai; thence northward along the centre line of the said lane to the southern extremity of the eastern boundary of the property of M. Sinnappu; thence north-eastward along the eastern boundary of the said property to its northern extremity; thence north-westward along the northern boundaries of the properties of M. Sinnappu, N. Manikkam, K. Shanmugam, K. Sinnathamby, K. Muththu and K. Kandiah and its north-westward prolongation to the centre line of Vannakadavai lane; thence north-eastward, south-eastward and again north-eastward along the centre line of the said lane to the centre of its junction with Katpha Pillaiyar Kovilady lane; thence north-eastward along the centre line of the said lane to the centre of its junction with the lane on the southern boundary of the property of R. Sivaguru; thence westward and northward along the centre line of the said lane to the centre of its junction with College Road; thence westward along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with the lane on the western boundary of the property of N. Kandasamy; thence northward along the centre line of the said lane to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 6—Colony

North: By a line drawn from a point where the common village boundary between Chunnakam and Iruvil meets the western limit of the Town Council area eastward along the said limit till it meets the southern boundary of Urelu village; thence eastward along the southern boundary of Urelu village to the northern extremity of the western limit of Ward No. 5.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southward along the western limit of Ward No. 5 till it meets the northern limit of Ward No. 4.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westward along the northern limit of Ward No. 4 to its western extremity.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northward along the western limit of the Town Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

Ward No. 7—Urelu East

North: By a line drawn from the centre of junction of Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road and Vilankam lane south-eastward along the eastern limit of the Town Council area to the eastern extremity of the southern boundary of Vilankan Sudalai.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westward southward, eastward and again southward along the eastern limit of the Town Council area to the northern limit of Ward No. 3.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westward, south-westward and north-westward along the northern limit of Ward No. 3 to its western extremity.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastward along the centre line of the Jaffna-Palali Public Works Department road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 8—Urelu West

North: By a line drawn from the starting point of the northern limit of the Town Council area eastward along the said limit to its eastern extremity.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westward along the eastern limit of the Town Council area to the northern extremity of the western limit of Ward No. 7; thence south-westward along the western limit of the said ward to the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 5.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westward along the northern limits of Wards Nos. 5 and 6 till it meets the western limit of the Town Council area.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastward along the western limit of the Town Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

THE ENTERTAINMENT TAX ORDINANCE

THE following resolution passed by the Village Council of the Udugoda Udasiya Pattuwa West village area in the Matale District, under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance (Chapter 267) has been approved by the Minister of Local Government and is published in terms of sub-section (2) of that section:—

Resolution

"This Council, under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance (Chapter 267), hereby imposes and levies, with effect from the date on which this resolution is published in the *Gazette*, a tax at the rates set out hereunder on payments for admission to entertainments (as defined in that Ordinance) held in the area within the administrative limits of the Council.

The provisions of paragraph (1) of the notification made under section 8 of the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257), relating to the Kudathanai village area in the Jaffna District, and published in this *Gazette* shall—

- (1) in so far as those provisions relate to any matter connected with the general election of members of the Village Council of the aforesaid village area to be held before the first day of July, 1967, come into effect on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*; and

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowances are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Chapter 264), and any amendments thereof, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities the payments of their pensions on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to Local Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

4. *New-Entrant Officers.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New-Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) "New-Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of prescribed proficiency tests in Sinhala within prescribed periods of time. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within prescribed periods will result in the suspension of increments and if a test is not passed within a further period of time beyond the prescribed period suspension will be converted to stoppage, such stoppage operating until the test is passed (Vide conditions relating to the implementation of the Official Language Act, published in *Gazette* No. 13,387 of 9.11.62).

(c) *Educational and other Qualifications.*—In all Schemes of Recruitment where the minimum qualifications prescribed is a pass in the S.S.C. examination or equivalent or higher examination, a candidate who is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent examination.

(This requirement will not apply to those officers who have been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to February 8, 1963, and who seek appointments to other posts in the Local Government Service.)

(d) *Efficiency Bars.*—New-Entrant Officers may be required to pass a prescribed Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala Language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in the appointment. Failure to pass this test will result in suspension in the first instance, stoppage in the second instance and deferment thereafter of the officer's increments.

(iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency test in Sinhala.

(v) Provisions of Local Government Service Regulations 21 and 22 will apply if the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala is not reached by the end of the period of probation/trial.

"(Conditions (iii) (a), (b) and (v) above will apply to those recruited through the Tamil/English medium.)"

Note.—The term "New-Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisements published on or after 29th January, 1960.
