The Licensing of Traders (No. 1) Regulations, 1961, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 12,575A of August 10, 1961, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended, as follows:—

NOTICE FOR GENERAL INFORMATION

Recognition of Political Parties for the Purposes of Local Authorities Elections

BY virtue of the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 27A of the Local Authorities Elections Ordinance as amended by Acts No. 9 of 1963 and No. 15 of 1965, the following parties have been recognized as political parties for the purpose of Local Elections and the following symbols have been reserved for the official candidates of these parties:—

<i>Political Parties</i>	<i>Approved Symbol of Party</i>
(1) All Ceylon Tamil Congress	.. Bicycle
(2) Ceylon Communist Party	.. Star
(3) Ilankai Tamil Arasu Kadchi	.. House
(4) Jatika Vimukthi Peramuna	.. Aeroplane
(5) Lanka Prajathanthravadi Pakshaya	.. Sun
(6) Lanka Sama Samaja Party	.. Key
(7) Mahajana Eksath Peramuna	.. Cartwheel
(8) Sri Lanka Freedom Party	.. Hand

2. Sections 27A(1), (2) and (3) are reproduced below for easy reference—

- 27A. (1) A political party shall, under and in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, be entitled to be treated as a recognized political party for the purpose of local elections.
- (2) A political party shall be entitled to be treated as a recognized political party for the purpose of local elections if, but only if, it was, at the last parliamentary general election immediately preceding such local elections, treated as a recognized political party under Parliamentary Elections Order in Council for the purpose of the provisions of section 29 of that Order relating to the deposit to be made by candidates.
- (3) Where a political party is entitled, by virtue of the operation of the provisions of sub-section (2), to be treated as a recognized political party for the purpose of local elections, the approved symbol allotted to the candidates of such party under the Parliamentary Elections Order in Council at the last parliamentary general election immediately preceding such local elections shall be deemed to be the approved symbol allotted to such party for that purpose until the date on which it ceases to be so entitled by virtue of sub-section (2).
