THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ELECTIONS ORDINANCE

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 5, 6 and 14 of the Urban Councils Ordinance (Chapter 255), and section 84 of the Local Authorities Elections Ordinance (Chapter 282), I, Murugeysen Tiruchelvam, Minister of Local Government, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke the Order published in *Gazette* No. 11,119 of May 24, 1957, as amended by the Order published in *Gazette* No. 13,692 of July 5, 1963, in so far as it relates—
 - (a) to the limits of the town of Gampola;
 - (b) to the number of members of the Gampola Urban Council and
 - (c) to the number and the limits of the wards of such Council,
- (2) order that the limits of the town of Gampola shall be as defined in the First Schedule hereto;
- (3) prescribe that the number of members of whom the Gampola Urban Council shall consist, to be twelve;
- (4) divide the town for which the Gampola Urban Council has been constituted into twelve wards with such limits as are defined in the Second Schedule hereto; and
- (5) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) to (4) of this Order shall—
 - (a) in so far as they relate to any matter connected with the general election of members to be held in the year 1967 come into effect on the date hereof; and
 - (b) in so far as they relate to any other matter, come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Gampola Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof.

FIRST SCHEDULE

LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF GAMPOLA

ALL that area of land known as Gampola Town and comprising the villages of Bebila, Gampola Town, Illawatura, Old Keerapones (Hospital Road), Polkumbura and Weegulawatte, and parts of the villages of Angammana, Bowatura, Eragoda, Gampolawela, Gadagama, Hathugoda, Kahatapitiya, Keerapone, Kobbewela, Kudanake, Kurukude, Mahara, Mariyawatte, Naranwita, Ratmalkaduwa, Sinhapitiya, Unamboowe, and Wellahagoda in Ganga Ihala Korale, Ganga Pahala Korale, Kandukara Ihala Korale and Kandukara Pahala Korale of the Uda Palatha Division in Kandy District, Central Province and bounded as follows:—

North: by a line drawn from centre of the Ambuluwawa Road above culvert No. 1/9 and eastwards along the centre line of the Punchi Pinille Ela till it meets a point at the centre of the

Ratmalkaduwa Road, and thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the Ratmalkaduwa Road till it meets a point opposite the south-western corner of the Ratmalkaduwa cemetery and north-eastwards along the southern boundary of the Ratmalkaduwa Cemetery, till it meets the Paddy Land known as Keerapone Welyaya; thence southwards along the western boundary of the said Paddy Land till it meets the Ratmalkaduwa Ela and north-eastwards along the northern boundary of Lots 12, 11, 10 and 9, in Town Survey Sheet No. L. 5/18-2 West, till it meets the centre of the Kekuladole Ela and north north-eastwards till it meets the centre line of the Hapugaspitiya Road on the culvert opposite the south-western corner of the premises known as Delgahakotuwa Watte and eastwards to a distance of 6.8 chains along the centre line of the Hapugaspitiya Road; thence north westwards until it meets the south-western corner of the Wanawasa Temple premises; thence north-eastwards along the southern boundary of the said temple premises to the centre line of the Kadugannawa Road and northwards till it meets a point opposite the south-western corner of the rubber property known as Mount Temple and claimed by Mrs. Daisy Fernando, and along the southern boundary of the said rubber property till it meets the village boundary of Unamboowa; thence south-eastwards along the said village boundary till it meets the western boundary of Lot 11 the western and northern boundaries of Lot 3, crossing the Metal Quarry Road, north-eastwards along the northern boundaries of Lots 4, 2½, 2 and 1, in Sheet No. L. 5/10-4 East, northern boundaries of Lots 1, 5, 6 and 7 and the western boundary of Lot 8 in Sheet L. 5/11-3 West, eastwards north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Liyannadeniya Ela, northwards and north-eastwards along the western and northern boundaries of Lot 19 in the said Sheet, north-eastwards along the centre line of the Irrigation Channel, the western and northern boundaries of Lot 40 and the centre line of the path which forms the western and northern boundaries of Lot 27 in Sheet No. L. 5/11-1 East, north-westwards and northwards along the centre line of the Raja Ela, south-eastwards, eastwards and southwards along the northern boundaries of Lots 1, 3 and 5 and the northern and eastern boundaries of Lot 6 in the said Sheet, eastwards along the centre line of the Raja Ela, south-eastwards along the northern boundary of Lot 9, crossing the Kandy Road, along the eastern boundary of Lot 31 in Sheet No. L. 5/11-3 East, eastern boundary of Lot 10 in Sheet No. L. 5/11-1 East and the northern boundary of Lot 37 in Sheet No. L. 5/11,3 East to the left bank of the Mahaveli Ganga; thence along a line in prolongation of the northern boundary of the said lot 37 to the centre line of the Mahaveli Ganga.

East: by a line drawn from the last mentioned point south-westwards, south-eastwards and again south-westwards along the centre line of Mahaveli Ganga to a point opposite the confluence of Angammana Oya with Mahaveli Ganga, and along the centre line of the Angammana Oya till it meets the south-eastern corner of Lot 43 in Gampola Town Survey Sheet No. L. 5/19-3 East.

South: by a line drawn from the last mentioned point south-westwards along the southern boundary of Lot 43 in Sheet No. L. 5/19-3 East, westwards, along the southern boundary of the ditch which forms the southern boundary of Lots 50, 49 and 48 in the said sheets crossing the Pusellawa Road, south-westwards and north-westwards along the southern boundary of Lot 47 in the said Sheet to the landmark at its south-western corner, thence north-eastwards, northwards, and north-westwards along the western boundary of the said Lot 47 and the

centre line of the channel which forms part of the said western boundary until it meets the centre of the culvert over the channel at the crossing of the Orwell Estate Road near the second elbow bend; thence westwards to the south-western corner of the bathing well and, westwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the stream to a point opposite the confluence of the said stream with Mahaveli Ganga and thence north-westwards along the centre line of the Mahaveli Ganga till it reaches a point opposite the confluence of Keerapona Oya with the Mahaveli Ganga; thence westwards, south-westwards and westwards along the centre line of the Keerapona Oya to the north-eastern corner of Lot 185 in Sheet No. L. 5/18-2 East; thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said Lot 185 and the eastern boundary of Lots 3 and 4 in Sheet No. L. 5/18-4 East to a point on the eastern boundary of the said Lot 4 where a line parallel to and 100 yards north of the centre line of the Recreation Ground (Weegulawatte Road) meets the said eastern boundary; thence eastwards along the said parallel line until it meets the western boundary of the premises of the old Jinaraja College; thence north-eastwards, eastwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards, north-eastwards, eastwards and south-eastwards along the paddy edge till it meets the north-eastern corner of Lot 15 in sheet No. L. 5/18-4 East and along the eastern, southern, and eastern boundaries of the said Lot 15 to a point on the western boundary of the said Lot 15 where a line parallel to and 100 yards south of the centre line of the Recreation Ground Road (Weegulawatte Road) meets the said western boundary; thence westwards along the said parallel line to the centre line of the channel which forms the eastern boundary of Lot 11 in sheet No. L. 5/18-4 East; thence south-westwards and along the centre line of the channel till it meets a point opposite the south-eastern corner of Lot 11 in the said Sheet, thence southwards, south-eastwards, south-westwards, south-eastwards along the western boundary of the Paddy Land known as Gampolawela Welyaya until it meets the centre line of the Raja Ela; thence along the centre line of the Raja Ela until it meets the stream in the bed of the abandoned tank and south-eastwards along the centre line of the said stream until it meets the centre of the culvert on Gampolawela Para and southwards till it meets a point about 8.4 chains eastwards of the junction of the Nawalapitiya Road with the Dumping Ground Road; and thence westwards along the centre line of the Dumping Ground Road crossing the Nawalapitiya Road and south-westwards to a point 10 chains from the centre of the said road.

West : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point north-westwards, northwards, north-westwards and northwards along a line parallel to and 10 Chains away from the centre of the Nawalapitiya Road till it meets the Raja Ela; thence north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Raja Ela till it meets the south-eastern corner of the Welyaya and northwards, north-westwards, north-westwards, north-eastwards, northwards, north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said Welyaya until it meets the centre line of the Channel which forms part of the western boundary of Lot 1 in Sheet No. L. 5/18-4 East; and thence northwards along the Channel till it meets the centre line of the Keerapona Oya, and westwards along the centre of the said Oya to a point opposite the confluence of the stream with the Keerapona Oya, thence, north-westwards to a distance of 6.4 Chains till it meets the centre line of the stream; and thence south-westwards, north-westwards along the said stream till it meets a point above the culvert on the Gampola-Nawalapitiya Railway line, thence south-westwards and southwards along the centre line of the Railway to a distance of about 26.4 chains till it meets a point opposite the northern boundary of the Paddy Land to the west of the railway line and westwards, north-westwards along the northern boundary of the said Paddy Land until it reaches the northernmost point of the said Paddy Land and thence to a point on the centre of the Hathugoda V. C. Road leading to the Paddy Land and westwards, and north-westwards along the centre of the said V. C. road till it meets a point on the centre line of the Kehelwatta Road; thence westwards to meet the north-eastern corner of the Hathugoda cemetery and westwards along the northern boundary of the Hathugoda cemetery and along a line extended in prolongation of the said boundary line until it meets the centre line of Dolosbage Road, thence south-westwards and westwards along the said centre line until it meets the centre of culvert No. 2/1, thence along a line drawn from the said point north-westwards until it meets the centre line of the Sinhapitiya Estate bungalow Road at the first elbow bend and northwards and north-westwards along the said centre line till it meets the next elbow bend; thence north-westwards to the centre line of the Ambuluwawa Road above culvert No. 1/6 and north-westwards north eastwards and north-westwards along the centre line of the Ambuluwawa Road till it meets a point on the centre of culvert No. 1/9.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Limits of the Wards of the Town of Gampola

WARD No. 1—KAHATAPITIYA

North : By a line drawn from the northern limit of the Urban Council area where the said limit meets the centre line of the Unambuwa Ela north-eastwards, northwards, eastwards, southwards and south-eastwards along the said northern limit to the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga until it meets the centre of the confluence of the Unambuwa Ela with the said Mahaweli Ganga.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards and north-westwards along the centre line of the Unambuwa Ela until it meets the centre line of the Kandy Road.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of the Unambuwa Ela to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD No. 2—ILLAWATURA

North : By a line drawn from the centre of the bridge on the Kandy Road over the Unambuwa Ela south-eastwards and north-eastwards along the centre line of the Unambuwa Ela to the centre of its confluence with the Mahaweli Ganga.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga to the centre of its confluence with Angammana Oya.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga until it meets the centre of the bridge on the Nuwara Eliya Road over the said Mahaweli Ganga.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards, north-eastwards and in north-westwards along the centre line of the Nuwara Eliya Road and the new Kandy Road to the centre of the junction of the New Kandy Road and the Kandy Road; thence north-eastwards along the centre line of the Kandy Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

WARD No. 3—POLKUMBURA

North : By a line drawn from a point on the northern limit of the Urban Council area at the north-western corner of lot 3 in Gampola Town Survey Sheet No. L. 5/10-4 East, north-eastwards along the said northern limit until it meets the centre line of the Unambuwa Ela.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the centre line of the Unambuwa Ela to the centre of the bridge on the Kandy Road over the said Ela; thence south-westwards along the centre line of the Kandy Road to the centre of its junction with the Kadugannawa Road.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of the Kadugannawa Road until it meets the northern limit of the Urban Council area.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards, eastwards, south-eastwards and north-eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD No. 4—CIRCULAR

North : By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of the Kandy Road and the New Kandy south-eastwards along the centre line of the New Kandy Road to the centre of its junction with the Illawatura Road.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the New Kandy Road to the centre of its junction with the Nuwara Eliya Road.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards and north-westwards along the centre line of the Nuwara Eliya Road to the centre of its junction with the Kandy Road.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the centre line of the Kandy Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

WARD No. 5—BAZAAR

North : By a line drawn from the centre of the culvert on the Ambagamuwa Road and opposite Lot 63 in Town Survey Sheet No. L/5/18-2 East, eastwards, and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Ambagamuwa Road to the centre of its junction with the Malabar Street; north-eastwards along the centre line of the Malabar Street until it meets the centre of its junction with the Kadugannawa Road.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Kadugannawa Road to the centre of its junction with the Kandy Road; thence south-westwards along the centre line of the Kandy Road to the centre of its junction with the Nuwara Eliya Road, south-eastwards along the centre line of the Nuwara Eliya Road to the centre of its junction with the Court House Road; thence south-westwards along the centre line of the said Court House Road to the centre of its junction with the road leading to the Ferry La.ne

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards and north-westwards along the centre line of the Court House Road to the centre of its junction with the Station Road ; thence westwards along the centre line of the Station Road to the centre of its junction with the Ambagamuwa Road.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of the Ambagamuwa Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD No. 6—KEERAPONE

North : By a line drawn from the south-western corner of the Wanawasa Temple premises, south-eastwards along the centre line of the Kadugannawa Road to the centre of its junction with the Malabar Street.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the centre line of the Malabar Street to the centre of its junction with the Ambagamuwa Road ; thence north-westwards, westwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the Ambagamuwa Road until it meets the centre line of the Railway line at the level crossing.

South : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the Railway line until it meets the Railway Culvert over the Kekaladole Ela ; thence north-westwards along the centre line of the channel which forms the southern boundary of lot 14 in Gampola Town Survey Sheet No. L-5/18-2 West until it meets the northern limit of the Urban Council area.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards, north-westwards and again north-eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

WARD No. 7—SINHAPITIYE

North : By a line drawn from the centre of the Ambuluwawa Road on culvert No. 1/9 eastwards, south-eastwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards and eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area until it meets the south-eastern corner of the Ratmalkaduwa cemetery.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards, south-westwards, eastwards, southwards, south-westwards, along the northern limit of the Urban Council area ; thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the channel, south-eastwards along the centre line of the Kekaladole Ela until it meets the centre line of the Dolosbage Road.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards, north-westwards, along the centre line of the Dolosbage Road until it meets the centre of its junction with the Ambuluwawa Road thence westwards, north-westwards, southwards and northwards, along the centre of the Ambuluwawa Road till it meets the centre of its junction with the Sinhapitiya Estate bungalow Road ; thence south-westwards along the centre of the said Estate Bungalow Road until it meets the western limit of the Urban Council Area.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards, north-westwards, northwards, north-eastwards and northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 8—BUWENAKABAHU

North : By a line drawn from the centre of the Sinhapitiya Estate Bungalow Road at its first elbow bend north-eastwards along the centre of the said Estate Bungalow Road until it meets the centre of its junction with the Ambuluwawa Road ; thence south-eastwards, southwards, north-eastwards, eastwards, south-eastwards, and eastwards along the centre line of the Ambuluwawa Road until it meets the centre of its junction with the Dolosbage Road ; thence south-eastwards and eastwards until it meets the centre of its junction with the Nawalapitiya Road.

East : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point southwards along the centre line of the Nawalapitiya Road ; until it meets the centre of the bridge on the Nawalapitiya Road ; thence south-westwards along the centre line of the Keerapone Oya, till it meets the Western limit of the Urban Council area.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards, south-westwards, north-westwards, south-westwards, southwards, westwards, north-westwards, westwards, south-westwards, and westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area until it meets the centre of the Dolosbage Road on Culvert No. 2/1.

West : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 9—GANGASIRIPURA

North : By a line drawn from the centre line of the Railway line at the centre of the culvert over Kekaladole Ela eastwards along the said centre line until it meets the centre line of the Ambagamuwa Road at the Railway level crossing ; thence southwards along the centre line of the Ambagamuwa Road to the centre of its junction with the Station Road ; thence north-eastwards along the centre line of the Station Road until it meets the centre of its junction with the Court House Road ; thence south-eastwards and north-eastwards along the centre line of the Court House Road to the centre of its junction with the Nuwara-

Eliya Road ; thence south-eastwards, north-eastwards and again south-eastwards along the centre line of the Nuwara Eliya Road to the centre of the bridge over the Mahaweli Ganga.

East : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of the Mahaweliganga to the centre of the confluence of the Keerapone Oya with the said Mahaweliganga, thence along the southern limit of the Urban Council area until it meets the south-eastern corner of Lot 11 in Sheet No. L. 5/18-4 East ; thence to a distance of 7 chains southwards along the said limit of the Urban Council area thence south-westwards to a distance of about 6 chains until it meets the north-western boundary of Lot 5 in P. Plan No. A. 1468 and southwards and south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said Lot 5 until it meets the centre line of the Resettlement Scheme Approach Road.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of the Resettlement Scheme Approach Road (which divides the Urban Council Housing Scheme area from the National Housing Scheme area) to the centre of its junction with the Nawalapitiya Road ; thence northwards along the centre line of the Nawalapitiya Road until it meets the centre of its junction with the Approach Road to the Central College and westwards along the centre line of the said road until it meets the western limit of the Urban Council area.

West : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point northwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards until it meets the centre line of the Keerapone Oya, thence north-eastwards along the centre line of the Keerapone Oya to the centre of the bridge on the Nawalapitiya Road ; thence northwards along the centre line of the Nawalapitiya Road to the centre of its junction with the Dolosbage Road ; thence westwards along the centre line of the Dolosbage Road until it meets the centre of the culvert over the Kekaladole Ela ; thence north-westwards along the centre line of the Kekaladole Ela to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

WARD No. 10—EREGODA

North : By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of the Nawalapitiya Road with the Road leading to the Resettlement Scheme Approach Road, eastwards and northwards along the eastern boundary of the Urban Council Housing Scheme land, north-westwards and northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 9 until it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point, south-eastwards, southwards, south-westwards, along the southern limit of the Urban Council area until it meets the centre line of the Raja Ela.

South : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards till it meets the centre of the culvert on the Nawalapitiya Road.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards, north-westwards and northwards along the centre line of the Nawalapitiya Road until it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD No. 11—MARIAWATTE

North : By a line drawn from a point on the western limit of the Urban Council area and opposite the end of the centre line of the Central College Approach Road and westwards along the Central line of the Central College Approach Road until it meets the centre of its junction with the Nawalapitiya Road.

East : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point southwards, south-eastwards, southwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Nawalapitiya Road until it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

South : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards to a point 10 chains from the centre of the Nawalapitiya Road.

West : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point, north-westwards, northwards, north-westwards, northwards, south-westwards, north-westwards, eastwards, northwards, north-westwards, north-eastwards and north-westwards, along the western limit of the Urban Council area, until it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD No. 12—MAHARA

North : By a line drawn from a point on the southern limit of the Urban Council area at the centre of the confluence of the Keerapone Oya with the Mahaweli Ganga northwards and north-eastwards along the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga crossing the Nuwara Eliya Road at the bridge to the point where it meets the eastern limit of the Urban Council area at the centre of the confluence of the Angammana Oya with the Mahaweli Ganga.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards, south-westwards, south-eastwards, south-westwards and southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area until it meets the south-eastern corner of lot 43 in Sheet No. L. 5/19-3 East.

South : By a line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards, northwards, westwards, south-westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point, north-eastwards, along the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga until it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 9—OLUGANTOTA

TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS

1. In these by-laws—

"Ordinance" means the Town Councils Ordinance (Chapter 256); and

"Revenue Overseer" means the Revenue Overseer of the Kinniya Town Council. The Schedule relating to tax on vehicles and animals required to be furnished under Town Council Financial Regulation No. 211 need not be furnished.

2. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 162 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the Office of the Kinniya Town Council on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of every vehicle, other than a vehicle exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, mule, bullock, or ass kept or used within the administrative limits of the Kinniya Town Council.

3. (1) On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with such of the distinguishing letters specified in the Schedule hereto as are appropriate to the vehicle and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register

of vehicles and animals. The plate issued in respect of a vehicle shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

(2) Where any plate issued under paragraph (1) becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate.

(3) Where the Chairman is satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate issued under paragraph (1) has been lost or stolen, the owner shall be entitled to receive a fresh plate on payment by him of fifty cents.

4. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the administrative limits of the Kinniya Town Council, the owner or person in charge of that vehicle shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

5. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, the Revenue Overseer, any Police Officer or any other officer authorised in writing by the Chairman to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road within the limits of the Kinniya Town Council for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate referred to in by-law 3; and the driver or the person in charge of any such vehicle shall stop that vehicle and permit the Chairman or such officer to make the inspection and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary for such inspection.

6. Every contravention of by-law 5 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.
