### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

IN terms of section 8 of the Ordinance No. 5 of 1899, I hereby give notice that the licenses for the sale by retail of opium within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo for the year commencing January 1, 1900, will be four in number. The said licenses will be put up to sale by public auction at this office at noon on Monday, November 20, 1899, and they will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinance, and on the following conditions:—

1. That the licensee shall cause to be painted or affixed in some conspicuous part of his shop his name, the number of the shop, and the words "Licensed to sell Opium by Retail."

2. That no person other than the licensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium under his license, either as agent or servant of such licensee, unless the name of such agent or servant be registered in the office of the Municipal Council with the sanction of the Chairman.

3. Wholesale licenses will be issued only to retail dealers.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, September 16, 1899, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 9, 1899.

*Present:*—The Hon. Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; and L. Creasy, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 19 last were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1898 to August 31; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Returns of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of August; and Health Officer's Report and Diary for the same month.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—

- (a) Return of tolls collected by the several collectors on behalf of the Municipal Council, to end of August.  
(b) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries visited during August.

4. Correspondence:—

*Police for Municipal purposes.*

- (a) Letter No. 51 dated August 18 from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to Chairman's letter of July 8, respecting police for Municipal purposes, and intimating that in the circumstances stated by the Inspector-General of Police in report annexed (Appendix A) His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor is unable to sanction the reduction of the charge for police.

Resolved that a copy of the report of the Inspector-General of Police be forwarded to the Government Agent (Police), and he be informed that the Council approves of the discontinuance of the Inspector's orderlies, and he be asked to send a list of the proposed revised beats by day.

- (b) Letter No. 52 dated September 5 from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding by-laws under Ordinance No. 2 of 1894 regarding burials.

7. Read letter dated September 9 from the Health Officer, in reply to Secretary's letter No. 905 of August 23, forwarding copy of resolution under Minute 2 of the Meeting held on August 19.

The Health Officer forwards letters from the Scavenging Inspector and from the Scavenging Contractor; also a return of cattle and buffaloes slaughtered since 1890.

8. Read letter dated September 11 from the Resident Electrical Engineer, in reply to Secretary's letter No. 915 of August 25, regarding a site at the head of the lake for the transformer sub-station, and submitting plan of ground and proposed site of building.

Resolved,—That the proposed site be approved of, provided an ornamental building be put up, the plan of which is to be submitted to the Provincial Engineer for his approval.

9. Proposed by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the meeting desires to record its sense of appreciation of the Hon. the Chairman's services to the Council during the five years of his tenure of office, and view with regret the approaching severance of his connection with the Council in consequence of retirement.

The motion was supported by Messrs. Gibbon and Vanderwall and carried unanimously.

The Chairman thanked the Councillors for the kindly expressions which had fallen from them all.

#### APPENDIX A.

##### The INSPECTOR-GENERAL OF POLICE to the Hon. the COLONIAL SECRETARY.

No. 069.

Colombo, August 12, 1899.

THE Municipal Council pays Rs. 13,000 a year, which they now request to be allowed to reduce to Rs. 10,000. This, at the rates fixed for the payment of police, would provide  $\frac{1}{2}$  inspector, 4 sergeants, and 24 constables.

From returns which I have called for I find that the division furnishes police daily for purely Municipal purposes (omitting all those furnished for such duties as the protection of the Pavilion, Colonial Secretary's house, magazine, &c., and those attending the railway station, courts &c.) as follows:—

Taken on July 16 and 17, 1899, as ordinary days, and omitting all those who were not on beat either by day or by night—

From these may be deducted one sergeant and one constable for the reserve, as possibly called on for general purposes, leaving ten sergeants and fifty constables (on the day on which the lowest number were employed) used entirely for Municipal purposes.

These would represent a cost as follows:— $\frac{1}{2}$  inspector, 10 sergeants, 50 constables, usual percentages for sick, uniform, &c., amounting to Rs. 21,592-56.

I am of opinion that the beats might be considerably reduced, especially by day. The "orderlies" to the Municipal Inspectors should be disallowed. I have always refused to allow them in Colombo, because I consider that the Municipal Inspectors should do their own work, and that it is objectionable in many ways for these officers to have a constable under their control. The dog-seizer should also be a cooly and not a constable.

I attach the return furnished by the Government Agent on which I have based my figures.

I should consider it fair that the Municipality should pay for three-fourths of the cost of police; while the Government, which pays for superior supervision, buildings, and attendance and accommodation for the sick, clerical, and store work, and work in connection with habitual criminals, should pay for one-fourth.

#### APPENDIX B.

##### By-laws made by the Municipal Council under Section 5 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1894.

(a) The corpse of every person dying within the Municipal town of Kandy shall be buried or cremated in one of the general cemeteries provided for the said town of Kandy, or in a burial ground or cremation ground duly registered as such.

(b) No person or persons shall remove, or cause, suffer, or permit to be removed the corpse of any person dying within the said town of Kandy outside the limits of the said town for the purpose of burying or cremating such corpse in any burial ground or place other than a general cemetery provided for the said town of Kandy, or a duly registered burial ground or cremation ground for the said town of Kandy. Provided that it should be lawful for the Chairman of the Municipal Council of the said town of Kandy, or in his absence the Secretary of such Council upon application made to him in that behalf, and on good and sufficient cause shown, to make order by writing under his hand that the corpse of any person named in the order may be buried or cremated in some burial ground or place outside the limits of such town. Provided further that should the said Chairman or Secretary fail within six hours of the delivery of such application to him, or to the Secretary or Sanitary Officer of the Municipal Council of the said town, to make order upon the said application, then it shall be lawful for any person to remove the corpse for burial or cremation in some burial ground or place outside the limits of such town. Proof of the delivery and time of the delivery of such notice shall be on the party making such application.

#### APPENDIX C.

##### Water Supply.—Use of Meters.

The Special Committee of the Municipal Council of Kandy, appointed on June 17 to consider and report on the petition of rate-payers, dated June 15, protesting against the fixing of meters, beg to report that from inquiries made and information obtained they find that the Special Committee appointed to consider questions connected with the water supply having ascertained that there was an excessive consumption of water recommended the purchase of a necessary supply of meters, the Special Committee being of opinion that a meter should be fixed in

each house having a private supply. The Council at their meeting in March, 1898, sanctioned the recommendation of that Special Committee, and the requisite number of meters were ordered under authority of the Council. A number of them have been fixed in various houses by order of the Special Committee on water supply, that Committee being of opinion that the terms of their appointment empowered them to do so.

Your Committee is however of opinion that no meters should have been fixed except by order of the Council, and recommend that in future each case in which it is proposed to fix a meter should be submitted to the Council for instructions. The Council have paid the cost of the meters. The charge which is made to the occupants of houses to which meters have been affixed, in proportion to the size of meter fixed, is by way of rent for their use, and to cover cost of repairs, &c. The Council is empowered by by-law No. 21, chapter XII, to make this charge.

Your Committee recommended that no charge be made for use of a meter if there is found to be no excess of consumption of water above the allowance during the quarter, and even then that no charge be made should that excess of consumption not exceed 1,000 gallons during the quarter. Under these conditions the fixing of meters will be no hardship.

The Council will remember that during last year the supply of water in the reservoir was very considerably diminished, owing to the long and unprecedented drought, and that at one time there was an apprehension that the supply would be entirely exhausted. This may occur again, and as long as the supply of water is limited, as at present in dry weather, it is necessary to prevent any waste or undue or excessive consumption of water.

Your Committee are informed that the water is turned on daily for eight hours, and not for six only as stated by the petitioners; but even in this limited time meter readings show that sixty-six per cent. of the houses that have a private supply exceeded the allowance.

## Health Officer's Report for the Month of August, 1899.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to forward my report for the month of August.

*Health.*—The health of the town and its suburbs during the period under review was satisfactory.

*Scavenging.*—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily done. The Inspector in charge of the carts reports that the full complement of carts was daily employed.

*Water Supply.*—Good and sufficient.

*Food Supply.*—Good and ample.

*Drains.*—There was an evident improvement in the condition of surface and side drains, the Superintendent of Works having ordered special gangs of coolies to attend to their cleaning and clearing. I regret I cannot say as much regarding the condition of the larger and deeper drains in the town from which the offensive smells that escaped from the manholes and other vents were unbearable. The insanitary condition of these drains will continue to be a source of danger to the public health, especially during the hot and rainless months, till they are rebuilt.

*Alleys* continue in much the same insanitary condition as they have hitherto been, and no improvement can be expected till they are taken in hand and rebuilt on approved sanitary principles.

*Market.*—Clean and well kept, save and except the vegetable stalls, which require re-construction.

*Exposing Shed and Slaughter House.*—In good order and well kept.

*Laundries.*—In good order, excepting those at Katukele and Trincomalee street.

*Dry Fish Boutiques.*—Well kept. The articles of food exposed for sale in these boutiques were sound and fit for food.

*Bakeries.*—In good condition and well kept.

*Latrines.*—Clean and well kept.

*Cooly Lines.*—In good order, except the temporary ones, which are overcrowded and badly ventilated.

### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on September 16, 1899, at 1.30 p.m.

*Present* :—The Chairman ; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; Dr. W. G. Keith ; N. Dias Abeyesinha, Esq. ; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq. ; D. G. Goonawardene, Esq.; D. C. F. Obeyesekere, Esq.; E. Coates, Esq. ; and E. Ludovici, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on August 26 last.

2. The by-laws revised by the Special Committee appointed for the purpose was brought up for consideration. On the motion of the Chairman the Council resolved itself into a Committee of the whole Council.

The Committee proceeded to consider the by-laws in regular order taking clause by clause. The following amendments were made :—

To chapter I. was added the following :—

(3) The following officers are hereby created : 1, Secretary, Municipal Council ; 2, Sanitary Officer ; 3, Superintendent of Works.

In chapter II., by-law 12, the words "by leave of Council" were deleted.

In chapter IV., by-law 4, the word "or" in line 14 was substituted for "and."

In chapter V., by-law 6, line 4, the words coming after the word "necessary" to the end of the word "order" were omitted.

In chapter VI., by-law 24, the words "not exceeding" were substituted for the word "of" in line 9, and in by-laws 21 and 23 "5" was changed into "9."

In chapter VII., by-law 16, the words "address of the" were inserted before the word "claimant" in line 7, and in by-law 20 the word "Secretary" was substituted for the word "Chairman," and the words "in addition to the stamp duty" were deleted.

In chapter VIII., by-laws 1 and 2 were deleted and the word "businesses" omitted in by-law 3.

In chapter IX., by-law 1, the words "to authorize any person in writing" were inserted after the word "power" in line 11.

In chapter X., by-law 18, the words "to be credited to the Municipal Fund" were added at the end.

In chapter XI., by-law 4, in line 8, the words "the Council shall have directed" were omitted and the word "shall" substituted for the word "to" after the word "tax."

In chapter XII., by-law 1, the words "made of tin, brass, or other durable material" were omitted, and the following by-law was added to follow by-law 2 : "Every owner desirous of providing his own collar shall be allowed to obtain the Municipal stamp and number on such collar on payment of a fee of 8 cents."

In chapter XIV., by-law 1, line 16, the words "or cause to be produced" were inserted after the word "produce."

In chapter XVIII., by-law drafted by the Attorney-General under section 5 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1894, and transmitted to the Council for approval under cover of the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 27 of September 5, 1899, was submitted for by-law 1 with the omission of the words "or to the Secretary or Sanitary Officer of the Municipal Council of the said town."

In chapter XIX., by-law 6, the word "vault" was inserted after the word "grave," and the words "nor vault within six months" omitted.

In chapter XX., by-law 12, line 7, the words "by Municipal workmen" were omitted ; and in by-law 14, line 6, the words "under the supervision of the Superintendent of Works" were substituted for "by the employes of the Council." In by-law 6 the word "Police" was inserted before the word "Magistrate."

The Council resumed, when the Chairman moved "that the by-laws, as passed by the Committee of the whole Council, be approved, and that they be forwarded to Government with the request that they be embodied in an Ordinance and submitted to the Legislative Council as the Kandy by-laws were by Ordinance No. 19 of 1896.

Seconded by Mr. E. Coates.—Carried.
