GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN

- 1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.
- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.
- 3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7 1/2 per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.
- (ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.
- (iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.
- 4. New Entrants to the Public Service.—(i) The period of probation/trial of New-Entrant Officers appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be three years, unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from passing these proficiency tests in Sinhala as a pre-requisite for confirmation.

5. Qualifications required.—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

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- 2. Terms of Employment and Conditions of Service.-

The selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness, including a standard test in eye-sight, before appointment. They will also be required to enter into an Agreement and Bond to pursue faithfully and deligently a course of five years' training and to serve the Government for a period of at least 15 years after successful completion of training. The amount of the Bond is Rs. 30,000.

- (ii) The course of training will be as indicated below:—
 - (a) 36 months—to be attached to the Railway Workshops, Ratmalana, 2 months of which should be in the Drawing Office, 1 month in the Technical Office and ½ month in the Accounts Office.
 - (b) (i) 7 months—to be attached to the Steam Sheds—Dematagoda.
 - (ii) 6 months—to be attached to the Diesel Sheds—Dematagoda.
 - (iii) 3 months—to be attached to Carriage and Wagons Section at Maligawatta, including 1 month at Colombo Yard and with Depot Master, Colombo Yard.
 - (iv) 1 month—to be attached to Nawalapitiya Shed.
 - (c) 2 months—Train Control work with Controllers.
 - (d) 5 months—to be attached to Operating Superintendent's Office (Train Section), Trans Superintendent (Motive Power), Assistant Trans Superintendent (Outstations), General Manager's Office (Administrative Officer and Office Assistant) and Stores Department, Maradana. (one month in each section).
 - (e) To pass, with Merit, an examination in Railway Safety Rules and Regulations, within three years of appointment.
 - (f) To pass, with Merit, an Examination in Railway Departmental Instructions (Administrative) and in the Public Service Commission Rules, Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Financial Regulations, &c., so far as they affect the Railway Department, within four years of appointment.
 - (g) To obtain the Graduate Membership of the Institute of Mechanical Engineers, London, or equivalent, on or before completion of the five-year trial period.
 - (h) Two years—generally to act without extra remuneration, in any post or, perform any duties which will give them experience, a sense of responsibility and a broader outlook with regard to Railway work.
- (iii) The training in any particular section may be varied at the discretion of the General Manager to suit the individual needs of the trainees. Failure on the part of the trainees to satisfy any of the conditions stipulated or to obtain satisfactory reports on their work and conduct during any stage of training will result in the termination of the appointments.
- (iv) On successful completion of training and on passing the examination referred to, the trainees will be appointed Supernumerary Assistant Divisional Transportation Superintendents on the scale Rs. 5,160—3 × 360—6,240/6,960—4 × 360, 10 × 480—Rs. 13,200 per annum (with a two-year halt at Rs. 11,280 and Efficiency Bars before Rs. 6,960 and Rs. 11,280 per annum), pending vacancies in the grade of Assistant Divisional Transportation Superintendent.

3. Salary and Allowances.—The salary Scale attached to these posts is as follows:—

Rs. 4,080-360-Rs. 6,240 per annum.

Note.—The appointees will be placed on the salary scale of Rs. $5,160-3\times360-6,240/6,960-4\times360$, 10×480 —Rs. 13,200 per annum (with a two-year halt at Rs. 11,280 and Efficiency Bars before Rs. 6,960 and Rs. 11,280 per annum), on their obtaining the Graduate Membership of the Institute of Mechanical Engineers, London, or equivalent qualification. - (ii) If the candidate is selected with A. M. I. Mech. E., he will be placed on a commencing salary of Rs. 7,320 p.a. He is required to pass the Departmental Examinations prescribed at para 2 (ii) (e) & (f) above within two years of appointment.
