GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7 1/2 per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the island.

4. *New Entrants to the Public Service.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of New-Entrant Officers appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be three years, unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) All New-Entrant Officers must subscribe to the condition that they will conform to the provision of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956, and any laws and rules that now exist or may be introduced in the future for giving effect to the language policy of the Government.

(iii) (a) They should acquire a working knowledge of the Official Language—Sinhala—during their period of probation/trial, except in exceptional cases where it is not essential for the efficient discharge of their duties.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *INTER ALIA*, on their passing within specified periods of time prescribed proficiency tests in Sinhala, leading up to a level not higher than the J. S. C. standard. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of the increments falling due, until the tests are passed. The services of those officers who do not reach the requisite standard of proficiency in Sinhala by the end of their period of probation/trial will be liable to be terminated.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from passing these proficiency tests in Sinhala as a pre-requisite for confirmation.

5. *Qualifications required.*—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

FITNESS TEST FOR CONFERMENT OF TEMPORARY STATUS AND MONTHLY PAY ON DAILY-PAID CASUAL TYPISTS AND STENOGRAPHERS—SEPTEMBER, 1969

DATE of Test.—The fitness test for conferment of temporary status and monthly pay on daily-paid Casual Typists and Stenographers referred to in paragraph 5 of Treasury Circular No. 685 of March 23, 1966, will be held by the Commissioner of Examinations in Colombo, on September 9, 1969.

2. *Eligibility.*—Typists and Stenographers who have hitherto been employed by Government Departments on a casual basis on fixed daily rates of pay are eligible to take up this test provided:

- (1) They have been recruited with due authority on or before 31st December, 1965;
- (2) They possess the S. S. C. or equivalent or a higher qualification (vide notes below);
- (3) Their work and conduct have been satisfactory throughout; and
- (4) They are still in service.

Note.—(i) Where the educational qualification is the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level), an employee should have passed in at least six subjects including (1) Sinhala or Tamil or English Language and (2) Arithmetic or Elementary Mathematics or Pure Mathematics or Commercial Arithmetic, provided that passes in at least five of the six subjects, have been secured on one and the same occasion.

(ii) Casual Stenographers who have been recruited to service with the J. S. C. qualification in terms of para. 5 (v) and (vi) of Treasury Circular No. 331 of 21.11.56 are also eligible to sit this fitness test.

3. *Applications.*—A specimen form of application is attached. Candidates should prepare their own application forms on a half-sheet of foolscap paper. Only one sheet of paper should be used for the purpose. The form may be prepared on a typewriter, but it should be filled up in the candidate's own handwriting.

Applications should be sent to the Commissioner of Examinations under *registered cover* so as to reach him on or before July 5, 1969, through the Heads of Departments in which the officers are serving. When forwarding the applications to the Commissioner of Examinations, Heads of Departments should report on the officer's work and conduct and certify that he is eligible to sit the test.

(i) Taking down in shorthand, a passage dictated at 50 words per minute, for 5 minutes and transcribing the record in long-hand at 5 words a minute.

(ii) Typing a passage at a minimum speed of 15 words per minute, for 20 minutes.

English medium

(i) Taking down in shorthand, a passage dictated at 80 words per minute, for 5 minutes and transcribing the record in long-hand at 7 words per minute.

(ii) Typing a passage at a minimum speed of 30 words per minute, for 20 minutes.

5. Candidates will be bound by the rules and regulations prescribed by the Commissioner of Examinations for the conduct of examinations and will be liable to any punishment imposed by him for any breach of such rules and regulations. These rules are printed separately at the end of this notification.

6. Candidates are requested to bring their own typewriters for their use at the test. Heads of Departments may in their description, grant permission to employees of their departments who are appearing for this test, to take their office typewriters to the examination hall provided they are satisfied that the machines will be promptly and safely returned. RULES FOR CANDIDATES

Examination for the Recruitment of Pupil Teachers to serve as English Assistants in Sinhala and Tamil Medium Schools—1969

General.—A competitive examination for the recruitment of Pupil Teachers to serve as English Assistants in Sinhala and Tamil Medium Schools, will be held on the 9th September, 1969, by the Commissioner of Examinations.

The regulations stated herei have been drawn up in collaboration with the Director-General of Education.

(b) A pupil teacher who fails to pass a Teachers' Examination or to enter a Guru Vidyalaya within four (4) years shall forfeit his/her appointment after four years from the date of appointment.

(c) A pupil teacher whose work and conduct are found unsatisfactory at any time is liable to be discontinued without notice.

(d) The period of service as a pupil teacher will not be reckoned for purposes of seniority or pension.

5. *Allowance.*—A pupil teacher will be paid an allowance of Rs. 100 per mensem. He/she will receive no other emoluments.

7. *Residence Qualifications.*—All candidates should prove residence qualification within the Electoral District to which he/she applies, by one of the following :—

- (i) the birth certificate which specifies that he/she was born in the District.
- (ii) uninterrupted residence of 36 months within the Electoral District during the period 1st July 1964 to 30th June, 1969.

(A Certificate from the Grama Sewaka countersigned by the D.R.O. or a certified Householders' List is acceptable for this.)

(iii) being a registered voter of the above-mentioned Electoral District.

N.B.—In case of a married female applicant, it will be adequate if the husband satisfies sub-section (ii) above.

- (x) At the end of each paper, arrange your answer sheets carefully in the order you wrote them and fasten them closely and securely together at the left-hand top corner (and not at the right hand top corner) with the string supplied.
- (xi) You should hand over your answer-script personally to the Supervisor or to an Invigilator or remain in your seat till it is collected by one of them. Failure to do so may result in the loss of your script and in your being treated as a absent for that paper. On no account should your script be handed over to a peon or attendant.
- (xii) If you wish to speak to the Supervisor or an Invigilator or to be served with additional stationery, you should raise your hand and continue to be seated.
