GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and Temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7 1/2 per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the island.

4. *New Entrants to the Public Service.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of New-Entrant Officers appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be three years, unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) All New-Entrant Officers must subscribe to the condition that they will conform to the provision of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956, and any laws and rules that now exist or may be introduced in the future for giving effect to the language policy of the Government.

(iii) (a) They should acquire a working knowledge of the Official Language—Sinhala—during their period of probation/trial, except in exceptional cases where it is not essential for the efficient discharge of their duties.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *INTER ALIA*, on their passing within specified periods of time prescribed proficiency tests in Sinhala, leading up to a level not higher than the J. S. C. standard. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of the increments falling due, until the tests are passed. The services of those officers who do not reach the requisite standard of proficiency in Sinhala by the end of their period of probation/trial will be liable to be terminated.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from passing these proficiency tests in Sinhala as a pre-requisite for confirmation.

5. *Qualifications required.*—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(ii) A candidate for any post for which the minimum educational qualification prescribed is a pass in the Senior School Certificate examination or equivalent or higher examination shall have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate examination or its equivalent if he is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium. (This requirement will not apply to those officers who are in the Public Service from a date prior to January 1, 1961, and who seek appointment to other posts in the Public Service).

Post of Geophysicist or Geophysicist-in-Training

GEOPHYSICIST

Such published work will be evaluated by a board appointed by the Public Service Commission for promotion over the Efficiency Bar at Rs. 8,400. If the candidate possesses a post-graduate degree or equivalent or has published work in a recognised Scientific Journal at the time of selection, he will be placed on the commencing salary of Rs. 5,160 after the published work is evaluated by a board appointed by the Public Service Commission.

- (a) of excellent moral character and physically sound;

- (b) a citizen of Ceylon either by descent or by registration;
- (c) not less than 22 years and not more than 30 years on 9.10.1969.

GEOPHYSICIST-IN-TRAINING

5. *Qualifications, Terms of Engagement, Allowances and Conditions of Service:*—

- (i) If suitable candidates with the qualifications listed in para. 4 are not available for appointment as Geophysicist, candidates with the following qualifications will be considered for selection as Geophysicist-in-Training and required to obtain the B.Sc.  - (a) A graduate of a recognised University with a First or Second Class Honours in the B.Sc. (Special) degree in Physics.
 - (b) Officers of the Geological Survey Department with the following educational qualifications and with at least five years service in the Department will also be eligible for consideration for appointment as "Geophysicist-in-Training"—
 - (i) B.Sc. (General) degree with Mathematics and Physics
 - (c) Not less than 19 years and not more than 26 years of age on 9.10.1969. Applications from those already in the Public Service will be considered irrespective of the upper age limit.
- (ii) Direct recruits with a B.Sc. (Special) degree will be paid a fixed salary of Rs. 3,780 plus Cost of Living, Special Living and Rent Allowances during the period of training. Officers of the Geological Survey Department selected as Geophysicist-in-Training will continue on the salary scale of their substantive posts during the period of training. On successful completion of training, i.e., on obtaining a B.Sc. (Special) degree in Geophysics and appointment as Geophysicist they will be entitled to the salary scale referred to in paragraph 3.

CADETSHIPS IN THE CEYLON ARMY

APPLICATIONS are invited for Cadetships in the Ceylon Army. Selected candidates will be trained in Ceylon.

2. After successful completion of the period of training in Ceylon, Cadets will be commissioned as Officers in the regular force of the Army in the commencing rank of Second Lieutenant and will be posted to an Arm or Service of the Army to suit the aptitude of the Cadet and the needs of the Army.

3. *Eligibility.*—Candidates must—

- (a) be citizens of Ceylon ;
- (b) be not less than 18 years and not more than 22 years of age on October 15, 1969 ;
- (c) have passed the Ceylon General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) examination in six subjects with at least four credit passes obtained in not more than two occasions with passes in Sinhala, Tamil or English and Arithmetic or Mathematics ;

Note.—Subject to general suitability preference will be given to candidates with credit passes in PHYSICS and MATHEMATICS.

- (d) be unmarried. No Cadet will be permitted to marry whilst under training ;
- (e) conform to the required medical standard. All candidates selected for the final interview will be medically examined under Ceylon Army arrangements before such interview.

4. *Conditions of Service*—

- (a) Candidates will be enlisted as Cadets on a normal regular engagement for a period of five years with the Colours and seven years with the Reserve.
- (b) The pay of a Cadet while under training will be Rs. 2,700 per annum in terms of Regulation 16 of the Army Pay Code, 1961. He will not be entitled to any increments of pay during the period of service as a Cadet.
- (c) Cadets will be required to undergo such training in Ceylon as may be prescribed by the Commander of the Army. The period of training will be approximately eighteen months.
- (d) The status of Cadets during this period will be that of Other Ranks and they will be subject to military law.
- (e) (i) In the event of a Cadet voluntarily terminating his candidature for a Commission during his period of training the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on the Cadet's account.
(ii) If at any time during his course, a Cadet is reported by the authorities to be unsuitable for reasons of misconduct or for causes within his own control for the issue of a Commission, his parents or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred by the Ceylon Government on the Cadet's account.
- (f) On appointment to Commissions, Cadets will be discharged from the Regular Army engagement they entered into as Cadets.
- (g) On Commissioning as officers they will be expected to serve the Army for a minimum period of seven years.
- (h) Officers will be governed by the following regulations in respect of their pay, prospects and conditions of service :—

- (1) The Army Pay Code, 1961, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 12,395 dated 28th April, 1961, and as amended from time to time.

(2) Regulations for Officers, 1949, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,028 dated 10th October, 1949, and as amended from time to time.

1970 World Youth Forum—New York

APPLICATIONS are invited from pupils (both male and female) in the G. C. E. (Advanced Level) First Year classes in Government and approved schools, for selection of a delegate to the 1970 World Youth Forum to be held in New York from January to March 1970.

2. *Aims and objectives.*—Under the Forum's auspices, students from countries throughout the world visit the United States of America for active participation in programmes which include public discussions, seminars, homestays, school visits, television programmes, etc., which are designed to give the viewers of varied audiences an appreciation of the personal, intellectual and cultural background of the students taking part. They will also be given the opportunity of living with American families, observing the American educational and governmental systems, speaking for his country in public discussion and taking part in a group experience with young people from other parts of the world.

For the 1970 Forum, delegates from 30-40 countries will assemble in New York, and Ceylon is expected to send one delegate chosen through an Island-wide competition. Since each country will be sending only one delegate, the selected participant is expected to represent the best which his country can offer. The applicants should, therefore, have a very broad personal understanding of the history and customs, and the social, economic, cultural and political concern of Ceylon, and also should possess a high degree of fluency in English.

3. *Programme and Dates.*—The forum will begin with week of orientation starting January 5, 1970; it will end the 16th of March. At the end of the Forum those delegates who are returning home through Europe will stop in Geneva, Switzerland for a programme at the International agencies there from March 17-25.

4. *Benefits under the Award.*—The selected candidate will be provided with free air travel between Ceylon and New York. Food, lodging, etc., will be supplied by host families in the United States.

5. *Eligibility.*—Every applicant should—

(a) be a Ceylonese;

(b) be a pupil in the G. C. E. (Advanced Level) First Year class in a Government or approved school;

(c) be among the upper fourth of his class academically (parallel classes taken together where such exist);

(d) have been born between 30.9.51 and 1.10.53;

(e) have obtained at least a credit pass in English language at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) examination under syllabus A;

(f) be articulate and fluent in both spoken and written English;

(g) be one actively engaged in diverse extra-curricular activities;

(h) be prepared to participate in public forums and assemblies, television programmes, and classroom discussions;

(i) be well-informed and interested in world affairs; familiar with the current international problems and the way Ceylon relates to the rest of the world; curious about other people, other lands and other ways of life;

(j) be of sound character and integrity, willing to work co-operatively with others and to respect the ideas of people of different races; religious and political philosophies; sensitive to and appreciative of efforts of others on his behalf;

(k) be in excellent health, able to withstand the physical demands of three strenuous months in the United States;

(l) not be a student whose family could easily pay his passage for a visit to the United States;

(m) not have been abroad earlier; and

(n) have parents' consent to proceed to the U. S. A. if selected.

(Candidates who do not satisfy all these stipulations should not apply.)
