WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 3rd section of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1880 it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time, by Proclamation, appoint that a Census be taken at such time as shall be notified in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to proclaim that a Census shall be taken on the First day of March, 1901:

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 6 of "The Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, frame and establish such Port Rules, not inconsistent with the said Ordinance, as he may think necessary for any of the purposes in the several sub-sections of the said section specified, provided that such Port Rules shall be promulgated by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* at least one month before the same shall take effect:

And whereas the Port of Colombo was brought within the operation of the said Ordinance by a Proclamation dated the Sixth day of January, One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-six, and certain Port Rules were duly framed, established, and promulgated for the said Port of Colombo for the purposes of the said Ordinance by a Proclamation dated the Twentieth day of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four:

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 23 of 1884 it is further enacted that whenever by any law or Ordinance of this Colony power is given to "the Governor in Executive Council" or to "the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council," or to "the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council," to make any rules or regulations under such law or Ordinance, such power shall be deemed to include the power of altering, amending, adding to, or repealing any rules or regulations so made:

And whereas it is expedient that Port Rule 28 of the port rules promulgated by the said Proclamation of the Twentieth day of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four, should be repealed, and that the port rule appearing in the schedule hereto should be substituted therefor:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby promulgate the Port Rule appearing in the schedule hereto in lieu of Port Rule 28 of the Port Rules promulgated by Our said Proclamation of the Twentieth day of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four, which is hereby repealed from and after the First day of May next ensuing.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the Twenty-seventh day of July, 1897, issued under the provisions of section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," a Police Force was duly established in the town of Anuradhapura, in the North-Central Province, within the limits in the said Proclamation set out and described :

And whereas by section 34 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that for the purposes of creating a fund from which the expenses of the Police Force payable by each town not created a Municipality are to be defrayed a tax shall be payable on the 31st day of March, on the 30th day of June, on the 30th day of September, and on the 31st day of December in every year, for the quarter ending on the said days respectively, on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever within every such town to an amount equal to such percentage on the *bonâ fide* annual value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements, as the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint, except in cases where such amount shall fall below the sum of twenty-five cents per quarter, in all which excepted cases twenty-five cents per quarter shall be assessed and payable : Provided that such tax shall not in the aggregate exceed the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in such town, except as aforesaid, and which sum it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time to determine and appoint : Provided further, that buildings appropriated to religious worship and such as are placed in charge of military sentries shall be exempted from the payment of such tax :

And whereas the town of Anuradhapura aforesaid has not been created a Municipality : And whereas the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has determined and appointed that the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in the said town of Anuradhapura is Rs. 1,348-24 :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that for the purposes aforesaid the tax payable on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever in the town of Anuradhapura aforesaid, within the limits specified in the schedule to the Proclamation dated the 27th day of July, 1897, aforesaid, shall, save in such excepted cases as aforesaid, and in the case of such buildings which are exempted from the payment of such tax as aforesaid, from and after the First day of January, 1900, be at the rate of four per cent. on the *bonâ fide* annual value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements aforesaid.

- (a) The period fixed under section 7 of the said "Forest Ordinance, 1885," for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer ; and
- (b) If such claims have been made, the periods fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court ; and
- (c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the said last mentioned Ordinance have become vested in the Crown—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation :

And whereas it is expedient that the following rule, which has been transmitted by the Government Agent of the North-Western Province and approved by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall be brought into operation in the district of Wannī hatpattu, in the North-Western Province:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by virtue of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid, proclaim that the said rule relating to the extension of paddy cultivation, the irrigation and cultivation of paddy lands, and maintenance of water rights in the district of Wannī hatpattu, in the North-Western Province, has been approved by Us, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council:—

No person other than the Irrigation Inspector, or some one duly authorized by him in that behalf, shall in any way interfere with or alter the level of the spill water of any village tank.

The building situated 120 ft. to the north of the said slaughter-house is hereby appointed as the spot in which the licensed butchers of Bogawantalawa shall, as required by section 12, sub-section (1), of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, expose to public view all cattle intended for slaughter for a period of not less than twenty-four hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter.
3. No cattle shall be slaughtered at the said slaughter-house except on such days and between such hours as may be determined by the Government Agent, notice of which shall be posted at the slaughter-house, nor until after they have been inspected and approved by the District Medical Officer of Bogawantalawa as fit to be slaughtered for human food.
4. Cattle rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.
5. The said District Medical Officer may prohibit the slaughter of any animal notwithstanding that it has been approved as aforesaid, if it should before slaughter be found to be diseased or otherwise unfit to be slaughtered for human food.
6. If on any animal which has been approved as aforesaid being slaughtered the carcass shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the said District Medical Officer shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human food.

THE following rules made by the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, in reference to the public slaughter-house and to places appointed for the slaughtering of cattle in the town of Haputale, and confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, are published for general information.

RULES.

1. No person licensed to carry on the trade of a butcher shall slaughter cattle at any place within the town of Haputale other than the public slaughter-house proclaimed as such.
2. No cattle shall be slaughtered at the said slaughter-house except between the hours of 3 and 5 P.M., nor until after they have been inspected and approved by the Town Arachchi at Haputale as fit to be slaughtered for human food.
3. Cattle rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.
4. If on any animal which has been approved as aforesaid being slaughtered the carcass shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the person in charge of the slaughter-house shall bring the same to the notice of the nearest Medical Officer, who may cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human food.
5. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any cattle which have not been approved as aforesaid.
6. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the directions of the person in charge, any meat which the Medical Officer has declared to be unfit for human food.
7. The person in charge of the slaughter-house and authorized to collect the fees shall be the Town Arachchi of Haputale.
8. The fee for use of the slaughter-house and for slaughtering elsewhere shall be—

For each head of cattle	75 cents
For each sheep or goat	25 cents
9. It shall be the duty of every licensed butcher or person holding a special license under section 14 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893 within two hours to cause to be removed and buried at such places as shall be appointed by the person in charge all entrails, offal, blood, and refuse of any animal slaughtered at the slaughter-house.

10. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall keep a register in the form annexed of all cattle brought to the slaughter-house :—

11. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall require the production and delivery of all the cattle vouchers relating to all cattle brought to the slaughter-house, and shall not allow any head of cattle to be slaughtered until such vouchers have been delivered to him.
