GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointment will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Chapter 264), and any amendments thereof, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by member of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a) The Pension right of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pensions By-law or Rules of the Local Authorities the payments of their pensions on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than female officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952 published, in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

4. *New-Entrant Officers.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of “New-Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New-Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation trial.

(b) Confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of prescribed proficiency tests in Sinhala within prescribed periods of time. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within prescribed periods will result in the suspension of increments and if a test is not passed within a further period of time beyond the prescribed period suspension

(c) *Educational and other Qualifications.*—In all schemes of recruitment where the minimum qualification prescribed is a pass in the S. S. C. Examination or equivalent or higher examination a candidate who is a Sinhalese educated in the Sinhala medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent examination.

(This requirement will not apply to those officers who have been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to February 8, 1963 and who seek appointments to other posts in the Local Government Service).

(d) *Efficiency Bars.*—New Entrant Officers may be required to pass a prescribed Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala Language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in the appointment. Failure to pass this test will result in suspension in the first instance, stoppage in the second instance and deferment thereafter of the officer's increments.

(iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency test in Sinhala.

(v) Provisions of Local Government Service Regulations 21 and 22 will apply if the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala is not reached by the end of the period of probation/trial.

“(Conditions (iii), (a) (b) and (v) above will apply to those recruited through the Tamil/English medium).”

Note 1.—The term “New-Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisement published on or after 29th January, 1960.

Note 2.—The provisions of paragraph 4 (iii) (a), (b) and (d) above will not apply to “Old Entrant Officer’s serving in Government Departments and who have been released from their posts to accept appointments in the Local Government Service.

5. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term “Ceylonese” is for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. *Concessions to Ex-Servicemen.*—(a) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to deduct their period of service in the Regular Force from their ages, where such deduction will enable them to be brought within the maximum age prescribed in the posts applied for.

(b) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to reduce the minimum educational standards laid down in the scheme of recruitment to any post in the Service to the next lowest examination.

7. *Age Concession.*—Employees of Local authorities holding permanent posts with two years’ continuous service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

8. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should when, forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

By-laws relating to the public library

1. The public library established and maintained by the Council shall consist of—

- (a) a Lending Library;
- (b) a Reference Library;
- (c) a Reading Room.

2. (1) The supervision and general administration of the public library shall be vested in a Library Committee (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") composed of—

- (a) the Mayor for the time being of the Council;
- (b) such other members of the Council not exceeding four as may be elected by the Council; and
- (c) five prominent residents within the Municipality elected by the Council at such meeting.

(2) The Council may appoint a librarian who shall be in charge of the public library and he shall be responsible for the maintenance of order in such library.

3. (1) The Mayor of the Council shall be ex-officio President of the Committee and he shall preside at every meeting of the Committee. In the absence of the Chairman at any meeting, such member of the Committee as may be elected for the purpose by the other members present, shall preside at that meeting.

(2) The Chairman at any meeting shall have an original vote and a casting vote if the votes cast on any question are equal.

4. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Committee unless there is a quorum of five members.

5. The Committee shall have the power to allow any person to use any part of the premises of the public library, subject to such conditions as it may deem necessary, or to refuse such person the use of any part of those premises, if such person has contravened any of these by-laws relating to the library.

LENDING LIBRARY

6. (1) No person shall be admitted as a member of the Lending Library unless he—

- (a) is not less than fourteen years of age;
- (b) is literate;
- (c) is resident or has an office or place of business, within the Municipality;
- (d) deposits with the librarian a sum of five rupees, and
- (e) is recommended by the occupier or owner of a house fetching a monthly rental of not less than twenty-five rupees.

(2) Every person desirous of being admitted as a member of the Lending Library shall make application in that behalf on a form obtainable from the librarian and shall have such application endorsed by any one of the following:—

- (a) a member of Parliament;
- (b) a member of the Council;
- (c) a member of the Committee;
- (d) a Minister of religion;
- (e) a member of the medical or legal profession;
- (f) a Justice of the Peace;
- (g) a Government Servant whose name appears in the annual Civil List;
- (h) a Principal of a Secondary School; or
- (i) an employee of the Council whose salary is not less than one thousand five hundred rupees per annum.

(3) No person who is entitled under the preceding paragraph to endorse an application shall be required to have his own application endorsed.

7. The librarian shall issue two tickets to every person who is admitted as a member of the Lending Library and such person shall be entitled to borrow one book on each such ticket.

8. A member of the Lending Library shall be responsible for any book removed from such library on a ticket issued to him.

9. Where a member of the Lending Library loses a ticket issued to him under by-law 7, he shall immediately give notice to the Librarian of such loss. If the librarian is satisfied that no book has been borrowed from the Lending Library on such ticket he may issue to such member a duplicate ticket. No such duplicate ticket shall be issued by the librarian unless there has elapsed at least a period of thirty days from the date on which the loss was brought to his notice.

10. Any book borrowed by a member from the Lending Library shall be returned to the librarian within a period of fourteen days from the date on which it was borrowed. The member may be allowed by the Librarian to borrow any such book for a further period of fourteen days if the book is not required by any other member.

11. Where a member fails to return any book to the librarian within the period of fourteen days referred to in by-law 10, he shall be liable to a fine of ten cents for each day the book is overdue.

12. Where a member fails to return any book he has borrowed from the Lending Library within thirty days of the expiry of the period of fourteen days referred to in by-law 10, then such book shall be presumed to be lost.

13. Where a book borrowed by a member is lost or presumed to be lost then such member shall be liable to pay the cost of its replacement.

14. No member shall damage or injure in any manner any book he has borrowed from the Lending Library.

15. It shall be the duty of every member to bring to the notice of the librarian any damage or injury in any book he intends to borrow from the Lending Library. Where he has failed to bring any such damage or injury to the notice of the librarian such book shall be presumed to have been issued to him without any injury or damage.

16. Where the librarian is satisfied that a book returned by a member has been so damaged by him as to render it unfit for further circulation, such member shall be liable to pay the cost of its replacement. When the book has been replaced the damaged book shall be given to that member with the words "The Public Library—sold as damaged" stamped thereon.

17. (1) No member shall lend to any person any book borrowed by him from the Lending Library.

(2) Any member who contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1) of this by-law shall forfeit his deposit and cease to be a member of the Lending Library.

18. (1) No member shall return to the Lending Library any book which to his knowledge has been used by any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease.

(2) Where a book borrowed from the Lending Library by a member has been used by any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, such book shall be destroyed and that member shall pay to the librarian the cost of its replacement.

19. Where any dispute arises between two or more members of the Lending Library as to which member should borrow a particular book, the librarian shall decide such dispute.

20. Any member who desires to borrow any book which has already been borrowed by another member, shall enter his name and the title of the book in a register kept for that purpose and the librarian shall, on such book being returned by the member who borrowed it, issue it to the member who has entered his name in the register. Where two or more members have entered their names in the register for any book, then such book shall be issued to them in the order in which they have entered their names in the register.

21. Any member who ceases to reside, or to have an office or place of business, within the Municipality shall cease to be a member of the Lending Library and shall return to the librarian the two tickets issued to him under by-law 7.

22. The deposit of five rupees paid by any person under by-law 6 (1) (d) shall, less any sum due from him to the Lending Library, be returned to him on his ceasing to be a member.

23. The Lending Library shall be open daily between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. except on Sundays, public holidays and such other days as the Committee may, after giving at least seven days notice to the members, fix for stock-taking or for any other purpose.

REFERENCE LIBRARY

24. No person shall make use of the Reference Library unless he—

- (a) has obtained permission from the Librarian for that purpose; and
- (b) has signed the register kept in the Reference Library.

25. The Librarian may permit any person who—

- (a) is literate;
- (b) is resident within the Municipality; and
- (c) is not less than fourteen years of age, to make use of the Reference Library.

26. No person shall take out of the Reference Library any book issued to him for purposes of reference.

27. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this by-law, the Reference Library shall, on any day other than a Sunday or a Public Holiday, be open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon and 2.30 p.m., 6.30 p.m.

(2) The Council may by resolution—

- (a) extend the hours specified in paragraph (1) of this by-law;
- (b) require the Committee to have the Reference Library open on a Sunday or Public Holiday during such hours as may be specified in the resolution; or
- (c) require the Committee to close the Reference Library on such days as may be fixed by the Council for purposes of stock-taking.

READING ROOM

28. No person shall make use of the Reading Room unless he—

- (a) has obtained permission from the librarian for that purpose; and
- (b) has signed the register kept in the Reading Room.

29. The librarian may permit any person who—

- (a) is literate;
- (b) is resident within the Municipality; and
- (c) is not less than fourteen years of age to make use of the Reading Room.

30. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this by-law, the Reading Room shall, on any day other than a Sunday or public holiday, be open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m.

(2) The Council may by resolution—

- (a) extend the hours specified in paragraph (1) of this by-law;
- (b) request the Committee to have the Reading Room open on a Sunday or public holiday during such hours as may be specified in the resolution; or
- (c) require the Committee to close the Reading Room on such days as may be fixed by the Council for purpose of stock-taking.

31. No person shall remove from the Reading Room any newspaper, periodical, magazine, map, document, manuscript or any other article placed in or belonging to the Reading Room.

GENERAL

32. No person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease or has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall enter the premises of the public library until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

33. No person shall—

- (1) behave in any disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about the premises of the public library?
- (2) damage or in any way deface any portion of the building, or any property of the Council in or about the public library;
- (3) remain or loiter about the premises of the public library after such library is closed, without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself;
- (4) smoke or spit within the premises of the public library;
- (5) gamble with dice or cards or play any game within the premises of the public library;
- (6) disturb the users of the public library by shouting, singing songs or making any other noise in such library;
- (7) enter the premises of the public library in an unclean condition;
- (8) bring any dog or other animal into the premises of the public library;
- (9) sleep or eat any food in any part of the premises of the public library; or
- (10) obstruct the librarian or any person acting under the orders of the librarian, in the lawful exercise of the powers under these by-laws.

34. Every contravention of by-law 31, by-law 32, or by-law 33, shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

35. In these by-laws—

- “ Council ” means the Negombo Municipal Council;
- “ Committee ” means the Library Committee appointed by the Council;
- “ Librarian ” means the person appointed by the Council to be in-charge of the library and includes his assistants; and
- “ Municipality ” means the Negombo Municipality.

Each such card shall bear a photograph of the vendor and a copy of each such photograph shall be deposited with the Commissioner.

3B. (1) No person shall sell, offer, hawk, or expose milk for sale, unless he is the holder and has in his possession a valid registration card issued as aforesaid.

(2) where any person selling, offering, hawking or exposing milk for sale fails to produce, on demand by any Municipal or Police Officer, such a card for inspection, he shall be guilty of an offence.

(3) The Mayor may cancel any registration card, if it appears to him to be necessary, in the interest of public health."
