The matter in dispute between the aforesaid parties is the demand made by the Lanka Krushikarma, Karmika Ha Velanda Sevaka Samithiya for the recognition of the Union by the Management of Walahanduwa Group.

This is an award in terms of section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act. The Commissioner of Labour referred to me for settlement by voluntary arbitration under section 3 (i) (d) the dispute between the parties above named which has been discribed as follows:—

"Whether the termination of services of W. B. M. Premaratne is justified and to what relief he is entitled".

The parties having filed their statements inquiry was fixed for the 19th of July, 1969, on which date Proctor Palitha Wanasundera, appeared for the applicant and Proctor C. L. W. Gunasekera for the respondent. Gunasekera for the respondent.

A settlement was proposed and Mr. Gunasekera moved for time to obtain confirmation from the management. Thereafter the case was taken up on the 6th of August and adjourned for the 29th of August. On this date the following settlement was arrived at:-

"The employer agrees to offer work to the workman on terms not less favourable than what he was enjoying at the time of his non-employment as soon as is possible and in any event not later than the 30th November, 1969, on condition that the workman hypothecate land to the value of Rs. 450 by way of security in favour of the Union.

The workman accepts this offer of employment and undertakes to hypothecate land to the value of Rs. 450 on or before the 15th of October, 1969, and further undertakes to release the bond by the payment of cash within 6 months of his employment.

It is agreed that the workman will be entitled to emoluments as from the 1st of November, 1969, on terms not less favourable than those he enjoyed at the time of his employment.

Both parties signed the record.

On the 6th of December, 1969, the counsel informed me that the workman had been re-instated in terms of the settlement arrived at and was back in employment.

Under these circumstances the settlement is confirmed by this award.

TEACHERS' WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' PENSION FUND

Report of the Board of Management—October 1, 1967 to September 30, 1968

- 1. Contributors.—The total number of contributors is estimated at 44,000 but declarations of family particulars under Regulation 10 (1) have not been received from all. The actual number received up to the end of September 30, 1968, is 24,920 and the number received up to the end of December, 1969, is 27,561.
- 2. Registers of Recoveries.—The registers of recoveries for the years 1958-50 to 1967-68 have not all been received from the Regional Directors of Education. Registers are outstanding for about Rs. 3,801,000 from the Regional Education Officers and other Accounting Units.
- 3. Pensions.—During the year under review 123 pensions were sanctioned. The total number of pensions sanctioned up to the end of September, 1968, is 1,162. Of these 31 have lapsed and the pensions current amount to 1,131. The annual liability in respect of these 1,131 pensions is Rs. 300,000.
- 4. Refunds.—16 refunds to bachelors and widowers without dependent children under Regulations 27 and 28 respectively were sanctioned during the year. Unpaid refunds as at September 30, 1968 amount to Rs. 1,711.
- 5. Government Contributions to the Fund, etc.—Government contribution due for the year under review is Rs. 1,722,390 and the over-credit of Rs. 27,593 has been adjusted under date September 30, 1969.

The cost of establishment and other expenses incidental to the Management of the Fund and the cost of living allowances payable under the Fund are met by Government.

6. Investments.—In terms of Section 5 (1) of the Teachers' W. & O. P. Fund Regulations, 1954, surplus monies are invested in the securities prescribed in Section 20 of the Trusts Ordinance (Cap. 87). During the year a sum of Rs. 4,694,952 was invested in the purchase of stock worth Rs. 4,700,000.

The total amount invested as at September 30, 1968, is Rs. 39,057,188·50 in the purchase of stock worth Rs. 39,031,000 at interest rates ranging from $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ to $5\frac{1}{2}\%$. The total amount of interest receivable annually in respect of these investments is Rs. 1,646,133·50 as shown below:—

- 7. Interest.—The total amount received on account of interest during the year is Rs. 1,458,379 40 as against Rs. 1,301,399 24 during the previous year. The amount of interest receivable on account of investment of monies of the Fund during the ensuing financial year (1968-69) is Rs. 1,700,000 approximately.
- 8. U.K. Actuary's Report.—It is regretted that none of the recommendations of Mr. F. Gordon Smith, U.K. Actuary, made in April, 1963, has so far been implemented but it is hoped to implement some of the recommendations shortly.
 - 9. Accounts.—The accounts of the Fund as at September 30, 1968, duly audited by the Auditor-General are appended.

REPORT OF THE AUDITOR-GENERAL ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE TEACHERS' WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' PENSION FUND FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 1968

(All figures in this report have been rounded off to the nearest i

The Balance Sheet as at September 30, 1968, of the Teachers' Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date, furnished by the Board of Management on August 13, 1969, have been certified by me subject to the following observations.

- 2. Income and Expenditure Account: Contributions—Rs. 1,722,390.—(i) In paragraph 2 of my report on the Accounts for 1966—67, it was stated that the Membership Registers, required to be maintained in terms of Section 9 (a) of the Teachers' Widows and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1954 giving the undermentioned particulars, had been maintained—

 - (a) the date of birth of every contributor and of every wife and child who may become entitled to a pension;
 (b) particulars of all contributions paid in to the Fund by each contributor and the Government;
 (c) the pension or pensions for the time being payable in respect of each contributor in the event of his death;
 (d) the dates of death and such other dates and particulars relating to contributors and their families.

It was also stated that particulars referred to at (b) and (c) have not been recorded therein. The Secretary and Accountant Teachers' Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund had explained in September, 1968, that the failure to record all particulars required under this regulation was due to the non-receipt of declarations of contributors from the Education Department, and to the delay on the part of the Education Department to render duly reconciled Recovery Registers. The Secretary and Accountant, Teachers' Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund, informed me on January 10, 1970, that no substantial progress has been made in this regard.

(ii) Section 10 and 11 of the Teachers' Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1954, require every contributor to the Fund to furnish a declaration to the Board within three months of the date he becomes a contributor to the Fund. The Secretary and Accountant informed me that up to December 29, 1969 out of a total of 44,000 contributors, declarations had been received from only 27,561. Contributions received from 16,439 persons had been credited to the Fund without obtaining declarations.

(iii) Registers relating to recoveries of contributions amounting to Rs. 3,800,578 were not made available for examination in audit up to December 31, 1969. Particulars are given below:

- 3. Government Contributions—Rs. 1,751,248.—According to Regulation 23, Government contributions should be equal in amount to the contributions made by the members. While the members' contributions amounted to Rs. 1,722,390 the amount actually credited to the Fund as Government contributions during the year was Rs. 1,749,983. The difference of Rs. 27,593 was made up of Rs. 27,474 and Rs. 119 being amounts over credited to the Fund. This difference has subsequently been adjusted during 1968—69.
- 4. Pensions Paid—Rs. 3,15,284.—Paid documents in respect of pensions amounting to Rs. 2,213 had not been received for audit up to the end of September, 1969.

A satisfactory audit of the pension payments could not be carried out in the absence of duly reconciled Recovery Registers from 1958–59 onwards and of completed Membership Registers. Pensions were awarded on the basis of statements of recoveries certified by the Director-General of Education and the correctness of the pensions so paid can be verified in audit only when the Recovery Registers from 1958–59 to 1967–68 together with the completed Membership Registers are made available.

Balance Sheet

5. Suspense Account—Rs. 26,877.—The debits to the suspense account remaining uncleared as at September 30, 1968, amounted to Rs. 1,564 while the credits awaiting clearence totalled Rs. 28,441 in the suspense account as at the same date.

General

In paragraph 6 of my report on the 1966-67 accounts, it was stated that a quinquennial valuation of the Fund by a qualified Actuary as required by section 7 of the Regulations fell due on 1.10.1956, 1.10.1961 and 1.10.1966 and that the first valuation was made in January, 1963. It was further stated that the Secretary and Accountant, Teachers' Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund, had informed me that the report of the Actuary furnished in January, 1963, was being considered by the Government and the periodical valuation of the Fund would have to await Government decision on the Actuary's report.

On December 14, 1969, the Secretary and Accountant informed me that it is proposed to implement some of the recommendations of the Actuary shortly.
