##### THE VILLAGE COUNCILS ORDINANCE

ORDER made by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 5 (2) of the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257).

##### Order

Provision in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby made for the matters necessary to give effect to the alteration and re-definition referred to in the Orders relating to the Karikkaddumulai South Village area and the Karikkaddumulai West Village area in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Maritime Pattu in the Vavuniya District, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 14,836/1 of January 11, 1969.

##### SCHEDULE

1. The Village Council of each new Village Area shall be the successor of the Village Council of the old village area for all such purposes of the Village Councils Ordinance as may relate to that new village area.

2. All by-laws made by the Village Council of the Old Village Area as are in force on June 30, 1969, shall continue in force in each of the new village areas and shall be deemed to have been made by the Village Council of that new village area.

3. One-half of the amount lying to the credit of the Communal Fund of the Village Council of the old village area on June 30, 1969, shall on July 1, 1969, be credited to the Communal Fund of the new village area of Karikkaddumoolai West, while the balance one-half shall be credited to the Communal Fund of the new village area of Karikkaddumoolai South.

4. All movable property, other than money vested in or under the control of the Village Council of the old village area on June 30, 1969, shall on July 1, 1969, be deemed to be vested in the Village Council of Karikkaddumulai West village area.

5. Each land, building, or other immovable property vested in, or under the control of the Village Council of the old village area on June 30, 1969, shall on July 1, 1969, be deemed to be vested in the Village Council of the new village area within which such land, building or other immovable property is situated.

6. All rights, debts, liabilities and obligations of the Village Council of the old village area shall in, so far as they relate to each new village area, be deemed to be transferred to the Village Council of that new village area as from July 1, 1969.

7. The liability of the old Village Council in respect of contributions towards the payment of pensions to its employees who had served in that Council shall be divided in the ratio of 1:1 among the Village Councils of Karikkaddumulai West and Karikkaddumulai South.

10. In this Schedule—

“new village area” means either the village area of Karikkaddumulai West or the village area of Karikkaddumulai South as the case may be described in the Order published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 14,836/1 of January 11, 1969; and “old village area” means the village area of Karikkaddumulai South as constituted by proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 8,444 of April 5, 1939.

Provision in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby made for the matters necessary to give effect to the division referred to in the Orders relating to the redefinition of the Othara Palatha North and Othara Palatha South village areas in the Chilaw District, published in the *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 14,838/8 of June 30, 1968.

**SCHEDULE**

1. The Village Council of each new village area shall be the successor of the Village Council of the old village area for all such purposes of the Village Councils Ordinance, as may relate to that new village area.

2. All by-laws made by the Village Council of the old village area as are in force on December 31, 1968, shall continue in force in each new village area in so far as these by-laws relate to that new village area, and shall be deemed to have been made by the Village Council of that new village area.

6. All rights, debts, liabilities and obligations of the Village Council of the old village area shall, in so far as they relate to each new village area be deemed to be transferred to the Village Council of that new village area as from January 1, 1969.

7. Liability of the old Village Council in respect of contributions towards the payment of pensions to its employees, who had served in that Council shall be divided in the ratio of 5:4 among the Village Councils of the new village areas of Othara Palatha North and Othara Palatha South.

**THE ENTERTAINMENT TAX ORDINANCE**

THE following resolution passed by the Village Council of Paragoda village area in Galle District, under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance (Chapter 267), has been approved by the Minister of Local Government and is published in terms of sub-section (2) of that section:—

**Resolution**

"This Council, under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance (Chapter 267) hereby imposes and levies with effect from the date on which this resolution is published in the Gazette, a tax at the rates set out hereunder on payment for admission to entertainments (as defined in that Ordinance) held in the area within the administrative limits of the Council".

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE**

**Examination (English) for Recruitment to the Local Government Stenographer's Service, Lower Grade**

A competitive examination (English) for male and female candidates wishing to enter the Local Government Stenographer's (Lower Grade) Transferable Service will be held on 25.3.70 in Colombo.

2. *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts of English Stenographer (Lower Grade) to serve in local authorities on the salary scale Rs. 4,008 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 144 to Rs. 6,456 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 5,448 per annum. A Marriage Allowance at Government rates and conditions will be paid to married officers.

3. *Conditions of Service.*—(a) Male candidates, who are successful in the examination, will be appointed on 3 years probation with effect from the date of appointment. Their posts are pensionable. Female candidates, who are successful in the examination, will be appointed on a provident fund basis in the first instance and will be on trial for a period of three years with effect from the date of appointment. They are entitled to opt to come into the pensionable establishment at any time before completing 10 years service. The option once exercised will be irrevocable. Those female candidates, who exercise this option during the period of trial, will be placed on probation thereafter, the period of probation being equivalent to that part of the three years' trial period, which they have not served.

Confirmation of candidates at the expiry of the period of probation and the continued employment at the expiry of the period of trial of female candidates who have not exercised the option to come into the pensionable establishment will be dependent on satisfactory work and conduct. Promotion over the Efficiency Bar before Rs. 5,448 will also be dependent on satisfactory work and conduct and on the passing of the test.

(b) Successful candidates who are holding permanent and pensionable posts in the Local Government Service, will be appointed on an acting basis in terms of Regulation 22 (2) of the Local Government Service regulations and their confirmation in the posts will be considered at the end of the acting period. The acting period will be 6 months in the first instance.

(c) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the by-laws and the regulations of the local authority in which she/he is employed subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Act, No. 18 of 1969, and any other regulations framed thereunder.

(d) Candidates appointed to a Local Authority will be liable to transfer within an area specified in the Part I of the Schedule to the above Act and may be posted to any station within the specified area in Ceylon. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Act, No. 18 of 1969, and further amendments of the Act and any regulations made thereunder.

(e) Successful candidates will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and, in particular, for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

4. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Government Gazette* and they will be given appointment as and when vacancies occur.

5. *Eligibility.*—(i) Candidates must be of good character, (ii) candidates must be Ceylonese\*, (iii) candidates should have previously passed at least—

(a) The London Matriculation Certificate or the Cambridge Senior Certificate or the Ceylon Senior School (English) or the Senior Domestic Science Certificate; or

(i) A credit pass in English at the S. S. C. together with one of the following:—

(i) A credit pass in English at the S. S. C. (Sinhala or Tamil) Examination, or at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) Sinhala or Tamil Medium Examination.

(ii) A pass in English language at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) English Medium Examination.

(c) General Certificate of Education (Ordinary) in six subjects which should have been passed on not more than two occasions including—

(i) Sinhala/Tamil.  
(ii) Arithmetic/Mathematics/Commercial Arithmetic.  
(iii) English Language (Credit); or

(d) The Final Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or

(e) One of the following—

(1) Cambridge Junior Certificate.  
(2) J. S. C. (English) Education Department.  
(3) J. S. C. (English) School approved by the Education Department.

Together with one of the following:—

- (a) Higher Commercial Certificate (either section), London Chamber of Commerce.
- (b) Commercial Certificate (either section), London Chamber of Commerce.
- (c) Commercial Certificate (either section), Ceylon Chamber of Commerce.

**NOTE.**—APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ENTERTAINED FROM CANDIDATES WHO HAVE SAT FOR ANY OF THE EXAMINATIONS MENTIONED ABOVE, THE RESULTS OF WHICH HAVE NOT BEEN RELEASED BEFORE THE DATE OF CLOSING OF APPLICATIONS FOR THIS EXAMINATION.

(iv) Candidates must be not less than 17 years nor more than 40 years of age on 23.2.1970.

If necessary—

- (a) Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilised service in the last war from their age; and
- (b) Candidates, who were or are temporary Stenographers or Typists in Government Service for any continuous period of two years or more, may deduct such period of temporary service from their age provided that they were in such temporary employment on a date subsequent to April 1, 1946.
- (v) Candidates should have been resident for at least three years immediately prior to 5.2.70 within an area specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Local Government Service Act, No. 18 of 1969.

**6. Eligibility.**—Special concessions to those already in the Local Government Service—

- (i) Typists in the Local Government Service who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before 5.2.70 will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications.
  - (ii) Clerks in the General Clerical Class of the Local Government Clerical Service who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before 5.2.70, will be permitted to sit for this examination irrespective of educational qualifications prescribed in para. 5 (iii) (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) of this notification.
  - (iii) Persons holding permanent posts in the Local Government Service on 5.2.70 and persons in the permanent employment of a local authority and temporary clerks in Local Authorities with not less than 2 years' satisfactory service on 5.2.70 will be permitted to sit for this examination irrespective of educational qualifications prescribed in para. 5 (iii) (a), (b), (c), (d), or (e) of this notification.
- 7. Trolley Bus Drivers and Conductors** who were in the service of the Passenger Transport Department of the Colombo Municipal Council and retired for abolition of office, are eligible to sit for this examination, provided they possess the qualifications prescribed in para. 5 (iii) (a), (b), (c), (d) or (e) of this notification and are not over 50 years of age on 5.2.70.

**8. Applications.**—(i) Application forms for admission to the examination may be obtained from the office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29-1/5, (First Floor), Gaffoor Building, Fort, Colombo, from 10.2.70.

Every person who applies by post for an entry form for this examination is required to send along with his application a self-addressed long envelope with the name of the examination written on the top left-hand corner of it, so that Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, may despatch the forms expeditiously to applicants.

(ii) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on or before 23.2.70. Any applications received after that date will be rejected. The name of the examination should be clearly written on the left-hand corner of the envelope.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 25.

(iv) Candidates who are already employed in Government Service or Local Government Service must forward their applications through the Head of the Department/Local Authority in which they work. If any candidate fails to do so, he/she will be regarded as disqualified. Candidates are requested to forward their applications to the Heads of the Departments/Local Authorities, well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, on or before 23.2.70.

**9. Documents of Eligibility.**—(i) A certificate of residence from a Divisional Revenue Officer, a Justice of Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary Public to the effect that the candidate has been a resident in an area specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Local Government Service Act for at least 3 years immediately prior to 5.2.70. (A specimen form of this certificate is provided in cage 16 of the application form. Candidates should get it perfected by any one of the above mentioned persons. A separate certificate should not be annexed to the application).

(ii) NO DOCUMENTS WHATSOEVER SHOULD BE FORWARDED WITH THE APPLICATION, BUT THE NECESSARY PARTICULARS SHOULD ALL BE PROVIDED IN THE FORM AS REQUIRED.

(iii) The documentary evidence in proof of eligibility will be required from candidates who have qualified. Such candidates should forward them promptly under registered cover when called for by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission.

(iv) The following documents will be necessary:—

- (a) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth (Affidavits of Baptismal Certificate or Special Certificate of Birth issued for school or educational purposes or a certified extract from the birth registered will not be accepted).
- (b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it must be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary Public, or generally some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be made;
- (c) Originals of certificates in proof of educational qualifications, and
- (d) Identity card.

(v) Candidates are requested to have all the necessary documents in readiness at the time of application. Any candidate who is unable to produce or who delays in producing them when requested by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, will have his entry rejected.

**N.B.**—(1) APPLICATIONS NOT MADE ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM WILL BE REJECTED.

(2) APPLICATIONS NOT CONFORMING IN EVERY RESPECT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS NOTIFICATION WILL BE REJECTED.

**10. Admission to the Examination.**—(i) The Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, will issue Admission Cards to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their admission cards. A candidate not producing such form will be disqualified.

(ii) Candidates must sit for the examination at the Examination Hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself/herself at an Examination Hall other than the one assigned to him/her will be refused admission to the examination.

(iii) Every candidate presenting himself/herself for the examination must hand over his/her admission card to the Examiner on the date of the examination.

(iv) If a candidate does not receive his/her admission card at least seven days before the date of the examination he/she should communicate without delay with the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, informing that he/she has not received the admission card and giving the following particulars:—

- (1) Name of examination.
- (2) Full name.
- (3) Full postal address.

**N.B.**—ADMISSION TO THE EXAMINATION DOES NOT CONSTITUTE ACCEPTANCE OF ELIGIBILITY.

11. If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his/her candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the examination.

12. Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalised.

13. **Withdrawal and Refunds.**—In no circumstances will a refund of value of stamps be made.

14. **Leave to officers to attend Examination.**—Heads of Departments/Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers of their Departments and Local Authorities whose applications have been approved by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission; to present themselves for examination.

15. **Identity Cards.**—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the Examination Hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.
- (b) A valid passport issued within three years preceding the date of this examination.

- (c) Any certificate, licence, or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination, on the authority of a Government Department.
- (d) A passport size photograph with the following attestation on the reverse made by a person eligible to provide such attestation on the signature form.

Candidates who fail to produce their Identity Cards at the Examination Hall will be disqualified.

16. *Scheme of Examination.*—The subject of the examination and marks assigned to each subject are given below. In written papers marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are likely to be disqualified:

(i) English Essay (one hour) ...	... 100

(iv) Sinhala/Tamil (one hour) ...	... 100

*Note.*—(a) This paper (Sinhala/Tamil) will be regarded as a qualifying test only and every candidate will be required to obtain a minimum of 40 per cent. of the marks allotted for the paper. The marks obtained in this paper will not, however, be taken into consideration when selecting candidates for appointment from among those who have so qualified.

(b) Candidates who have obtained a Senior School Certificate with Sinhalese or Tamil or Lower Sinhalese or Lower Tamil as a subject, or have passed the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) Examination in Sinhalese or Tamil, will be exempted from this paper.

*Note.*—EVERY CANDIDATES MUST BRING HIS/HER OWN TYPEWRITER TO THE EXAMINATION HALL.

17. *Medical Examination.*—The selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.
