REGULATIONS made by the proper authority in that behalf, to wit, the Erukkaampiddy Village Council in the Mannar District, under section 27 of the Butchers Ordinance (Chapter 272), and confirmed by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section.

Regulations

1. The public slaughter-house or any approved place proclaimed under the Butchers Ordinance shall be in charge of the Medical Officer of Health or any public Health Inspector authorised by him in that behalf. Such officer shall be responsible for the discipline and the sanitary conditions within such slaughter-house.

2. (1) No person shall slaughter any animal at the slaughter-house—

(a) unless such animal has been inspected by the Medical Officer of Health, or the officer appointed by the Chairman for the purpose and approved by such officer as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption; or

(b) except between 8 a.m. to 12 noon on any day: provided that the Chairman may, in exceptional circumstances, authorise the slaughter of any animal at any time other than specified herein.

(2) No person shall slaughter any animal at the slaughter-house—

(a) at any time after the expiry of a period of 30 hours from the time of the approval of that animal under paragraph (1) or

(b) if it has been removed alive from the slaughter-house premises after it was approved under paragraph (1) unless it is again inspected and approved under that paragraph as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption.

3. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of the slaughter-house shall take all such measures as may be necessary to ensure that the animal is adequately fed and watered while it remains in those premises.

4. Every person, who brings any animal into the premises of the slaughter-house shall, if the animal is rejected as unfit for slaughter, immediately after such rejection, remove the animal or cause it to be removed from those premises.

5. Any officer referred to in regulation 2 may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if, after it had been approved under regulation 2, it is found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption.

6. If the meat or offal of any animal slaughtered in the slaughter-house is in the opinion of any officer referred to in regulation 2, deceased or unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the meat or offal to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent such meat or offal being exposed for sale or used for human consumption.

7. The officer-in-charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited as provided in regulation 5.

8. (1) No person shall remove from the slaughter-house except under the direction of any officer referred to in regulation 2, any meat or offal which has been declared under regulation 6 to be unfit for human consumption.

(2) No person shall remove the carcass of any animal intended for human consumption from the

slaughter-house unless such carcass has been stamped on its fore-quarters and hind-quarters by the officer-in-charge of the slaughter-house with the mark "V.C.E." with the word "Beef" or "Mutton" as the case may be.

9. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of any other animal or until the carcass of every animal previously slaughtered has been removed from the premises.

10. (1) Subject as hereinafter provided a fee at the following rates shall be charged for the use of the slaughter-house—

	Rs. c.
For each head of cattle	.. 1 50
For each sheep or goat	.. 1 00

Provided that where any animal brought into the slaughter-house is rejected as unfit for slaughter or is withdrawn from slaughter, the fee to be charged in respect of that animal shall be 50 cents only.

(2) No animal shall be slaughtered in or removed from the slaughter-house until the appropriate fee under the paragraph (1) has been paid to the Council in respect of that animal and an official receipt for the payment of such fee has been produced to the keeper of the slaughter-house or to such other officer as may be appointed by the Chairman in writing as the person to whom such receipt should be produced.

11. (1) The keeper of the slaughter-house shall maintain a register of all cattle, and a register of all goats and sheep slaughtered at the slaughter-house.

(2) Such register shall be substantially in the form set out in the Schedule hereto—

"This House resolves, under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 268), that, from 1.12.1969, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto:

SCHEDULE

All that area of land situated in the village of Nochchiyagama in Wilachchiya Korale in the Divisional Revenue Officers Division of Nuwaragam Palata West in the Anuradhapura District in the North Central Province; and bounded as follows:

North: By a line drawn from a point 350 yards north and on a line drawn perpendicular to the centre line of Anuradhapura-Puttalam road at the 31st mile-stone, north-eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 350 yards from the centre line of the said road to the point of its intersection with a line drawn perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the 33rd mile stone.

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE
ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. *Allowances*.—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service*.—Appointment will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Chapter 264), and any amendments thereof, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement*.—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by member of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a) The Pension right of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pensions By-law or Rules of the Local Authorities the payments of their pensions on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than female officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately

prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service,)
are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the
Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension
Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows'
and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952 published, in
the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30,
1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of
salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either
in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee
Association approved by the Local Government Service Com-
mission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local
Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local
Government Service will be required to pass a medical examina-
tion by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical
fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or
subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise
specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth
certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when
called upon to do so.

4. *New-Entrant Officers.*—(i) The period of probation/trial
of "New-Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/
non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years
unless a longer period in prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) "New-Entrant Officers" will be required to comply
with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for
giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in
particular for implementing the provisions of the Official
Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency
in Sinhala during their period of probation trial.

(b) Confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial
will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of prescribed proficiency
tests in Sinhala within prescribed periods of time. Failure to
pass these proficiency tests within prescribed periods will result
in the suspension of increments and if a test is not passed within
a further period of time beyond the prescribed period suspension
will be converted to stoppage such stoppage operating until the
test is passed (vide conditions relating to the implementation of
the Official Language Act published in *Gazette* No. 13,387 of
9.11.62).

(c) *Educational and other Qualifications.*—In all schemes of
recruitment where the minimum qualification prescribed is a
pass in the S. S. C. Examination or equivalent or higher exam-
ination a candidate who is a Sinhalese educated in the Sinhala
medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its
equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent
examination.

(This requirement will not apply to those officers who have
been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to
February 8, 1963 and who seek appointments to other posts in
the Local Government Service).

(d) *Efficiency Bars.*—New Entrant Officers may be required
to pass a prescribed Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala Language
of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from
the date of confirmation in the appointment. Failure to pass
this test will result in suspension in the first instance, stoppage in
the second instance and deferment thereafter of the officer's
increments

(iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the
Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be
exempted from the Proficiency test in Sinhala.

(v) Provisions of Local Government Service Regulations 21
and 22 will apply if the prescribed standard of proficiency in
Sinhala is not reached by the end of the period of probation/trial.

"(Conditions (iii), (a) (b) and (v) above will apply to those
recruited through the Tamil/English medium)."

Note 1.—The term "New-Entrant Officers" in this context
means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government
Service in response to advertisement published on or after 29th
January, 1960.

Note 2.—The provisions of paragraph 4 (iii) (a), (b) and (d)
above will not apply to "Old Entrant Officer's serving in Govern-
ment Departments and who have been released from their
posts to accept appointments in the Local Government Service.

5. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish
satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese"
for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service
is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. *Concessions to Ex-Servicemen.*—(a) Ex-Servicemen will
be allowed to deduct their period of service in the Regular
Force from their ages, where such deduction will enable them to
be brought within the maximum age prescribed in the posts
applied for.

Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to reduce the minimum
educational standards laid down in the scheme of recruitment
to any post in the Service to the next lowest examination.

7. *Age Concession.*—Employees of Local authorities holding
permanent posts with two years' continuous service are eligible
to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local
Government Service.

8. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a
Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Com-
missioner or Chairman of the Local authority in which they are
serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service
should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective
Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding
permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the
Department concerned should when, forwarding the application,
state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if
selected.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE

Examination for Recruitment to Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service 20th April, 1970

DATE of Examination.—A competitive examination for recruitment to Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foreman's Service will held by the Commissioner of Examinations on 20th April, 1970, in Colombo and Jaffna.

2. (i) *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts in Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service on the salary scale of Rs. 2,760 per annum rising by 18 annual increments of Rs. 60 to Rs. 3,840 per annum. Efficiency Bar before Rs. 3,360 per annum.

(ii) *Conditions of Service*.—(a) The posts are permanent and the selected candidates will be eligible for Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension benefits.

(b) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the Local Authority subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Act and any regulations framed thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates will be appointed on three years' probation, and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Act and any further amendments of the Act and any regulations framed thereunder.

(d) Successful candidates who are holding permanent and pensionable posts in the Local Government Service, will be appointed on an acting basis in terms of Regulation 22 (2) of the Local Government Service Regulations and their confirmation in the posts will be considered at the end of the acting period. The acting period will be six months in the first instance.

(e) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in a Local Authority drawing a salary higher than the initial salary assigned to the post of Electrical Foreman, Grade II, may be placed on a suitable step on this salary scale.

(f) Successful candidates, on their appointment, will be required to reside within the limits of the respective Local Authorities to which they are appointed.

(iii) Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the Local Government Service Commission is satisfied that a genuine attempt has been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the Commission, if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

4. *Eligibility*.—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese*.

(iii) (a) Candidates should be previously passed at least the 7th Standard or higher examination in Sinhala or Tamil or English.

(b) They should have at least five years' practical experience in an Electrical Engineering firm or under a Chartered Electrical Engineer or under Government or Local Supply Authority, viz., Linesman, Switch Board Operators and others of similar status.

(c) In the case of those who have completed the Evening Vocational Course in Electricity at the Ceylon Technical College; two

years' practical experience in an Electrical Engineering firm or under a Chartered Electrical Engineer or under Government or Local Supply authority.

(d) Should have a knowledge of the operation and maintenance of high tension and low tension distribution systems, transformers, diesel engine plant and switch gear, testing of consumers' installations and house service meters. Should also possess a working knowledge of safety rules and I.E.E. Regulations for electrical equipment and buildings; Electrical Units, Ohm's and Kirchoff's Laws and their applications thereof. Knowledge of measuring instruments, knowledge of tariffs.

(iv) Candidates must be not less than 20 years nor more than 40 years of age on 17.3.70. Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilized service in the last war from their age.

Note.—(i) Applications from Linesmen, Switch Board Operators, &c., holding permanent posts in a town lighting scheme of a Local Authority having the necessary technical knowledge and experience will be considered irrespective of general educational qualifications.

BUILDINGS AND BOUNDARY WALLS

1. No person shall, within the village area, erect any new building, boundary wall, or gateway within a distance of—

- (a) fifteen feet from the centre of any village cart road;
- (b) fifteen feet from the centre of any village path which has been notified by the Council as a path which, in course of time, is to be converted into a village cart road; or
- (c) seven feet from the centre of any village path other than a path referred to in sub-paragraph (b).

2. No person shall, within the village area, erect any new building, boundary wall, or gateway along any cart road or path referred to in by-law 1, without giving at least thirty days' notice thereof in writing to the Chairman.

STRAY CATTLE

3. The charges payable before the removal of any animal impounded under paragraph (1) of by-law 3 of Part xxiv of the standard by-laws adopted by the Council shall be calculated and levied at the following rates:—

- (a) Two rupees and fifty cents for each animal placed in the pound.
- (b) In addition to the above charge—
 - (1) two rupees for each animal kept in the pound for each night, and
 - (2) fifty cents for each animal kept in the pound or tied for during the day time.

ABATEMENT OF NUISANCE

4. No person shall, within the village area, by operating or causing or permitting any other person to operate, any gramophone, radio, loud-speaker, amplifier, or other similar instru-

ment produce or reproduce or cause to be produced or reproduced any sound which, by reason of its volume or its repetition or its continuous nature, causes a nuisance to the occupants of the premises in the neighbourhood.

5. No proceedings shall be instituted in respect of any contravention of by-law 4 against any person operating or causing or permitting any other person to operate any instrument as aforesaid in any place other than a street, public place, shop or place of business, or any place which adjoins any street or public place and to which members of the public are admitted, unless—

- (a) complaint of nuisance is made to the Chairman by not less than three householders of the neighbourhood affected by the nuisance;
- (b) written notice is served on the person by the Chairman setting out the nature of the complaint received and requiring that person to abate the nuisance forthwith or within a specified period; and
- (c) that person fails or refuses to comply with such notice forthwith on receipt thereof or within the period specified therein, as the case may be.

OFFICERS AND SERVANTS

6. The Chairman may authorize in writing any officer or other person to collect all taxes or fees due to the Council and to issue printed receipts bearing the facsimile of the Chairman's signature and the seal of the Council.

7. No person shall wilfully obstruct—

- (a) the Chairman or any other officer of the Council in the exercise, performance or discharge of any power, duty or function conferred on, or imposed upon, or assigned to, such Chairman or other officer by, or under, any of the provisions of the Ordinance, or of any by-laws made thereunder; or
- (b) any servant or labourer employed by, or on behalf of the Council in the performance of any duty lawfully imposed upon such servant or labourer by the Chairman or by any other officer of the Council.

8. In these by-laws—

- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council;
- "Council" means the Village Council of the village area;
- "Ordinance" means the Village Councils Ordinance; and
- "village area" means the Marapona village area in the Ratnapura District.
