GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

- 1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.
- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointment will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance (Chapter 264), and any amendments thereof, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.
- 3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by member of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.
- (a) The Pension right of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions and transferred to pensionable posts in the Lecal Government Service
- (b) In the case of employees of Loca Authorities who hold (6) In the case of employees of Loca Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pensiona By-law or Rules of the Local Authorities the payments of their pensions on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.
- (c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than female officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Leeal Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952 published, in the Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary. salary.
- (d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in each or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local
- Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examina-tion by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.
- (f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise specified.
- (g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.
- 4. New-Entrant Officers.—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New-Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/ zon-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period in prescribed in respect of any posts.
- "New-Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.
- (iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation trial.
- (b) Confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, inter alia, on the passing of prescribed proficiency tests in Sinhala within prescribed periods of time. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within prescribed periods will result in the suspension of increments and if a test is not passed within a further period of time beyond the prescribed period suspension will be converted to stoppage such stoppage operating until the test is passed (vide conditions relating to the implementation of the Official Language Act published in Gazette No. 13,387 of 9.11.62).
- (c) Educational and other Qualifications.—In all schemes of recruitment where the minimum qualification prescribed is a pass in the S. S. C. Examination or equivalent or higher examination a candidate who is a Sinhalese educated in the Sinhala medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent examination. examination.

- (This requirement will not apply to those officers who have been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to February 8, 1963 and who seek appointments to other posts in the Local Government Service).
- (d) Efficiency Bars.—New Entrant Officers may be required to pass a prescribed Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala Language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in the appointment. Failure to pass this test will result in suspension in the first instance, stoppage in the second instance and deferment thereafter of the officer's
- (iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency test in Sinhala.
- (v) Provisions of Local Government Service Regulations 21 and 22 will apply if the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala is not reached by the end of the period of probation/trial.
- "(Conditions (iii), (a) (b) and (v) above will apply to those recruited through the Tamil/English medium)."
- Note 1.—The term "New-Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisement published on or after 29th January, 1960.
- Note 2.—The provisions of paragraph 4 (iii) (a), (b) and (d) above will not apply to "Old Entrant Officer's serving in Government Departments and who have been released from their posts to accept appointments in the Local Government Service.
- 5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

Keeping an establishment for the manufacture of jewellery. Keeping a printing press. Storing of empty gunny bags.

Keeping rice huller.

Keeping a place for repairing or servicing motor vehicles. Keeping an establishment for repairing bicycles. Keeping an establishment for vulcanising tyres and tubes.

Manufacturing aerated water.

Keeping a carpentry work shop. Keeping a kraal for soaking coconut husks.

Keeping a keresone oil depot. Keeping a depot for storing diesel oil. Keeping an electrical workshop.

Keeping a forge or smithy. Keeping a tinker's shop. Storing of old metal. Storing empty bottles. Keeping a furniture shop.

The Municipal Councils Ordinance

BY-LAWS made by the Municipal Council of Badulla under sections 267 and 272 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance (Chapter 252), as amended by section 10 of Municipal Councils (Amendment) Act No. 15 of 1957 and approved by the Minister of Local Government and confirmed by the Senate and the House of Representatives under section 268 of that Ordinance.

BY-LAWS

- 1. A fair to be called and known as 'the Badulla Fair' shall be held by the Council on every Poya Day and any other day fixed by the Council.
- 2. (1) No person shall use or occupy any stall or space within the premises of the fair, unless he is the holder, or the servant or the agent of the holder, of a permit issued by or under the authority of the Commissioner, or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit.
- (2) Every permit issued under paragraph (1) shall be substantially in the form set out in Schedule I hereto and shall be in force for such period not exceeding twelve months or less than one month as may be specified in the permit.
- 3. Every holder of a permit issued under by-law 2 shall pay a fee at the rates specified in Schedule II hereto for the use of a stall or space within the premises of the fair.
- 4. If the Council does not employ an officer to collect the fees payable under by-law 3, it may lease the right of collecting the fees to any approved person—

 - (a) by private treaty; or(b) by calling for tenders; or(c) by putting up the right to public auction.
- 5. No holder of a permit issued under by-law 2 shall, without the written permission of the Commissioner—

 - (a) transfer his permit to any other person; or
 (b) sub-let any part of the stall or space allowed to him; or
 (c) permit any person, other than his servant or agent, to
 use or occupy any part of the stall or space allowed to
- 6. Within the premises of the fair, no person shall, between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.
 - (a) read or offer to read the palm, or tell the fortune of any
 - person visiting the fair; or

 (b) advertise, sell or expose for sale, medicines or drugs of
 any kind whatsoever; or
 - (c) beg for alms in or near the fair premises from persons attending the fair; or
 (d) advertise, read, sing or sell any ballads, songs or books.
- 7. Every holder of a permit issued under by-law 2 may, between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. sell or expose for sale within the premises of the fair, vegetables, fruit, country rice, paddy, coconuts, tamarind, kollu, kurakkan, grains, cereals, berries, yams, jaggery, potatoes or any other garden or Chena produce.
- 8. (1) No holder of a permit issued under by-law 2 shall sell or expose for sale within the premises of the fair any meat. Provided however, that any such article or commodity may be sold or exposed for sale under the authority of a special permit issued in that behalf by the Commissioner.
- (2) No special permit shall be issued by the Commissioner unless he is satisfied that there are good and sufficient reasons for issuing such a permit.
- 9. Any dispute arising between holders of permits issued under by-law 2 or their authorised servants or between them and the public relating to the use of the fair, may be settled by any officer authorised by the Commissioner, on duty, within the premises of the fair.
- 10. Order within the premises of the fair shall be maintained by an officer of the Council appointed for the purpose and on duty within the premises of the fair.
- 11. Every person attending the fair for the sale or purchase of goods shall comply with any lawful order given by an officer of the Council or by a police officer in settlement of any dispute or for the maintenance of order.
 - 12. No person shall, within the premises of the fair-

 - (a) carry on any cooking; or
 (b) behave in a disorderly manner, or create any noise or disturbance or fight with any other person, or use insulting, abusive or obscene language; or
 (c) remain in or loiter about without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself after being ordered to leave by an officer of the Council or Grama Sevaka or

Police Officer or any person acting under the authority of the Commissioner.

- 13. (1) It shall be lawful for a court of competent jurisdiction to cancel any permit in respect of a stall or space in the fair on a second or subsequent conviction of the permit-holder by such court for the contravention of any of the by-laws in connection with which such permit was issued.
- (2) The Commissioner may refuse to issue a permit under by $_{\mathrm{law}}$ 2 to any person whose previous permit has been cancelled by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 14. (1) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner or the medical officer of health, or for any officer of the Council acting under the authority of the Commissioner, to inspect and seize any article of food exposed for sale within the premises of the fair, which appears to him to be unwholesome.
- (2) Where any article seized under paragraph (1) is certified by a government medical officer to be unwholesome, such article may be destroyed without payment of compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.
- 15. (1) No person shall resist, obstruct, hinder or molest any officer or person appointed by the Commissioner to Suprintendent the fair in the execution of his duties.
- (2) No person shall resist, obstruct, hinder or molest any person appointed to collect the fees by the Council or (where the right to collect the fees has been leased) by the lessee, in the execution of his duties.
 - 16. No person shall-

 - (a) construct any sheds or awnings, or leave mats or sacks in the premises of the fair earlier than 3 p.m. of the day preceding the holding of the fair; or
 (b) leave any sheds awnings, mats, sacks or any other goods in the premises of the fair later than 9 a.m. the day following the holding of the fair.
- 17. It shall be lawful for the Commissioner, or any other officer of the Council acting under the authority of the Commissioner to remove any sheds, awnings, mats, sacks or any other goods left in the premises of the fair after 9 a.m. the day following the holding of the fair.
- 18. Every contravention of any of these by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees and, in the case of a continuing contravention, with an additional fine not exceeding twenty five rupees, for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction or after service of a written notice from the Commissioner or any officer authorised by the Commissioner directing attention to such contravention.
