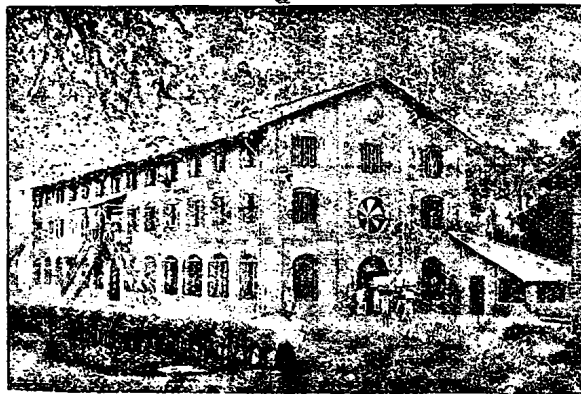

China, East—Pescadores Islands—Rock to the South-eastward of Ponghau Island.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 740 of 1899) of the existence of a rock, named Nansho, with

a depth of 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms over it at low water, south-east ward of Ponghau island.

Nansho rock is situated with Round island bearing N. 16° E., distant 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and Hau point S 86° W.

Approximate position: lat. 23° 30' 10" N., long. 119° 42' 0" E.

Variation, nil in 1899.
