Vs. Municipal Council, Negombo.

Award

This Award relates to a reference made to this Tribunal under section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 revised edition) as amended by subsequent Acts.

The matter in dispute is whether the termination of the services of Mr. K. M. Chandrasekera by the Municipal Council Negombo, is justified and to what relief he is entitled.

It is not in dispute that Mr. Chandrasekera functioned as a Physician of the Ayurvedic Dispensary, Moor Street, Negombo, run by the Municipal Council, from 13th November, 1963 to 1st June, 1964.

Mr. Chandrasekera's case is that, as a result of an interview with the then Mayor of Negombo, one Mr. John Rodrigo. he (Mr. Chandrasekera) agreed to take up the post Ayurvedic Physician in a honorary capacity as from 6th November, 1963, for a period of 3 months, on the understanding that he will be made permanent at the end of that period. He has complained that although he continued to work for a period of 6 months in the above hope of obtaining permanent employment, his services were terminated with effect from 1st June, 1964, consequent on the appointment of another person as the

permanent physician. His contention is that the termination of his employment is wrongful in view of the promise held out to him.

The position of the Municipal Council is that Mr. Chandra-sekera was appointed by exhibit A1 as an honorary Ayurvedic Physician, and that at no time was any promise given to him that he would be made permanent. The appointment was on the strict understanding that it was on a vountary basis. At the end of the period of approximately 6 months when the L.G.S.C. appointed a permanent physician, the services of Mr. Chandrasekera had to be discontinued and he was given a certificate to that effect and the Municipality had no choice in the matter.

As far as the documentary evidence goes it is clear that there is nothing to support Mr. Chandrasekera's version. However, he relied on the evidence of two witnesses, one Piyatilleke, the establishment clerk of the Municipal Council and one Ganizius de Crusz, the store-keeper, also of the Municipal Council, who, it would appear, had been present at the interview. It is not possible to say from the evidence of these two witnesses that there was any definite promise held out to Mr. Chandrasekera to make him permanent at the end of the 3 months Mr. Chandrasekera speaks of. Piyatilleke admitted the fact that it was an extra ordinary thing that nothing of the discussion was recorded. He said that it is usual to put on record matters of this nature. Witness Crusz who had introduced Mr. Chandrasekera is also not certain of the exact terms and condition discussed.

On the other hand Mr. Chinniah, the then Municipal Commissioner in his evidence has stated that he was present at the discussion that Mr. Chandrasekera had with the Mayor and he was certain that no definite promise was held out to Mr. Chandrasekera as stated by Mr. Chandrasekera. On the contrary he stated that Mr. Chandrasekera succeeded one Ayurvedic Doctor Cyril Silva. Dr. Cyril Silva had also served in honorary capacity.

It would, therefore, appear from the above evidence, although the possibility of Mr. Chandrasekera being made permanent was discussed, there had been no definite promise to that effect. At most this had been a mere gentleman's agreement and what was discussed was never intended to form a part of a binding contract.

There is also evidence to show that the Municipal Council had made every effort to get Mr. Chandrasekera appointed to the permanent post but this was not possible as it had to be made by the L.G.S.C. according to their requirements. Mr. Chandrasekera did not have the required qualification. In any event Mr. Chandrasekera would not have been appointed to this particular dispensary because appointments to such posts were made by the L.G.S.C. not on an area basis.

For these reasons I hold that the termination of Mr. Chandra-sekera's services as honorary physician was justified and that he is not entitled to any relief.

Collective Agreement No. 2 of 1970

This Collective Agreement made this ninth day of March one thousand nine hundred and seventy pursuant to the Industrial Disputes Act Between the Ceylon Estate Employers' Fedaration a trade union duly registered under the provisions of the Trade Unions Ordinance and having its registered office at 73/1, Kollupitiya Road, Colombo 3 (hereinafter referred to as "the Federation") of the one part and the Ceylon Workers' Congress a trade union duly registered under the provisions of the Trade Unions Ordinance and having its registered office at 72. Ananda Coomaraswamy Mawatha, Colombo 7, (hereinafter referred to as "the Congress") of the other Part.

Whereas after due consideration of the minimum wages payable at the date hereof under the provisions of the Wages Boards Ordinance to workers employed in the Rubber Growing and Manufacturing Trade the parties hereto are agreed that the members of the Congress governed by the decisions of the Wages Board for the Rubber Growing and Manufacturing Trade should receive a price/wage supplement based on the average sale price of Ribbed Smoked Sheet No. 1 (hereinafter referred to as "RSS No. 1").

And whereas at the date hereof the basic wages prescribed by the Wages Board for the Rubber Growing and Manufacturing Trade are

Rs. 1.40 per day for male workers not under 16 years of age. Rs. 1.30 per day for female workers not under 15 years of age. Rs. 1.05 per day for child workers.

It is hereby mutually agreed between the Federation and the Congress as follows:—

- 1. This Collective Agreement shall bind the Federation and the Congress as well as the members for the time being and from time to time of the Federation and the members for the time being and from time to time of the Congress who are employed by members of the Federation.
- 2. The price/wage supplement payable in terms of this Collective Agreement to any worker employed in the Rubber Growing and Manufacturing Trade shall for all purposes of any written law or otherwise be deemed to constitute part of his wages.
- 3. Every worker employed in the Rubber Growing and Manufacturing Trade shall be entitled to receive and every employer of such worker bound by this Collective Agreement shall be liable to pay such worker a price/wage supplement computed in accordance with the provisions of the schedule hereto with reference to the average sale price of RSS No. 1 for the month immediately preceding. immediately preceding.
- 4. "The average sale price of RSS No. 1" shall mean the average sale price of RSS No. 1 payable by the Commis-sioner of Commodity Purchase to Shippers in Colombo as shall be declared by the Commissioner of Labour and published in the Ceylon Government Gazette.
- 5. The amount payable as and by way of price/wage supplement in terms of this Collective Agreement shall be reduced ment in terms of this Collective Agreement shall be reduced by the amount of any increase which may be granted in future by the Wages Board for the Rubber Crowing and Manufacturing Trade in the basic wages or the Special Allowances payable to workers employed in that trade as at the date hereof. There shall be no reduction in the price/wage supplement in consequence of any increase in the Special Allowances payable to workers employed in the Rubber Growing and Manufacturing Trade, resulting from a fluctuation in the Cost of Living Index.
- 6. This Collective Agreement shall come into effect as from 1st March, 1970.
