The Union, in its Statement of Case, stated that the 47 workers were discontinued on 1st July, 1969, without proper notice of termination and without payment of gratuity for their many years of service, and prayed for reinstatement with back-wages.

The Employer's position was that it did, in fact, close down its rubber export business at Nos. 41, 43 and 47, Lacsoreen Street, Kotahena, and No. 46, Green Lane, Kotahena, on the 1st July, 1969, and thereupon terminated the services of the workers there employed as from that date with one month's wages in lieu of notice; that, of the 47 persons listed in the Commissioner's statement of matters in dispute, six (6) workers—

No. 3-M. Sirisena-left in June, 1964;

R. M. K. Wimalasena and No. 30—M. R. M. Siddiek were temporary workers whose employments were terminated on 20th May, 1969, with one month's wages in lieu of notice in consequence of reduction in volume of work;

—G. W. Nancy Nona was deemed to have vacated post from 27.4.69 (re which Labour Tribunal Application No. 1/729/69 is pending); No. 37-

and five (5) other persons

No. 15—L. W. Simon Perera, No. 21—N. Jesamuthu, No. 32—G. Charles Silva, No. 40—P. Somaweera Latha and No. 43—J. A. Alice were not employed by the Company.

During the hearings on 27.12.69, 4.1.70, 9.1.70, 16.1.70, 15.2.70 and 1.4.70, Mr. H. D. Ismail, instructed by Mr. Arnold de Silva, appeared for the Company and the Union was represented on different dates, by Mr. P. B. Wijesundera, its Assistant Secretary, Mr. K. V. Kanapathy. General Representative, and Mr. L. W. Panditha, General Secretary.

There was the question of to what workers this award should apply and what their length of service was. At the request of apply and what their length of service was. At the request of Court a statement showing the length of service of each of the workers affected was filed by the Union (A. I in respect of all 47 workers) and by the Employer (R. I—in respect of 41 workers, i.e., excluding Nos. 3—said to have left in June, 1964—and Nos. 15, 21, 32, 40 and 43 whose names do not annear in their Registers). It was later agreed that the Labour Tribunal application by No. 37 G. W. Nancy Nona should be withdrawn and the award of this Court accepted instead. It was also accepted that it was possible that these workers whose names were not found in the Company's records could possibly be represented therein under different names.

It was early established that the termination of services of employees on 1.7.69 was in fact directly consequential to the closure of the business by the Company. I agree as urged by Mr. Ismail for the Company that neither this Court nor any other had the power to enforce continuance of a business by an Employer against his firm decision to close it. On the other hand I, at the same time, agree with the Union's contention that it was unjust and contrary to accepted Labour principles for an Employer to effect closure of his business (however long premeditated and necessary) without sufficient notice and provision for his workers who are rendered unemployed by such action. In this case figures were produced by the Employer—Company, for his workers who are rendered unemployed by such action. In this case figures were produced by the Employer—Company, showing that the downward trends of their Rubber Export business were sufficiently cogent to support their decision to close down. In the circumstances Court considered that the termination was justified and the Union did not seriously contest this and was therefore agreed not to pursue its request for reinstatement. This did not, however, justify the denial of sufficient notice to workers. In this regard the Company's position was that they had paid one month's wages in lieu notice, and, apparently, had left the question of quantum of monetory consideration and any other terms for settlement before this Court. this Court.

At this stage parties found it desirable to come to a settlement. This was finally reached on 1.4.70, and the following Memorandum of Settlement was finalised and signed by Mr. L. W. Panditha on behalf of the Union and by Mr. Musin on behalf of the Company before me on 5.4.70, with the assistance and approval of Court:

#### MEMORANDUM OF SETTLEMENT

#### It is agreed-

- (a) that the Respondent Company has already paid its employees one month's salary in lieu of notice;
- (b) that the respondent agrees to make a further payment ex-gratia of three weeks' salary for each year of service. Fractions of a year exceeding one-sixth will be paid for proportionately.
- (c) that in the event of the respondent's rubber export business being revived by any other person, applications by the workers in employment at the time of the closure for employment will be given preference in order of their seniority, due regard being had to the requirements of the new business. It is also agreed that any persons so recruited will be employed as new hands, commencing employment at the date of their engagement as aforesaid.
  - (d) that the following should be added to the list R. 1':-

No. 3-W. M. D. Sirisena

No. 15-W. Simon Perera,

No. 21-M. Pachimuthu

No. 32-G. Charlis Silva, and

No. 40—P. Samaradeevakara

these workers are not employees of the respondent.

If, however any employees claim to be the persons represented thereby and produce their certificates of discharge their claims will be considered.

No. 37—G. W. Nancy Nona (L. T. 1/729/69 withdrawn) is entitled to this Award plus one month's salary in lieu

Nos. 25, 26, 27 and 30 in R. 1 are not entitled to this Award.

- (e) that the Applicant Union agrees to the deduction of the loans they have obtained from the Respondent before the payment of the money due to them on the aforesaid basis.
- (f) that the Respondent agrees to add on ex-gratia 12 months to the period of service of every employee at the date of the closure.

It is finally agreed that the Respondent pays the employees in terms of the statement produced and marked R. 2 in full and final settlement of all claims, statutory or otherwise, of the employees.

The Respondent will send cheques made out in favour of the individual employees to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo North, Narahenpita, on or before the Tenth of April, 1970, for payment.

The above terms have been accepted by both parties in Court on 5.4.70 and declared by me in open Court at the time. I consider these terms fair and reasonable and make my Award accordingly.

#### Decision

This is a decision under section 34 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1956 Revised Edition), as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968), made in respect of the following questions referred to me by the Commissioner of Labour by his order dated 21st March, 1970, arising out of my Award dated 24th November, 1969, in this dispute under Case No. A. 828:—

- "(i) Whether the payments ordered through the Award in favour of M/s. K. D. Kularatne, V. G. S. Munasinghe, H. D. Sumathasiri, T. H. Victor Peiris, V. E. Varghese, H. A. Tudor, D. M. Piyadasa, V. Edmond Joseph and T. M. Jayasekera should be made to them by the Management of The Associated Engineering Co. Ltd., directly or through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo South, and
  - (ii) the date before which the above payments should be made. "

On the 11th of April, 1970, parties being duly noticed. Mr. S. Hari Hara Iyer represented Mr. M. S. Liyanage (present), one of the Directors of the Company, and The Associated Engineering Co. Ltd., whilst Mr. P. Rajanayagam appeared for the Ceylon Mercantile Union. Five of the employees affected were also present.

In regard to the above questions (i) and (ii), I consider that the Award was clear enough where it stated—

"The Company shall pay the above sums as agreed to the employees concerned within two (2) weeks of the publication of this Award."

The Award was published on the 12th December, 1969, and had the payments been made by the Company, as agreed, within two weeks of that date, no question should have arisen.

Having regard to the situation as it now exists, it was agreed in Court on 11.4.70, as between the Company and the Union representing the workers concerned, that the sums awarded in my relevant award of 24.11.1969 be paid to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo South, Labour Secretariat, Colombo 5, by the aforesaid Company on or before the 11th June, 1970, for distribution accordingly to the said workers. I make Order accordingly.
