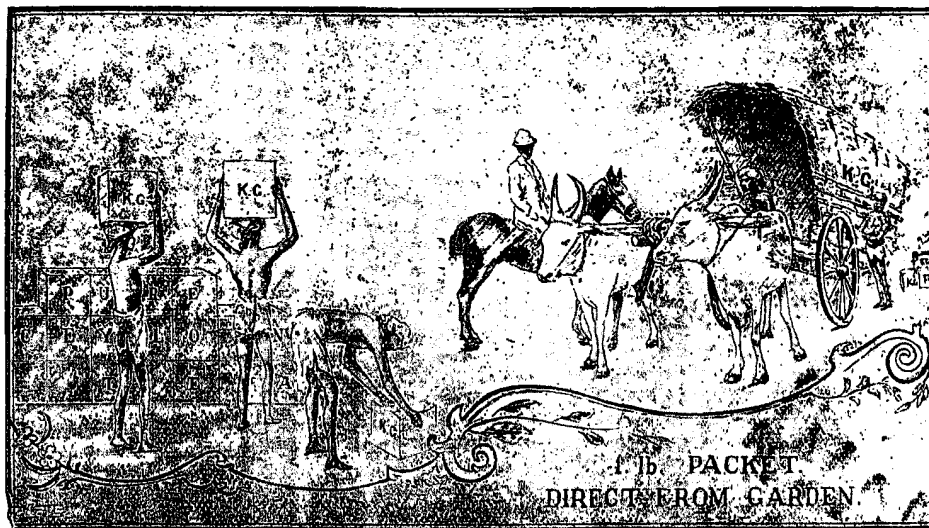

*India—West Coast—Mangalore Light.*

With reference to this office Notice to Mariners No. 9 of 1900, it is notified that the arc of illumination from

seaward of the fixed white light to be exhibited on and after May 1, 1900, from a (cement) grey tower on the Marine yard at Mangalore is from N. 12° E. through E. to S. 27° E. (magnetic), and that the height of the tower from base to vane is 48 ft.
