*India, West—Malabar Coast—Murmagoa Harbour—
Leading Lights, Buoys, &c.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 235 of 1900) that on February 1, 1900, two white fixed leading lights, visible from a distance of 12 miles, were exhibited from cylindrical columns, painted white, in Murmagoa harbour; the front light is situated on Chiquilim point, the rear light on Secretario island, about 14 cables S. 78° E. from the front light.

Approximate position: front light, lat. 15° 24' 35" N., long. 73° 49' 50" E.

The above two lights in line S. 78° E. lead into the harbour.

Also, that it is intended to exhibit from the extremity of the pier a red fixed light, visible about 4 miles through an arc of 76° over the anchorage, in place of the light now shown on the pier.

The black conical buoy marking the Murmagoa rock, and the red conical buoy marking the submerged end of the pier, will both be withdrawn.

*New Zealand—Bay of Islands—Rawiti Passage—
Buoy established.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 236 of 1900) that a red buoy has been placed to mark the sunken rock on the edge of the shoal extending to the southward of Poroporo island. It is situated with the west extreme of Poroporo island bearing N. 8° W., distant 5½ cables, and the east extreme of the same island N. 37° E.

Approximate position: lat. 35° 14' 35" S., long. 174° 14' 45" E.

Variation, 13° easterly in 1900.
