- 3. The matter came up for hearing on the 23rd May, 1970, and again on 18.6.70. Mr. L.L. de Silva, Organising Secretary, All Ceylon Local Government Workers' Union appeared for the Union, and Mr. Advocate N. C. J. Rustomjee, instructed by Mr. Warusavithane, Assistant Legal Officer, Colombo Municipality, represented the Colombo Municipal.
- 4. At the hearing of this matter the Council withdrew from its position that it had the power to punish this category of employees for refusal to work overtime in the circumstances of this case and accordingly agreed to remit the fines imposed.
- 5. I hold that the action of the Municipal Council in the circumstances of this case is unjustified, and order that the fines recovered from the six workers named above should be paid back to them along with or before the regular payment of wages to them next after the publication of this Award.

It is the case for the Union that these workers were working It is the case for the Union that these workers were working in this establishment for many years prior to their letters of appointment. On 31st December, 1968, they were paid their wages, at 12.30 p.m. and as it was a half day they did not come back to work in the afternoon. The 1st and 2nd January, 1968, were Public Holidays, and when they reported for work on the 3rd they were not given work. On the 4th they were sent letters to the effect that they had vacated their posts.

The case for the Company is that prior to 1968 these workers were employed by one Abdul Cader, an independent contractor employed by the Company. On 1.2.68, they were taken on probation for six months, but they were not confirmed at the end of that period. On the 31st December in the afternoon they did not turn up for work, as their demand for a bonus had not been granted. On the 3rd January, 1969, they were in the premises, but had not reported for work.

- 6. On the question whether these workers were employed by the Company prior to 1968, there is sufficient evidence, both oral and documentary, to show that they were employed by Abdul Cader, an independent contractor. The Company has produced stamped receipts (R2 to R18) signed by Abdul Cader for large amounts received by him as wages. Abdul Cader admitted that he gave receipts to the Company for wages paid by him for seven or eight years for piece-work done by these workers. The Attendance Registers, R27 and R26, show that these workers have signed against their names from February 1968 to December 1968, which was, in fact, the period during which they were employed by the Company. According to the Store Keepers' Wages Book, R24, these workers have signed and drawn their weekly wages from February 1968 to 30th December.
- I have examined these documents and I find no reason to doubt their genuineness. No documentary evidence has been produced by the Union to show that any of these workers were employed by the Company prior to February 1968. This position is further strengthened by their letters of Appointment; R1, R20 and R25 in respect of Kusumawathie, Alawudeen and Abdul Cader. Except for the oral evidence of three workers, namely, Kusumawathie, Alawudeen and Abdul Cader. no other evidence Cader. Except for the oral evidence of three workers, namely, Kusumawathie, Alawudeen and Abdul Cader, no other evidence has been adduced in support of the fact that they were employed by the Company prior to February, 1968. Kusumawathie, in her evidence stated that she received her wages prior to February, 1968, from Banjit Perera, but this is contradicted Abdul Cader when he says he paid the respective labourers, wrote the total amounts and placed his signature. Kusumawathie categorically stated in evidence that although she had not seen anybody sign the Copy Book for his or her wages prior to February 1968, she had signed it. She further said that when she signed she had not seen the signatures of the other workers. On the evidence I am satisfied that these workers were employed by Abdul Cader, an independent contractor prior to 1st February, 1958.
- 7. These workers were employed by the Company on 1st February, 1968, except for Alawdeen, who was employed on the 23rd February, 1968, and according to their letters of appointment, they were taken on probation. The question then arises whether they were automatically confirmed on the expiry of six months.

- It was argued for the Union that at the end of the probationary period, the probation ends unless the Employer informs the workers that their probationary period has been extended. The Employer should either confirm them or inform them that they have not been confirmed. For the Company it was argued that there must be an express act in writing on the part of the Employer confirming their employment; otherwise, the presumption is that they still continue to be on probation. There does not appear to be any decided case in Ceylon on this point. In 1965, Vol. I.—Indian Labour Law Journal, page 77, it was held that probationers could not claim automatic confirmation on expiry of the period of probation unless so provided for in the order of appointment. In the "State of Uttar Predesh Vs. Akbar Ali Khan", reported in 1963, Vol. I. Labour Law Journal, the Allahabad High Court following a Full Bench decision in "Chief Conservator of Forests, Uttar Predesh Vs. D. A. Lyall" in 1961 2. Labour Law Journal 251, held that an officer placed on probation could not be deemed to be confirmed unless and until an express order of confirmation is passed. In "Caltex Vs. Secretary, Industrial Tribunal 1953, Vol. I. Labour Law Journal, p.156, it was held that a probationer cannot be deemed to be confirmed in his post by sheer lapse of time. A probationer cannot automatically acquire the status of permanent membership in service unless, of course, the rule under which he is appointed expressly provides for such a result. appointed expressly provides for such a result.
- 8. In the case of these workers, their letters of appointment, 8. In the case of these workers, their letters of appointment, clearly state that on expiry of six months they will be considered for permanent employment. The Management has not written to the workers that they have been confirmed. They have, therefore, been on probation on 31.12.68. Perhaps, the workers thought that they were confirmed at the expiry of the probationery period. It is unfortunate that the Union did not intercede on their behalf at the end of the probationary period. However, hard and unconscionable it may appear to be where ignorant workers are concerned, as the law stands, I am constrained to hold that they were on probation.
- 9. It is not disputed that 31st December, 1968, was not a pre-Poya day, although the workers thought it was a half day, because they were paid at 12.30 p.m. on that day. It is in evidence that the workers were paid at 4.30 p.m. when the week ended on a full working day, and at 12.30 when the week ended on a half day.
- Mr. Kreltshzeim in his evidence stated that the 31st December, 1968, was a half day for the clerical staff. According to R28, the Office and Staff Attendance Register, Ranjit Perera and Dharmasena, the Store-keeper, left at 1 p.m. Perhaps the workers honestly believed that it was a half day for more than workers honestly believed that it was a half day for more than one reason. Firstly, it was a half day for the Company. Secondly, they were paid at 12.30 p.m. and not at 4.30 p.m. as if on a full working day. Thirdly, being the end of the year they perhaps thought it was a half day. Fourthly, according to the evidence of the three workers, Dharmasena, the Store-keeper had told them at 10 a.m. on that day that they should work overtime after 1 p.m. These workers had demanded a bonus from Mr. Kreltszheim at the time they were paid their wages at 12.30 p.m. Mr. Kreltszheim statied in evidence that he told them he would consider their demand. There seems to be some justification for a bonus as they had worked for 11 months. It may well be that they kept away on that afternoon because they were tion for a bonus as they had worked for II months. It may well be that they kept away on that afternoon because they were not given their bonus. However, for the reasons stated above I am of the view that they were under the honest but mistaken belief that it was a half day. Ist and 2nd January 1969, were Public Holidays, and on the 3rd it was alleged that they went for work, but were not given work.

On behalf of the Company, it was stated that they had not taken their tokens and gone to work but sat on the premises. It is significant that both Mr. Kreltszheim and Dharmasena saw these workers on the morning of the 3rd but neither of them had thought it fit to call them and ask them why they were there if they were not working. The proper course would have been to call for an explanation. The Management acted rather been to call for an explanation. The Management acted rather hastily in sending letters of vacation of posts within three days, unmindful of the fact that two of these days were Public Holidays. They might have held an inquiry or have written to them that if they did not return to work they will be deemed to have vacated their posts. I, therefore, hold that the Management had terminated their services by its letter of 4th January 1969.

10. Evidence was led of mis-conduct, arriving late for work, leaving the premises before the scheduled time and absence without leave. I am satisfied that Kusumawathie, Alawudeen and Abdul Cader had on several occasions kept away from work and walked out and walked in without prior permission. On several occasions Kusumawathie had been pulled up by the Management for late attendance. On 10th October 1968 she was written to (R21) that she had abused Ranjit Perera, Dharmasena and Mr. Kumar and was asked to apologise. She was suspended for 14 days in this connection. It is in evidence that Abdul Cader had left the premises on several occasions without prior permission. He was not amenable to discipline. By R29 Abdul Cader had left the premises on several occasions without prior permission. He was net amenable to discipline. By R29 he had been warned for leaving the stores at 3.15 p.m. on many occasions. Alawudeen's attendance has been very unsatisfactory. He has been an unwilling worker and refused to obey instructions and has been warned several times for leaving the premises without permission. I am unable to place any reliance on the evidence of Kusumawathie, Alawudeen and Abdul Cader. Fareed,

Buhardeen, Baby Nona and Mohideen appear to have carried out instructions, although they, too, have on certain occasions come late for work and left the stores without permission. They have not received any letters of warning; presumably their conduct did not merit any warning. Mr. Kreltszheim stated that he was prepared to take some of the workers back at a conference with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour.

11. Having considered the evidence of the witnesses and the documents placed before me, I hold that the non-employment of Kusumawathie, Alawudeen and Abdul Cader were justified and that they are not entitled to any relief, whatsoever.

With regard to (1) Fareed, (2) Buhardeen, (3) Baby Nona, and (4) Mohideen, I hold that their non-employment is unjustified.

I hold that they be reinstated from the date of the publication of this award in the Ceylon Government Gazette and direct that the back wages due to each of these workers be limited to 10 months wages.

I make award accordingly.
