The Examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations. The medium of examination will be English.

(vii) Officers who have passed the two-year course in Quantity Surveying I and II (Buildings) are eligible for exemption from the subjects " Taking out Quantities " for the purpose of this Examination.

(b) Inspectors having the necessary Technical qualifications, who were appointed to Local Government Service prior to the publication of the Local Government Service Salaries Scheme 1955, are exempted from all the subjects prescribed for this examination except the paper relating to " Municipal Council Ordinance, Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, Motor Traffic Act, Drainage By-laws, Waterworks Ordinance, etc. "

2. *Application.*—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on the specimen form given below and must be addressed to the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo.

(ii) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo on or before 4.8.1970. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

(iii) Candidates must forward their applications through the Head of the Local Authority in which they work. If any candidate fails to do so he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iv) Candidates must forward their applications to the Head of the Local Authority in which they work well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission on or before 4.8.1970.

*N.B.*—Applications not made on the prescribed form or not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this notification will be rejected.

3. *Admission to the Examination.*—(i) The Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to the candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such forms will be refused admittance to the examination.

(ii) Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admittance to the examination.

(iii) A copy of the time table will be forwarded together with the Admission Form. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination, must produce his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the examination.

(iv) If a candidate does not receive his Admission Form at least seven days before the day of examination, he should communicate with the Secretary, Local Government Service, Commission, informing him that he has not received the Admission Form and giving the following particulars :—

*N.B.*—Admission to the Examination does not constitute acceptance of eligibility.

4. If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the Regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage, prior to during or after the examination.

5. *Leave to Officers to attend Examination.*—Heads of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers serving in their Council, whose applications are accepted by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, to present themselves at the examination.

6. *Identity Cards.*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor, for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted :—

- (a) Identity cards issued by the Postmaster-General.
- (b) A valid passport issued within 3 years preceding the date of this examination.
- (c) Any certificate, licence, or other documents embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination on the authority of a Government Department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

7. *Scheme of Examination.*—The subjects of the examination will be—

- (A) Trigonometry—100 Marks (3 hours).

Leading up to Graphs of trig. ratios likely =  $a \sin (cx + d)$  ;  $Y = A \cos (ex + d)$  ; Solutions of equation like  $p = A \sin (co + d)$  ;  $p = a \cos (co + d)$ . To obtain the maximum value for  $a \cos + b \sin$  and solution of  $a \cos + b \sin = c$  ; Harder Identities on trig. ratios. Identities involving the sides and angles of a triangle ; Solution of triangles.

- (B) Taking out Quantities—2 papers (i) or (ii)—100 Marks (3 hours).
  - (i) Standard Method of ' Taking off ' Squaring, abstracting and Billing for building plans of which will be provided. Candidates will be required to be conversant with the current rates, or
  - (ii) For Water Supply and Drainage Sections—Such as manholes, House Drainage, Septic Tanks, Water Towers, Incinerators, Storage Tanks, &c.

- (C) Surveying and Levelling (Lower Paper)—100 marks (3 hours).

The subject will be confined to chain surveying only, levelling and the use of the road tracer and Abney level.

*Chain Surveying.*—Instruments used in Chain Surveying ranging out straight lines on uniform ground and over ridges and hollows, measurements of distances with the chain or steel bands on level or sloping ground, method of obtaining horizontal distance on sloping ground, principal sources of error and their correction, method of fixing points in relation to survey line by means of offsets and ties, method of booking survey lines and details, plotting survey, scale, conventional methods of representing various features such as fences and boundaries, roads, railways, buildings of various kinds and land, special problems such as setting out a right angle, dropping a perpendicular from a point on to a chain ; line ; chaining post and inaccessible area, chaining past obstacles, finding distance across river, surveying for sides of river, &c.

*Levelling.*—This shall comprise all levelling with the exclusion of precise levelling and include the following :—

The essential elements of construction of the Engineer's level and staff, and the methods of using them, the temporary adjustments of the level computing the levels by the " Rise and Falls " and " Instrument Height " methods, various errors and their corrections, taking of longitudinal and cross sections, contouring taking out quantities from contour plan ; levelling problems and devices.

*Road Tracer and Abney Level.*—The principles of operations and use of these instruments. There will be three papers as follows :—

- (i) Set paper—Surveying and Levelling.
- (ii) Field work and plotting—chain survey.
- (iii) Field work and plotting—Levelling, use of road tracer, &c.

- (D) Surveying and Levelling (Higher paper)—100 Marks. (3 hours).

As in (C) above with addition of the following :—Surveying, Traversing with theodolite, elementary principles of the construction for the theodolite and its use, running a traverse, correction of angles, plotting of a closed traverse and correction of closing error by graphical means. The candidates will be tested in—

- (i) Set Paper—Surveying and Levelling.
- (ii) Field work and Plotting—Surveying and Levelling.

- (E) Drawing—100 Marks (3 hours).

- (i) Buildings ; or
- (ii) El. Water supply and drainage ; or
- (iii) Bridge and Heavy Structure Construction and Maintenance.

This paper will be limited to the tracing of a development of working plans from line diagrams, drawings of section and elevations not given in the plans but from the views and details given in the plans. Marks will be given for neatness, accuracy and for the arrangement and presentation of the plan (the details on the original provided may be rearranged for this purpose at the candidates discretion).

(F) Building Construction and Maintenance—100 Marks (3 hours).

*General Principles of construction.*—Soils, Foundations, Piles, Brickwork, Bonds, Floors, Roofs, Partitions, Doors, Windows, Stairs, Shoring, Needling, Underpinning, Reinforced Concrete, Steelwork.

*Standard Specifications.*—Properties and use of Building Materials, Measurements, &c.

(G) Road Construction—100 Marks (3 hours).

(i) *Road Construction.*—Standard classification of the roads in Ceylon. Specification as to widths of roads, widths of culverts and bridges in the above classification, setting out and construction of roads, gradient, camber, super-elevation and drainage of roads, types of road surfaces and materials used, types of foundation for roads, metalling and surface treatment. Type of retaining walls, culverts and small bridges, and setting out same. Plant used in road construction and maintenance—its operation and maintenance. Use of the Road Traacer.

Improvement of minor roads taken over from V.C., U.C. and D.R.C., to conform to P.W.D. classification analysis of D.S.R., check roll and works organization. Preparation of reports and estimates for construction or improvement of roads and other structures.

(ii) *Road Maintenance.*—Remetalling and reconditioning various types of road surfaces. Reconditioning side drains and surface drainage.

Maintenance of culverts and bridges, materials used such as rubble, metal, gravel, sand, tarbitumen, &c. Preparation of road maintenance, estimates programmes, bills, materials and metal returns, &c. Analysis of D.S.R. check roll and works organization. Safety regulations regarding blasting operations. Reports and estimates to be furnished when taken over roads from V.C., U.C. and D.R.C. Reports to be furnished regarding erection of buildings, &c., on P.W.D. roads. Registers of road reservations.

(H) Water supply and Drainage—100 marks (3 hours).

(i) *Elementary Physics.*—(a) The principles of calculating areas, volumes, capacity of drains, egg-shaped sewers, &c. (b) The composition and properties of air and water. (c) The principles of Hydrostatics and Hydraulics. The velocity and discharge of liquids and gases through pipes, channels and orifices. Definitions in Hydraulics. Flow of water in pipes of simple cases connected with house drainage. (d) Porosity; Capillarity. (e) Definition of vacuum, action of siphon, principle of suction, the construction of lift and force pumps. (f) Production and transmission of heat, and the effect of heat on solids, liquids and gases. (g) Rainfall measuring instruments. Their construction and use. Temperature recording instruments. (h) Physical properties of metals and alloys used in plumber's work. Definitions: Properties and uses of alloys, such as Brass Bronze, &c., Electrolysis of metals—its cause, effect and remedy. Weights of lead of specified thickness. Corrosion of iron pipes, treatment by Dr. Angus Smith's process. Corrosion of metal in the tropics—methods of preservation.

(ii) *Water Supply.*—Sources of water supply—Wells, springs, artesian wells, Rainfall and its effect on water supplies. Gravitation schemes, pumping schemes, measuring the flow of water, impounding, and storage reservoirs.

*Practical Field observation of water samples.*—Practical field test for salinity, contamination of water, hardness and permanent hardness tests. Effects of various waters on lead fittings, and the results on the quality of the water.

Water fittings, cast iron pipes, wrought iron pipes, tapping mains under pressure, fittings, to houses, water hammer, how caused and its prevention.

*Requirements and supply of towns and public institution.*—Special knowledge of water fittings connected with house drainage—Colombo Waterworks; principle regulations, Prevention of waste of water.

Drainage sewerage and sanitary, appliances, house drainage, definition of drains, sewers, sewage. Disposal of surface and rain water separate and combined systems.

The proper conditions of good drainage. House drainage fittings, water closets, traps, gullies, use of intercepting traps, sewer and drain ventilation.

Examples of house drainage, pipe laying, joining trenches. Testing of house drains apparatus used.

General principles involved in the various methods of sewage treatment.

The various systems of dealings with house sewage and refuse.

(iii) *Water.*—Sources of supply—measurement of water. Storing of water. Brackishness and physical characteristics of water. Filtration methods. Requirements of supply-pipes, fittings, Prevention of pollution of waste

(iv) *Specifications.*—Knowledge of the P.W.D. Standard specifications for Water Supply Works.

(I) Bridge and Heavy Structure Construction and Maintenance—100 Marks (3 hours).

(i) *Preliminary Investigations.*—Methods of carrying out bridge surveys and taking longitudinal and cross sections. Alignment of bridges and deviations and methods of carrying out borings.

(ii) *Construction.*—Setting out a bridge from plans and methods of carrying out and difficulties encountered in—

(a) Excavation for foundation of abutments and piers. (b) Sinking concrete cylinders. (c) Erecting, Driving and Extending R.C.C. and sheet piles. (d) Underwater concreting. (e) Driving and extracting timber and steel sheet piles. (f) Erection of steel bridges of all types.

Reinforcement, mixing, placing and curing concrete; Staging for pile drives supporting, erecting, and striking, shuttering types of super structure—

i.e., R.C.C. Slabs.

R.C.C. Tee Beams precast or cast in situ steel Girders supporting :—

(i) Troughings.

(ii) Corrugated plates.

(iii) Curved plates or Bucklad plates.

Types of wearing surface over bridge platform; Reverting; Types of temporary bridges; Plant used in bridge construction.

(iii) *Strengthening and Maintenance of Bridges.*—Common failures in substructure and super-structure of bridges and prevention and remedy of same; Replacing members of steel truss bridge girders, strengthening or replacing existing cross girders; replacing bridge decking; strengthening existing bridges by means of intermediate pile trestles. Sealing, scraping, red leading and tarring of steel work of bridges. Maintenance of wearing surface of bridge platform.

(j) M.C.O. Ordinance, Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, Motor Traffic Act, Drainage By-laws, Water Works Ordinance—100 marks (3 hours).

8. Officers who are required to qualify for promotion over the E.B. Rs. 7,500 will be required to pass in subjects (A) to (G), (H) or (I) and (J). Officers who are required to qualify for promotion over the E.B. Rs. 6,024 and Rs. 4,872 are required to pass in subjects (A) to (C), E(i) to (H) and (J).

9. Separate question papers will be set for different grades except (i) Surveying and Levelling (Higher). (ii) Bridge and Heavy Structure construction and Maintenance. These two papers will be set only for the Grade I Examination.

Question papers will be set in the following manner :—

- Grade I : Question papers—E.B. before Rs. 7,500.
- Grade II : Question papers—E.B. before Rs. 6,024.
