Objections to the aforesaid proposal will be received by the Chairman of the Board until 12 noon on September 12, 1970.

Every such objection must be made in writing and must contain a statement of the grounds upon which such objection is taken.

SCHEDULE

The decisions in respect of minimum wages made by the Wages Board for the Printing Trade and set out in the Schedule to the notification published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,436 of July 21, 1945, as varied from time to time, shall be further varied by the substitution for Part II of that Schedule, of the following new part:—

PART II

- (1) Wages for the Printing Trade shall be paid on a monthly basis.
- (2) The minimum rate of wages for time work shall consist of a basic rate and a special allowance as set out below.
- (3) (a) A worker of any class specified in this Part shall be paid as wages for any month mentioned in Column I below an amount equal to the minimum monthly rate specified in respect of that class in this Part, if he has worked during the minimum number of working days specified in respect of that month in Column II below:
Provided, however, that the minimum number of working days specified in the aforesaid Column II shall be reduced by one in respect of any month which has five Sundays.

For the purposes of this sub-paragraph, any day on which the employer fails to provide work to any worker who presents himself therefor shall be deemed to be a day on which such worker has worked.

- (b) In respect of each such day of work in any month as is in excess of the minimum number of working days specified in respect of that month in sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, the minimum rate of wages payable shall be an amount equal to twice the minimum daily rate ascertained by dividing the minimum monthly rate by 25.
- (4) Where a worker has not been in employment for a full month he shall be paid as wages an amount which bears to the minimum monthly rate the proportion which the period of employment bears to the number of days in the month.
- (5) Where by reason of any unauthorized absence a worker of any class specified in this Part has not worked in any month during the minimum number of working days specified in respect of that month in paragraph (3) (a), he shall be paid as wages for that month an amount which bears to the minimum monthly rate specified in respect of that class in this Part the proportion which the difference between such minimum number of working days and the number of days of unauthorized absence bears to such minimum number of working days.
- (6) Absence from work on holidays or on days for which leave with full pay is allowed shall not be deemed to be unauthorized absence.

The Honourable Minister of Labour and Employment, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon (1936 Revised Edition) as amended by Acts Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968 (read with Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act No. 37 of 1968) referred the above dispute to me for settlement by arbitration. The matter in dispute, according to the statement of the Commissioner of Labour dated 2nd March, 1969, accompanying the Honourable Minister's Order of reference of 17th March, 1969, was—

" whether the employees of the Hatton Bank Ltd. should be granted the terms and conditions of employment applicable to employees in Banks belonging to the Commercial Banks Association as agreed between the Ceylon Bank Employees' Union and the Commercial Banks Association and, if not, what should be the terms and conditions of employment."

The matter came up before me on the 25th May, 1969. Mr. Prins Rajasooriya, instructed by Mr. R. S. Bhagavan, appeared for the Ceylon Mercantile Union. Mr. Advocate S. J. Kadigamar, Q.C., instructed by Mr. C. A. S. Mather, appeared on behalf of the Hatton Bank Limited. Counsel on both sides represented to court that the two parties were very hopeful of reaching a satisfactory settlement very shortly at further conferences, and accordingly requested that the proceedings be laid by *sine die* for the present.

On the 25th February, 1970, parties reached agreement and transmitted same to court. In all the circumstances of the dispute, I agree that this represents a satisfactory and equitable resolution of their dispute and I make my Award in terms of the settlement as follows:—

- (1) The Hatton Bank Limited will grant to the employees mentioned above the terms relating to salary and grading in the current agreement between the Ceylon Bank Employees' Union and the Commercial Banks Association with effect from November, 1966.
- (2) In regard to all other terms and conditions of employment, the Hatton Bank Limited will be bound by the provisions of Collective Agreement No. 5 of 1967 pending the formation of the new Bank.
- (3) If a new Bank is formed amalgamating the Hatton Bank Limited with two outstation Branches of National and Grindlays Bank Limited, the employees of the Hatton Bank represented by the Ceylon Mercantile Union in the present proceedings under this reference will be offered employment by the new Bank. If the offer is accepted by any or all of the employees and if any such employees work up to the time when they would be entitled to a pension in accordance with the Thal-godapitiya Award, the period of service of such employees with the Hatton Bank Limited will be counted for pension purposes.

Award

This is an award made under section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments, Ceylon (Revised Edition 1956), as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts Nos. 14 of 1957, 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962, 37 of 1938 and 39 of 1968. It refers to an industrial dispute between Mr. H. N. Perera of 1054, Kandy Road, Kelaniya (hereinafter referred to as the applicant), and Brooke Bond Ceylon Ltd., No. 200, Union Place, Colombo 2, (hereinafter referred to as the respondent).

The Honourable Minister for Labour, Employment and Housing, by his order dated 3rd of June, 1967, made under section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act referred this matter to me for settlement by arbitration.

The Commissioner of Labour by his statement dated 25th of May, 1967, has stated that the matter in dispute is as follows—

“ whether the termination of the services of Mr. H. N. Perera is justified and to what relief he is entitled to ”.

The applicant in respect of whom this reference has been made, Mr. H. N. Perera, had been employed as a Junior Clerk in the respondent Company with effect from the 28th of January, 1957. Certain terms and conditions of service had been specifically stipulated in the letter of appointment which was dated the 25th of January, 1957. Thereafter by letter dated 8th of August, 1957, having satisfactorily completed his period of probation he had been appointed to the permanent cadre of the Company.

The letter of appointment stipulated, among other things, that he was entitled to contribute 10 per cent. of his salary to the Provident Fund. He was also entitled to 14 days privilege leave which the Company suggested be taken in one period. He was also entitled to 7 days casual leave which had to be availed of depending upon the exigencies of service and subject to prior approval. He was also entitled to medical leave with pay up to 42 days and a further 42 days to be on 3/4th pay. Even thereafter medical leave would be granted at the discretion of the Company. Medical leave was not accumulative from one year to another. The letter of appointment was marked R.1 and the letter confirming him in his appointment was marked R.2.

For the first time the respondent has had occasion to warn the applicant in respect of his work by letter marked R.3 dated the 16th of April, 1959. He had been warned against slackness in his work and the letter also goes on to state, “ we will have to consider whether we will be able to retain your services with the Company ”. There had been no reply from the applicant to this letter. Again, on the 27th of October, 1959, by letter marked R.4 he had again been warned with regard to his work. To this letter also there had been no reply from the applicant. By letter dated the 13th of May, 1961, marked R.5, he had again been warned about an accident at Kekirawa to motor van No. 33 Sri 22.7. In this letter it was stated “ Consequently, you are hereby warned that any further incident of neglect, etc., will warrant your dismissal ”. On the 10th of August, 1961, he had again been warned about a quarrel he had with another clerk. This letter was marked R.6. His superior officer had made the endorsement, which was marked R.6A, that the workman concerned had refused to sign an acknowledgment regarding the acceptance of this letter.

On the 23rd of January, 1962, by letter marked R.7, the Secretary of the firm had confirmed a discussion which he had with the applicant regarding his unsatisfactory work. On the 22nd of January, 1964, by letter marked R. 8, the applicant concerned had been informed that numerous discussions and verbal warnings had been administered by the writer regarding his unsatisfactory work and attendance. This letter which had also been acknowledged by the applicant stated, “ While confirming previous warnings you are also hereby informed that you will not be granted medical leave, unless same is recommended by the Company doctor ”. A letter of warning had also been given again on the 3rd of February, 1964, which was produced marked R.9. It stated that within two weeks of the last letter, he had submitted another medical certificate for

one day. It also stated that up to that date he had reported for work only on 13 days and on 5 of these days he was late for work. The letter added, “ Should there be no improvement in the immediate future, we will not hesitate to take steps to discontinue you from employment ”. Another letter of warning had been issued to the applicant dated the 19th of February, 1964, which was produced marked R.10.

According to this letter between the 2nd of December, 1963, and the 17th of February, 1964, he had availed of 19 days medical leave. In between these dates which was approximately 2½ months he had suffered from influenza on not less than five occasions. He had suffered from diarrhoea on two occasions. He had suffered from enteritis on one occasion and he had suffered from colitis with diarrhoea on one occasion.

Mr. S. E. G. Perera, the Personnel Manager and Consultant to the Ministry of Industries, who was the Personnel Manager at the material time, gave evidence. According to him, the work and attendance of the applicant concerned was very unsatisfactory. In view of this reason the Company had also taken steps for executives of the Company to have verbal discussions with the applicant in respect of his work in addition to the numerous letters which were written to him. The company had formed the impression that the applicant was malingering under cover of illness. It was for this reason that the Company on the 22nd of January, 1964, by letter marked R.8, specifically informed him that he would not be given medical leave unless it was recommended by the Company Doctor. However, it was clear that the applicant had, even after this order, submitted a medical certificate marked R.20 in respect of the period 29th February, 1964 to the 4th of March, 1964.

On the 4th of March, 1964, as the applicant did not report for work, two Executives of the Company Mr. S. E. G. Perera and Mr. A. L. Fernando had gone to the residence of the applicant. They had visited the address of the applicant as was available to them from the records of the Company. They had not found the applicant at home. They had come to the conclusion that the applicant was not ill on that date.

On the 5th of March, 1964, the company had terminated the services of the applicant giving him 3 months' salary, which was a sum of Rs. 1,122.88.

The response to the letter of termination was marked R.17. This letter had been written by the applicant about a month later on the 8th of April, 1964. In this letter he had made the claim somewhat half-heartedly for re-employment and if that was not possible he had requested that his provident fund money and his medical scheme money be paid to him as early as possible.

Thereafter, the applicant apparently had not taken any further steps in respect of the termination of his services. He had not filed an application before the Labour Tribunal. This reference had been made by the Hon'ble Minister on the 3rd of June, 1967, that is, approximately, 3 years and 3 months after the date of termination of services.

The applicant concerned gave evidence on his own behalf. According to him, there was no dispute that he was employed in the respondent Firm from 1957 in the capacity of a clerk. According to him, for a short period he also worked as a Telephone Operator. This makes no material difference to the case.

In the first instance, he tried to explain the delay in coming before any forum for relief. It was admitted by him that he was a member of the Ceylon Mercantile Union which had a very active branch in the respondent firm. The Union for some reason or other did not wish to sponsor his case. Thereafter, he said he approached certain influential people to bring about a reinstatement which too did not meet with success. Several years later this reference had been made to this Tribunal.

The applicant also tried to make it appear that certain letters of warning which were marked and which were purported to have been delivered to him were not received by him. His position was an invitation to this Tribunal to come to the conclusion that these documents were fabrications on the part of the Company, and that his attendance and work were quite satisfactory.

Learned Counsel for the respondent completely demolished the credibility of the workman concerned in this reference. The cross-examination clearly revealed that he was a completely untruthful person who was giving evidence in reckless disregard of the truth or falsity of the statement he made. In fact, on several occasions, the applicant could give no reply to the questions of Counsel for the respondent. The demeanour displayed by the applicant in giving evidence and the manner in which he gave his evidence was so obviously that of an untruthful person that Counsel for the respondent on one occasion invited me to make a note of this fact in the proceedings.

I was convinced that the applicant concerned was an untruthful witness and I pay little regard to his evidence.

From the facts of this case it has been clear that the applicant has been very generously treated. In fact, as far back as 1957 the Company had a Provident Fund Scheme whereby the respondent contributed 10% and the applicant 10%. The medical

leave scheme of the Company has been extremely generous and I have no doubt that the medical scheme of the Company was to accommodate employees who were genuinely ill and not to permit persons to malingering and be on full pay under the guise of being sick.

In fact, I cannot visualise a more generous scheme of medical leave than the one stipulated in clause 5 of the letter of appointment R.I.

I completely reject the contention of the applicant that any letters of warning issued on him are fabrications. I accept the evidence of the Company that they were, in fact, delivered to the applicant. I am also convinced that from 1959 to 1964 the applicant had been given several warnings in writing and that Executives had gone to the extent of having personal discussions with him to enable him to improve his work and attendance. Several warnings had been given to the applicant that his services would be terminated if there was no improvement in his attitude for work. All this had been of no avail. The applicant, apparently, had ignored all warnings turning a deaf ear to the advice administered to him and failed to show the slightest improvement. In spite of the fact that the applicant was informed that no medical leave would be allowed unless recommended by the Company Doctor, he had disregarded these instructions and submitted a medical certificate from an Ayurvedic Physician after keeping off from duty. The behaviour of the applicant in this case has been such that no reasonable employer could have countenanced it.

From the evidence it is clear to me that the respondent had acted in a very reasonable manner and had afforded ample opportunity to the applicant to improve his work and attendance. The conduct of the applicant had been such that the respondent had been left with no alternative but to terminate his services.

On the evidence before me I hold that the respondent was justified in terminating the services of the applicant.

The only other question which remains for consideration is whether the applicant in this case is entitled to a gratuity. I have considered the generous rates of contribution by the respondent from 1957 up to the time of his termination. I have also taken into consideration the consistently bad record of the applicant who has failed to show any progress in his work over a period of several years. Even in the witness box he appeared to me to be a person who was completely untruthful. In this instance I do not call upon the respondent to pay any gratuity in respect of the period of service.
