Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE

Examination (Sinhala) for Recruitment to Grade II of the Local Government Translators Service—21.10.70

A competitive examination (Sinhala) for recruitment of candidates of either sex to Grade II of the Local Government Translators Service will be held in Colombo. The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examination.

2. *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to Grade II of the Local Government Translators Service, on the salary scale of Rs. 3,864 per annum rising by 18 annual increments of Rs. 144 to Rs. 6,456 per annum. E.B. before Rs. 5,304 per annum.

3. *Conditions of Service*.—(a) Male candidates, who are successful in the examination, will be appointed on 3 years probation with effect from the date of appointment. Their posts are pensionable. Female candidates, who are successful in the examination, will be appointed on a Provident Fund basis in the first instance and will be on trial for a period of three years with effect from the date of appointment. They are entitled to opt to come into the pensionable establishment at any time before completing 10 years service. The option once exercised will be irrevocable. These female candidates, who exercise this option during the period of trial will be placed on probation thereafter, the period of probation being equivalent to that part of the three years trial period, which they have not served.

(b) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the by-laws and the regulations of the local authority in which she/he is employed subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Act, No. 18 of 1969, other regulations framed thereunder.

(c) They will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon.

(d) Successful candidates will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and in particular, for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

4. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as and when vacancies occur.

5. *Eligibility*.—Candidates for this examination must—

(i) be of good character;

(ii) be Ceylonese*;

(iii) possess at least one of the following main requirements:—

- (1) The London University General Certificate of Education (Advanced Level) in Sinhala;
- (2) The Ceylon General Certificate of Education (Advanced Level) in Sinhala;
- (3) The Higher School Certificate with Sinhala (not Special Sinhala) as a subject;
- (4) The London University Intermediate Arts Certificate/ the Ceylon University General Arts Qualifying Certificate with Sinhala as a subject;
- (5) A pass in Sinhala—Advanced Level—in the Proficiency Examination in Sinhala of the General Treasury;

together with at least ONE of the following supplementary requirements:—

- (a) The Senior School Certificate (English Medium) issued in or before July, 1957, with a credit pass in English Language or English literature

OR

The Senior School Certificate with a credit pass in English Language Syllabus 'A' or in English Literature obtained on any occasion at a General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) Examination;

OR

A pass in an examination with an equivalent or higher attainment in English.

- (b) The General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) in six subjects obtained on not more than two occasions including a credit pass in English Language Syllabus 'A' or in English Literature.

Note.—Applications will not be entertained from candidates who have sat for any of the examinations mentioned above the results of which have not been released before the date of closing of applications for this examination.

(iv) Candidates must be not less than 19 years nor more than 30 years of age on 16.9.1970. Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilised service in the last war from their age.

6. *Special Concessions*.—(i) Persons holding permanent posts in the Local Government Service on 28.8.70, will be permitted to sit for this examination, irrespective of age, and educational qualifications provided—

(a) their services are certified as satisfactory by the heads of Local Authorities who are prepared to release them if they are selected for appointment to the 'Translators' Service.

(ii) Persons holding temporary posts in the Local Government Service on 28.8.70, will be permitted to sit for this examination, provided—

(a) they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 5 (iii);

(b) they are under 45 years of age on 28.8.70; and

(c) they have completed at least one year's continuous service on 28.8.70.

7. *Applications*.—(i) Applications should be made on the specimen form published at the end of this notification. Only half-sheets of foolscap paper should be used.

(ii) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on or before 16.9.70. Any application received after that date will be rejected. The name of the examination should be clearly written on the top left-hand corner of the envelope.

(iii) The applications must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 25.

(iv) Candidates who are already employed in Government Service or Local Government Service must forward their applications through the Heads of Departments/Local Authorities in which they work. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified. Candidates are requested to forward their applications to the Heads of the Departments/Local Authorities, well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, on or before 16.9.70.

8. *Documents of Eligibility*.—(i) No documents whatsoever should be forwarded with the application but the necessary particulars should all be provided in the form as required.

(ii) The documentary evidence in proof of eligibility will be required from candidates who have qualified. Such candidates should produce those documents under registered cover when called for by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission.

(iii) The following documents will be necessary:—

(a) a certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth (affidavits or baptismal certificates or special certificates of birth issued for school or educational purposes or a certified extract from the Birth Registration entry will not be accepted);

(b) a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise, it must be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary Public, or generally some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be made.

(c) originals of certificates in proof of educational qualification; and

(d) Identity Card.

(iv) Candidates are requested to have all the necessary documents in readiness at the time of application. Any candidate who is unable to produce the necessary documents at the "Viva Voce" test or who delays in producing them when requested by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, will have his entry rejected.

N.B.—(1) APPLICATIONS NOT MADE ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM WILL BE REJECTED.

(2) APPLICATIONS NOT CONFORMING IN EVERY RESPECT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS NOTIFICATION WILL BE REJECTED.

9. *Admission to the Examination*.—(i) The Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, will issue Admission Cards to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their Admission Cards. A candidate not producing such form will be disqualified.

(ii) Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself/herself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

(iii) If a candidate does not receive his Admission Card at least seven days before the date of the examination he/she should communicate, without delay, with the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, informing him that he/she has not received the Admission Card and giving the following particulars:—

10. If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his/her candidate is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the examination.

11. Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalised.

12. *Withdrawal and Refunds.*—In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made.

13. *Leave to officers to attend Examination.*—Heads of Departments/Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies whose applications, have been approved by the Secretary, Local Government Service Commission, to present themselves for the examination.

14. *Identity Cards.*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of his Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.
- (b) A valid passport issued within three years preceding the date of this examination.
- (c) Any certificate, licence, or other documents embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination, on the authority of a Government Department.

CANDIDATES WHO FAIL TO PRODUCE THEIR IDENTITY CARDS AT THE EXAMINATION HALL WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

15. *Scheme of Examination.*—The subjects of the examination and marks assigned to each subject are given below. In written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.
