The petitioners are seeking a declaration that their Fundamental Rights guaranteed to them under article 12(1) and 14(1) (a) of the constitution have been infringed by the

Maithripala's writ petition to be heard before five-judge-bench

The Court of Appeal yesterday decided to near former President Maithripala Sirisena's writ petition before a fuller bench comprising five judges of the Court of Appeal.

In his writ application former President Sirisena had challenged the magisterial inquiry and issuance of summons against him in connection with the Easter Sunday attack incidents.

Court of Appeal (President) Justice Nissanka Bandula Karunaratne announced that the five-judge-bench comprising most senior judges of the Court of Appeal are to be appointed to hear this petition. Meanwhile, the Court of Appeal further ordered to lay by the magisterial inquiry against former President Maithripala Sirisena at Colombo Fort Magistrate's Court.

Filing a motion before the Court of Appeal, Rev. Fr. Cyril Gamini Fernando had earlier sought a fuller or a divisional bench to hear the writ petition filed by former President Maithripala Sirisena.

Faiszer Musthapha PC with Counsel Keerthi Tillekaratne and Pulasthi Rupasinghe appeared for the former President. Rienzie Arsekularatne PC with Counsel Udara Muhandiramge appeared for Fr. Cyril Gamini

On October 14, 2022 the Court of Appeal wo-judge-bench issued an order postponing the magisterial inquiry against former President Maithripala Sirisena and the writ petition was accordingly fixed for argument. The Court of Appeal further decided to postpone the magisterial inquiry at Colombo Fort Magistrate's Court for a period of 10

UNIONS DIVIDED OVER STRIKE

The Government Medical Officers Association (GMOA) said they would participate in the trade union action today. GMOA Spokesperson Dr. Chamil Wijesinghe said that they engaged in their trade union action yesterday, but no response was received from any responsible authority and therefore the association's central committee decided to continue the TU action until they receive any response.

The Ceylon Electricity Board (CEB) engineers and other employees have decided to go on sick leave today in protest against the government's tax policy.

However, the specialized hospitals in provinces, including maternity and children's hospitals, the National Cancer Institute, the National Institute of Mental Health, Nephrology treatment units, military hospitals, and emergency services in all hospitals, will not be affected by the trade union action.

The Water Board workers yesterday withdrew from their duties and engaged in their four-hour trade union action until 2 p.m. claiming that the President has not paid heed to their demands as yet. Therefore, the workers have decided to engage in 24-hour trade union action today. No office or customer service will be entertained. However, Railways General Manager W. A. D. S. Gunasinghe said the engine drivers' unions have communicated that they will take part in today's trade union action. Railway services will be hampered due to the trade union action. Discussions are underway to avoid service interruptions. There is no need to be upset, he said, as he did not make any wrong statement. The Minister made these comments speaking to journalists at the MICE EXPO organized by Sri Lanka Convention Bureau and Sri Lankan Airlines at the Shangri-La, Colombo.

Addressing the forum earlier, Fernando said that his intention was not to offend the Maldives but to work with the country to promote Sri Lankan tourism.

"I have got into a bit of trouble since of late, when I have made a comment about Maldives. I need to rectify that here as well," Fernando said.

"The Maldivians, my friends have got a bit annoyed with me for that comment, but I apologize if there's any inconvenience caused to them," he clarified.

COPE raps CID and Sri Lanka Insurance

It has been decided to send observations from COPE to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the purpose of a formal closure of the two branches

COPE Chairman Ranjith Bandara requested Sri Lanka Insurance to inquire from CID about the progress of the investigation into the incident. It has been revealed that the complaint has been lodged with CID in 2009 and nothing has been done about it.

Officials of Sri Lanka Insurance said the matter was pertaining to fictitious brokers who had been appointed during the time Sri Lanka Insurance was run as a private entity.

It has been decided to send observations from COPE to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the purpose of a formal closure of the two branches under the Insurance Corporation in Maldives and Seychelles which have suffered huge financial losses. The decision to close down the Sri Lanka Insurance branch in Maldives has been made 25 years ago while the decision on the closure of Seychelles has been made in 2016. However it is yet to be implemented according to COPE.

Also the COPE had recommended that Sri Lanka Insurance should be divided into 2 entities so that life insurance business and general insurance business could be handled





ADDRESSING POVERTY IS A STATE RESPONSIBILITY

hether the country is reeling from an economic crisis or not Sri Lankans once in every few years witness a trend among some sections of the society taking drastic decisions to ruin their own life and that of their children. One might doubt if such a trend is in the making at present as well, given a series of self inflicted crimes committed by some people for the past few weeks, especially taking the lives of their own children.

A man from Aranayake had killed his two children before committing suicide on February 6 while in a similar incident, two children had been found murdered after which their mother had attempted to kill herself as well on February 18 in Kuruwita. Another mother from Kebithigollewa in Anuradhapura had jumped into a well on March 5 along with her two children and on the same day another disgruntled mother had thrown her one-andhalf year-old child into a shrimp tank in Udappuwa, a fishing village in Puttalam District. Two days later, a young father from Vavuniya had killed himself by hanging after poisoning his wife who was a teacher and two children. It was said that the man had been frustrated as he had run into debt.

We have been reading in newspapers or watching in televisions similar incidents in the recent past as well such as parents throwing children into crocodile-infested rives or jumping into rivers, leaving the children on the bank. When we hear those incident our subconscious conclusion would be that the wretched person or the family represents the low income stratum of the society, as that has been the case in most occasions. Not a single incident cited above had occurred in affluent families. The immediate cause for these incidents may vary from family disputes, indebtedness to unemployment or such frustrating situations, but poverty lies as a running thread underneath all these

One can blame the current economic crisis for the above incidents, but poverty had taken toll on lives of low-income families even during politicians thumping their chests over what they claim massive economic development in the country. A casual Google search would remind us many such incidents took place during the past several decades. True, the current economic downturn has ruined the lives of the members of thousands of families who had been leading a somewhat comfortable life and the push for them to take drastic decisions should be relatively higher, though only a few succumb to that drive. And running counter to the claims of some politicians about economic hegemony of certain communities over the one they belong to, we hear of these unfortunate incidents from around the country.

What is disheartening is nobody responsible for the country's economy seems to have been moved by these horrific reports. They apparently feel this situation as something alien to their realm of authority and these shocking incidents are felt like those in the movies they have been watching. A sense of duty to address the underlying causes is not

An individual has to bear some degree of responsibility to his economic standing, but humans do not live alone like Robinson Crusoe in an isolated uninhabited island. The state as the collective and organized mechanism for the security and wellbeing of all individuals has a higher degree of responsibility to address issues such as natural disasters, epidemics and poverty that cannot be tackled individually. Feudal China and the Tsarist Russia which were highly backward in the early 20th century became world powers with socialist programmes launched by the leaders of famous Chinese and Russian revolutions. Germany and Japan which were destroyed by the World War II emerged within a few years as economic giants with successful capitalist programmes by the leaders of those countries. Singapore, Hong Kong, Taiwan and South Korea are another four cases in point for the state transforming the economy into "tigers."

In Sri Lanka, even those who ruled the country now admit that they destroyed the country. They put it as "all past governments are responsible for the current economic mess." Impunity for high profile corruption is something well accepted in this island. After the country being declared bankrupt in April last year Sri Lanka is now about to be awarded with a breathing space by the International Monetary Fund (IMF) by helping restructuring its foreign debt and lending it US\$ 2.9 billion for four years. Along with the debt restructuring, the government is planning to obtain more loans from the World Bank, Asian Development Bank and some countries. Yet, we have a blurred future ahead of us, as we are yet to be informed of how we are going to shake off the burden of all these debts and how the leaders are going to develop the country, using these borrowings.

MISERY IS QUICKLY FORGOTTEN **EXCEPT BY THOSE WHO SUFFER**



e get so mired in our own problems that we forget how troubled the outside world is. Not that it's any comfort. The problem is that, while the epicenters of violence which threaten world stability, such as the Ukraine, get all the media attention, other troubled nations are quickly forgotten and left to stew in their own misery. Myanmar, Iran, Belarus and Palestine are prominent examples, while no one even mentions Zimbabwe, Venezuela, Haiti or Albania.

Russia is still a world power capable of rattling the West. Once a great nation, it doesn't belong in the above list but has done most things wrong under autocratic President Vladimir Putin and is set on a self-destructive course. One year after Russian President Vladimir Putin's invasion of Russia, I can see how mistaken my initial assessment was. The invasion was a mistake but I thought Russia's massive armoured forces would easily overrun Ukraine. It has proved to be otherwise. That assessment was based on Soviet era Red Army capability, now obviously eroded by corruption and selection of inept generals and strategists by Putin, who can't put this right because he's very much part of this self-serving and self-consuming system.

While there are no clear victors in this war (now reminiscent of stagnant World War I warfare or the Iran-Iraq war started by Saddam Hussein, the Ukrainians can claim the moral high ground with their fierce resistance. When the war ends, it will face huge problems because of terrible infrastructure damage, people's mental and physical health and other issues. Russia, despite talk of a powerful Moscow-Beijing alliance, has in fact become an economic satellite of China, a humiliating fate to a country which got its then backward ally started in her drive to be a military-industrial power

under Mao Tsetung.

To get out of this socio-economic and political quagmire, Russia needs bold new leadership ready to forget world dominance and territorial claims and willing to keep corruption under check. Unfortunately, the country's best democratic hope for this has been jailed under trumped up charges, much of the opposition and free press silenced. China checked corruption with brutal efficiency. Those convicted of bribery or siphoning off public assets were executed by firing squad, and the victim's family had to pay

Putin can't do this because he will have to shoot his own friends. Of course, in Sri Lanka, we find such solutions unacceptable because this is a democracy which guarantees the rights of those politicians responsible for economic crimes and unsolved disappearances.

Russia's more prosperous ally too, is focused on territorial claims – Taiwan and the Spratt Islands, and is a nuclear power. That gives this duo an awesome power which the old Axis powers – Germany, Italy and Japan - never had.

Of the other troubled nations mentioned above, it's Myanmar which provides the most heartbreaking example. After decades of military rule, it remains poor and underdeveloped, with per capita income rarely going above US\$1400. Administrative services, health and education suffer severe problems as the country's military rulers, with Chinese backing, pour money into lucrative mega projects such as highways and a new capital, profitable to themselves and their business backers.

Aung San Su Kyi, daughter of assassinated national hero Gen. Aung San and Myanmar's democratic hope, was finally freed three years ago after spending most of her life in detention. In November 2020, her National League for Democracy (NLD) won General Elections with more than 80% of the vote. Striking a deal with the military, she was appointed 'national councillor' or de facto prime minister and Myanmar began walking a perilous path to democratic rule. But, though the deal still gave them power in parliament and several key portfolios including defence, the military simply could not get used to civilian rule.

They ousted her government in a coup in February 2021, placing Suu Kyi under house arrest. She was subsequently arrested under sham charges, facing 18 months of trials on 19 charges. A Myanmar military court has sentenced Aung San Suu Kyi to a total jail time to 33 years. She is now 77 and, unless a miracle occurs and she goes free, the military clearly want her to die in jail. Her trials have been set behind closed-doors

where the public and media are barred access and her lawyers were banned from speaking to journalists. This was in effect a military kangaroo court.

Large parts of Myanmar descended into chaos after the latest coup, displacing more than a million people. More than 2,900 people have been killed during the junta's crackdown on dissent, according to monitoring group the Assistance Association for Political Prisoners.

40,000 homes have been burned down, 8 million children are no longer in school, and 15 million people (of a total of 53.8 million) are judged by the UN to be dangerously short of food.

Much of the country is caught up in a brutal civil war. Yet the military is still refusing to negotiate with its opponents, as it promised to do in a meeting with neighbouring countries shortly after the coup.

Instead, it has plans for an election which would almost certainly exclude Suu Kyi, and much of her party.

Those loyal to her are calling on citizens to boycott any poll organised by the military, arguing it would be illegitimate and impractical. The UN says these would be "sham elections".

Many members of Suu Kyi's party are among more than 16,600 people who have been arrested by the junta since they seized power - 13,000 remain in prison, according to the Assistance Association for Political Prisoners (Burma).

Recently, the UN Security Council called for an end to violence in Myanmar and the release of all political prisoners. China and Russia abstained from the vote and did not use their veto power following amendments to the resolution's wording.

With no hope of fair elections or the military showing any signs of compromise, young people have taken two different paths of protest – one of 'silent protests' in the cities where they hold placards. But those with less patience have taken to violence.

With typical harshness, the junta has executed suspects and passed a draconian law under which the properties of those on trial for terrorism will be confiscated, forcing families to state publicly that they have disowned family members, be they sons, daughters or spouses, accused of such 'crimes against the state.'

Soon after she became national councellor, Suu Kyi lost her standing in the West for not standing up to the military when they began brutally persecuting the Muslim Rohingiya minority. Oxford University which awarded her an honorary degree, removed her portrait and she was widely condemned as racist and unfeeling towards the Rohingiyas.

But it's clear now why she remained silent. If she had spoken out, the coup which ended Myanmar's all too brief experiment with democracy and rule of law, offering a glimmer of hope to millions of long suffering citizens, would have come sooner rather than later. The military were simply waiting for a chance to get back to the driving seat. When she didn't give them one, they quickly made it up.

QR Code for Fuel

Seven months before, the authorities has introduced the QR Code System to issue Fuel to the vehicles according to the types of vehicles. The quota is entitled for a week and reset the quota by midnight of Sunday/Monday.

However, the reset date of the quota has been changed to Monday/Tuesday midnight recently as cost saving of distributions during the weekends. If the reset date change as Friday/ Saturday this benefit will be more effective.

As an example 20 liters quota is entitled for Motor Cars category and fuel tank capacity of majority of cars are above 40 liters. Hence, every week most of them require to fill their tanks every week and wasting their valuable time as well as filling stations' resources.

Hence, it's proposed to change the system to allocate quota to be doubled and reset every 2 weeks time. This benefits the customers to fill their tank at once and manage their long distance travels accordingly.

A/L answer script marking

As a matter of fact that the GCE (A/L) examinations concluded last month but the preparation for answer script evaluation is still dragging on due to the anomalies in the payments for evaluators of answer scripts. The evaluators were paid at the rate of only Rs 2,000 each a day but this amount is hardly sufficient for the evaluators to manage with their daily expenditures during the script markings. The CTU secretary has revealed that the Ministry authorities has agreed to pay to Rs 3,000 each evaluator a day. SISTERHOOD INITIATIVE CELEBRATES THREE YEARS

To commemorate three years since Sisterhood Initiative's (SI) inception, -"Celebrating SI" was held recently at the International Centre for Ethnic Studies recently.

According to a release issued by SI, this Muslim women's group was founded in early 2020 by Nabeela Iqbal; an activist with experience in peacebuilding,

The release states, "Sisterhood Initiative is a non-profit, non-political & non-religious discussion and volunteer group, dedicated to understanding and addressing issues faced by Muslim women across the island. The group engages with women from all faiths and backgrounds. Its vision is to make Muslim women be recognised as important stakeholders in society with decision-making power. SI works towards creating a safe space for women to have conversations, to inspire learning and

leadership through volunteering, while raising awareness for the protection and advocacy of the rights of Sri Lankan Muslim women.

Piyumi Wattuhewa, the Coordinator for Colombo, described how the unfair treatment that Muslim women were subjected to became increasingly transparent against the backdrop of the Easter Sunday Attacks in 2019. This inspired SI's founding members to invite women to converse about their experiences. They had an overwhelming response and from there, the group has since expanded to different Muslim, Wattuhewa spoke of her

experience in Sisterhood as not catering exclusively to Muslim women. In fact, during one of the highlights of the event, members from the audience were asked to say a word that described SI — "inclusivity" was one of them. The other words included "safe space", 'community", "advocacy" and "freedom".

Despite the pandemic ensuing almost immediately after SI's inception, Samiha Muhsin, the Coordinator for Kandy, explained that their most impactful discussions were held online; such as IG lives like "A day in the life of a Muslim Girl in Ramadan", "Learning about Poson Poya Day" and "Conversation between a Catholic and a Muslim".

SI had also had heavier conversations, surrounding the Muslim Marriage and Divorce Act (MMDA) reforms, women's participation in politics, forced cremations, which were carried out with relevant experts. But the work done by the SI Team has come at the cost of online attacks and harassment, with the intention of discrediting young female activists.

The group has increasingly come under scrutiny for their work, the slander only worsening under Sri Lanka's current crisis. The team has been subjected to smear campaigns and thinly veiled threats, especially for their work in bringing light to laws that discriminate against Muslim women, under the MMDA.

But that has not stopped the team. SI has been running (Legal) Support Team which consults young women who reach out, through social media and its membership, regarding domestic and intimate partner violence, and discrimination in the Quazi courts. Shifa Najumudeen, an Attorney-at-Law and also SI's Legal Officer, carries out free weekly online consultations for these women. Fellow Sumaiya Frahath assists these cases with her background in Psychology.

One of SI's biggest milestones is their campaigns

team programme. Volunteers were pooled into teams by inter-faith and intra-faith dialogues, women's rights and the MMDA reforms. They learned about key policy and legislative instruments that shaped Sri Lankan society and were mentored on how to inspire change. Other workshops, with resource persons, included digital

storytelling and countering hate speech on social media.

A highlight of SI's 2022 was drawing murals in Union Place and Slave Island with South Asian artists, Fearless Collective, to depict images of minority women, representing leadership and unity. The group returned to Slave Island, during the height of the economic crisis, to support communities with ration packs distributions.

Key stakeholders who've worked with SI present at the event shared their sentiments. Rev. Fr. Andrew Devadason of St. Paul's Church, Milagiriya, said "All the parents here are very proud to see these young women working at their potential. I am leaving with greater hope. You guys are the hope for this nation. We are getting old, but this nation will not fall because of

you. I saw that here as I came, I told Mr. Iqbal (Nabeela's father) you will initiate change. It's there in you and all that I have heard

On April 21, 2022, SI in collaboration with the Milagiriya Church organized an Ifthar (breaking fast) event to remember the victims of the Easter Sunday Attacks and the families affected by the unlawful arrests that followed, under the PTA.

"I noticed how much joy is there in the way you work. I have always noticed the duty of care you all have towards getting something moved off the internet or getting a case result and the duty of care that you hold

for people who come to you for help or advice. I think that's very commendable. I really hope you don't lose sight of it and I have faith that you won't," said Saritha Irugalbandara from Hashtag Generation, an organization which SI relays cases regarding online harassment. They also help the team at SI remove harmful content off the internet.

The event concluded with a conversation between Nabeela and the Guest Speaker, Shreen Abdul Saroor, the co-founder of Women's Action Network. She spoke of her experience working with SI during the government's policy of forced cremations and its crushing impact on Sri Lankan Muslims. She commented on SI: "I am also one of the admirers of Sisterhood Initiative. Since their inception, I've been working with them. I see their volunteerism and how they resonate with the community wherever they go, how they care about the community, how they care about other activists on the ground."





Ireland to play two Tests in Sri Lanka after schedule tweak

Ireland's tour of Sri Lanka next month will now include two Test matches -- the visitors' fifth and sixth ever -- after a scheduling rejig, officials said yesterday.

The tour initially comprised one Test match and two ODIs, but both teams agreed to play a second Test and skip the 50-over games.

Both Test matches will be played in Galle, the first starting on April 16 and the second on April 24.

Richard Holdsworth, of Cricket Ireland, said they agreed to the late change in schedule because the Test series is preceded by six white-ball matches in Bangladesh and followed by three further ODIs after they return home. "Exposing our playing group to an extended period in Asian conditions will be beneficial to their development and given the World Cup this year is in India, the more exposure to these conditions the better, despite it being a different format," he said in a statement. Ireland have played just three Test matches, losing all of them, since being given Test status in 2017.



They are due to play their fourth.in Bangladesh, in early April. In June they are set to take on England in a one-off Test at Lord's.



President assures transparent, fair debt restructuring effort

n an open letter to Sri Lanka's official bilateral creditors, President Ranil Wickremesinghe yesterday assured that safeguards will be put in place to ensure equitable burden sharing and comparability of treatment.

Sri Lanka defaulted on its debt last April, and is expected to announce its debt restructuring strategy this April, according to the Central Bank

Governor Dr. Nandalal Weerasinghe. The island nation successfully secured financing assurances from all its major bilateral creditors, which was a prerequisite to unlock an International Monetary Fund

(IMF) bailout package to the tune of US\$ 2.9 billion over a period of four

The Executive Board of the IMF is meeting on March 20 to consider Sri Lanka's request for a bailout, and if approved, the first tranche of the facility would be released shortly.

Sri Lanka would need to restore debt sustainability over a ten-year period as per the agreement with the IMF, and debt treatment remains the most critical aspect of that exercise.

In this backdrop, President Wickremesinghe yesterday assured Sri Lanka's bilateral creditors with transparency, equal treatment of all creditors and equitable burden sharing of all restructured debt.

"We also understand and acknowledge that we must ensure that appropriate safeguards are in place to ensure equitable burden sharing and comparability of treatment. To alleviate any legitimate concern in that regard, there are commitments that we can make to those of you willing take action ahead of others.

Govt. hints providing relief to public sector after April

While insisting that only to government employees and 10 percent of public sector employees are subjected to PAYE taxes, the government revealed that discussions are underway to grant relief to public sector employees after

April.
"We will prioritise providing relief to public sector employees once we see a marked improvement in the economy," the Cabinet Spokesperson Minister Bandula Gunawardana told reporters in Colombo yesterday.

In particular, he noted that discussions are underway at the Treasury to provide tax relief special attention has been drawn to exempt various allowances granted to them from income

"Separate committees are considering exempting allowances coming under PAYE tax," he added.

He remarked that the relief measures are likely to be granted beyond April after the country secured the US\$ 2.9 billion IMF rescue package.

However, he emphasised that only 10 percent of public cadre earning above Rs.100,000 per month is subjected to PAYE tax.

Moody's puts six US banks on watch for potential downgrade



Indices close on mixed note

The ASPI closed in green as a result of price gains in counters such as Hatton National Bank, Sampath Bank and National Development Bank with the turnover crossing Rs. 1.4 bn.

Meanwhile, the S&P SL20 closed in red. High net worth and institutional investor participation was noted in Hayleys, Hatton National Bank and John Keells Holdings.

Mixed interest was observed in Lanka IOC, ACL Cables and Expolanka



Holdings whilst retail interest was noted in Softlogic Capital, SMB Leasing nonvoting and Piramal Glass. Foreign participation in the market activity remained at subdued levels with foreigners closing as net buyers.

Capital Goods sector was the top contributor to the market turnover (due to Hayleys, John Keells Holdings and ACL Cables) whilst the sector index edged up by 0.05%. The share price of Hayleys moved up by Rs. 0.10 (0.13%) to close at Rs. 77.80.

The share price of John Keells Holdings recorded a loss of Rs. 0.50 (0.35%) to close at Rs. 141.00. The share price of ACL Cables appreciated by Rs.

2.80 (3.38%) to close at Rs. 85.70. The Banking sector was the second highest contributor to the market turnover (due to Hatton National Bank) whilst the sector index increased by 2.21%.

The share price of Hatton National Bank increased by Rs. 7.50 (6.04%) to close at Rs. 131.75. Lanka IOC was also included amongst the top turnover contributors. The share price of Lanka IOC lost Rs. 6.25 (3.33%) to close at Rs. 181.50.

President assures...

The first of these commitments, probably the most important one, is transparency. We commit to communicate transparently with all of you on any debt treatment terms that are agreed with any creditor or group of creditors, before being formalised. In the same vein, we commit to report regularly on our indebtedness, ensuring no financial liabilities incurred by the country are undisclosed," Wickremesinghe's letter read.

"Second, we commit not to resume debt service to any creditor unless that creditor agrees on a comprehensive debt treatment in line with IMF-supported programme parameters and the comparability of treatment principle.

Third, we reiterate our commitment to a comparable treatment of all our external creditors, with a view to ensuring all-round equitable burden sharing for all restructured debts. To that end, we will not conclude debt treatment agreements with any official bilateral creditor or any commercial creditor or any group of such creditors on terms more favourable than those agreed under any multilateral platform put forward by out official bilateral creditors.

Offering a debt treatment outside of the perimeter set by the debt targets under the IMF programme would risk making Sri Lanka's debt unsustainable again. To this

end, we also confirm that we have not and will not make any side arrangement with any creditor aimed at reducing the debt treatment impact on the creditor," the letter further read.

"I sincerely hope that these clarifications will provide comfort to all of you and enable us to progress swiftly to the next stage of debt treatment negotiations. This is paramount for our country. Just as my administration and I have committed to do so, we rely on all of you to do the right thing," the letter said in conclusion.

Sri Lanka's first...

Due to the right infrastructure in place, Sri Lanka has been successful in bagging a few events for the 2023 calendar.

Some of the key events include the Travel Agents Association of India (TAAI) convention which will be held in July this year, and the hosting of a reality show by Zee TV in Jaffna, both of which will generate immense publicity for destination Sri Lanka.

"Sri Lanka has what it takes to be your next MICE destination," the Minister told the fully-packed audience.

Sri Lanka Conventions Bureau Chairman Thisum Wijetunga said the island nation is "undoubtedly" the best destination for their next MICE event.

"We are one of the very few countries in the world that offers you everything from coastal train rides, breathtaking mountainous regions, wildlife, adventure sports, wellness retreats, and many other attractions in a few

hours of each other," he said. "The next few days are going to be full of learning and sharing of ideas and exploring new opportunities," added Wijetunga.

Government to...

The IMF highlighted the need for the introduction of new anti-corruption laws to reduce corruption vulnerabilities to unlock Sri Lanka's growth potential.

The Cabinet of Ministers in July last year approved the proposal to draft the new anticorruption legislation. Gunawardana noted that the bill has been drafted with extensive consultations from various stakeholders.

Although Sri Lanka already has a substantial amount of anti-corruption laws, their implementation hasn't been effective, largely due to the politicisation of the law enforcement agencies and anti-corruption

bodies. The proposed legislation is inclusive of the establishment of an independent commission

of inquiry on bribery and corruption, which is accountable to parliament.

It also proposes to appoint experts with more than 20 years of experience in the fields of law, forensic audit, accounting, engineering, international relations and diplomatic service, public administration as

members of the commission. In addition, the draft law has proposed to establish a separate director board to receive asset liability statements and to address related issues.

After receiving financing assurance from China, IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva last week announced that she would be taking Sri Lanka's staff-level agreement to the IMF Executive Board on March 20 for approval.

The seal of approval from IMF remains critical for the bankrupt nation to regain confidence from international investors, multilateral funds and other funding sources.

It is expected that upon the IMF Executive Board approval, Sri Lanka would receive funds from the World Bank and Asian Development Bank, which have already been lined up.

Moody's puts...

The move comes after shares of regional banks got clobbered on Monday even after the US federal government stepped in with a massive intervention designed to protect depositors and prevent further bank runs. Regional bank shares rebounded in premarket trading yesterday.

For San Francisco-based First Republic, Moody's pointed to the bank's "high reliance on more confidence-sensitive uninsured deposit funding," high unrealised losses in its bond holdings and a "low level of capitalisation" relative to its peers.

First Republic has a high amount of deposits above the FDIC's insurance limit, Moody's said, noting this makes the bank's funding profile "more sensitive to rapid and large withdrawals from deposits."

After plunging 62 percent on Monday, First Republic shares climbed 24 percent in premarket trading yesterday.

IFC, ComBank and Sarvodaya join forces to set up early childhood development centres

o help meet the demand for quality childcare services among employed parents in the Eastern province of Sri Lanka, the International Finance Corporation (IFC), Commercial Bank of Ceylon (CBC) and Sarvodaya have joined forces to establish early childhood development centres in the area.

It's an innovative move with the project developed under the Women in Work partnership between the IFC and Government of Australia, after an IFC study last year showed strong demand by parents for childcare services and local business owners also had strong interest in subsidising the childcare services for

The first of the centres will be established in Batticaloa, with CBC providing the support on infrastructure development. The facility, which will provide day care and preschool services, will be extended to all parents in the locality, who will be in need of such facilities and specially to all employees of companies/institutions in the area, who will pledge to partner with this initiative.

The 2022 IFC study surveyed almost 1,000 employees from 37 companies across the Ampara, Batticaloa and Trincomalee districts. It found companies lost Rs.99 million annually in productivity. due to employee absenteeism, distractions and delays. Almost two-thirds of parents surveyed reported dissatisfaction, including safety concerns, with their existing childcare arrangements. Over half of parents said they would make use of a childcare service, if one were available.

As the local implementing partner, Sarvodaya will help upgrade and fully equip the centres to provide children with the suitable setting to foster development. Each centre aims to support 50 children, demonstrating a sustainable model for employer-supported childcare.

Poor access to quality childcare poses a key constraint on labour force participation among Sri Lankan women. Many employable women either fail to enter the workforce or exit prematurely and fail to return. Through the newly established early childhood development centres, the participating companies can expect more women to return to work after having a child. It also aims to reduce turnover and absenteeism associated with childcare responsibilities among employees.

The IFC also plans to develop and roll out an awareness campaign with the local communities to promote the uptake of the service, especially on the business opportunities it provides for women entrepreneurs.

Fitch assigns JAT Holdings first-time 'AA(Ika)' National Rating; Outlook Stable

Fitch Ratings has assigned Sri Lankan paint manufacturer JAT Holdings PLC a National Long-Term Rating of 'AA(lka)'. The Outlook is Stable.

JAT's rating reflects the company's adequate liquidity and strong financial profile, which complement its leading share in the domestic wood-coating market, its growing international presence and well-established relationships with global suppliers.

Counterbalancing these strengths are JAT's small scale and exposure to cyclical end-markets with volatile demand. The Stable Outlook reflects Fitch's view that JAT's credit metrics will remain adequate for the rating in the next 12-18 months, with sufficient buffers to navigate a prolonged and deeper economic downturn beyond our expectations.

Fitch expects JAT to maintain EBITDA net leverage around 1.0x and EBITDA interest cover around 4.0x over the next two years, despite operational challenges, high working capital and capex. The rating agency forecasts that JAT will spend Rs.600 million-700 million on working capital a year to support revenue growth.

"JAT's capex in the next two years will mainly focus on capacity expansion and diversification into certain non-related sectors at around Rs.1.0 billion-1.2 billion a year. However, the rating could come under pressure if JAT continues to make non-core investments," Fitch said.

JAT is the exclusive partner of Sayerlack products in South Asia and in certain African countries. Sayerlack accounts for 60 percent of JAT's gross profit and has helped the company to become the market leader in wood coating in Sri Lanka, with a market share of 55 percent and holds a 25 percent market share in Bangladesh's industrial wood-coating market. JAT's longstanding relationship

with Sayerlack's principal, The Sherwin-Williams Company (SWC, Long-Term Issuer Default Rating: BBB/Stable), has helped it with preferential pricing, product customisation and extended credit periods.

JAT entered the decorative paint market in 2021, with the launch of the brilliant white emulsion paint, which has gained nearly a 10 percent market share within a short time. The company has adopted an innovative online strategy of directly selling to the customers by bypassing distributors. This has allowed JAT to offer more attractive prices than competitors.

Fitch expects the decorative paint segment to grow by around 25 percent a year over the medium term, with JAT continuing to gain market share and contribute 20 percent to group revenue by the financial year ending March 2025 (FY25), from 8 percent in

Fitch expects JAT's domestic sales volumes to fall by 10 percent-15 percent in FY24, amid a 2.2 percent contraction in the economy in 2023, after a Fitch-estimated 6.4 percent decline in 2022. The construction sector, JAT's main end-market, is seeing a significant slowdown, due to budget cuts, high construction costs and rising interest rates. Consumers are also deferring maintenance work as incomes weaken. Fitch expects JAT's recent price hikes, ranging from 30 percent to 50 percent across all categories, to counterbalance the volume decline, driving domestic revenue (9MFY23: up 28 percent YoY).

Demand for JAT's wood coating, decorative paints and paint brushes stems from the cyclical construction sector. The company caters mainly for the less-volatile maintenance market within the construction sector but demand is still subject to discretionary income. JAT's rating is constrained by its small operational scale, as reflected in EBITDA size, against higher rated peers. This is because the company is a leader in a niche market within building materials and has a small share of the larger decorative paint segment.

JAT is increasingly focusing on export markets to diversify away from the weakening Sri Lankan market. JAT started a manufacturing plant in Bangladesh in 2022 to further penetrate the retail and industrial wood-coating markets. Fitch expects onsite manufacturing to reduce costs and make JAT's products more competitive in the Bangladeshi market, which is dominated by multinationals with large economies of scale. The rating agency expects the new plant to double the revenue contribution from Bangladesh in the next three years, from the current 20 percent.

Meanwhile, Fitch believes that JAT's attempt to penetrate the Indian market remains challenging, due to the market being highly price sensitive and import taxes, making JAT's products less competitive against the locally manufactured paints.

JAT plans to set up a manufacturing plant in East Africa in FY24, to cater for this highly underpenetrated African region with strong growth potential. It already has a presence in Africa as the authorised distributor of Sayerlack






