Intervals at which wages shall be paid (section 23 (1)) 1. Wages shall be paid weekly and within 3 days of the end of the week.

Definition of a normal working day (section 24) 2. The number of hours constituting a normal working day (inclusive of one hour for a mea!) shall be nine.

PART II

Wages

The minimum rates of wages for time work applicable to the male workers shall be Rs. 4 per day and for the female workers Rs. 3 per day.

PART III

Overtime rates

In respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day, the minimum overtime rate shall be the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum daily rate of wages for time work by 8) increased by 50 per cent. of such minimum hourly rate.

PART IV

Weekly Holidays (Section 24)

Every employer shall allow Poya Day in any week as the weekly holiday to every worker employed under him and if there is no Poya Day falling in any week he shall allow any one day in that week as the weekly holiday; provided, however, that an employer shall not be precluded from employing any worker on such weekly holiday, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) that a day within the six days next succeeding such weekly holiday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday;
- (b) that in respect of work done on such weekly holiday the worker shall be remunerated by increasing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 50 per cent.
- (c) that for each hour of work performed on a weekly holiday in excess of the number of hours constituting a normal working day under paragraph 2 of Part I, the minimum overtime rate shall be an amount equal to double the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the normal minimum daily rate by 8);
- (d) that the remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday shall be paid along with the wages paid for that week.

Provided, further that when a weekly holiday falls on a public holiday declared under section 25 of the Wages Boards Ordinance (Chapter 136), the public holiday shall be granted on that day and the weekly holiday shall be allowed on the day immediately succeeding such public holiday.

PART V

Annual holidays (section 25)

1. A worker who has been in continuous employment under the same employer during any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year") and has worked the number of days specified in column I set out hereunder shall be allowed in the next succeeding year the holidays (specified in the corresponding entry in column II set out hereunder).

If a worker has worked for more than 180 days, he shall in addition to the said 10 days be allowed one holiday for each unit of 6 days by which the number of days the worker has worked exceeds 180 days. Provided, however. that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in excess of 18 days.

2. If a worker is entitled in any year to 7 or more holidays he shall be allowed, and he shall take 7 holidays on consecutive days.

3. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 a worker shall be allowed his holiday or holidays on a day or days to be mutually agreed upon between him and his employer.

4. Where a worker intends to leave his employment of his own accord or is to be discontinued or dismissed from employ-ment, such worker shall be entitled to take and shall take during the period immediately preceding such leaving, dis-continuance or dismissal:—

- (a) every holiday that he was entitled to in respect of the previous year which he has not already taken; and
- (b) if the worker has during the current year complied with the provisions relating to employment and work set out in paragraph 1, every holiday that he would have otherwise been entitled to in the next succeeding year; provided, however, that the total number of holidays that such worker shall take in any year shall not exceed 18.

5. The remuneration payable in respect of each such holiday referred to in this part shall be an amount equal to the minimum daily rate.

6. The remuneration due to a worker in respect of his holiday or holidays shall be paid to him before such holiday or holidays, but not earlier than 10 days before such holiday or holidays.

7. For the purposes of paragraph 1. "days on which a worker has worked " shall include---

- (i) every holiday allowed by the employer to the worker under section 25;
- (ii) every holiday or day of absence from work to which a worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards , Ordinance ;
- (iii) every day of absence on any ground approved by the employer;
- (iv) every day of absence due to any injury to the worker caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment; provided, such injury had been notified to the employer;
- (v) every day of absence due to anthrax or due to any occupa-tional disease specified in Schedule III of the Work-men's Compensation Ordinance (Chapter 117);
- (vi) every day on which the employer fails to provide work for the worker; and
- (vii) every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal, in case of such days do not in the aggregate exceed 30 days a year; but shall not include the day fixed as the weekly holiday under section 24.

Public holidays (section 25)

7A. Every employer shall allow as holidays with remunera-tion to all workers employed by him, the following public holidays within the meaning of the Holidays Act No. 17 of 1965 :

- 1. National Heroes' Day (January 1).
- 2. The Tamil Thai Pongal Day.
- 3. Independence Commemoration Day (February 1).
- 4. The day immediately prior to the Sinhala and Tamil New Year's Day.

(a) a day on or before the thirty first day of December to the worker as a holiday with remuneration at not less than the daily minimum rate of wages payable for a normal working day, or (b) such worker shall be remunerated for work done on any such public holiday at not less than double the minimum daily rate of wages for work done during the number of hours constituting a normal working day for that worker, and at not less than three times the normal hourly rate (obtained by dividing the minimum daily rate by 8) for work done during each hour (and pro-portionately for work done for part of such hour) in excess of the number of hours constituting a normal working day. working day.

REPORT OF THE LOAN BOARD FOR THE YEARS 1966 AND 1967

THE annual reports of the Commissioners of the Loan Board for the years 1966 and 1967 are submitted with the statements of accounts and balance sheets as at 31st December each year.

Funds

The funds of the Loan Board comprise of the deposits held in trust on behalf of the Supreme Court and District Courts Suitors. The main function of the Loan Board is to invest these funds to the best advantage of the Suitors. The bulk of the capital (about 81 per cent in 1966 and about 82 per cent in 1967) is invested in gilt-edged securities. Of the balance, about 13 per cent is invested in house property loans and loans for constructing houses.

Limits of towns in close proximity to Colombo. Such loans are paid only in instalments according to the progress of the building. Loans granted for the construction of houses are repayable in 20 years and other loans in 15 years. During the years under review a limit of Rs. 50,000 operated in the case of loans on the security of residential building and Rs. 100,000 on the security of commercial buildings.
