Provided, however, that an employer may employ any worker on such weekly holiday, subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) that a day within the six days next succeding such weekly holiday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday;
- (2) that in respect of work done on such weekly holiday-
  - (a) a worker who has worked for 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) or for any period that falls short of nine hours by reason of the failure of the employer to provide him with work shall be remunerated at 1½ times the mnimum rate of wages for a normal working day;
  - (inclusive of one hour for a meal) by reason of his unwillingness to work shall, for each hour that he has worked, be paid 1½ times the hourly rate, (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 8);
  - (c) a worker who has worked for more than 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) shall be reinunerated at twice the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 8) for each hour of work in excess of 9 hours; and
  - (d) in the case of a piece rated worker, the remunera-tion payable on a weekly holiday to such worker shall be one-and-a-half times the minimum wage payable for such piece work for a normal working day.
- (3) that the remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any period shall be paid within the time prescribed for the payment of wages for such period by section 2 (b) of the Wages Boards Ordinance. Provided, further, that when a weekly holiday falls on a day declared a Public Holiday under section 25 of the Wages Board Ordinance such Public Holiday shall be granted on that day and such weekly holiday shall be allowed on a day within the six days next succeding such holiday. next succeding such holiday.

The preceding provisions of this Part shall not apply to workers engaged in cattle-keeping ". 9-851

The case for the workmen is that they were employed as labourers by Messrs. Weerasinghe and Sirisoma who were contractors to Messrs. Ceylon Tea Blending Company, for periods varying from 2 to 3½ years.

Three of the workmen gave evidence on behalf of all cight workmen in regard to their terms and conditions of employment. Chandradasa stated that he was employed as a stencil cutter and was paid Rs. 26 per week. He stated that he worked regularly for about 3½ years. On 30.12.66 Weerasinghe for no reason at all refused to give him work. Along with him, he stated, the services of another 4 or 5 workmen were similarly discontinued. N. M. A. Jayakody and W. S. Fonseka gave evidence to the same effect.

Of the two employers, only Weerssinghe was present. At the inquiry before the Tribunal, Sirisoma was not present in spite of the fact that due notice was given to him and several attempts were made to ensure his presence.

Weerasinghe in his evidence admitted that the 8 workmen were employed by Sirisoma and himself. But his position was that they (Weerasinghe and Sirisoma) had a contract with the Ceylon I'ea Blending Company for a limited period of time from 1965 to 1967, for the supply of labour to do packing, blending, etc. He stated that none of the labourers employed by both of them, including the 8 workmen concerned in this dispute had regular work under them as they did not have regular work to offer because their work depended on the contracts the Ceylon Tea Blending Company received from the C.W.E. His position is that none of the workmen counted anything more than 2 to 3 months service under both of them.

Weerasinghe, however, under cross-examination admitted that they had not maintained any records of their labour force. He stated that he was not concerned with labour regulations because the contract was for one year.

Weerasinghe's evidence regarding the terms and conditions of employment of the 8 workmen is unconvincing. It was obviously their duty to maintain records of the labour force. In the absence of such records I would prefer to accept the evidence of the workmen regarding their terms and conditions of employment.

Some of the workmen have stated that they had worked for three years. This does not appear to be correct. It is clear from the evidence that Weerasinghe and Sirisoma were only contractors of the Ceylon Tea blending Company for a definite period of time, namely, from 1965 to 1967. Their contract had ended in 1967. As such the total period of employment of these workmen could not have been anything more than 2 to 2½ years.

On the evidence placed before the Tribunal it would also appear that the workmen were unaware as to who their actual employer was, because of the fact that they worked on the premises of the Ceylon Tea Blending Company. They had apparently acted in the belief that they were assured of regular employment under the Ceylon Tea Blending Company. It seems to me that Weerasinghe and Sirisoma who actually employed these workmen should have made it known to the workmen who their actual employer was.

On the above evidence I hold that the 8 workmen were regular employees under Weerasinghe and Sirisoma, and their services were terminated without notice, which is wrongful.

In regard to the question of relief, it is to be noted that Weerasinghe and Sirisoma are no longer contractors. Their contract had ended in 1967 and the question of reinstatement is therefore impossible.

In all the circumstances, therefore, I make my award granting the following relief to the workmen concerned:—

Each of the 8 workmen shall be entitled to Rupees One hundred and thirty (Rs. 130) being approximately one month's wages in lieu of notice and a further sum of Rupees One hundred and thirty (Rs. 130) being gratuity for their two year period of employment.
