MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, November 12, 1897.

The Council met this day at 3 r.m., pursuant to notice dated November 6, 1897.

Present:—Mr. W. E. Davidson, Acting Chairman; Brigade Surgeon Lieut.-Col. A. W. Duke; Mr. F. W. Bois; Mr. H. van Cuylenburg; Mr. F. H. Grinlinton; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. J. D. Mason; Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Hon. Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; and Mr. Arthur Alvis.

The Minutes of October 8, 1897, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of October 8, 1897, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna asked—Whether the Chairman is satisfied that the whole of the taxes due to the Municipal Council under the provisions of Road Ordinances of 1861 and 1884 and of the sections 128 and 132 of the Municipal Ordinance of 1887 are duly recovered; and if not, whether he has concerted measures for the recovery of taxes from those who may at present evade their liabilities.

The Chairman replied as follows:

I answer the Hon. Member's question in detail. Taking first the recovery of commutation money under the provisions of the Road Ordinance and of section 130 of the Municipal Ordinance, the results, judging from the yearly progressive increase in the cash value of the recoveries, afford some reason for satisfaction. The increase in ten years from Rs. 37,462 in 1888 to Rs. 61,390 in 1897 is good. But tested by the percentage to the population, which we may assume now to be 150,000, the results are not satisfactory. The precentage of able-bodied males between 18 and 56 should be 22·1 per cent. Our recoveries only account for 20·5 per cent. I think we ought to recover 22 per cent., or over Rs. 4,000 more. The difficulties are:—

- (1) Ceylon-born men resident in Colombo endeavour to pay Re. 1.50 in their birth villages rather than Rs. 2 to the Municipal Fund. This difficulty needs patience, but it can be overcome. I am persuaded that we should not lose very much if this tax were reduced from Rs. 2 to Re. 1.50.
- (2) Most Coast-born labourers try to evade payment altogether. Each man when arrested invariably asserts that he left for the Coast on a holiday in December and returned ten days ago. This is sometimes true. But this difficulty can be overcome by patience.
- (3) Some householders omit the names of servants in filling in their schedules, and many love to think that their 18 years old sons are still 17. Many men of 50 will write themselves down as 56. To meet these methods of evasion, sometimes counived at by dishonest division officers, I have arranged to employ for a time a staff of four private inquiry officers to detect such omissions not only in the Road Ordinance schedules, but in the schedules wherein should be enumerated the number of carriages, carts, horses, and dogs. I mean, if possible, to make public examples by prosecution of a certain number in most walks of life, and I trust that the dread of detection and punishment by the Magistrate will yield an increased harvest, especially in increased returns from carts and dogs.

- (4) Then we have sometimes a bad stamp of tax collectors. There is little enthusiasm among the better stamp of many to collect the taxes from the Hon. Member's own ward, where taxpayers have a rooted objection to paying taxes. I hope, however, that the Government Agent will let us have the use of his gravets headmen next year, and thus enable me to dispense with certain, at least, out of our division officers who are capable of a thousand tricks and evasions, whereby money for the Municipal Fund may be diverted elsewhere. The better a tax gatherer's personal status in society, the more likely he is to be honest.
- (5) Finally, the greatest difficulty which cannot be surmounted is this. The eminent lawyer who was lately Standing Counsel to the Council held that, whereas the notice under section 13, Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, to perform ten days' labour may be general, that is, not personally served the notice to a defaulter under section 14 to perform twelve days' labour must be personal. This ruling is disastrous in two ways. Assuming our division officers to be honest, they say that when they do succeed in effecting personal notice on a defaulter to perform twelve days' labour he gets seven days clear in which to move out of the division officer's reach, or to effectually conceal himself—not a difficult thing in Colombo for the class to which defaulters usually belong. But, supposing a division officer not to be strictly honest and to connive for private reasons at the evasion of tax by a person who is liable, all he has to say is, "I have not met him, and so cannot personally serve him, therefore no warrant can issue for his arrest." The aggravating part of this interpretation is that although we are bound by the religious of our own Councel, the District aggravating part of this interpretation is that although we are bound by the ruling of our own Counsel, the District Road Committees throughout the Island interpret the wording of the 14th section differently, and consider that notice is sufficient if it is published by beat of tom-tom in the village, and if written lists of the defaulters' names are affixed in certain prominent places. Observe the difference in the two methods. I know of a district where over 99 6 per cent. of persons liable have been accounted for this year. Again, in the Colombo division, the value of 93 and 94 per cent. is recovered yearly, yet we barely reach 80 per cent. If the Hon. Member and other Members of Council who have the honour of occupying seats in the Legislative Council will lend us their support, the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884 might be amended by the omission of the words "on receivings personal notice" in the 7th line of section 15, and, if need be, by the substitution of the words "by publication of the defaulter's name in the village in which he resides." This simple amendment would enable us, I believe, to add Rs. 4,000 a year or more to the Municipal Fund, and would take away from division officers the principal temptation and opportunity for fraud; or it would enable us to reduce the rate within the city limit to Re. 1.50 from Rs. 2 without serious loss to the Council. It would also settle the question whether the reading of the words "by our Standing Counsel" was correct, or whether the District Road Committees are within the law in interpreting the words more liberally. I have gone into this important question at such length that I will only add my belief that evasions of taxes due under sections 128 and 132 are frequent, and that I look for good results from the labours of the four persons, whose private inquiries I have referred is sufficient if it is published by beat of tom-tom in the village, and if written lists of the defaulters' names are affixed frequent, and that I look for good results from the labours of the four persons, whose private inquiries I have referred to and whose employment has received the sanction of the Standing Committee. Certain general safeguards have also been added lately for more efficient recoveries under the provisions of Butchers' Ordinance. Overtures have also been made to the Government for diverting large sums to the Municipal Fund under Ordinance No. 12 of 1891, of which at present are lost both to the Government and the Council; and on this subject I propose to treat when laying before the Council a comparative statement showing the incidence of taxation in Eastern and Colonial Municipalities, and the proportion contributed by the central Government in each instance. This treatise will be ready for the consideration of the Council when Mr. Mansergh's report comes on for decision.
- 2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved "that with the view of removing misconceptions regarding the scheme for the removal of night soil, a circular be issued in the Sinhalese and Tamil languages, setting out clearly that the adoption of the scheme proposed by the Council is not compulsory, nor that the total abolition of cesspits is a necessary consequence of it, and explaining generally the objects and advantages of the scheme.'

The application is recommended for the acceptance of Council in terms of the memorandum dated October 21, 1897, from the Superintendent of Works.

(3) Letter from Messrs. Boustead Brothers, Agents for the United Planters' Company of Ceylon, Limited, for permission to allow to start opening the road on the Grandpass route starting at Victoria bridge.

The application is recommended to the Council. (The majority of the Standing Committee formally renew their protest against the lack of provision for footways along the proposed tramway routes.)

(7) Tenders for the lease of St. John's fish market for 1898. Resolved that the Council be recommended to authorize the Chairman to accept tender No. 1. if genuine. If that person cannot be found, or if he cannot provide the one-tenth security required, the Chairman shall call upon tenders No. 2 and No. 3, and shall put the rent up to auction between the two and accept the highest bid. But if one of these tenders is fictitious, the Chairman may accept the other; and if both are fictitious, the Chairman may accept No. 4.

(33) Letter from Superintendent of Works with reference to over-expenditure on certain sanctioned votes.

The Standing Committee recommends the transfer under section 114 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 of a sum of Rs. 1,133·32 from vote No. 98 of 1897 (on which the unexpended balance on December 31 is estimated to be Rs. 1,350) to the credit of the following votes, viz., 101, conservancy of sewers and drains, Rs. 157·60; 103, urgent repairs, Rs. 324·21; 86, lighting metal and gravel heaps at night, Rs. 118·46; 181, widening Chatham street, Rs. 215·27; 304 of 1895, widening Wall's lane, Rs. 317·78; for the payment of coolies, watchers, and artificers, and for the hire of carts on the works in question, being amount, overexpended on these and for the hire of carts on the works in question, being amount overexpended on these votes. The pay of overseers is to await the explanations called for by resolution 8 of the Minutes of the Standing Committee of November 1, 1897.

6. A letter dated September 27, 1897, from Messrs. Boustead Brothers, enclosing a drawing showing the

proposed motor car for the Colombo tramways, was laid before the Council.

Mr. Alvis moved "that the plan be accepted with the following suggestions made by Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, the top must be double throughout its width and length. The sides below the seats and the seats themselves should be perforated."

Mr. Grinlinton seconded.—Carried.

- 7. The Sanitary Officer's Report for the 3rd quarter, 1897, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
 - 8. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for June, 1897, were laid on the table.
- 9. Applications from the Superintendent of Works and the Recordkeeper, for authority to destroy certain useless documents, were laid on the table.

 Mr. Alvis moved "that the lists of documents be referred to the Standing Committee for examination and for report to the Council."

Mr. H. van Cuylenburg seconded.—Carried.

- 10. The City Analyst's Report on the town water for October, 1897, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
- 11. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on shops used for the sale of kerosine, poisons, and gunpowder for October, 1897, were laid on the table.
