MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall of Kandy on Saturday, April 16, 1898, in accordance with notice dated April 7 at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present:-Hon. Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; Dr. F. Keyt; J. MacDonnell, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklass, Esq.: A. Philip, Esq.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Regular Meeting held on March 19, Special Meetings on March 31 and April 2, and of an Adjourned Meeting on April 5, were read and confirmed.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1897 to March 31 on account of the General Revenue; Police Assessment and Water-rate Accounts; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of March.

 Resolved,—That the several statements, as required by section 90 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance," No. 7 of 1887, be forwarded with the Minutes of Proceedings to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government

3. Read letter No. 14 dated March 28 from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to the Chairman's letter of March 12, applying for a loan for the purchase of lands lying within the basin of the Waterworks reservoir, stating that the Governor in Executive Council is prepared to grant the loan on payment of 4 per cent. interest and sinking fund 2 per cent., and asking that the proposed bond to be given by the Council be sent for examination.

The Chairman stated that he had forwarded draft of proposed bond.

It was proposed by Mr. W. D. Gibbon, seconded by Mr. C. Vanderwall, "that the Council, in accepting the

offer made by Government of a loan to enable the Council to purchase property in the vicinity of the reservoir respectfully requests the Government to deduct from the amount of the loan for this purpose the amount received by Government from the sale of Crown lands, now forming the Fairieland, Hantane, and Roseneath estates.'

On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried.

4. Read Health Officer's report on premises No. 41, Hill street, recommending that the two cesspits be

emptied, disinfected, and closed, and a dry-earth latrine substituted.

On motion of Mr. C. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. E. Beven, it was resolved "that the Chairman be especially empowered, in accordance with section 209 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owner or occupier of the premises No. 41, Hill street, to close the cesspool on the said premises and substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

5. Read letter No. 373 dated February 3 from the Assistant Superintendent of Prisons, Kandy Old Jail, and one dated February 2 from Mr. F. W. Vansanden, complaining of a privy on premises No. 252, Colombo street. The Health Officer reports that the cesspit is in a sanitary state, but recommends that a dry-earth closet be substituted. The Inspector of the district reports that there would be very great difficulty in removing the contents of a dry-earth closet.

Resolved that, as the cesspit is in a sanitary state, no action be taken.

- 6. Read memorandum dated April 2 from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding (1) copy of letter of same date to the Director of Public Works, intimating that the Governor has sanctioned the estimate for Kandy Lake road improvement, and stating that there is no objection to allowing the small piece of Government ground referred to in the Chairman's letter to be utilized for widening the road; also (2) copy of letter to the Deputy Assistant Adjutant-General, requesting that the matter of allowing the portion of the military hospital land deemed necessary for widening the road round the lake may have re-consideration so as to avoid the necessity for the destruction of palm trees on the other side of the road.
- 7. Read letter No. 15 dated April 4 from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to the Chairman's letter No. 32 of March 23, applying for a loan for carrying out the improvement of the drainage of the town, inquiring the amount of loan required, and the precise means from which the interest and sinking fund, which will amount to 6 per cent.

Read Chairman's reply dated 14th instant, stating that Rs. 251,000 will be required, and showing that the annual instalment of 6 per cent. on the amount of loan can be met out of general revenue.

It was proposed by Mr. Philip, seconded by Mr. E. Beven, "that in view of the correspondence that has passed between Government and the Municipal Council, the terms framed by Government be accepted, and that Government be asked to have the scheme carried out with the least delay possible, the work being entrusted to the Public Works Department for execution"

On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried nem. con.

8. The Chairman submitted draft of by-laws necessary for carrying out a scheme for the removal of night soil On motion by Chairman, seconded by Mr. J. H. Sproule, the Council went into Committee.

The by-laws were considered *seriatim* and, with certain modifications, approved of.

The Council then resumed.

It was proposed by Mr. Philip, seconded by Mr. E. Beven, "that the by-laws (Appendix A.) as adopted by the Council in Committee, be adopted."

On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried nem. con.

9. It being late, and several Members having appointments, the Meeting was adjourned till 8.30 A.M. on Saturday, April 23.

APPENDIX A.

The following by-laws are made by the Municipal Council of Kandy in addition to the by-laws of chapter XIII. of the schedule to Ordinance No. 19 of 1896.

To by-law 3 shall be added:-

- 3 (a). The night soil in every house, building, land, and tenement assessed for Municipal rates in which the dryarth system of disposing of night soil is or may hereafter be in use shall be removed or caused to be removed from such house, building, land, or tenement at least once a day by the person bound so to do, unless such house, building, land, or tenement is exempted by writing under the hand of the Chairman from the operation of this by-law. The person bound so to do shall be, in the case of any such house, building, land, or tenement comprising more than one dwelling or occupied by more than one household under separate contracts of tenancy, the owner of such house, building, land, or tenement as defined in section 3 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887; and in the case of any other house, building, land, or tenement, the occupier thereof. In case of a dispute arising between the owner and the occupier of any such house, building, land, or tenement as to which of them is the person so bound, the decision of the Chairman shall be final. shall be final.
- (b). Such person shall employ for the purpose of such removal from his premises either an officer of the Council duly authorized by the Chairman or the holder of a license from the Chairman granted under by-law 4 of this chapter, and shall forthwith furnish in writing to the Chairman the names and addresses of himself and of the officer or licensee so employed by him, and all night soil from the premises of such person shall be removed, if the same be in one or more standard buckets,
- 3 (c). Each standard bucket shall be made of galvanized sheet iron, and shall not exceed 10 lb. in weight and of the following dimensions; that is to say, height 14 in., diameter at the mouth 12 in., diameter at the base 9 in.
- 3 (d). Every such person so employing a Municipal officer for the removal of night soil shall pay to the Council in advance such sum as shall be determined by the Chairman, not exceeding two rupees per mensem for each standard bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer. The sum payable if not paid on or before the 10th day of the month in respect of which it is due, may be reported by the Chairman to the Magistrate and recovered in the same way as if it were a fine imposed by such Magistrate.

To by-law 4 shall be added :-

- 4 (a). It shall not be lawful for any person, not being a contractor with the Council, or an officer in the service of the Council, or a licensed scavenger, to remove night soil from any house or land within the Municipality. All licenses issued under this by-law shall be in force to the end of the year in which they are issued.
- 4(b). Any person licensed as aforesaid shall from time to time give such particulars as the Chairman may require as to the houses or lands from which night soil is removed by him.
- 4'(c). No night soil shall be removed except in carts or vessels of pattern and construction approved of by the Health Officer or other person authorized in this behalf by the Chairman, and such carts and vessels shall be at all times whole, sound, and watertight.

- 4 (d). No cart shall be used for the conveyance of night soil before a certificate has been obtained from the Health Officer or other person authorized in that behalf by the Chairman that such cart is fit for the purpose; such certificate shall be renewed from time to time as may be ordered by the Chairman.
- 4 (e). A register shall be kept of all carts certified as fit for the conveyance of night soil. Such carts shall be consecutively numbered, and the words "latrine cart" and the number in the register shall be painted on such carts at the Municipal Office at the expense of the licensee.

To by-law 9 shall be added :-

9 (a). Night soil shall in such places be buried or otherwise disposed of in such manner as may be ordered by the Chairman.

Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, adjourned from April 16, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, April 23, 1898, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present:—Hon. Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; A, Philip, Esq.

1. In accordance with notice, Mr. Philip inquired with reference to minute No. 13 of the Proceedings of the General Meeting of the Municipal Council held on December 29, 1897, what action was taken thereunder, and moved that a statement be read giving all necessary detailed information as to the result, and as to how the scavenging of the town is now being, and will be, carried out.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Beven and carried.

The Chairman replied that tenders were called for in accordance with the resolution of the Council, and read the following statement, viz.:—"The Standing Committee having considered the tenders have approved of a contract being entered into with K. Suppiah for scavenging. The work has been carried out by him from April 16. The amount of the contract is for Rs. 1,062 14 per month, and the contract is for a term of three years."

2. Mr. Philip inquired on what date the official minutes of the General Meeting of the Municipal Council, held on March 19, were forwarded to the press, and moved that the letters transmitting them be read.

The motion was seconded by Mr. R. W. Jonklaas, and on being put to the Meeting was carried.

The Chairman replied that the Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting of March 19 were forwarded to five newspapers on March 26.

No special letters were sent, entries of despatch were entered in post book, which was laid on the table.

3. Mr. Philip drew attention to the following extract from the report of the Special Committee dated November 15, 1897, adopted at the General Meeting of the Municipal Council on November 20, 1897:—"The Special Committee are of opinion that all letters, without exception, from Government should be laid before the Standing Committee and the Municipal Council in General Meeting, and orders made thereon (Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, chapter II., section 3, sub-section (c)), the subject of the communication being stated on the Agenda Paper," and moved that a memorandum be drawn up and read of all letters received from Government since November 20, 1897, when they were received, when they were laid before the Standing Committee and the Municipal Council General Meeting, and of the orders made thereon in each case.

The motion was seconded by Mr. C. Vanderwall, and on being put to the Meeting was carried.

4. Mr. Philip asked—On what system the watering of the streets is carried out, what water is used therefor from what tax the expenditure incurred is recovered, and moved that statement be read giving full particulars.

The motion was seconded by Mr. R. W. Jonklass.

Reply by Chairman.—Certain town streets and a portion of Peradeniya road are watered twice a day when considered necessary in the dry weather. The amount voted for the service is only Rs. 300. The water is taken from the stand-posts. The amount is provided out of general revenue. The carts, distributing apparatus, and hose are provided by the Council. Bullocks.are hired when required.

On the motion being put to the Meeting, the following votes were recorded:-

The Chairman declared the motion lost.

Mr. Philip moved that a copy of the accounts in connection with the celebration of Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee, as received from the Chairman of the Public Meeting of the citizens, be laid on the table.

The motion was seconded by Mr. C. Vanderwall. Mr. Beven objected to the motion, as the Council had appointed a Special Committee to report on the matter.

Mr. R. W. Jonklass moved, and the Chairman seconded, as an amendment "that the Special Committee be called upon to make a report as early as possible."

On the amendment being put to the Meeting, the Chairman declared it carried.

Health Report for March, 1898.

Water Supply.—The water supply still remains open to sources of pollution, the remaining portions of land from which the water supply comes not yet having been purchased.

Public Latrines.—The public latrines have been kept in a sanitary condition during the past month.

District Court Latrines.—These latrines are emptied nightly by the night soil carts. They are kept in a most insanitary condition, and the drainage from them is simply scandalous. I have many times reported about them, and many complaints have been made about their filthy state, the last complaint made was by the District Judge of Kandy on March 31, 1898.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town has been most disgracefully done during the month. In several reports and personally I brought this matter to the Chairman's notice.

Drains.—Repairs on the drain in Brownrigg street are in progress. The drainage of Kandy generally is disgraceful. I never seen anything more loathsome than some of the drains in the alleys, these drains are connected with the main drains. I am of opinion that every drain in Kandy ought to be thoroughly overhauled at once and put in a proper state of repair. The Public Works Department drains in Malabar street and railway approach road are a disgrace to the town.

Alleys.—I completed my inspection of the Kandy alleys during the month and sent in a full report concerning them to the Chairman. No words of mine could be found to in any way describe the absolutely repulsive state I found many of the alleys to be in. I only wonder how human beings can live in them. I have been trying to get the sanitary condition of the alleys improved for over a year now. It is awful to think what would happen to their inhabitants if an epidemic broke out in Kandy.

Laundries.—The laundries remain in the same most insanitary state as I mentioned in my special report concerning them. At Ampitiya and at Deyannewella, two places where the majority of the laundries are situated, no latrines or even cesspits are used by the dhobies, so the filthy state of the ground round their houses can be imagined. I brought this matter to the notice of the proper authorities, and ventured to make recommendations which did not meet with approval; but if public latrines are not built, I am of opinion that every dhoby ought to build at once a sanitary dry-earth latrine:

Cooly Lines.—The Municipal cooly lines at Mahaiyawa and railway approach road were kept in a most insanitary condition during the month. I visited these places several times, and was once accompanied by the Chairman. At Mahaiyawa are several most insanitary cattle sheds, all of which are kept in a condition utterly regardless of by-laws. At railway approach road cattle are kept in the cooly lines without any shed at all being provided for them. I pointed out this to the Chairman, it is distinctly against his orders. The latrines used by the coolies in both

lines have no surface drains or catchpits provided, water used for washing these latrines and urine soak into the ground round these latrines, causing at times a most unbearable smell. Many times have I reported against these latrines; up to date their condition remains the same. The Public Works Department cooly lines next the Municipal ones in railway approach road are always in a most insanitary condition.

Bakeries.—Nearly every bakery in Kandy is now in a sanitary state.

Dairies.—The dairies are all in a sanitary condition, and every effort is being made to keep them so.

Cuttle Stands and Gala Stalls.—All are either in, or are being put into the condition required by the by-laws, with the exception of the largest one in Kandy, No. 994, Peradeniya road. The owner of this cattle stand was served with a notice to put his place into a sanitary condition on June 25, 1897, and has since twice been fined by the Municipal Magistrate, but at the present date his cattle stand is in a more insanitary conditionthen ever it was; nothing has been done to it.

Slaughter Houses.—These buildings have been kept in a sanitary condition during the month.

Cuttle Inspection Shed.—The same remarks apply as in the previous case.

-I have had almost daily to reject many cattle during the month which were not fit for food for human The sheep and goats brought for inspection were particularly bad.

Fish Boutiques.—In my inspection of these places I discovered no bad fish.

Public Market.—This building needs many repairs to it yet. The scavenging of it was very badly done during the month. The different kinds of food exposed for sale in it were good.

Night Soil Depôt.—This place at Katugastota was kept in a fairly sanitary state.

Infectious Diseases.—Several cases of chickenpox, nearly all of them in the police barracks at Bogambra, and one case of measles occurred during the month.
