Rules

Short title

1. These rules may be cited as the Ceylon Railway Uniform Staff Benevolent Fund Rules.
2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
“Committee of Management” means the Committee of management established under section 4 of the Ordinance ;
“Corporation” means The Ceylon Railway Uniform Staff Benevolent Fund ;
“Ordinance” means the Railway Uniform Staff Benevolent Fund Ordinance (Chapter 284) ; and
“Railway” means the Ceylon Government Railway.

Membership

3. (1) Every employee of the Railway attached to that section of the Railway known as the Uniform Staff, who has not attained the age of 40 years shall be eligible for admission as a member of the corporation.
(2) Every application for admission as a member shall be addressed to the Secretary and Treasurer, with such proof of his eligibility for admission as a member of the corporation as may be required by the Secretary and Treasurer, and he shall submit the same to the Committee of Management for approval.
(3) The Committee of Management may decide to accept or reject, any such application without assigning any reasons therefor and such decision shall be final.
(4) Membership of the Corporation shall commence from the date of approval of the application for membership by the Committee of Management.

Change of nominee

4. (1) Any member may, by application made in the form provided for the purpose and addressed to the Secretary and Treasurer, change his nominee or nominees.
(2) The change of nominee or nominees shall become effective from the date of approval of the same by the Committee of Management, and in the event of the death of any member prior to the approval of such change of nominee by the Committee of Management, the change of nominee as declared by the member shall be deemed to be effective and valid.

Working expenses

5. Every member shall pay a sum of Re. 1.50 in April in each year, towards the working expenses of the corporation.

Monthly contribution

6. (1) Every member shall contribute a minimum contribution of three rupees every month to the corporation.
(2) Any member desirous of contributing a larger amount, may do so by giving written notice to the Secretary and Treasurer, prior to the 15th day of October in any year.
(3) All monies payable to the corporation, by the members shall be recovered in their respective pay sheets, as an abatement and the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury, and the General Manager of Railways, or the Head of Department, in which the members are serving shall have the power to recover such money in the manner aforesaid.
(4) In the event of sickness or other emergency, any member may by application made to the Secretary and Treasurer, obtain permission for the suspension of the recovery of any amount recoverable for any specified period.

Office expenses

7. (1) Monies recovered under rule 5, shall be utilised by the Committee of Management for the purpose of office expenses.
(2) The Committee of Management shall not incur any expenditure in any year in excess of the amounts recovered under rule 5, unless sanctioned by the members at a general meeting of the corporation.

Dismissal

8. (1) Any member dismissed from the public service shall, from the date of such dismissal cease to be a member of the corporation, and shall be entitled to receive payment as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this rule.
(2) Any member who is dismissed from the public service for dishonesty or drunkenness shall be paid only the amount standing to his credit in the books of the corporation, after deducting any money due from such member to the corporation, and to the Government.
(3) Any member who is dismissed from the public service for any reason other than dishonesty or drunkenness shall be paid a donation of one half of such amount as is calculated in accordance with the provisions of rule 19, after deducting any monies due from such member to the corporation and to the Government.

Cessation of Membership

9. (1) A member shall lose his membership in the corporation by reason of his retirement or dismissal from the public service, or by withdrawal of membership, or upon his failure to pay his contributions, donation, interest or other sums due to the corporation for a period of six consecutive months.
(2) Any member whose contributions have not been recovered or who has failed to pay the amounts due to the corporation by way of contribution, donation or interest by reason of his having been placed on no pay, long leave, interdiction from duty or illness shall inform the Committee of Management, in writing, and any decision taken by the Committee in respect any such matter shall be final.

Change of Department

10. (1) Any member transferred to any other Government Department from the Railway may in his discretion continue his membership in the corporation or withdraw his membership.

(2) Any member transferred to any other Government Department from the Railway may withdraw his membership by writing addressed to the Secretary and Treasurer at least three months before the date of such transfer. In the event of the membership being not so withdrawn, such member shall continue to enjoy all the benefits under these rules as a member.

(3) No donation shall be paid to any member who withdraws his membership, by reason of his transfer to any other Department from the Railway, but he shall be paid the amount lying to his credit in the books of the corporation after deducting any sum liable to be paid by the member.

(4) If the amount lying to his credit in the books of the corporation is found insufficient to cover the sum liable to be paid by the member, the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury, and the Head of the Department, to which he is transferred, shall have the power to recover such monies in his pay sheet on behalf of the corporation.

Resignations

11. (1) Any member who resigns from the public service, shall cease to be a member of the corporation and he shall be paid the amount lying to his credit in the books of the corporation, after deducting any money liable to be paid by that member to the corporation.

(2) If any member resigns his membership in the corporation, while he is still in service in the Railway, or in any other Government Department, he shall forfeit all monies lying to his credit in the books of the corporation, and such resignation shall become effective only after the repayment of all the outstanding monies due from the member to the corporation.

(3) Any member who resigns his membership may obtain the sanction of the Secretary and Treasurer, to pay any money due to the corporation in instalments, with interest calculated at the rate of half of one per centum per month on the amount of such money outstanding at the end of each month, at the discretion of the Committee of Management.

(4) The General Manager of Railways, or the Head of the Department in which the member is serving and the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury, shall have the power to recover in the pay sheet of the member, any money liable to be paid by the member to the corporation.

Reinstatement of a member

12. (1) Any member upon re-instatement in the public service, shall regain his membership in the corporation, with the approval of the Committee of Management, if he has not obtained any donation from the corporation at the cessation of his membership. Such member shall make application within six months from the date of his re-instatement, and shall pay in one lump sum or in instalments, the outstanding amount of his contributions, donations or interest, due to the corporation from the date of cessation of membership, which he would have paid to the corporation, had he continued to be a member of the corporation.

(2) If such member had received any donation, he shall repay in one lump sum the sum received as donation and shall pay any other sums due to the corporation in the manner provided in paragraph (1) of this rule.

Retirements

13. (1) On retirement or death of a member, the monies standing to his credit shall be paid after deducting any sums due to the corporation from the member within three months of the date of notification of such retirement or death by the Head of the Department, or the sub-department to which such member was attached.

(2) The Committee of Management may, in case of Emergency, grant to any member an advance of an amount not exceeding Rs. 500 out of the donation fund on written application made by such member.

Death

14. (1) Upon the death of any member, all monies and donations standing to the credit of such member shall be paid to his nominee or nominees, within three months from the date of notification of such death by the Head of the Department in which the deceased member served.

(2) If the member had not appointed a nominee or if the nominee is dead, the monies lying to the credit of such member, shall be paid in the proportion of half to the wife and half to the legal children, on the production of the documents referred to in paragraph (3).

(3) In the case of the wife, the certificate of marriage and in case of children, the certificate of birth, along with a letter from Gramasevaka, countersigned by the Divisional Revenue Officer, shall be forwarded to the Committee of Management.

(4) If the children are under the age of 18 years the monies shall be deposited in the Ceylon Savings Bank in the name of the children, and the pass books from such Bank shall be entrusted to the custody of the guardian.

(5) If no claim is made as required by paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) of this rule, notification in two news papers, shall be published after five years from the date of the death of the member, to draw the attention of the heirs of the deceased member to enable them to submit a claim in respect of the monies lying to the credit of such member.

(6) The heirs of any deceased member may make the claim to the Committee of Management, and the decision of the Committee of Management on any such claim shall be final and conclusive.

(7) In the event of any money being unclaimed or if any claimed is disallowed by the Committee of Management, such money, after three months of the publication of the notification, referred to in paragraph (5) of this rule shall be forfeited, and such money shall be transferred to the Funeral Advance Account.

Funeral Advances

15. (1) In the event of the death of a member, a funeral advance shall be given in the manner provided in paragraph (2) of this rule to the widow, children, relation, or to the nominee on the production of the certificate of death, or a certificate conferring the death from the officer-in-charge of the station or office, where the member was working.

(2) The funeral advances referred to in paragraph (1) shall be paid from the funds of the corporation to the widow, children, relation or nominees as set out hereunder—

(a) Where the membership exceeds one year, but does not exceed five years, the amount of the funeral advance shall not exceed Rs. 200/-.

(b) Where the period of membership exceeds five years the amount of the funeral advance shall not exceed Rs. 500/-.

Funeral Advances for Dependents :

16. (1) Funeral advances shall be paid as provided in paragraph (2) at the death of a parent of an unmarried member, or at the death of the wife or a child of a married member, if the child is over two years and under eighteen years of age, on application made to the Secretary and Treasurer, accompanied by the certificate of death, or a letter from the Gramasevaka, countersigned by the Divisional Revenue Officer of the area, confirming such death.

(2) In every such case Rs. 100/- shall be paid where the period of membership of the member exceeds one year, but does not exceed five years, and Rs. 300/- shall be paid where the membership exceeds five years.

(3) Funeral advances referred to in this rule shall be recovered in instalments of not less than Rs. 5 per month. No subsequent loan advances of any kind shall be granted to any member until the funeral advances are fully repaid. In the case of a subsequent death that occurs before the first funeral advance is fully repaid, the amount recovered at the time of the second occurrence shall only be paid, on the production of the documents referred in rule 16 (1).

(4) The interest payable on funeral advances shall be at the rate of half of one per centum per month on the amount of advance outstanding at the end of each month.

(5) Where any member is detected, in giving incorrect information or making a false declaration or trying to mislead the Committee of Management with the intention of obtaining a funeral advance fraudulently such member shall be reported to the Head of the Department for disciplinary action and his membership in the corporation shall be suspended.

(6) The grant of any funeral advance under these rules shall commence only after the Committee of Management has made a deposit of Rs. 50,000 towards the payment of funeral advances. A notification in at least two local newspapers shall be published at least 14 days prior to the date fixed for the commencement of the grant of funeral advances.

(7) All recoveries made in respect of the funeral advances, shall be credited to the Funeral Advance Account which shall be maintained under separate head in the books.

*Unsound
Mind*

17. (1) Any monies of the corporation lying to the credit of any member, condemned by a duly constituted Medical Board as being of unsound in mind, shall remain in the books of the corporation, until such member produces a certificate from a duly constituted Medical Board in proof of complete cure. If the member retires or dies while being still in the condition of unsound mind, the monies lying to his credit shall be paid to his nominees, heirs or legal representatives as herein-before provided.

(2) If such member dies and he has no widow or children, such payment shall be made to the other heirs or the legal representatives of the deceased member.

*Payments
made by the
Committee
of Manage-
ment*

18. Any payments made under these rules to the nominee, widow, or to the heirs of any member, by the Committee of Management, shall be a valid and effectually discharge against any claim or demand, upon the corporation made by any other person or persons.

Donations

19. (1) A donation shall be paid to any member of the Corporation of over three years of membership, upon his retirement in accordance with the following provisions.

(2) A donation shall be paid to a member at his retirement with a membership of three years, after deducting all outstanding dues from him to the corporation at double the amount of donation the member had paid during his membership towards the donation account.

(3) Upon the death of a member, who has completed membership of three years, a donation shall be paid to his nominee, calculated at the rate of three cents per year for every year of his membership, on the number of members on roll, who have completed three years of membership, at the date of such death, after deducting all outstanding dues from such member to the corporation. For the purposes of this rule, any period over six months shall be counted as one complete year.

*Recovery of
Donations*

20. The donation shall, in the first instance, be paid out of the monies in the funds of the corporation and shall subsequently be recovered by means of special calls from members, in equal proportions and the amounts debited to the members in respect of such calls during the year, shall be recovered, within the same year, or before the expiry of six months in the year following.

*Donation Re-
serve Fund*

21. An amount of Rs. 1,000,000 shall be deposited in terms of section 23 of the Ordinance, on account of Donation Reserve Fund.

*Contribution
Loans*

22. (1) The Committee of Management may, at its discretion, grant any member, who has completed at least one year of membership, a loan of an amount equal to three-fourths of the amount of the contribution standing to his credit in the books of the corporation, for any purpose which the Committee of Management thinks is in the interests of the member.

(2) Application for such loans shall be made to the Secretary and Treasurer in the application form provided for the purpose and shall be accompanied by the member's Pass Book, and a statement of the grounds on which the loan application is made.

(3) The acknowledgement form printed on the reverse of the application shall also be perfected, signed on a ten cents stamp, together with the signatures of two witnesses. The office bearers of the corporation who sign cheques shall not be entitled to witness any such loan application.

(4) A cheque for the amount of the loan, along with the pass book, in which details of debits and credits are entered, shall be sent to the member, on receipt of a correctly perfected loan application and receipt.

(5) The member shall on receipt of the cheque and the pass book, check the entries therein, and if any incorrect entries are discovered he shall promptly inform the Secretary and Treasurer, and shall get such incorrect entry rectified.

(6) The minimum amount of any loan given to a member, under paragraph (1) of this rule shall be Rs. 20.

(7) It shall be lawful for the Secretary and Treasurer, President and the two Vice Presidents to grant loans under these rules. A schedule showing all particulars of loans granted during the month, along with the monthly statement, shall be submitted to the Committee of Management, at the end of every month, for approval, and a duplicate of such schedule and monthly statement shall be sent to the General Manager of Railways, every month.

(8) Every contribution loan application shall be replied within three days of its receipt. Interest on loans shall be at the rate of half of one per centum per month. Every fraction of a month shall be treated as one full month, when calculating the interest on loans. The minimum monthly instalment payable on loans shall be five rupees.

Salary Loans

23. (1) The Committee of Management may, in its discretion, grant any member, with a membership of over three years, a salary loan, during any emergency sickness, or at any time of distress, or for any other good reason, in accordance with the following provisions.

(2) The Committee of Management may grant such salary loans to members, if the recoveries can be made on the pay sheet for and on behalf of the corporation, within the limits of 50 per centum of the salary or under any other rule made by the Minister of Finance in respect of pay sheet deductions from public servants from time to time.

(3) Salary loan forms which are obtainable at the office of the corporation, shall be duly perfected and attested by two witnesses and two sureties (in cases where sureties are necessary) and shall be submitted to the Secretary and Treasurer.

(4) Any member may witness any loan application of any other member known to him, but, however, members signing as sureties can sign as sureties only for two members and not more.

(5) Members of over ten years of membership only shall be entitled to be accepted as sureties for applicants entitled to loans of six months salary advance.

(6) Members of over fifteen years of membership only shall be entitled to be accepted as sureties for applicants entitled to loans of nine months salary advance.

(7) Members of over twenty years of membership only shall be entitled to be accepted as sureties for applicants entitled to one year's salary advance.

(8) The Secretary and Treasurer shall enter the perfected applications in serial order, in the register kept for the purpose, and shall submit the said applications to the Committee of Management at the end of each month. Loans shall be granted as sanctioned by the Committee of Management, or by the office bearers who are authorized to do so.

(9) Every salary loan advance shall be subject to the following provisions :—

- (a) Where the membership exceeds three years, but does not exceed five years, the amount of salary loan advance shall not exceed one month's basic salary or Rs. 200/- whichever is the higher.
- (b) Where the membership exceeds five years but does not exceed ten years, the amount of the salary loan advance shall not exceed three month's basic salary or Rs. 500/- whichever is the higher.
- (c) Where the membership exceeds ten years, but does not exceed fifteen years, the amount of the salary loan advance shall not exceed six month's basic salary or Rs. 1,000/- whichever is the higher.
- (d) Where the membership exceeds fifteen years, but does not exceed twenty years, the amount of the salary loan advance shall not exceed nine months basic salary or Rs. 1,500/- whichever is the higher.
- (e) Where the membership exceeds twenty years, the amount of the salary loan advance shall not exceed one year's basic salary or Rs. 2,000 whichever is the higher.

(10) The maximum amount of salary loan allowed under these rules shall not exceed Rs. 2,000. No member shall be eligible for any other subsequent salary loan, under these rules, until the salary loan already obtained has been fully repaid. No member shall reduce or refuse to repay the loan instalments, until the loan is completely recovered.

(11) The perfected receipt for the salary loan advance shall be submitted to the Secretary and Treasurer along with the pass book. The pass book along with the cheque for this amount of the loan shall be sent to the member, within three days of the receipt of the acknowledgement.

(12) The interest payable on salary loans shall be at the rate of half of one per centum per month on the amount of the salary loan outstanding at the end of each month.

Salary Loan recoveries

24. (1) Salary loans granted under rule 23 of these rules, shall be recoverable in instalments, with interest as provided hereunder :—

- (a) Where the amount of the loan does not exceed one month's basic salary or the maximum amount prescribed, the loan shall be repaid in eighteen equal monthly instalments.
- (b) Where the amount of the loan does not exceed three month's basic salary or the maximum amount prescribed, the loan shall be repaid in twenty four equal monthly instalments.
- (c) Where the amount of the loan does not exceed six month's basic salary or the maximum amount prescribed, the loan shall be repaid in thirty six equal monthly instalments.
- (d) Where the amount of the loan does not exceed nine month's basic salary or the maximum amount prescribed, the loan shall be repaid in forty eight equal monthly instalments.
- (e) Where the amount of the loan does not exceed one year's basic salary or the maximum amount prescribed, the loan shall be repaid in sixty equal monthly instalments.

(2) When any member does not repay, refuses to pay, or neglects to pay any loan obtained under rule 23, the amount of the loan shall be recoverable in one lump sum or in instalments, in full, from any monies lying in the books of the corporation to the credit of the member to whom the loan was granted and the Committee of Management shall be entitled to recover such money from the sureties in the same manner as the Committee of Management considers fit. The sureties shall not be entitled to any loan or loans from the corporation until the amount of the loan is repaid or recovered in full.

Arrears

25. Where any member is dismissed from the service of the Railway or from any other Government Department, the corporation may recover any money due to the corporation from such member by legal process.

Petty Cash

26. The Secretary and Treasurer, may retain with him an amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty rupees out of the monies of the Corporation, to meet calls for petty cash amounts.

Dividends

27. The profits of the corporation at the end of a financial year as disclosed in the balance sheet, shall be added to the Donation Reserve Fund, until its reserves amount to ten hundred thousand rupees as provided in rule 21, and thereafter, the profits of the corporation shall be distributed as dividends to members in proportion to the amount lying to their credit in the books of the corporation. Such dividends accruing to a member shall be credited to the account of the member in the books of the corporation.

Special General Meeting 28. (1) The Secretary and Treasurer shall summon a special general meeting of the members of the corporation at the written request of the President. Every member shall be informed of such meeting, in writing and by a notification, published in at least two local news papers not less than seven days prior to the date of such meeting specifying the date, time and place of such meeting and the purpose of such meeting. At any such meeting, no other business shall be discussed, except the business specified in the notice.

(2) The Secretary and Treasurer shall summon a special general meeting of the members of the corporation on a written requisition made by not less than fifty members, in accordance with the provisions of section 17 of the Ordinance and such meeting shall be summoned as directed by the Committee of Management.

(3) The Secretary and Treasurer shall summon a special general meeting of members, on a resolution passed at a meeting of the Committee of Management, by a majority of votes, or on a written requisition made by at least seven members of the Committee of Management, or on a written requisition, made by not less than fifty members.

(4) The Secretary and Treasurer shall inform the members the business laid down in the agenda by issuing a circular, and by publishing a notification in the news papers; and no business shall be brought before or transacted at such meeting other than the business specified in such notice.

Annual General Meeting 29. (1) An annual general meeting of the members of the corporation shall be held in Colombo, not later than the 31st day of March of each year.

(2) The notice of the annual general meeting shall be sent to all the members, at least 7 days prior to the date fixed for the meeting. Such notice shall be published in at least two news papers, and also by circular to the members.

(3) Any member desirous of moving any resolution at the annual general meeting shall submit such resolution in writing, to the Secretary and Treasurer, at least 7 days prior to the date fixed for the meeting.

Quorum 30. The quorum at any general meeting of the corporation shall be one hundred and fifty members.

Election of office bearers 31. (1) The office bearers shall be elected annually, at the annual general meeting, from among the members of the corporation, for the post of President, two Vice-Presidents, and twelve members of the Committee of Management. Nominations shall be called from the members for the posts of office bearers and for the election of the twelve members of the Committee of Management. Every such nomination shall reach to the Secretary and Treasurer at least six weeks prior to the date fixed for the meeting.

(2) The Committee of Management shall ensure that the nominations so received are in accordance with the provisions of rule 32, and shall circulate among the members a list of the names of the candidates nominated at least two weeks prior to the date fixed for the meeting.

(3) The election of President, two Vice-Presidents, and twelve members of the Committee of Management shall be by secret ballot. The office bearers and the members of the Committee of Management, so elected, shall continue in their posts until the next general meeting.

(4) The Secretary and Treasurer shall distribute the ballot papers to the members present at the general meeting, and the members shall cast their votes by making a sign "X" in the cage printed against the name of the candidate in the ballot paper and shall return the ballot paper to the Secretary and Treasurer or to such member or members appointed for the purpose, at the general meeting.

(5) For the election of the President, two Vice-Presidents, and the twelve members of the Committee of Management, each member shall be entitled to cast fifteen votes. Any ballot paper not conforming to these rules shall be rejected.

Qualification of Candidates 32. (1) Any member who contests for the post of President, or Vice-President, shall have over twenty years of membership in the corporation, and shall also be competent in the Official Language, and also shall possess a sound knowledge of English.

(2) Any member who contests for membership in the Committee of Management, shall have over ten years of membership in the Corporation, and shall also be competent in the Official Language in order to transact the business of the corporation.

(3) No office bearer or member of the Committee of Management shall be eligible to contest on the 3rd year for any such post at a subsequent general meeting after serving in any such post continuously for two years.

Duties of the Secretary and Treasurer 33. (1) The member who is elected to the office of the Secretary and Treasurer, under the provisions of section 6 of the Ordinance shall perform his duties in accordance with the provisions of section 7 of the Ordinance, and shall be responsible for any loss or damage caused to the corporation by him and the corporation shall have the power to recover such loss or damage from him.

(2) The Secretary and Treasurer shall report to the Committee of Management any irregularity or fraud committed by any office bearer or any member of the office staff.

(3) Any loss caused to the corporation by the Secretary and Treasurer by his negligence shall be recoverable from such Secretary and Treasurer.

(4) The Committee of Management or any office bearer shall not act contrary to any of the rules and if any loss caused to the corporation by any member of the Committee of Management or by any office bearer, the corporation shall be entitled to recover all such loss from such member or office bearer.

Duties of the Committee of Management 34. The Committee of Management shall perform their duties in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance and these rules.

Pass Book with loan card and rule book 35. (1) Every member, on admission, shall be provided with a copy of the Ordinance, a copy of these rules and a pass book.

(2) Every member shall send his pass book twice every year, before and after the audit, to the office of the corporation, to be posted up, and every member shall be provided with a certified statement of the accounts before and after the annual audit.

Properties of the corporation 36. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be responsible for the safe custody of all the books, stationery, files, furniture and fittings and other such properties belonging to the corporation.

Change of station and address 37. Every member shall notify to the Secretary and Treasurer in writing of the member's change of station or address.

- Financial Year** 38. The financial year of the corporation shall commence on the first day of November in any year and shall end on the thirty-first day of October of the following year.
- Complaints and inquiries** 39. The General Manager of Railways or the Secretary to the Treasury or Deputy Secretary to the Treasury shall have the power to inquire into any complaints made by any members of the corporation in respect of any matters relating to the corporation.
- Repeal of previous rules** 40. All rules heretofore made by the corporation are hereby repealed and all such rules shall be superseded by these rules.
