GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE
ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Married allowance is payable at rates and on conditions applicable to Government Officers.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Local Government Service Act, No. 18 of 1969, and Local Government Service Regulations and any other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(a) The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females who have not been transferred to the Pension Scheme are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulation, 1962.

(b) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pension and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(c) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the respective Local Authorities in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to Local Government Service under the Local Government Service Act, No. 18 of 1969.

(d) In the case of appointments to posts not declared to be pensionable under the Local Government Pension Scheme Regulations, appointees will be required to contribute 5% of their salary to the Local Government Service Provident Fund established under section 18 of the Local Government Service Act, No. 18 of 1969. The Local Authorities to which they are appointed will contribute 7½% of their salaries to the Fund on their behalf.

(e) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, those above the age of 55 and those who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their hypothetical basic salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of the hypothetical basic salary.

(f) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(g) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(h) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of 3 years unless otherwise specified.

(i) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

(j) Appointees should serve in any part of the Island.

4. *New-Entrants to the Local Government Service.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) All New-Entrant Officers must subscribe to the conditions that they will conform to the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956, and any laws and rules that now exist or may be introduced in future for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government.

(iii) They should acquire a working knowledge of the Official Language—Sinhala during their period of probation/trial except in exceptional cases where it is not essential for the efficient discharge of their duties.

(iv) Their confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, *inter alia* on their passing within the prescribed period of time prescribed Proficiency Tests in Sinhala leading up to a level not higher than the J. S. C. Standard. Failure to pass these tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of increments falling due until the tests are passed. The service of those officers who do not reach the required standard of Proficiency in Sinhala by the end of their period of probation/trial will be liable to be terminated.

(v) *Educational and other Qualifications.*—In all schemes of recruitment where the minimum qualification prescribed is a pass in the S. S. C. Examination or equivalent or higher examination a candidate who is a Sinhalese educated in the Sinhala

medium should have a pass in the Sinhala Language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate or equivalent examination.

This requirement will not apply to those officers who have been in the Local Government Service from a date prior to February 8, 1963, and who seek appointments to other posts in the Local Government Service.)

Note.—(i) Those who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala Medium will be exempted from passing these Proficiency tests in Sinhala as a pre-requisite for confirmation.

Note.—(ii) The term "New Entrant" shall for the purpose of the Official Language Policy, apply to an officer who was first appointed to a post in the Local Government Service in response to a Gazette notification published on or after 29.1.60.

Note.—(iii) The provisions of paragraph 4 (iii) and (iv) will not apply to old entrant officers serving in Government departments and who have been released from their posts to accept appointments in the Local Government Service.

5. Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A Ceylonese is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. Concessions to ex-Servicemen—(a) ex-Servicemen will be allowed to deduct their period of service in the Regular Force from their ages, where such deduction will enable them to be brought within the maximum age prescribed in the posts applied

(b) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to reduce the minimum educational standards laid down in the scheme of recruitment to any post in the Service to the next lowest examination.

7. Age Concession.—Employees of Local Authorities holding permanent posts with two years' continuous service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

8. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should when, forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

Posts of Overseer

APPLICATIONS are invited by the L.G.S.C. for the posts of Works Overseer, Revenue Overseer, Sanitary Overseer and Water Works Overseer.

2. The candidates selected as works overseers may also be called upon to do Revenue and for sanitary works in addition to their normal duties; candidates selected as Revenue Overseers may be called upon to do sanitary works in addition to their normal duties and the candidates selected as Sanitary Overseers may be called upon to attend to Revenue works in addition to their normal duties.

The candidates selected as water works overseers will be appointed only to the posts of water works overseers.

3. The selected candidates should be prepared to serve in any part of the Island.

4. Each post carries a consolidated salary of Rs. 3,000 per annum on the scale Rs. 3,000 per annum rising by 11 annual increments of Rs. 90 to Rs. 3,990, with an efficiency bar before Rs. 3,450 per annum. Married officers will be paid a married allowance.

The posts are permanent and pensionable. The appointed candidates will be entitled to contribute to the L.G.S. W. & O. P. Fund.

5. The candidates will be appointed on 3 years' probation and will be subject to the L.G.S. Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder.

6. The selected candidates will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and in particular for implementation of the provisions of the Official Language Act.

These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation. Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation, will depend on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the Local Government Service Commission is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the Commission if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

The officers who qualify for selection through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the proficiency test in Sinhala.

7. Candidates must be of good character and they should be Ceylonese.

8. Candidates must be not less than 18 years of age and not more than 30 years of age on 17.11.1970. Birth Certificate should be furnished when it is required and copy of the B. C. should be annexed to the application. Neither affidavits nor Baptismal Certificates will be accepted instead of the B. C.

9. Qualifications.—

POSTS OF WORKS OVERSEER

Candidates should have passed any one of the following examinations with 5 credit passes of which one should be in Mathematics (not Arithmetic):—

- (i) S.S.C. (Sinhala) or Tamil.
- (ii) S.S.C. (English) examination with Sinhala or Tamil as a subject.
- (iii) G.C.E. (Ordinary Level) Examination in six subjects with Sinhala or Tamil which should have been passed on not more than 2 occasions.

(The credit passes and the other requisite subjects should have been passed on these 2 occasions).

Applications will also be considered from those who have 2 years' experience in minor construction works, taking out quantities, metalling and tarring roads, etc., provided they have passed—

- (i) S.S.C. (Sinhala) or (Tamil) with Mathematics as a subject, or
- (ii) S.S.C. (English) with Sinhala or Tamil and Mathematics as subject, or
- (iii) G.C.E. (Ordinary Level) in 6 subjects with Mathematics and Sinhala or Tamil which have been passed on not more than 2 occasions.

(A certificate of experience from a recognised firm or a Government or Local Government Institution should be attached.)

(a) Applications will also be considered from those who have passed the Preliminary Examination in Engineering Science in the Institute of Practical Technology or a Junior Technical Institute.

(b) Selected candidates for the posts of Works Overseer will have to undergo a course of training arranged by this Department and they should pass an examination at the end of the course. The duration of the course will be about 8 weeks. During the period of training no salary or allowance will be paid to those candidates who have not received their appointment before the commencement of the training course. Those who get appointments before the commencement of the training course will be given duty leave. And all expenses during the period of staying to follow the training course which may be conducted either in Colombo or any other place will have to be met by the candidates themselves.

A selected candidate will each have to pay a sum of Rs. 50 (Rupees Fifty) only being the fees for training.

N.B.—Those who fail to attend the training course when called upon to do so and/or fail the examination held at the end of the course are liable to be discontinued.

- (iii) G.C.E. (Ordinary Level) Examination in 6 subjects with Sinhala or Tamil as a subject which should have been passed on not more than 2 occasions. (Candidates should have passed the examination on these two occasions in the necessary subject and with credit passes as required.)

POSTS OF WATER WORKS OVERSEER

(i) Candidates should have passed any one of the following examinations with 5 credit passes:—

- (1) S.S.C. (English) Examination with Sinhala or Tamil as a subject, or
- (2) S.S.C. Examination (Sinhala or Tamil),
- (3) G.C.E. (Ordinary Level) Examination in 6 subjects on not more than 2 occasions. (Candidates should have passed the Examination on these 2 occasions in 6 subjects with the necessary credit passes.)

Candidates should also possess knowledge and 2 years' experience in plumbing and maintaining of water supply scheme. (A certificate of experience from a recognised firm or a Government or Local Government Institution should be annexed).

(ii) Applications of candidates who have obtained the certificate in Plumbing in Ceylon Technical College or a Junior Technical College will be considered provided they have passed any one of the following examinations:—

- (1) S.S.C. Examination (Sinhala or Tamil),
- (2) S.S.C. Examination (English) with Sinhala or Tamil as a subject.
- (3) G.C.E. (Ordinary Level) Examination in 6 subjects on not more than 2 occasions.

Those who do not possess minimum qualifications should not apply.

PUBLIC MARKETS

1. For the purposes of by-law 1 of Part XV of the Standard By-laws adopted by the Hikkaduwa Town Council, the market area shall be the area within a circle having a radius of 600 yards from the Hikkaduwa public market.

2. No person shall sell meat, poultry, fish, fruit or vegetables within the market area other than in the public market except on the authority of a licence issued by the Council.

3. A licence fee of Rs. 10 per annum shall be levied in respect of any licence issued under by-law 2.

CONSERVANCY

4. For the purposes of by-law 6 of Part XIX of the Standard By-laws adopted by the Council, the conservancy fee payable monthly to the Council shall subject as hereinafter provided be at the rate of four rupees for each bucket conserved:

Provided that where only one bucket is used no conservancy fee shall be payable and where two or more buckets are used, no conservancy fee shall be payable in respect of the first bucket.
