THE Award transmitted to me by the Arbitrator to whom the Industrial Dispute which had arisen between The Ceylon Mercantile Union, 22 1/1, Upper Chatham Street, Colombo 1 and Messrs. Brown & Co. Ltd., Darley Road, Colombo 10, was referred under section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131, as amended for settlement by arbitration is hereby published in terms of section 18 (1) of the said Act.

Messrs. Brown & Company Limited, Darley Road, Colombo 10.

#### The Award

As an industrial dispute in respect of the matter specified in the statement below existed between the Ceylon Mercantile Union, 22 1/1, Upper Chatham Street, Colombo 1, and Messrs. Brown & Company Limited, Darley Road, Colombo 10, and as the parties to the said dispute consented to the reference of the said dispute for settlement by arbitration and have jointly nominated me as arbitrator for the said purpose, the learned Commissioner of Labour by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Act, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, 4 of 1962 and 39 of 1968, read with the Industrial Disputes (Special Provisions) Act, No. 37 of 1968, referred the aforesaid dispute to me for settlement by arbitration by his letter dated 12th July, 1970.

Mr. S. M. Fernando, Assistant Secretary, Employers Federation of Ceylon, appeared for the Company, and Mr. P. Rajanayagam, Proctor, appeared for the Applicant Union.

The matter in dispute between the Ceylon Mercantile Union and Messrs. Brown & Co., Ltd., is whether the termination of the services of Mr. M. R. Packeer by Messrs. Brown & Company Limited is justified and to what relief, if any, is he entitled. Mr. Fernando for the Management filed the statement of the Company in regard to the matter in dispute.

- (1) Messrs. Brown and Company Iimited is a member of the Employer's Federation of Ceylon.
- (2) Mr. M. R. Packeer referred to in the statement of dispute was dismissed as he was found guilty of the following act of misconduct:—
  - "In that he while being a Foreman in the Engineering Division of Messrs Brown & Company Ltd., Workshops, did on 16th March, 1969, at about 3.25 p.m. attempt to remove in his car \( \frac{1}{2} \) b. Leatheroid Paper belonging to the Company without permission or authority."
- (3) Before the services of Mr. Packeer was terminated he was issued with a show cause letter and as his explanation was unsatisfactory a proper domestic inquiry was held.
- (4) The Employer submits that the termination of the services of Mr. Packeer was bona fide and in the circumstances, perfectly jujstified and that he is not entitled to any relief, whatsoever.

Mr. Rajanayagam for the Union said that he would make his statement orally and submitted that Mr. Packeer is a member of the Ceylon Mercantile Union. He was appointed in 1960, and he counts about ten years' service. A show cause letter was issued dated 17.3.69, on which date he was suspended from service. He was asked to explain his attempt to remove the 1 lb. Leatheroid Paper, said to be the property of the Company without the authority of the Management. By letter dated 23.3.69, the worker concerned replied to the Charge Sheet, among other things, that the particular Leatheroid Paper was his private property, and that he had purchased it elsewhere and that it did not belong to the Company. Subsequently, Mr.

Packeer produced a receipt for the purchase of this particular Leutheroid Paper. An inquiry was held commencing from 1.4.69, and the employee concerned was dismissed subsequently by letter dated 18.6.69 with effect from 17.3.69 the Company having found him guilty of the charge. The Union submitted that the termination of the services of the worker concerned was unjustified and that he should be reinstated with back wages.

Mr. Fernando for the Management did not accept the position that the Leatheroid Paper which Mr. Packeer attempted to take out on that day belonged to him and maintained that it was Company property. There was a requirement of the Company that if an employee brings any of his goods into the Company premises he must notify the Security Officer at the gate when he brings it, and it is only in those circumstances could he bring any property into the Company premises. In this case Mr. Packeer has not notified the Security Officer at the gate, in case he does say that he brought it from outside.

When I questioned Mr. Fernando why the Company took a serious view of the matter, he replied that every year the Company lost property amounting to large sums of money and that Mr. Packeer as Foreman in the Company and in a position of trust and confidence has betrayed this trust and confidence by removing the property of the Company without permission.

It must be said that Mr. Packeer was amenable to any suggestion that would protect his fair name as Foreman.

However, on the 19th August, 1970, Mr. Fernnado for tie Management led the evidence of Mr. L. S. Cabraal, a junior executive, Group Secretary, Brown & Company Limited to prove the charges against Mr. Packeer and examination-in-chief went on for sometime. Mr. Cabraal was a former Police Officer and he has investigated into the charges in detail and has made a report of the entire inquiry held by him.

Mr. Fernando, Assistant Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, sought to produce a report of what the witnesses said took place on the 17th and 18th March, 1969. Mr. Rajanayagam, however, was on the alert and rightly objected to the production of this document.

At this stage, however, on my suggestion the parties were prepared to settle their dispute, and on the 20th of August, 1970, it was brought to my notice that the parties would like to report to court that they had settled the dispute on the basis of the Company agreeing to pay Mr. Packeer a sum of Rs. 2,500 as an ex gratia sum in full and final settlement of all claims, statutory or otherwise, against the Company. Mr. Packeer would, however, be entitled to withdraw the total amount lying to his credit in the Provident Fund. The Company also agreed to send Mr. Packeer a Certificate of Service, giving the period of employment, the nature of the work he did and his last salary.

The parties, however, desired that the case be called on the 24th August, 1970, to produce a memorandum of settlement duly signed by the parties, incorporating the terms already agreed upon, and accordingly, on the 24th August, 1970, a memorandum of settlement marked A1 was filed of record as part and parcel of the Award. A1 reads as follows:—

- "1. The dispute between the Ceylon Mercantile Union and Messrs. Brown & Co. Ltd., arising out of the termination of the services of Mr. M. R. Packeer has been settled.
- 2. The Company offers to pay Mr. Packeer, a sum of Rs. 2,500 ex gratia in full and final settlement of all his claims against the Company including statutory dues, if any. On receipt of this payment Mr. Packeer will have no claims whatsoever against the Company.
- 3. Mr. Packeer will be free to withdraw the total amount lying to his credit in the Provident Fund subject to any charge in favour of the Department of Inland Revenue.
- 4. The Company will also issue to Mr. Packeer a certificate of service."

This sum of Rs. 2,500 will be deposited with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo South, Labour Secretariat, Narahenpita, Colombo 5, to be paid to Mr. Packeer. The Company will also furnish a Certificate of Service to be handed over to Mr. Packeer. Mr. Packeer is free to withdraw this money from the Commissioner of Labour, after 14.9.70.

I consider the terms of settlement just and equitable, and I make my award accordingly.

## REPORT OF THE AUDITOR-GENERAL ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE LOCAL LOANS AND DEVELOPMENT FUND FOR THE YEAR 1966-67

(The amounts have been rounded off to the nearest rupee.)

THE accounts of the Local Loans and Development Fund for the year ended September 30, 1967, were audited under my direction and this report is submitted in accordance with section 14 of the Local Loans and Development Ordinance (Cap. 404). The following financial statements were furnished for the year ended September 30, 1967:-

- (a) Cash Account:
- (b) Income and Expenditure Account; and
- (c) Statement of Assets and Liabilities.

These statements which are in agreement with the books of accounts have been certified in audit, subject to the following observations.

2. Operating Results.—The income of the Fund for the year inclusive of a sum of Rs. 15,162 being interest received during the two previous years was Rs. 2,738,301 and the expenditure was Rs. 2,934,917. The operation of the Fund for the year 1966-67 resulted in a not loss of Rs. 196,616 as compared with a net profit of Rs. 353,746 for the previous year. In view of the fact that interest represented the interest actually received during the year and not the amount accrued due for the year, the Income and Expenditure Account does not disclose the true results for the year.

#### Cash Account

- 3. Interest received during the year—Rs. 2,738,301.—The above sum includes Rs. 15,162 being interest received during the years 1964-65 and 1965-66 and shown as a Suspense Account in the Statements of Liabilities and Assets on September 30, 1965 and 1966.
- 4. Loan Repayments—Rs. 4,492,621.—The above sum includes Rs. 14,244 being repayment of capital during the years 1964-65 and 1965-66 and included as a Suspense Account in the Statements of Liabilities and Assets on September 30, 1965 and 1966.

#### Income and Expenditure Account

- 5. Interest—Rs. 2,738,301.—(a) As stated in paragraph 3 above this sum includes Rs. 15,162 being interest received during the years 1964—65 and 1965—66, but does not include interest accrued up to September 30, 1967.
  - (b) The rates of interest charged on loans have not been prescribed by regulations under section 11 (d) of the Ordinance.
- 6. Balance interest for 1963-64 paid into Government Revenue—Rs. 554,746.—A sum of Rs. 18,491, 525 was loaned to 5 local bodies during the period 1967-61 for a Water Supply Scheme. These local bodies refused to pay the interest due on the loan to the Local Loans and Development Fund from October 1, 1962 until such time the local bodies got an independent source of supply of water after the completion of Head Works. On representations made by the Commissioner of Local Government to the Local Loans and Development Fund Commissioners, the latter obtained the approval of the Minister of Finance under section 28 of the Local Loans and Development Ordinance to waive the interest due from October 1, 1962 until the Head Works are completed. on these loans from the local bodies concerned. The Commissioners also obtained the approval of the Minister of Finance to waive the interest due to the Consolidated Fund from October 1, 1962 on the moneys obtained for the Water Supply Scheme, until such time the local bodies are in a position to make payment. However, the Attorney General who was consulted at my instance by the Commissioners on the propriety of this waiver, was of the opinion that interest due to the Consolidated Fund cannot be waived administratively and that special statutory provision was necessary to enable such action to be taken. The Local Loans and Development Fund, therefore, became liable to pay the interest due to the Condolidated Fund from 1962-63. Interest for the years 1962-63 to 1966-67 has since been paid to the Consolidated Fund.
- 7. The position with regard to repayment of loans and payments of interest by Co-operative Societies as well as certain local bodies continues to be unsatisfactory. According to the report of the Secretary, annexed to the accounts, arrears of loan repayments and interest thereon were as follows:—

#### LOCAL LOANS AND DEVELOPMENT FUND-REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1966-67

THE Statement of Accounts for the year ended September 30, 1967, and the Balance Sheet as at that date are submitted along with this report.

Interest.—The rate of interest on loans to local authorities remains at  $4\frac{1}{2}\%$  per annum and on loans to Government officers for building houses at 5% per annum. The total interest received during the year on loans is Rs. 2,738,301.

Borrowings.—The Fund borrowed during the year a sum of Rs. 5,000,000 from Government to enable it to pay the loans that had been approved. The Fund also repaid a sum of Rs. 4,930,640 on loans obtained from Government in previous years, the total indebtedness as at September 30, 1967 is Rs. 90,717,920 to Government and Rs. 750,000 to the Savings Certificates Fund. The rate of interest on sums borrowed from Government remains at 4½% per annum.

#### Repayments

Co-operative Societies.—Repayment of loans and payment of interest by Co-operative Societies have continued to be unsatisfactory. The arrears of principal as at September 30, 1967 was Rs. 163,262. 87 which is the same as the amount shown in the previous year. The arrears of interest at September 30, 1967 amounted to Rs. 103,564. 71 as compared with Rs. 95,881. 23 at September 30, 1966. The unsatisfactory state of these loans has been brought to the notice of the Registrar of Co-operative Societies with the request that some positive action should be taken to see that the outstanding sums are settled early.

Local Authorities.—The interest due from local authorities participating in the Towns South of Colombo Water Supply Scheme was waived until the completion of the headworks. Although the headworks was completed in 1966, the local authorities concerned have failed to pay the interest due. The fund has, however, paid a sum of Rs. 554,745.75 during the year representing the interest due to Government, on the loans taken to finance the Local authorities share of this scheme.

The following Local authorities are in arrears in regard to repayment. If these defaulting local authorities do not make a genuine attempt to settle their arrears, the Commissioners of the Fund will be compelled to evoke the provisions of Section 18 of the Local Loans and Development Fund Ordinance and appropriate the rates and taxes in settlement of the amounts due.

As a result of the failure on the part of local bodies to pay their dues, the Fund has incurred a loss of Rs. 196,615.75 in the year's working.
