It would be noted that the employer has been cited as A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera. When statements were called for in terms of regulation 21 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Regulations the Union sent their statement, but there was no response from the employer. Thereafter a notice of hearing was sent through the Police to be served on the employer, and the Police reported that the notice of hearing was affixed to the main gate of the office as the Police felt certain that the business was still functioning there.

In the meanwhile the Ceylon Mercantile Union had entered into correspondence with the Commissioner of Labour with copy to the Tribunal re the correct name, and the Commissioner of Labour had confirmed in writing, with copy to the Tribunal, that according to the Registrar of Business Names, the proprietor's name is A. H. S. Abeygoonasekera.

Thereafter the parties were present before the Tribunal on 6.1.71, 17.1.71 and 31.1.71 on which dates discussions were held and the parties sought to negotiate a settlement.

On 15.2.71 the parties indicated to the Tribunal that their attempts at negotiation had failed and that the matter will have to proceed to trial.

On this date the representative of the employer, very correctly in my view, said he would accept the name of the employer given in the reference as correct. It was revealed by the representative on this date and by Counsel' who appeared for the employer on subsequent dates that the word Ahangamawithanalage in the name of the employer though it stood as one word in the certificate of registration, should really be two words, Ahangama Withanalage. However, Counsel too indicated that he would accept the name as correct. that he would accept the name as correct.

When the trial commenced, on behalf of the Ceylon Mercantitle Union (hereinafter referred to as the Union) it was stated that the Union is not taking up matters relating to Gnanadasa (No. 21 in the list of reference) and Perera (No. 22 in the same list). The Union further brought to the notice of the Tribunal that worker D. L. A. C. Appuhamy is now dead.

On behalf of A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekara, Proprietor of Safety Carriers (hereinafter referred to as the employer) it was stated that though the name of Dickson Peiris appeared as an employee on the reference made, it is now found on verification that Dickson Peiris is not an employee of the respondent and he requested that this be treated as an amendment of the statement.

The Union maintained that Dickson Peiris was an employee, and pointed out that even in the statement filed by the employer this had been conceded.

The Counsel for the employer thereupon stated that, since the terms of reference is "whether the termination of the services of certain employees whose names are listed therein is justified and to what relief each is entitled", it was the duty of the Union to begin and establish that the employees on whose behalf the reference has been made are employees of Safety Carriers and that the termination was without adequate notice.

On behalf of the Union it was stated that the services of 22 employees had been terminated by letter dated 30.11.69, and the letter of termination gave the reason for the termination, that the Company was running at a loss and that the Company was due to be closed. They contended that the Union is not in a position to know whether the Company was really running at a loss or the need to close the business; it was the employer's responsibility to establish before the Tribunal the justification for the action they have taken. In fact it was the Union's position that the business was still in existence and was functioning.

In the statement filed by the employer they have admitted the fact that the 22 workers were employed at Safety Carriers. It is idle now to take up this very point as an argument that the Union must establish that the employees on whose behalf the reference had been made are employees of Safety Carriers.

The letters of termination issued to the employees disclose the reason that the business was running at a loss which resulted in the gradual closure of the business. The statement filed by the employer reiterates this position and further claims that alternate offers were made to the 22 employees, but it was not accepted by them.

These claims of the employer need establishing to justify the action he has taken and the bona fides of his intentions and in the circumstances of this case it is the employer who should begin. Order was made accordingly.

In this case I must give in somewhat sufficient detail the evidence of the witnesses for a proper understanding of the case. In his evidence, Devakumara, who said he was Assistant Manager of Safety Carriers, stated that Safety Carriers commenced business in 1965, and the business involved transport and carriage of export and import cargo. The Company owned no lorries, but the proprietor of the Company, A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekara, i.e., the employer in this case, owned about 22 lorries and these lorries were engaged in the import and export of cargo of the Company. There were about 24 drivers and 24 clearners and a further office staff of clerks and garage staff of mechanics, making a total of approximately 70 to 75.

The firm had written contracts and verbal contracts with shippers and consignors and payment by them to the firm was on a tonnage basis. There were about 15 such contracts in 1965. These contracts were carried on till about 1967, when with the eruption of the Middle East crisis the number of ships coming to Colombo Harbour was reduced; and consequently this resulted in a reduction of work. At the same time the import work was also reduced because the firms stopped importing.

While in 1965 and 1966, the business was a paying one, it began losing after 1967. The lorries also went into a state of disrepair because of the absence of spare parts, and for whatever work they had, they had to hire out lorries. Lorries for this business were hired out from a firm called A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera & Sons the proprietor of which is A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera, who is the father of the employer. In addition to hiring from A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera & Sons they also hired vehicles from other individual owners and firms like Jayagiri Transporters. In 1969, the firm had only six lorries plying in the business and a staff of about 45, which included drivers and cleaners, office staff and mechanics.

In October, 1969, in view of the continuing losses arrangements were made to close down the Company and all employees were issued a notice marked as R14. This was issued on 30.11.69 to about 50 to 60 of the staff and they were issued by the Cashier, Dissanayake.

Thereafter some drivers and clearners met the proprietor of the firm A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera, and said they could not leave their jobs. A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera thereupon told them that he could not give work, but that he was willing to give the lorries to them and they could use the lorries and pay him a hire. Some drivers and clearners accepted this proposition, but not the employees whose names are in the list of reference. These persons left the service of the Company on 31.12.69 and their December salaries were also paid.

Dickson Peiris had not been working at Safety Carriers, according to the witness.

He marked the income and expenditure statement for May, 1970 to January, 1971, as R3 to R11, and stated that they were continuing to lose in business. R12 was marked as the accounts concerning the outstanding amounts, and the trial balance sheet for 1970-71 as R13. According to these, and when loans and outstanding payments are taken into account total expenditure was Rs. 640,663.59 against a total income of Rs. 627,289.97 for the year ending 31.3.71.

Newman giving evidence said that he attended to the accounts work of the employer and he marked a certificate purported to have been issued by S. A. Scharenguivel, Registered Accountant and Auditor, as R22 for the financial year, 1968-69. Marking document R23 for year 1969-70, he said that there was a profit of Rs. 7,680 which, for the purpose of income tax, was reduced to a profit of Rs. 5,410, but in the computation of this, the overdraft of Rs. 30,000 obtained from the State Bank and a fraud involving a sum of Rs. 14,229 were not taken into account.

Dickson Peiris, one of the workmen on behalf of whom this reference is made, was called by the Counsel for the employer to give evidence; and he identified R16 and R16A as the statements prepared by him. The name and address appearing, according to this document is A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera & Sons and the employer's number for E. P. F. registration is 3533/A. In R16 there are 5 names of persons whose names are listed in the reference who were contributors to the Provident Fund. As to why no contributions were made in respect of the others whose names are in the reference he could not say, nor whether such persons were casual employees or not—— "I was given a list of names to be prepared, and I do not know anything further".

Questioned specifically as to whether he would deem that his employer was Abeyagoonasekera & Sons, his reply was "I was working for Abeyagoonasekera & Sons, Safety Carriers. They go by the name of Safety Carriers, their business name is Safety Carriers." Asked to clarify, he said "Abeyagoonasekera & Sons is the Company name and they have a transport service under the business name 'Safety Carriers'." He had taken it for granted that Safety Carriers and A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera & Sons is one firm, and he knew for a fact that the business was carried on in one place at Gunananda Mawatha office and this address is the registered address of the firm known as Safety Carriers and of the business known as Abeyagoonasekera & Sons. He worked as Accounts Clerk attending to the accounts of Safety Carriers, maintained its ledger and cash book, marked as A3, journal, etc. He identified the cash book A3 as the book maintained by him. Safety Carriers did not have a separate bank account. Mr. A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera, the father, had direct control over the activities of the business of Safety Carriers. Witness's services were terminated by A1 issued by the Proprietor of Safety Carriers in December, 1969, and his December salary was not paid. A1 had been signed by the proprietor of Safety Carriers, A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera.

Both, father A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera and son A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera, worked at the office situated at 32, Gunananda Mawatha and witness was working in the room adjoining that of Abeyagoonasekera. Both father and son occupied the same table, and Devakumara too was working in the same office.

A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera, proprietor of the firm known as A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera & Sons said his Company which was registered in 1960 is still in business. He employed both permanent and casual staff. The permanent workers were those who had been with him for a long time and to whom vehicles were assigned to be operated exclusively by them. On such dates as the permanent workers did not turn up any one who calls for and requests work is offered work as a casual employee.

In 1965, the firm of Safety Carriers came into existence, the owner of which was his son, A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera. These two firms were functioning as separate and distinct firms.

Seven out of the 22 employees referred to in the reference are his employees and the others may have been casual under him or under his son at Safety Carriers. The permanent workers were: W. M. Heen Banda, G. P. Mendis, K. P. Jinadasa, D. L. A. C. Appuhamy, B. W. Fernando, W. Jayasekera and he was unable to recall the 7th name. These seven were employees of Abeyagoonasekera & Sons.

Both firms were doing transport work and when the lorries of his firm did not have any work, he sent them to Safety Carriers and vice versa. Since his lorries used to be hired by Safety Carriers, two of his vehicles were sent to Safety Carriers and the drivers and clearners of those lorries went with the lorries, and that is how they came to work at Safety Carriers.

He was aware that in November, 1969, the employees of Safety Carriers were given notice. Explaining how the firm of Safety Carriers came to give notice of termination of employment to employees whom he claimed were his, he said:—

- Q. Can you explain to Court how is it that Safety Carriers gave notice of termination of employment to some employees?
- A. Because Safety Carriers occasionally was managing my business and I instructed Safety Carriers. At that time we were running at a loss, and continuously the regular work that was being done was lost . . . . Therefore. I took this decision and gave instructions to Safety Carriers to serve notice on my employees.

Questioned as to who paid the wages of these employees he said "Abeyagoonaskera & Sons and sometimes Safety Carriers" used to pay, but the amount paid by Safety Carriers was deducted against the hire due to Abeyagoonasekera & Sons.

Although notice was served on the employees, witness offered alternative employment to all the persons whose names were included in the reference.

The employer giving evidence said that he signed the blank letters of termination and asked Dissanayake, the Cashier, to fill in the names of employees in the letters. The termination letters issued to the 7 workers were on the instructions of his father and the rest were issued notices on his own decision. The 7 workers whose services were terminated on the instructions of his father were Heen Banda, Mendis, Jinadasa, Appulamy, Fernando. Peiris and "I cannot remember the other name".

Other than the 7 employees of his father, the rest of the drivers and cleaners who were working at Safety Carriers were casual employees who did work only when work was available.

As the Union failed to be present on the dates assigned to it for leading its evidence, I concluded proceedings and made order that award will be made on the evidence so far led and available. The Union subsequently indicated that it would rest its case with the evidence of Dickson Peris, a workman whose evidence had already been tendered.

A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera's (i.e. the father's) evidence is that when the business of Safety Carriers was registered in his son's name in 1965, he helped his son with money and arranged credit facilities for him and sold some of his vehicles to his son under a sales agreement. A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera (the son, and employer in this case) too spoke of an agreement, though not a written one, under which he purchased lorries from his father when the business commenced. The business of Safety Carriers has been registered under the Business Names Ordinance (R1) bearing certificate No. 59411 and according to this the date of commencement of the business is 6.3.1965 and its proprieto is A. H. S. Abeyagoonasekera. Hence there is no doubt that this business existed from 1965.

There is also no doubt that the father took a great interest in his son's business and helped him along. It is also not improbable that he had given the services of 7 of his men when the son's business commenced in 1965.

But how valid is the claim that the 7 persons are still the father's employees and not the employees of Safety Carriers?

In the first place, the employer in his statement filed almost 10 months after the reference was made had admitted that all the employees in the reference were the employees of Safety Carriers. It must be noted that this statement was filed only on the 5th date when the case was called before the Tribunal, and on the 4 earlier dates the two contending parties to this dispute entered into negotiations to arrive at an agreed settlement. The employer had all the time to realise who were his employees and who were not.

This new claim that 7 persons were employees of the father apparently came to be made when it was found that their names appeared in the E. P. F. returns sent to the Commissioner of Labour by the father's firm of Abeyagoonasekera & Sons.

It was obvious that this was merely an attempt to draw a red herring across the trail. It must be remembered that both father and son were conducting two identical businesses and undoubtedly a large amount of "give and take" has occurred between these two firms. Both men and lorries having been moved to work under the firm of Safety Carriers as far back as 1965, it is absurd to claim after so many years that they are still the employees of the father.

It is relevant to record at this stage the several "peculiar" stands taken in this case. The first was an attempt to avoid appearing before this Tribunal on the plea that the employer's name was wrongly cited. When this attempt proved futile a more daring attempt was made. Salary records of these workmen which were produced before this Tribunal were, on a sebsequent date, said to have been lost, due presumably to the incriminating evidence revealed in these salary records. The existence of the father-son relationship and their erratic records and returns were made use of as another attempt to justify their stand. I am certain that a comparison of the "salary cards" and the E. P. F. returns would have been very revealing. Having regulated their day to day work, having terminated their services by R14, having admitted their employment, having entered into negotiations with regard to a settlement of the dispute, an attempt is now made to dislodge the claims of the workmen under an excuse that their names appear in the father's E. P. F. records.

At the stage when the finances and the documents thereto of the employer were taken up for examination, the employer's Counsel moved that Dickson Peris, a worker, should be asked to leave Court for the moment as he is a witness whom the employer proposed to summon to give evidence. The Union objected to Dickson Peris being asked to leave but the objection was overruled as it was felt that if Dickson Peris was going to give evidence on accounts he should leave Court.

Even in the case of Dickson Peris a completely different position was adopted at the trial from that taken in their statement. It was strange that this person who had maintained the cash book A3 of Safety Carriers was said to be not employed by Safety Carriers. It is found that salaries have been paid monthly to Dickson Peris and this is recorded in the cash book.

What obviously has happened is that Dickson Peris, an employee of Safety Carriers, has also worked on the records and books of the firm of Abeyagoonasekera & Sons and his salary may have been met by both firms—with Safety Carriers paying Rs. 100 as indicated in A3.

The further claim that other than the 7 employees, the rest were casual workers did not sound convincing at all. There was not one piece of satisfactory evidence produced to prove this and here again the "salary cards" would have revealed interesting facts. Apart from this it is in evidence that all these workmen, when their services were terminated by R14 were paid a month's salary in lieu of notice, thus recognising the fact that the workmen were not casual workmen.

The alleged reasons for termination are closure of business and the increasing losses. No accounts or balance sheet or any evidence was placed before the Tribunal with regard to the position of the Company up to 1968. For the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, two certificates, R22 and R23, purported to have been signed by a Registered Accountant were produced, but here again neither the Registered Accountant nor the books from which these accounts were made, nor even the audited statements were produced before the Tribunal. Some other statements of accounts and trial balance sheets were produced which themselves were lacking in authenticity.

The evidence of Newman, Accounts Clerk, was revealing. He joined Safety Carriers in September, 1970, and had "done the books" for 1968-69 and 1969-70. Questioned "from what statements did you prepare the books? "his answer was "It was not in order. I had to build up the whole structure."

In the first place, if continuing losses is the reason, then one must have figures for the earlier years to compare with the figures of the present in order to arrive at a proper assessment.

When this is not done, and if the employer seeks to rely on the figures of two years, then, at least this evidence must be well established with *reliable* documents. This has not been done.

The income and expenditure statements (R7 and R8) for September, 1970 and October, 1970, respectively, indicate that a sum of Rs. 7,500 and of Rs. 11,617.02 have been received by Safety Carriers from A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera, the father. But in the statement for financial year April, 1970—March, 1971 (R13) the amount received from A. W. A. Abeyagoonasekera is given as only Rs. 4,777,29. There are several other discrepancies discernible, but I have pointed out one glaring instance.

If reliable and satisfactory documents are produced, losses or profits, as the case may be, are very easy to prove, but in this case the losses as alleged by the firm have not been proved. On the contrary, it would appear that if the income had been as much as Rs. 627,289.57 in 1970-71, when only 6 lorries were working, it would work out to approximately one lakh on a lorry per year and approximately Rs. 8,000 per month. With this income per lorry if the employer were to say he was running at a loss, the cause can neither be due to business nor to workers.

with regard to closure, the evidence of the employer's witnesses is still more confusing. While the employer maintained that it was he who made the offer of alternative employment to the workmen, the father maintained it was he himself who made the offer; and Devakumara gave two different versions. However, it is in evidence that Safety Carriers started in 1965, and in November, 1969, terminated the services of only about 45 workmen out of a total of about 70. If one were to go by the employer's evidence, it would appear that 1½ months after the alternative offer was made, work on the old basis recommenced and he continued to employ drivers and cleaners. Hence there has been no closure in its real sense. It is further in evidence that though notice was issued, the business was and is still in existence and they are continuing the same business even now. As stated earlier, the firm has been earning at the rate of Rs. 8,000 per month per lorry even in 1970-71. The reasons urged in the letters of termination cannot in my view be said to be bona fide.

I hold that the termination of the services of the workmen is not justified.

In the circumstances of this case, I do not think an order for re-instatement will serve any useful purpose and I am of the view that an order for payment in lieu of re-instatement will be just and equitable. In assessing the question of payment I have been guided by the judgment in S. S. Shetty vs. Bharat Nidhi Ltd., Supreme Court Report India, 1958, 442.

I order that the employer pay the 19 workmen an amount equivalent to one year's salary calculated on the basis of the daily rate (as given in the Wages Boards Ordinance)  $\times$  25 working days in the month.

On this basis the workmen will receive as follows:—

The employer shall remit the total sum of Rs. 39,918 Rupees Thirty nine thousand nine hundred and eighteen) to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo North, Labour Department, Colombo 5, within one month from the date of publication of this award in the Government Gazette; and the workers are free to collect what is due to them thereafter.

Ceylon Mercantile Union (on behalf of K. T. Ratnam), 22 1/1, Upper Chatham Street, Colombo 1

Kundanmal Industries Limited, 26, Keyzer Street, Colombo 11

The Commissioner of Labour by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act with the amendments thereto has referred the following dispute to me for settlement by arbitration.

The matter in dispute is whether the termination of the services of Mr. K. T. Ratnam by his Employer is justified and to what relief he is entitled.

Ratnam was employed as a Cashier of Kundanmal Industries Limited from the year 1964. His services were terminated by the Management on 30.9.1970. The salary he drew at the time of the discontinuance of his services was Rs. 325 per month. His services had been terminated on a complaint made by Kularatna, one of the employees of the self-same firm.

The complaint of Kularatna is that on 29.8.70, Ratnam, the Cashier got him to sign a book and gave him a few coins and put the balance salary in his (Ratnam's) pocket, meaning that Ratnam refused to pay his legitimate salary. On this complaint of Kularatna, the Management served a notice on Rantam to

show cause why he has failed to pay the wages of Kularatna and appropriated the said sum for his benefit and gain. The Management on the 30th of September, informed Ratnam that they were not satisfied with the explanation he had given and they had lost confidence in him and were unable to continue him in service. Hence the termination of his services.

What was the evidence Kularatna gave in this inquiry? He and Ratnam had been very close friends. According to him, he used to borrow Rs. 5 to Rs. 10 from Ratnam. His final recollection is that he had borrowed a sum of Rs. 240 to buy a wristlet. Ratnam also used to deduct Rs. 20 a month for bringing him on his motor cycle pillion.

During the middle of every month he had already taken an advance of Rs. 75. He had asserted that during the three months immediately preceding August, 1970, he did not receive any salary, because Ratnam was in the habit of deducting what he owed Ratnam. On the day in question Ratnam threw some small coins on the table and pocketed the balance salary. Therefore he made the above complaint to his superiors.

Upali Gunawardene, the Personnel Manager of Kundanmal Industries Limited, testified that he was in charge of the labour Industries Limited, testified that he was in charge of the labour relations, welfare and administration of this Factory. According to him. Ratnam's functions were to pay the wages of the workers, their overtime payments and their salary advances. Ratnam handles about Rs. 7,000 to Rs. 8,000 a month in the payment of wages to the employees. He says that on the day in question at about 12.30 p.m. Kularatna came to him and complained that Ratnam had refused to pay his salary. He questioned Ratnam and he had admitted that he had deducted certain amounts that Kularatna owed him. Gunawardene issued the notice to show cause on Ratnam. According to Gunawardene, it was a clear case of misappropriation. Therefore, he did not want to hold an inquiry. Just that. Gunawardene had been in the Police Force, and this attitude shows the real mentality of a Police Officer—no inquiry but instant dismissal.

The majority of the workers in this institution are Sinhalese, about 80 per cent. and a few Tamils. Ratnam fell into this minority, unfortunate category. Ratnam had been made the President of the Union round about June, 1970. This, I feel, is another thorn on the side of the Management. Ratnam, a youth of 28 years, had joined this firm on the 1st of July, 1964, as a Cashier-Clerk on a salary of Rs. 90 per month. He has received his usual increments and a special increment in September, 1966; and thereafter he had received his usual increments, and in 1970, he has been paid an additional allowance of Rs. 25. He said that there was a token strike on the 26th of January, 1970, and that thereafter he was made the President of the Union. The Management did not like him joining the Union, and the Directors called him to the Office and congratulated him, but asked him to resign from his office. He refused. Ratnam said that Kularatna borrowed Rs. 200 from him somewhere in May and asked him, to deduct Rs. 25 from his May salary. Then in June he was asked by Kularatna to deduct another Rs. 25 and he promised to give him the balance. Ratnam himself wanted money urgently to repair his motor bicycle and was pressing Kularatna to pay the outstanding balance. On the day in question the salary due to Kularatna was Rs. 126.43. He got Kularatna to sign the pay sheet, deducted his Rs. 125 and kept the balance Re. 1.43 on the table.

I accept the evidence of Ratnam that Kularatna had borrowed Rs. 200 from him and promised to re-pay him within a very short time. It is not unusual for Ratnam to deduct Rs. 25 or so from Kularatna's salary: Kularatna himself had consented and this process of deduction went on for sometime by mutual agreement. Can anyone blame Ratnam for finally deducting the amount due and returning a few cents to Kularatna? There is no case of misappropriation of Kularatna's salary by Ratnam. Apparently, on this day Kularatna was incensed that he received only a few coins. Taking it for granted that Ratnam refused to pay, is the Management entitled to impose the maximum penalty on Ratnam?

The Personnel Manager did not hold an inquiry to find out whether there were any mitigating circumstances. I do not know how the Management can say in the instant case that Ratnam had misappropriated the said sum of money for his benefit and gain. Ratnam had no intention to misappropriate these sums of money, and there was no loss, either to the Management or Kularatna. As a matter of fact, he was a man who was handling Rs. 7,000 to Rs. 8,000 a month. Not a cent lost; not a word against him. I am firmly of the view that the termination of services of Mr. Ratnam was unjustified. I, therefore, make award that he be reinstated with effect from the 1st February, 1973, and that he be paid all his back wages. The back wages due to him shall be deposited with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo North, within 15 days of the publication of this award in the Gazette of the Republic of Sri, Lanka.

## CONTROL OF PRICES ACT

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act (Chapter 173), I, Mediwake Seneviratne Banda, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), for the Nuwara Eliya District do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with immediate effect Food Price Order No. N.E. 109 of 21st January, 1968, published in Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 14,786/1 of 28th January, 1968;
- (ii) fix the prices specified in Columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per 148 lbs. nett and the maximum retail price per lb. nett above which wheat flour shall not be sold within the corresponding areas in Column 1 of the Schedule;
- (iii) direct that for the purposes of this Order-
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any wheat flour for the purpose of re-sale, or any sale of wheat flour in a quantity of 148 lbs. nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour less than 148 lbs. nett for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (c) "Wheat Flour" shall be deemed to include any mixture of wheat flour with maize flour;
- (iv) direct that no person shall sell any wheat flour which is mixed with any other article except maize flour;
- (v) direct that no person shall sell any mixture of wheat flour and maize flour which contains more than ten per cent by weight of maize flour;
- (vi) direct that when any wheat flour is sold, the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper or container, if any, in which wheat flour is sold;
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader, who has wheat flour in his possession or under his control, at any place or in any vehicle, shall exhibit conspicuously at the place or on that vehicle a quantity of such wheat flour in a suitable container with the maximum prices for such wheat flour fixed by this Order displayed in figures not less than one inch in height on price tags or boards attached to such container in such a manner that the wheat flour and the maximum prices could be clearly seen by any customer;
- (viii) direct that every person who sells any wheat flour by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any wheat flour by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of sale;

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- (b) the weight of wheat flour sold;
- (c) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold, and
- (d) the nature of the transaction, i.e. whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (ix) direct that for the purpose of this Order "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois
- (x) this Order shall not apply to the D.R.O's Division of Udahewaheta in the Nuwara Eliya District.

- (iii) direct that any loaf weighing more than 8 oz. or any part more than 8 oz. in weight of any loaf shall not be sold in any area at a price higher than the price calculated proportionately by weight from the maximum price per 16oz. loaf fixed by the Order for that area;

- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any bread shall on demand give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out

  - (a) the date of sale;
    (b) the description of the loaf sold;
    (c) the quantity of bread sold, and
    (d) the price paid for the bread sold.
- (viii) direct that for the purpose of this Order "oz." shall be deemed to be the standard ounce avoirdupois weight; This Order excludes the D.R.O's Division of Udahewaheta in Nuwara Eliya District.

- (i) The groups of madel fishermen organised under Mr. Benedict Silva and Mr. M. O. P. - does not have or has not exercised any customary right to carry on madel fishing operations in the aforestated portion of territorial waters.
- (ii) The group of madel fishermen organised under Mr. Clement Dias while averring that they have acquired a right to do madel fishing in the aforestated portion of territorial waters with the purchase of a madel boat and nets from Mrs. Catherine Mary Perera of Kalamulla who had exercised madel fishing rights thereat. claim that such madel fishing operations are essential for their liyelihood.
- 3. I have been requested to hold a Public Inquiry and report on the subject matter of this dispute and also on such matters relating to, connected with, or arising from this dispute.
